SPEECH AND LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT CHECKLIST FOR EARLY YEARS SETTINGS – SEPTEMBER 2011

Please look at the part of the checklist appropriate to the age of the child that you are assessing. The boxes on the left describe speech and language skills that are not a cause for concern, and strategies from the EYFS should be used to support ongoing development. The boxes on the right describe possible causes for concern and a **consultation with a Speech and Language Therapist should be considered.**

If a child's speech is unintelligible (meeting the 'possible cause for concern' criteria), or if the child stammers, please refer directly to the Speech and Language Service.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Parental consent <u>MUST</u> be obtained in order to request a consultation with a Speech and Language Therapist or to make a referral.

If you are an education or other professional, written consent is essential.
