Pre-registration audit for applicants undertaking one or more of the following treatments:

- □ Tattooing
- Body piercing
- □ Acupuncture
- Electrolysis
- □ Semi-permanent make up

Requirement

The treatment room/area

The treatment room/area is solely used for giving treatments

There is a designated hand wash basin in the treatment room/area supplied with hot and cold water, soap and a hygienic means for hand drying e.g. paper towels The walls, doors, windows, partitions and floor are smooth, impervious and washable

There is no bare wood or untreated surfaces

All tables, couches, seats, arm rests etc used by clients in the treatment area have a smooth impervious surface that can be adequately cleaned. All furniture and fittings are kept clean and in good condition

There is a suitable waste bin and liner which is washable and leak proof

There is a suitably located sharps box for disposing of used needles and razor blades

A 'No Smoking, drinking or eating' sign is displayed in the treatment area/on the premises

There are an adequate number of electrical sockets/gas points available

The premises

There is another sink/water outlet available in the premises where water for cleaning the
treatment room/area can be sourced. There is running hot and cold water available.There is a WC available for use by operators. The WC has its own designated hand wash
basin supplied with hot and cold water, soap and a hygienic means for hand dryingThere is a first aid kit available

The treatment process

There is disposable paper roll/cling film/cord covers available for covering seats/couches/arm rests /machine and machine cords

Needles are sterile, single use and kept in a sterile condition until used

Needle cartridges have backflow membranes and this information is available in writing

Containers used for dyes, pigments and inks are single use or autoclaved

Other equipment used in the treatment is single use or autoclaved/sterilised

Equipment used in the treatment is stored in a safe, hygienic way until it is used

Towels, gowns, wraps and other protective coverings are single use for each client

Disposable gloves are used which are CE marked. Non-latex gloves are available	
There is an adequate supply of cleaning chemicals available including anti-bacterial disinfectant and/or sterilising solutions.	_
COSHH sheets are available for the cleaning chemicals used (Manufacturer instructions)	
There is an adequate supply of disposable cleaning cloths available	
There is an effective stock rotation procedure for inks/dyes/ pigments	

The operator undertaking treatments

The operator keeps their hands clean and nails short

The operator wears clean clothing or a disposable protective apron for each client

The operator covers any open boils, cuts, wounds with an impermeable dressing

The operator does not smoke or consume food/drink

Other legal requirements

Risk assessments are undertaken for each client for every treatment e.g. client consent and medical forms. Aftercare advice is given and is available in writing.

The information gathered about clients is secured safely in line with Data Protection law.

The operator is aware of any age restrictions for the treatments they undertake

There is a business trade waste contract set up with a licensed waste contractor for the disposal of sharps and clinical waste. *Note: Sharps waste cannot be taken to local pharmacies for disposal* The operator has suitable employer/employee/public liability insurance

The operator is aware of any accidents/incidents they must report under RIDDOR <u>Reporting of Injuries, Diseases & Dangerous Occurrences RIDDOR (hse.gov.uk)</u> <u>Autoclave use</u>: there is an up to date pressure test certificate and maintenance records for the machine. Evidence that the machine is sterilising sufficiently must be available

Numbing creams: Please be aware that operators should not be supplying or applying these to clients.

Recommendations

Operators should consider having up to date tetanus and any relevant hepatitis vaccinations e.g. Hep B
