1. INTRODUCTION

Our core data protection obligations and commitments are set out in the Council's Primary Privacy Notice.

This notice provides additional privacy information for **Environmental Health**. Environmental health includes environmental protection, statutory nuisance, private tenanted property, food hygiene, infectious diseases, food poisoning outbreaks, health & safety in accordance with their remit.

2. WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION DO WE COLLECT

In order to carry out activities and obligations as regulators for Environmental Health, we may process information in relation to:

- Name
- Title
- Address
- Telephone numbers
- Personal email addresses
- Date of birth
- Gender
- Marital status
- Bank account details, payroll and tax/national insurance status information

We may also collect, store and use special categories of more sensitive personal information. This may include, but is not limited to:

- Offences (including alleged offences), criminal proceedings, outcomes and sentences

3. HOW WE USE PERSONAL INFORMATION

The main purposes for processing your personal information are:

- The inspection as necessary any premises in respect of food, water, land, air (including noise ,radiation, vibration, artificial light etc.), chemicals, materials, plant and equipment for any purpose appropriate to the functions of the service
- Investigation of complaints or responding to enquiries
- Pro-active enforcement activities to ensure compliance
- For the prevention and / or detection of fraud and / or crime
- Intelligence sharing with enforcement partners
- To allow us to communicate with service users
- To fulfil a legal obligation
