- 1 12.7% decrease in due to overpayment of tax in previous years.
- 2 Due to Covid meetings were only advertised on line for most of the year and took place virtually hence the reduction of 87.7% in mileage.
- 3 An apparent increase of 81.9% because payment for the subscription to LALC/NALC had to be made twice in 2020/21, as the first cheque was lost in the post.
- 4 100% decrease in room rent, as all meetings were held virtually.
- 5 100% decrease in postage, as all written communications took place by email
- 6 Audit documents were shared electronically via Google drive resulting in a 23.1% reduction, as there was no need to pay for a courier.
- 7 2020/21 witnessed a 50% reduction in licence fees, as the fee for renewing a small lotteries licence is lower than the initial fee.
- 8 No face to face events being held resulted in a 73.7% reduction in expenditure on community engagement

9 97.8% reduction in VAT payments.

- 10 Savings made in several cost centres resulted in a 10.4% reduction in expenditure.
- 11 20% increase in precept intended to reduce dependency on and depletion of reserves.
- 12 100% reduction, as no events were held due to Covid.
- 13 Apparent 100% increase due to introduction of contra to balance lost cheque.
- 14 A combination of the 20% precept increase and the 10.4% reduction in expenditure resulted in a small surplus.
- 15 3.67% increase in balances.
