## 349 Issues Relating to the Balcarres Arms

for discussion and agreement

The Balcarres Arms is located in what is supposed to be a conservation area, yet the pub are regularly playing loud music in the beer garden. It is often so loud that residents of properties some distance away often think that the music is emanating from the home of a close neighbour.

Pub fights are a regular event. When football matches are shown on large screens, the noise is incredible.

Complaints made by neighbours to the police achieve nothing. Cllr A Edwards will lead on this.

Members are invited to discuss the situation and agree the best way forward.

350 Loud Music in Woods – for discussion & agreement Every Friday night very loud music and aggressive shouting can be heard coming from the woods behind the Alms Houses and annoying local residents. Recently this has increased to Thursday and Sunday nights. A lot of litter is left behind in the woods on these occasions.

The resident who has drawn this to the Council's attention has complained to Wigan Council, but nothing has happened. It is stopping residents enjoying their own garden spaces.

The residents have no objection to young people enjoying themselves in the woods as a big group (they have been doing so for years) but the music and noise levels are really are becoming unacceptable.

Another resident spoke to Mr Keith Bergman about it. He reported the gatherings to the Police, but he only had a limited response. Haigh Woodland Park staff do a litter pick on Saturday and Sunday mornings and regularly fill at least three bin bags. Members are invited to discuss the matter and agree the best way forward.

This matter was discussed with Wigan Council officers during the Parish Council's meeting with them on 24 August.

A team of officers are currently in the process of engaging with the owners of the field over the issues being created by the tent pegging events being held there with a view to finding a resolution.

## 356 Bubblefest 2021 – for approval

The working party has been meeting virtually on a weekly basis since the last Parish Council meeting to plan the event. They have meet with Mr Keith Bergman at Haigh Woodland Park and have assessed the site. Additional virtual meetings have been arranged for Friday, 3 September and Thursday, 9 September (both at 6:30pm) to finalise matters. Members are invited to approve decisions made by the working party.

A member has been approached by one of the stable owners on Hall Lane and has asked if the Parish Council could approach Wigan Council about the possibility of putting up signs above and below the S bends to warn motorists that horses use the lane. There is no access through Haigh Woodland Park, so, to get on to Pendlebury and Sennicar Lanes, the horses have to negotiate the blind bends.

Members are invited to discuss this and agree the best way forward.

358 Remembrance Sunday - for discussion and agreement
At present the situation with respect to arrangements for
Remembrance Sunday is unknown, so we have to assume that it
will be a case of 'back to normal as far as the Parish Council is
concerned.

There are two commitments to consider:

(a) The arrangements for ordering, collecting and laying the wreath at the war memorial at Aspull on behalf of the residents of Haigh Parish on Remembrance Sunday, which this year is on Sunday, 14 November. Mr John Hilton usually orders it for the Council and the Council make a donation of £100 to the Royal British Legion.

The wreath is laid by the Chairman (or his deputy) as part of the Remembrance Sunday parade.

Members are invited to approve this and agree the identity of the councillor laying the wreath.

(b) The Council own display poppies which are attached to lamp posts around the Parish by a contractor. The poppies remain on display throughout November, after which the poppies are removed by the same contractor. The contractor is available to do this and has quoted £50 for the work – the same as in past years.

Members are invited to discuss and approve this.
