Key Findings

Population



The Neighbourhood has a roughly even split between under-16 and over-65 population.

Gender split reflects the Borough profile however percentage of BAME and limiting disability population is above the Borough average.

Start Well



Leigh West ward has the second highest rate of children living in poverty in the Borough (406%) after housing costs taken into account.

Leigh has the highest rate of primary pupils in receipt of Free School and second highest rate of special educational needs pupils. The Neighbourhood has the second lowest rate of school readiness (2019) in the Borough.

Hospital Activity



The location of the Walk-In Centre within this Neighbourhood results in a significantly higher average for A&E attendances from other urgent care settings than the Borough average with P92035 reporting a Borough-high rate for this category. Attendances from consultant-led sites is below Borough average albeit PY02322 and P92029 both report above Borough average. Y00050 reports a Borough high for 0-17 age cohort attending from other urgent care settings. P92035 reports a Borough high rate for 18-64 age cohort attendances from other urgent care settings. Y00050 reporting a Borough-high rate for attendance from other urgent care settings for 65 and older age cohort.

Elective admissions are marginally below the Borough average with non-elective admissions being in line with the Borough.

The Neighbourhood is marginally below Borough average for outpatient appointment attendances. All bar four practices fall below the Borough average for follow-up attendances.

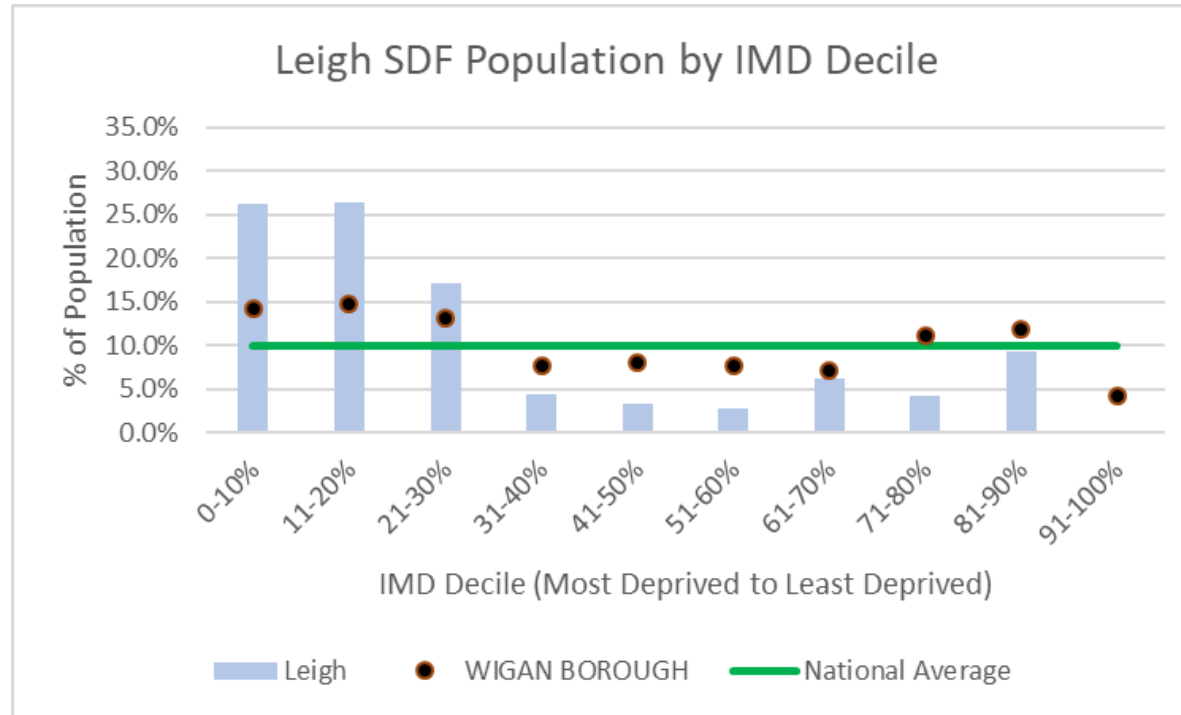

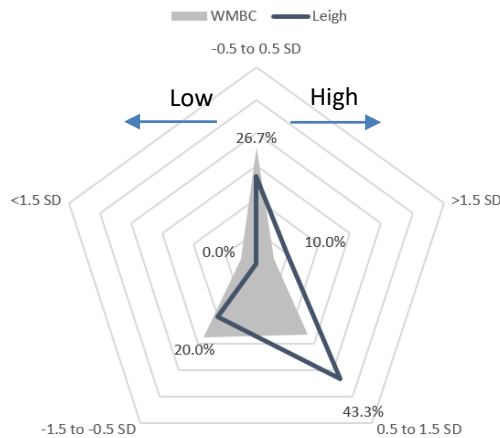
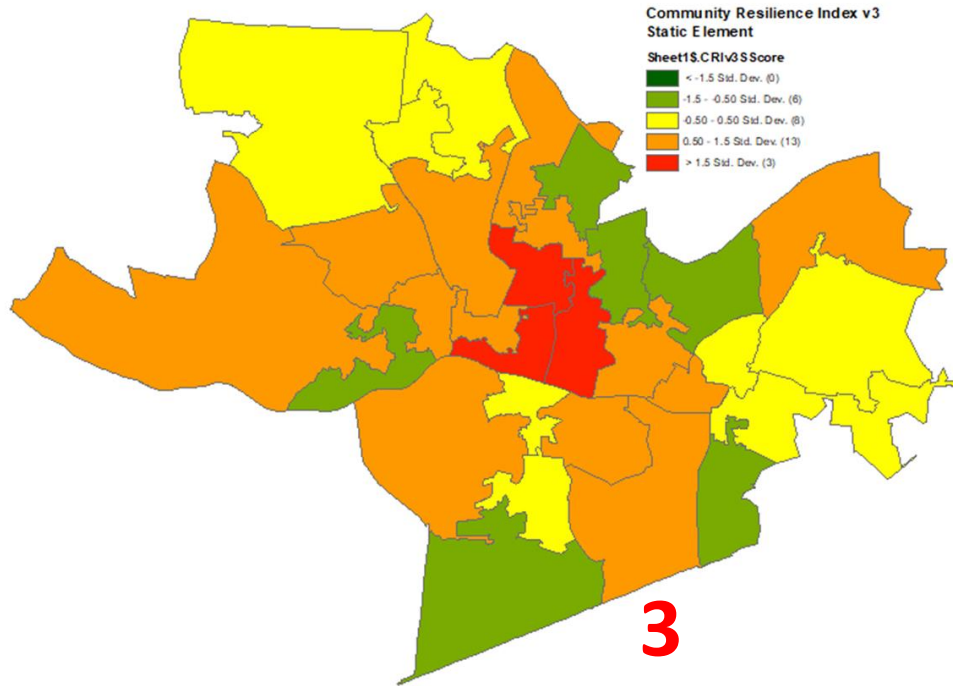
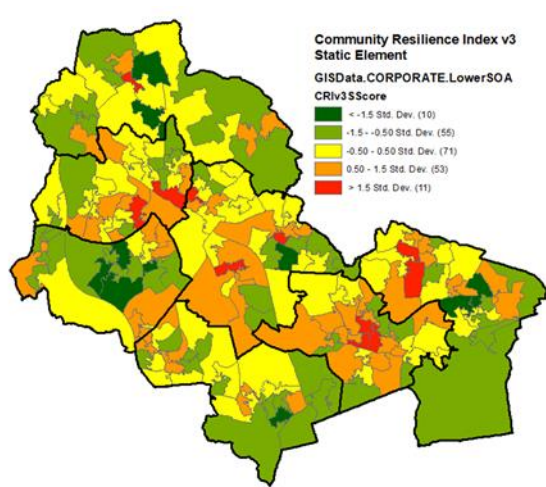
Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
 - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
 - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
 - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.
 - The rate of shielded patients in each LSOA.

Impact of Covid

- The Neighbourhood is above the Borough average for community resilience risk factors with over 50% of the LSOAs being in the top two tranches of risk
- Three adjoining LSOAs are in the top tranche for risk factors – Railway Road / Twist Lane, Leigh Centre and Hilton Park
- Three GP practices are in the top ten Borough-wide for prevalence of asthma – P92607, P92615 and P92621

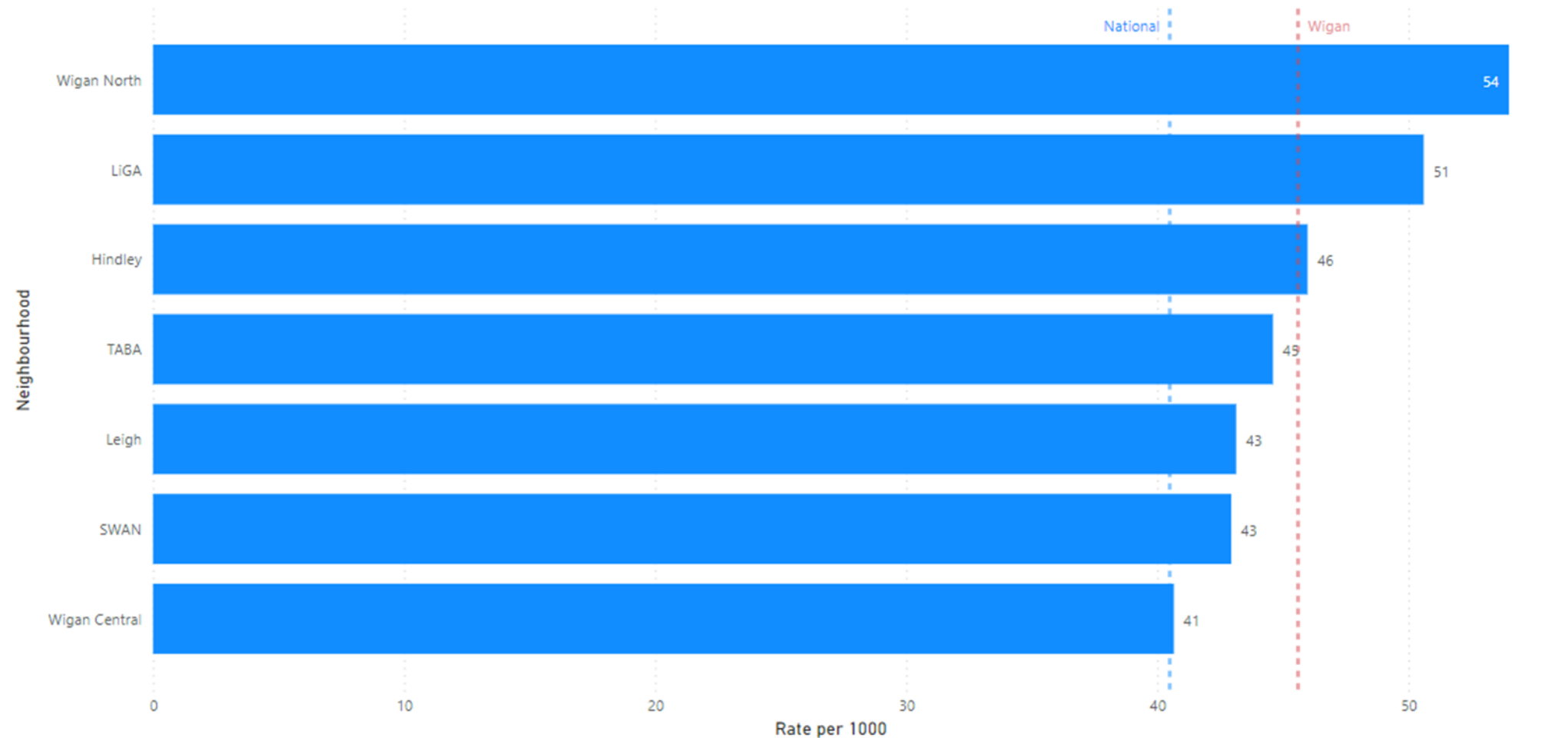

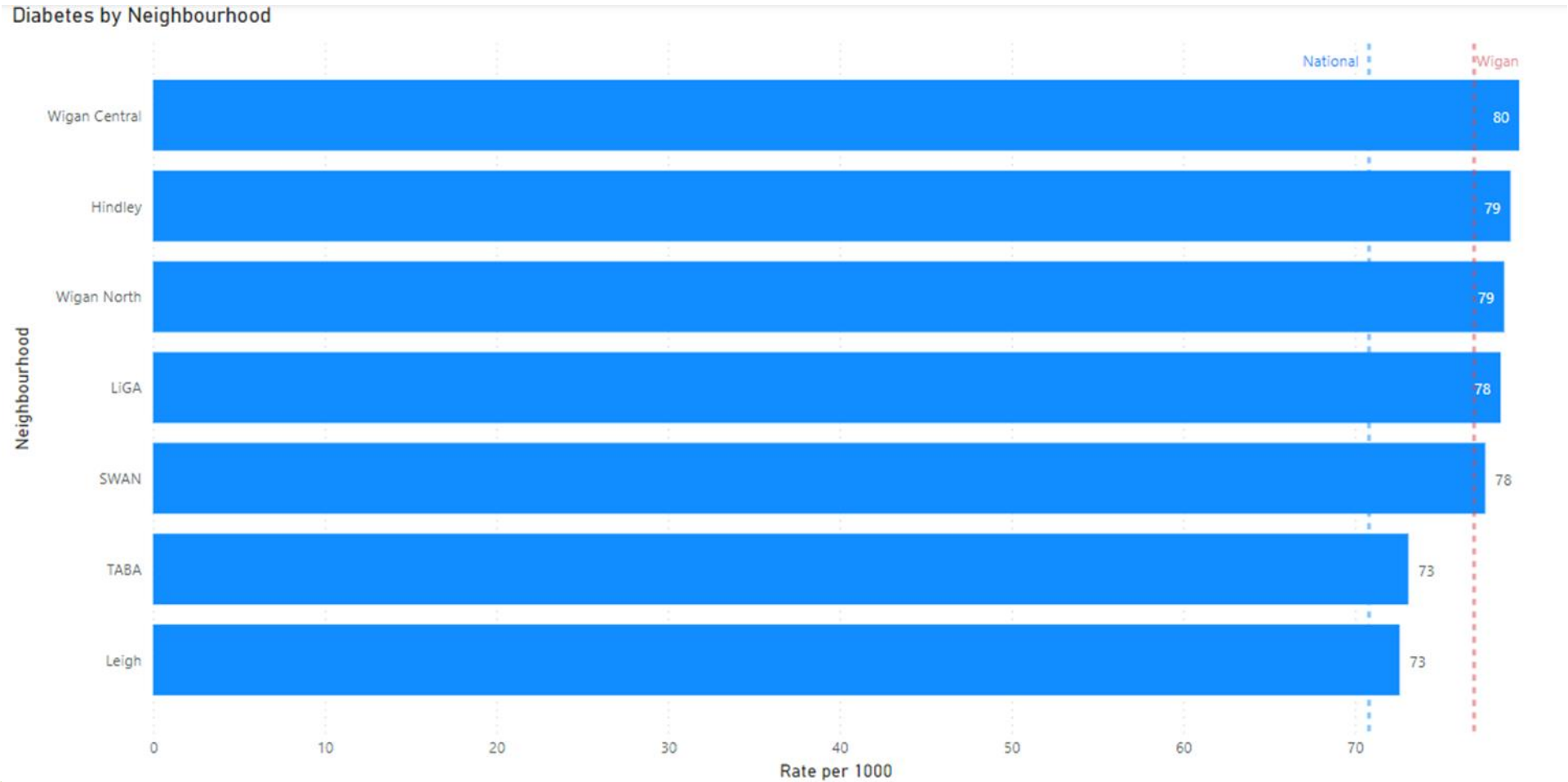

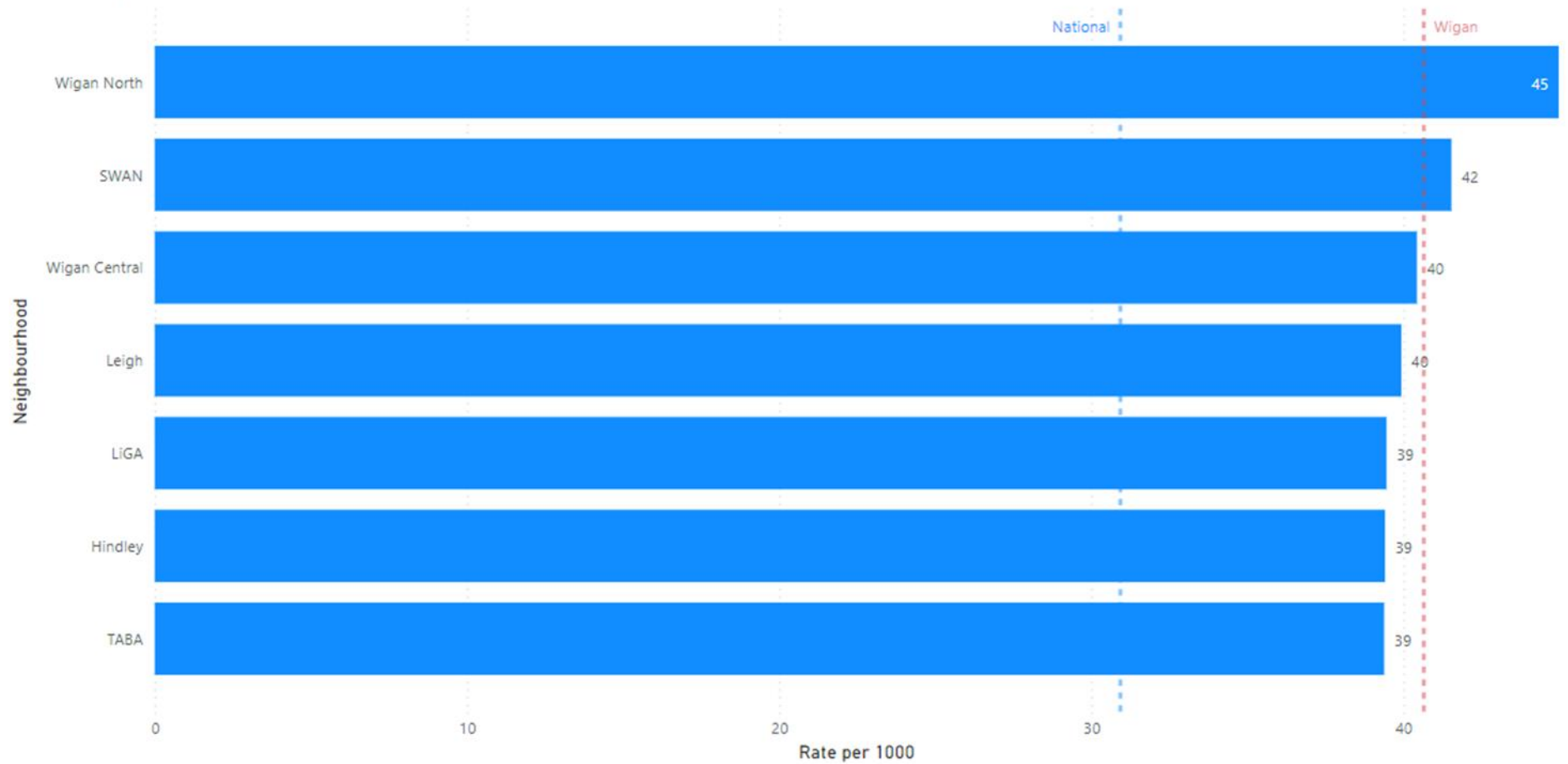

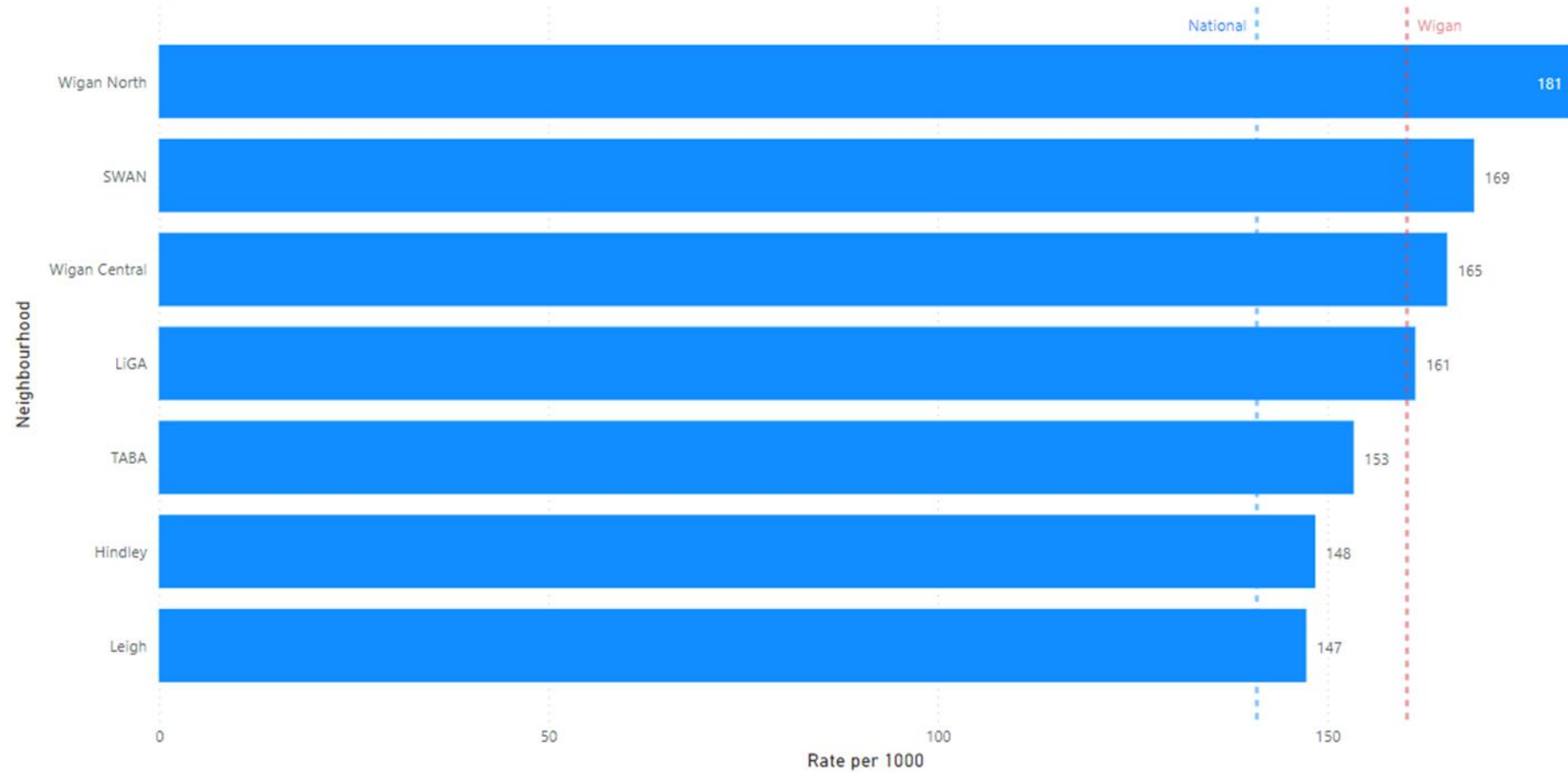

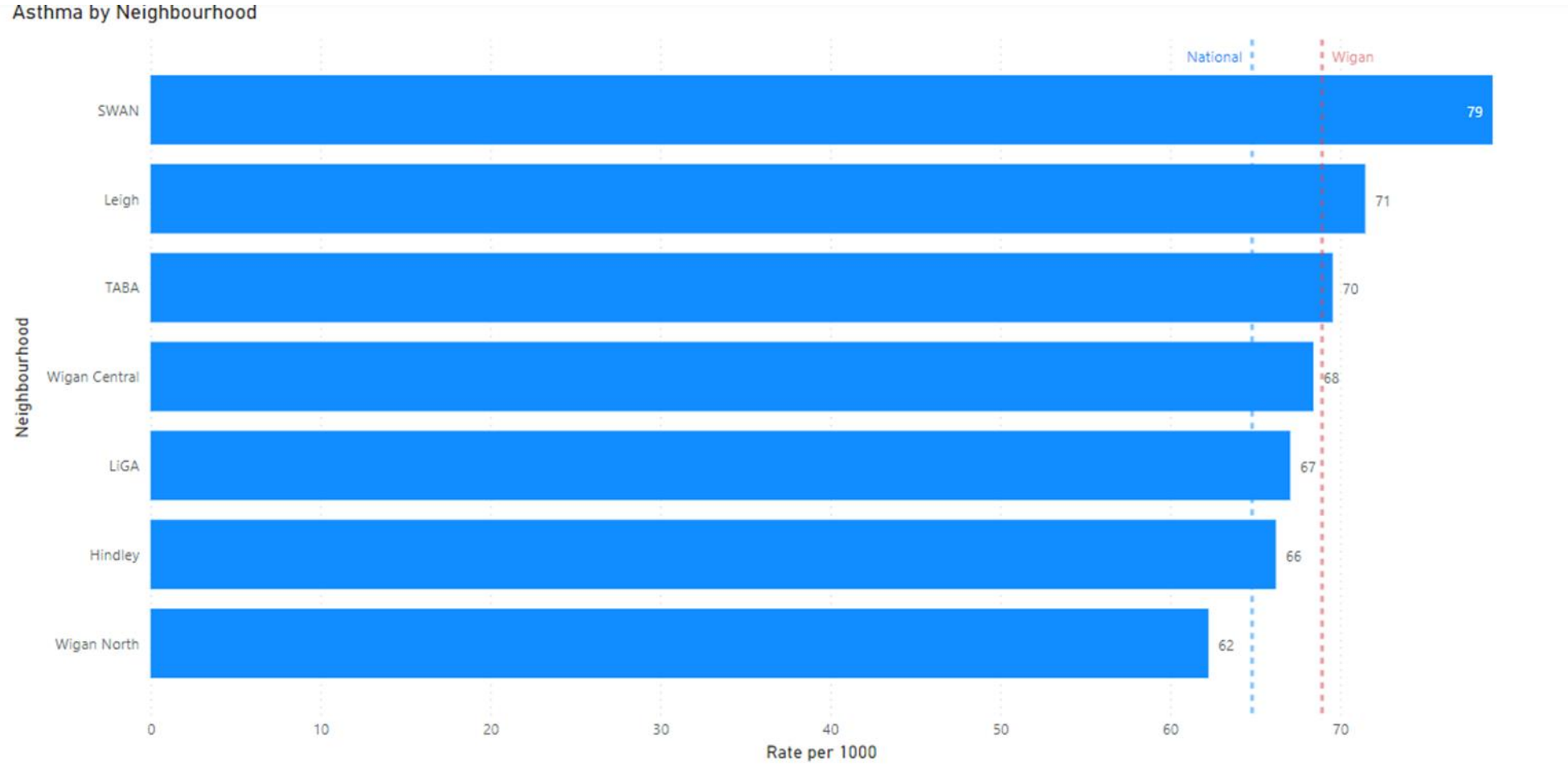

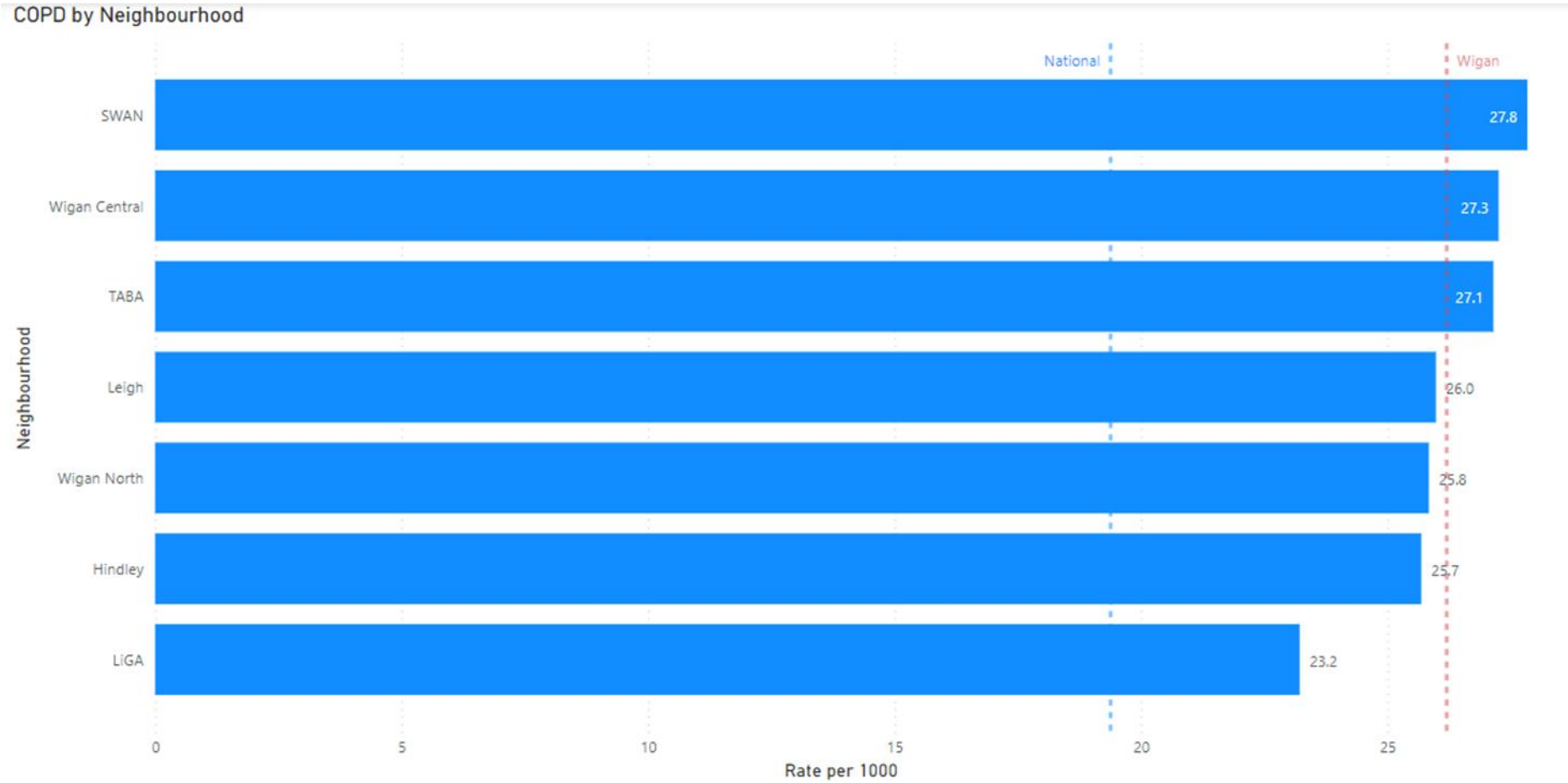

93% of over 70s had received the booster vaccination.

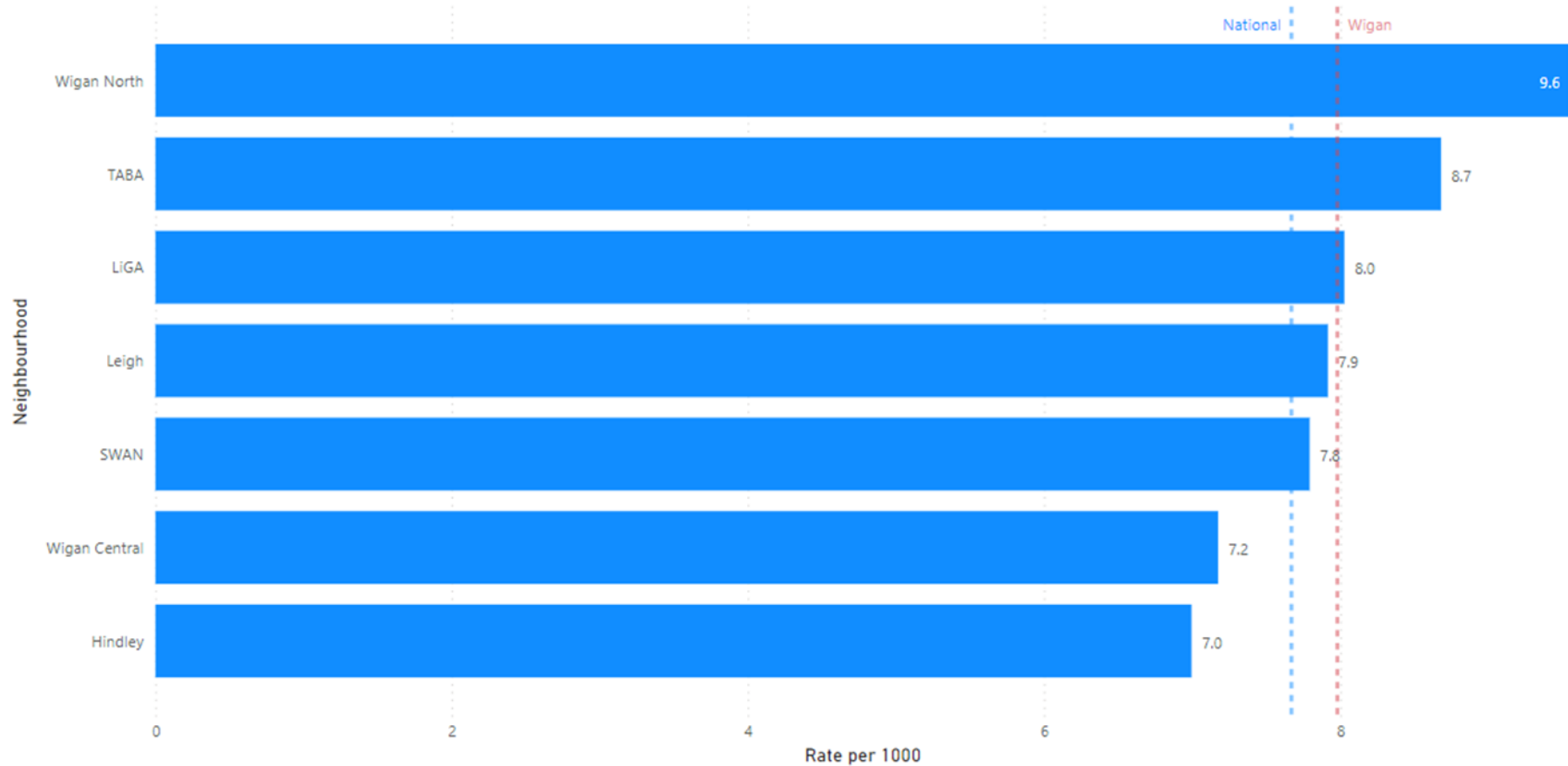

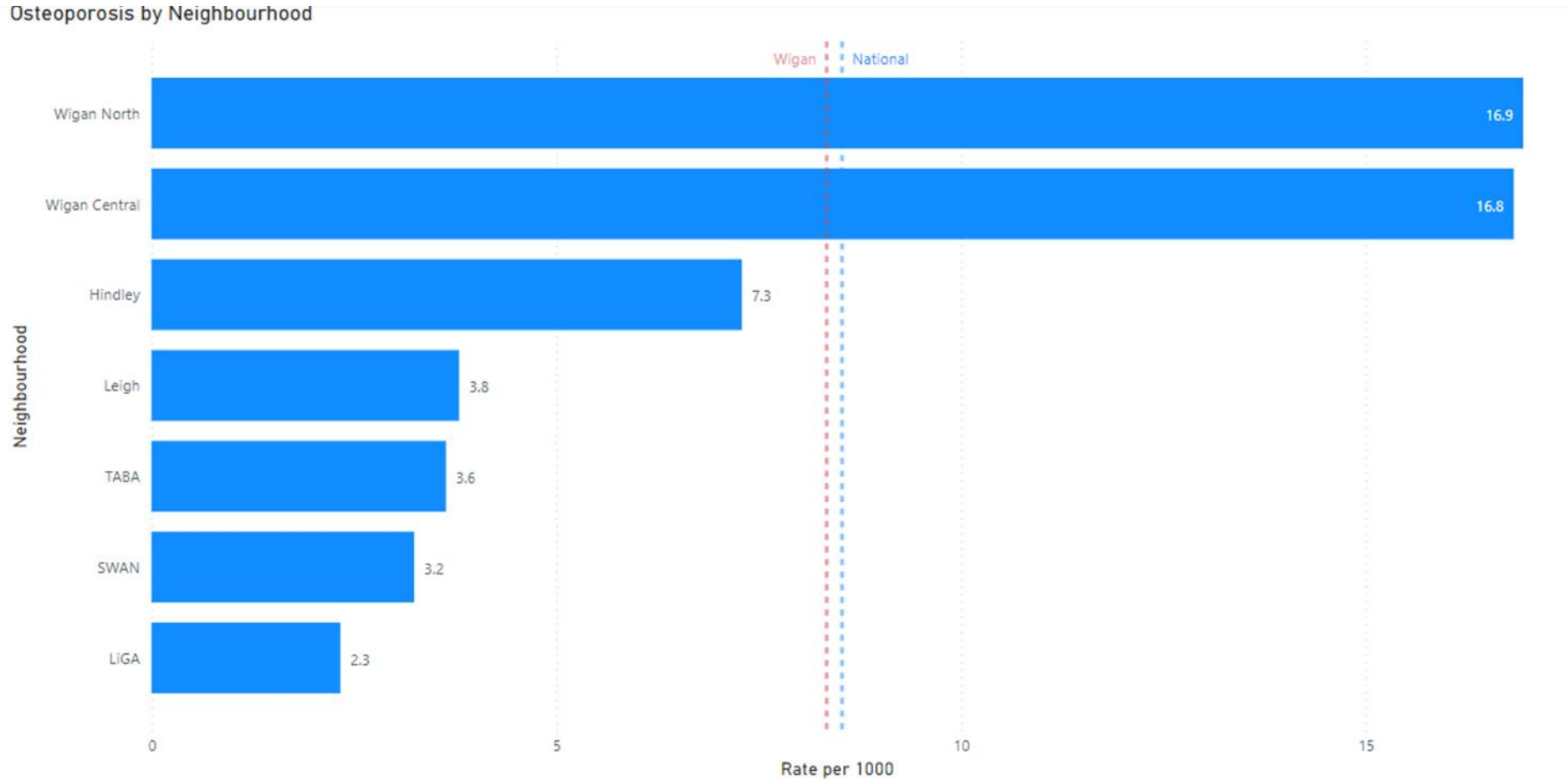

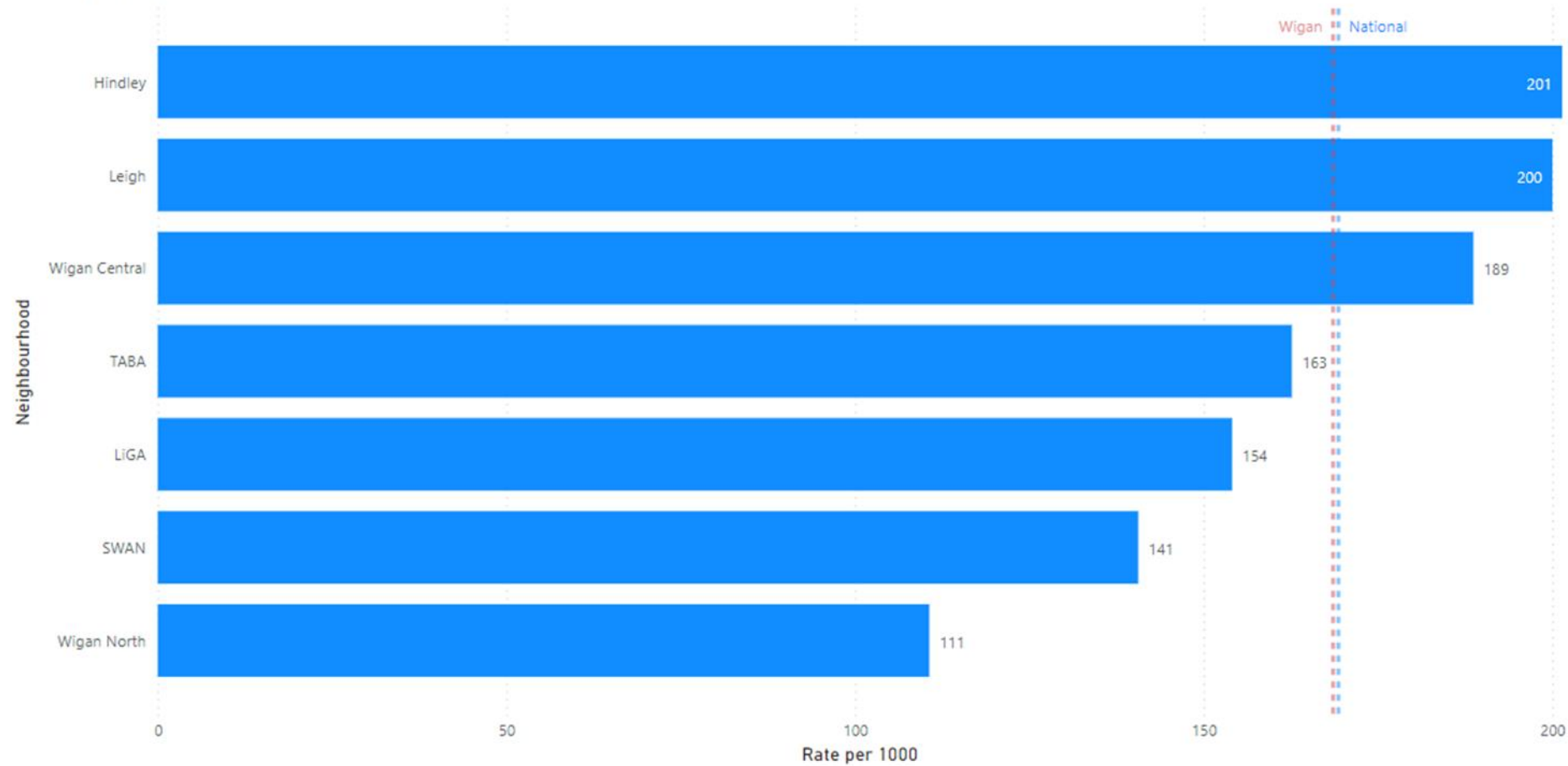

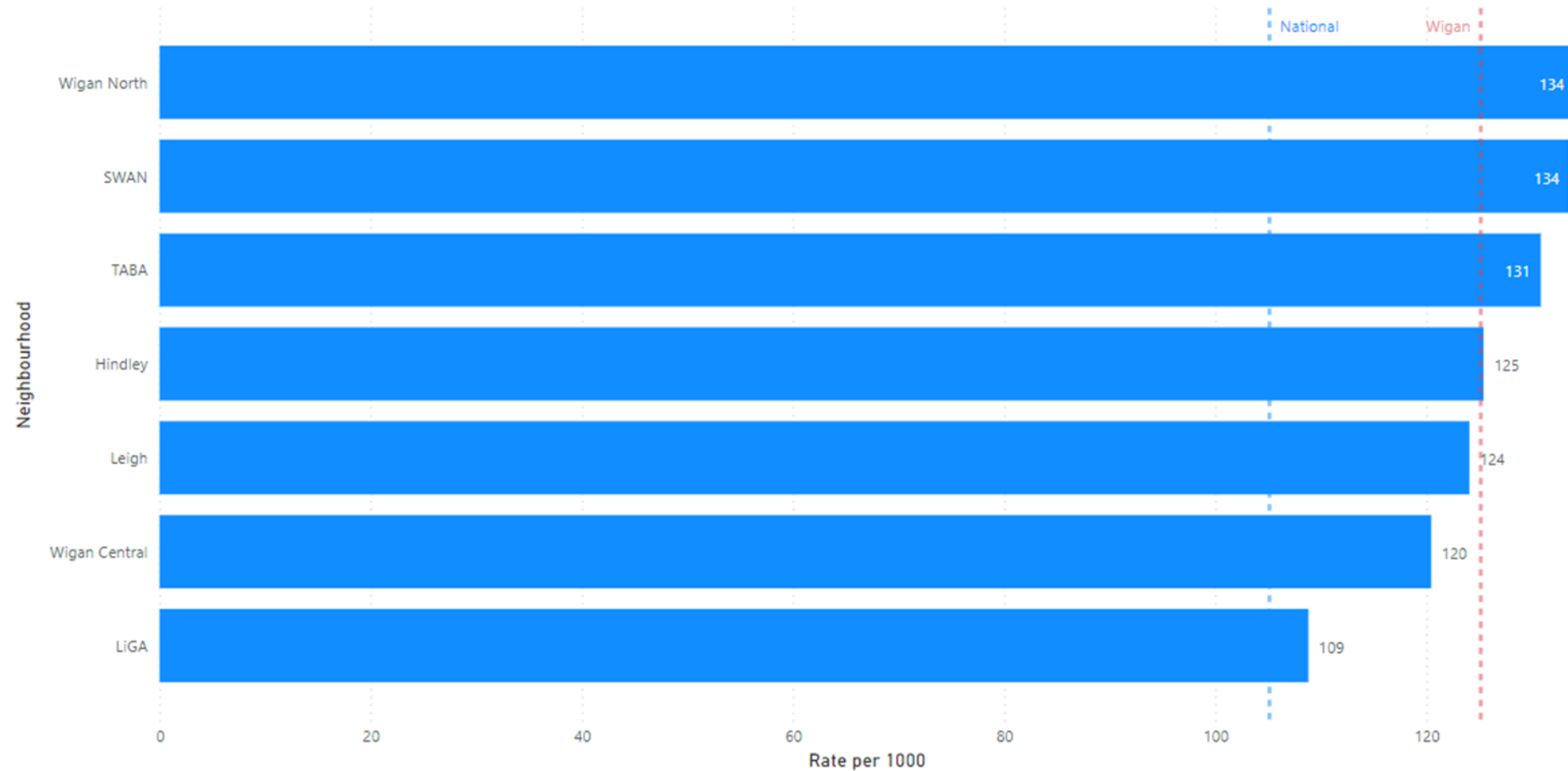
Smoking by Neighbourhood

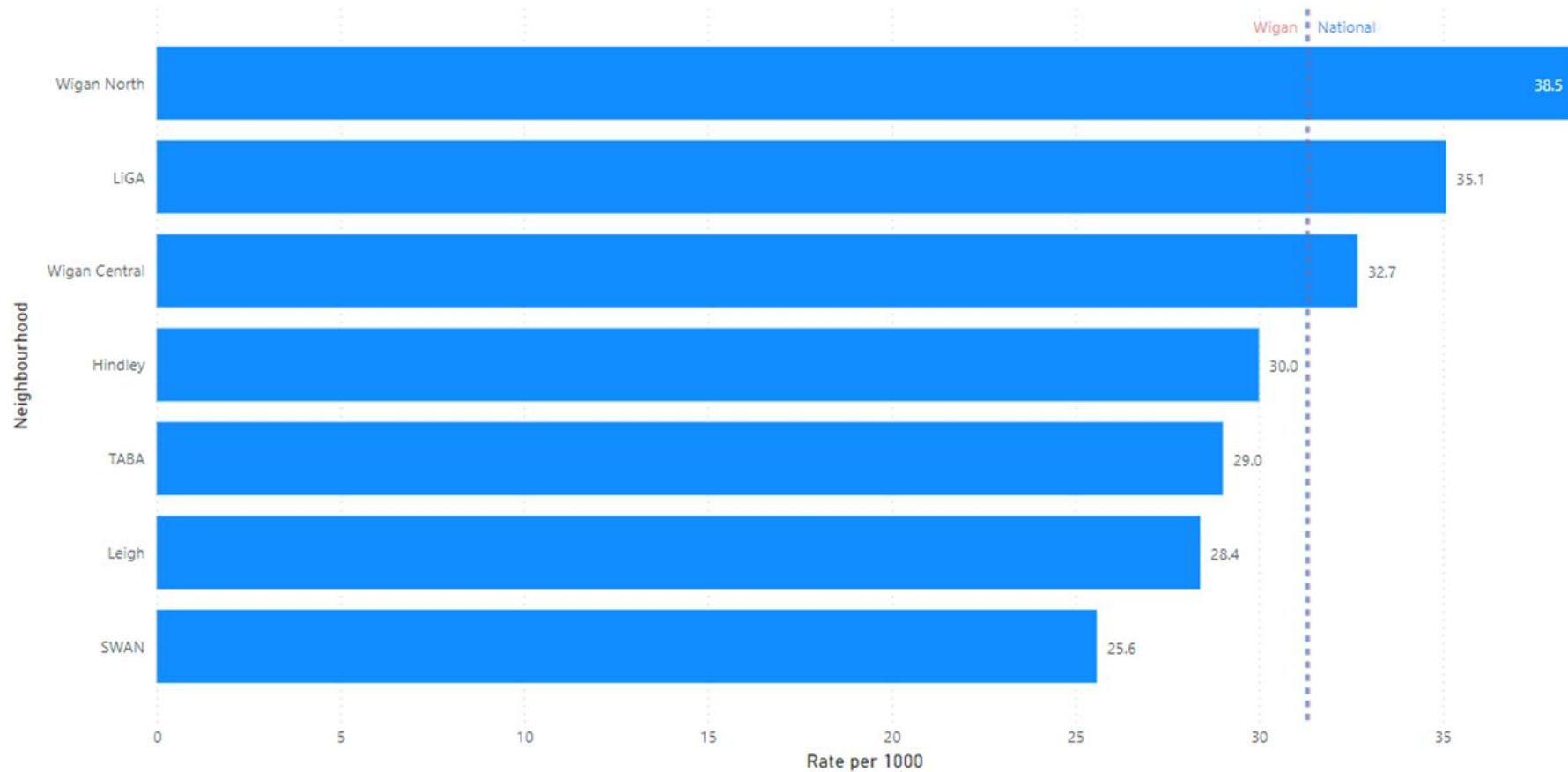
Adult Obesity by Neighbourhood

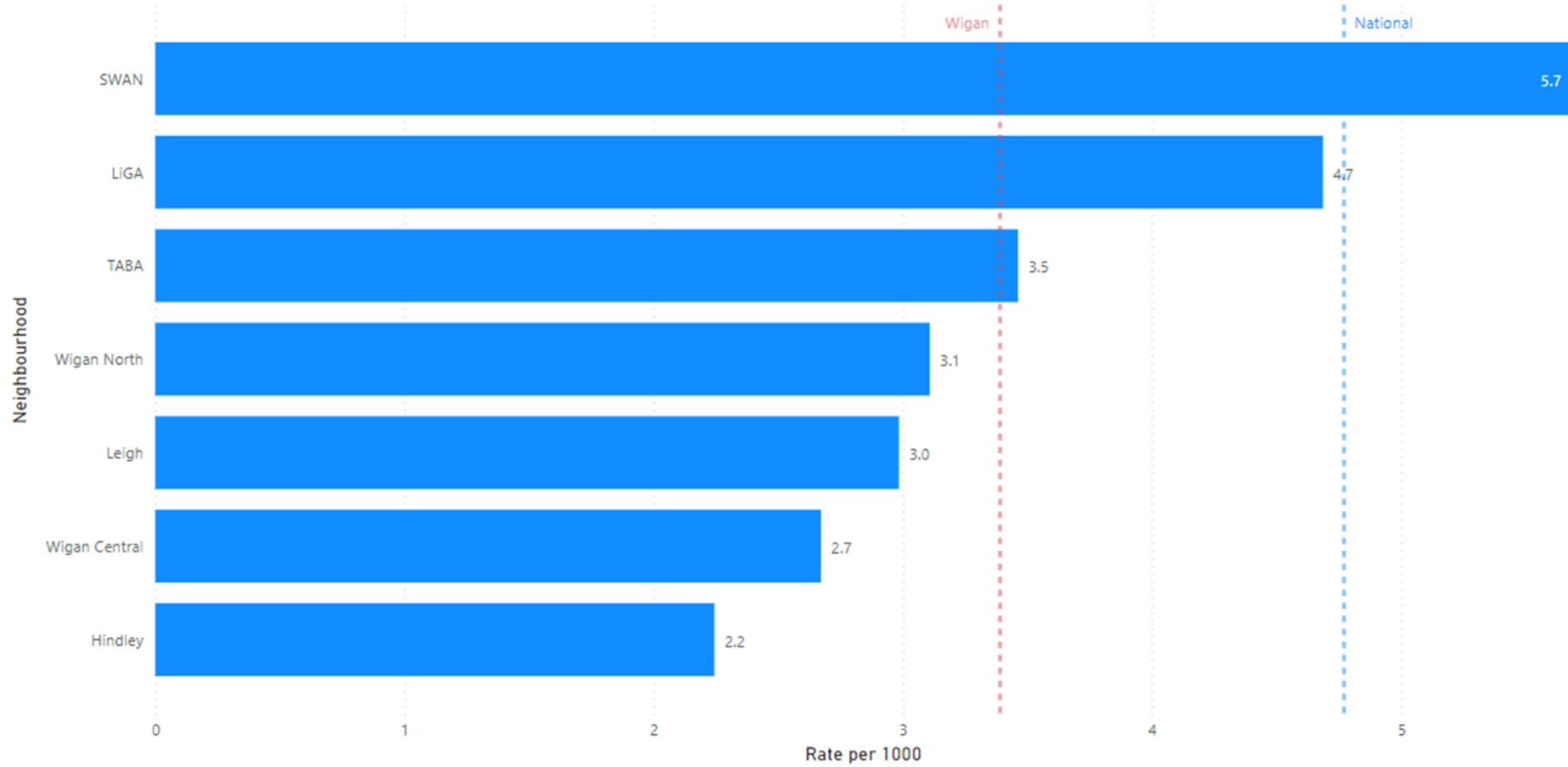

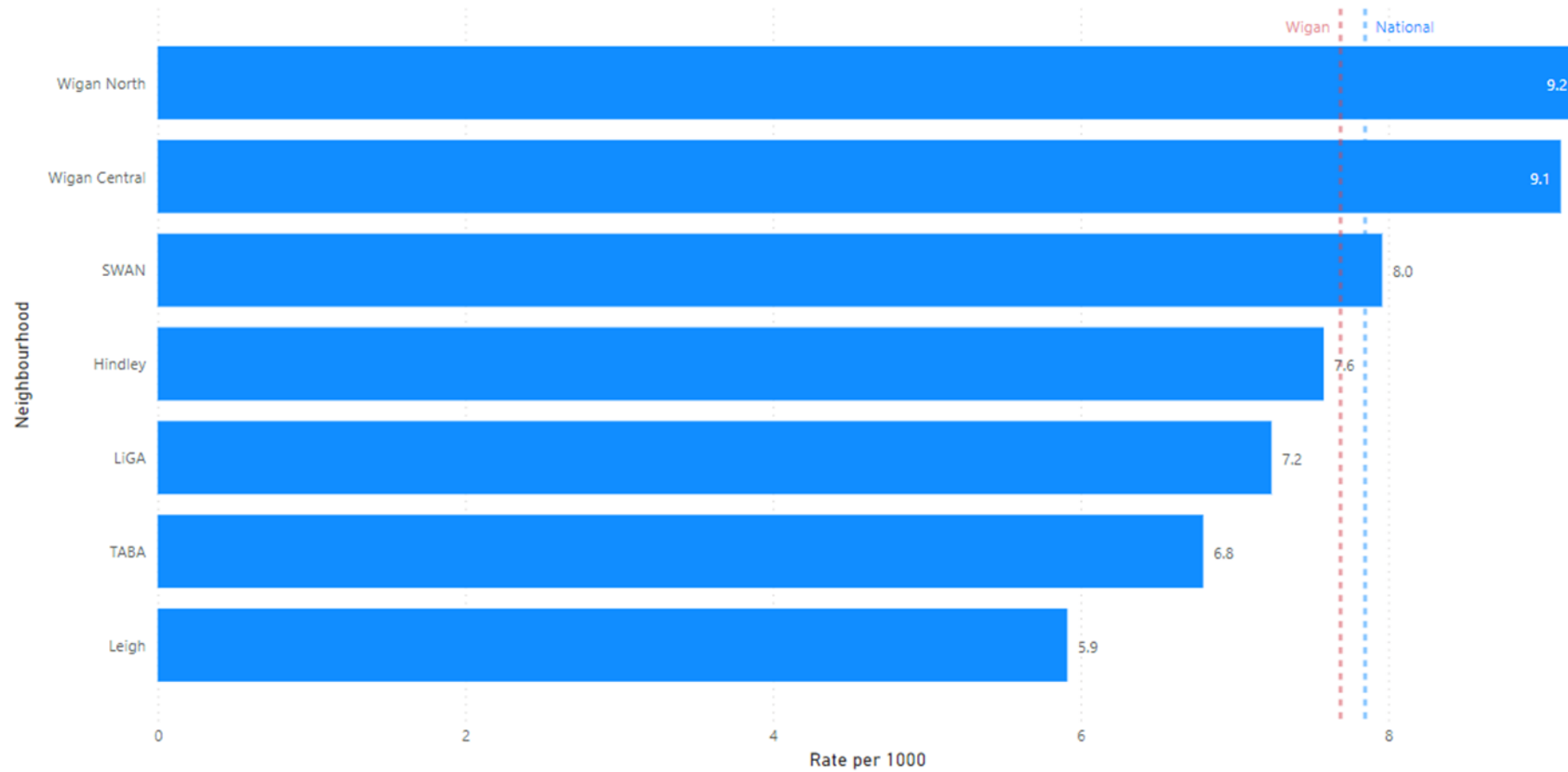

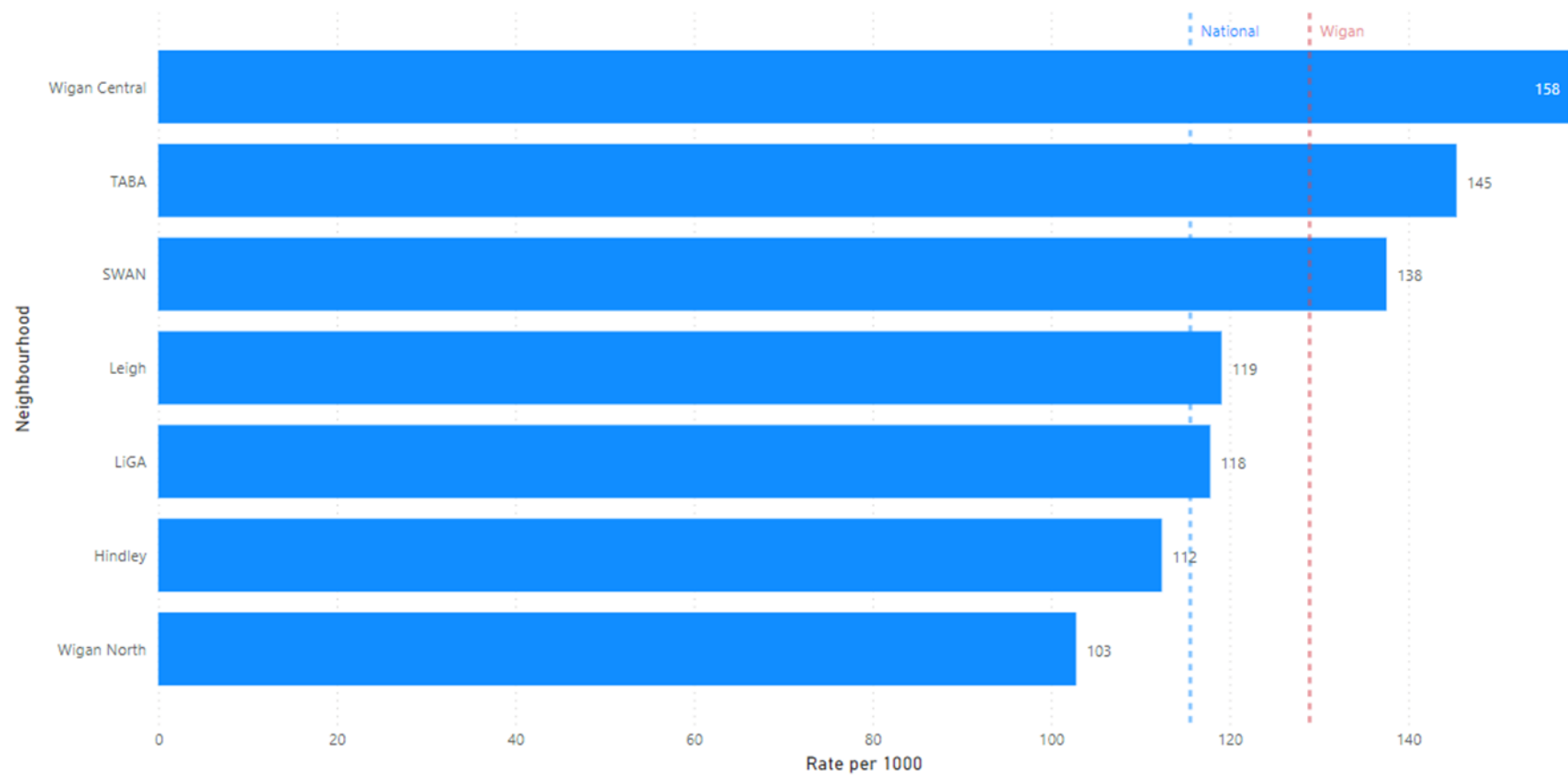
Dementia by Neighbourhood

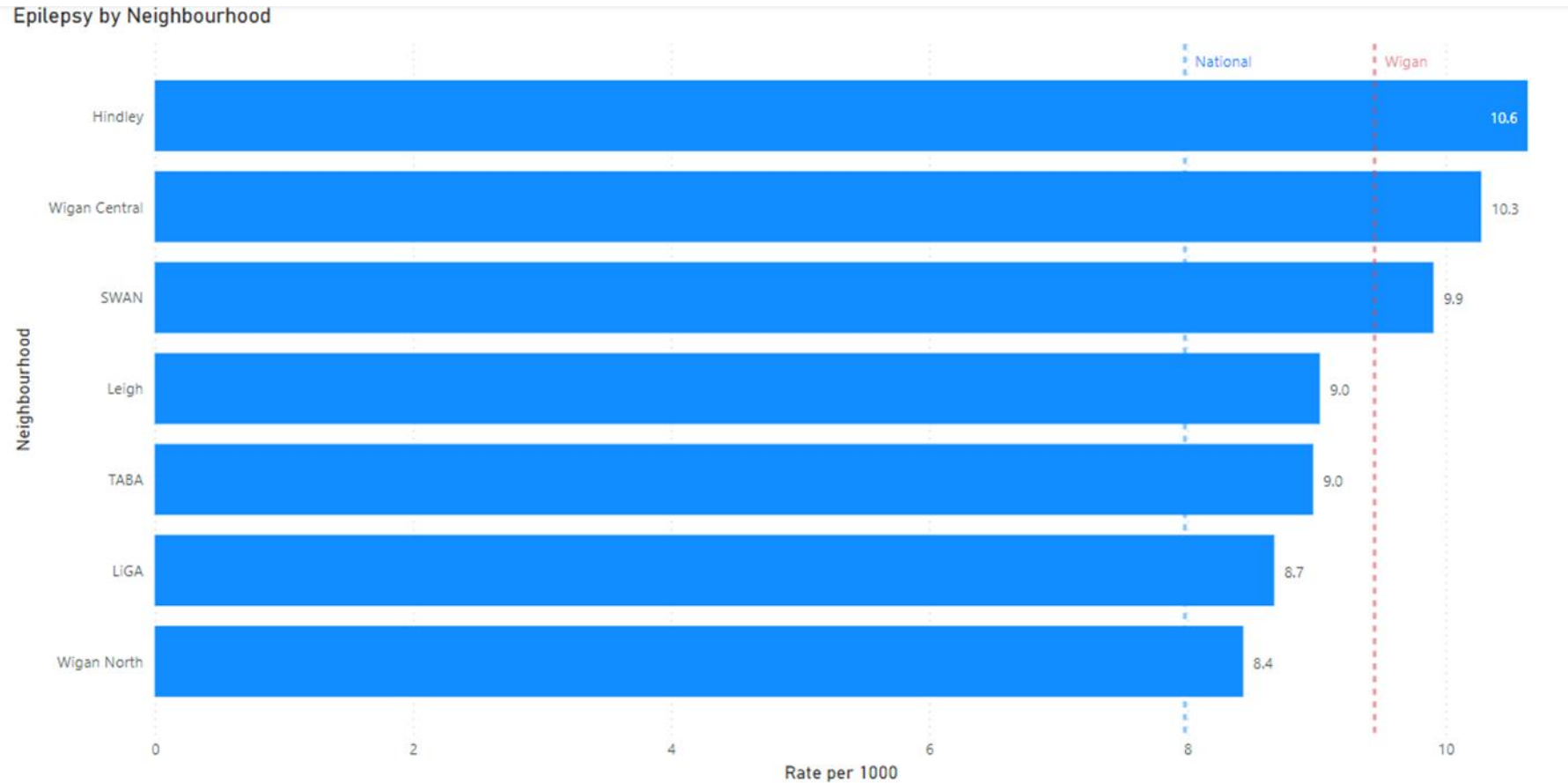

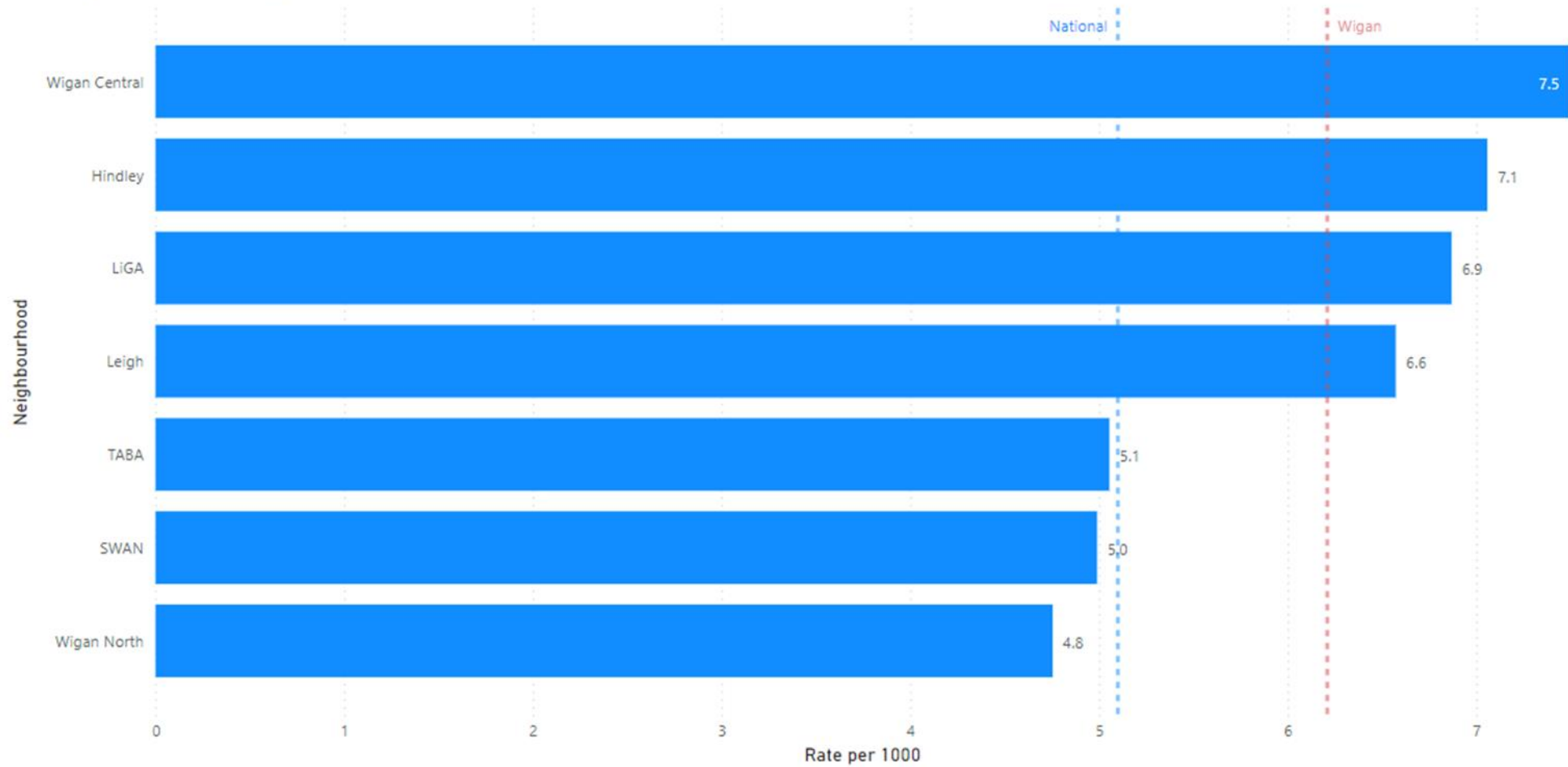

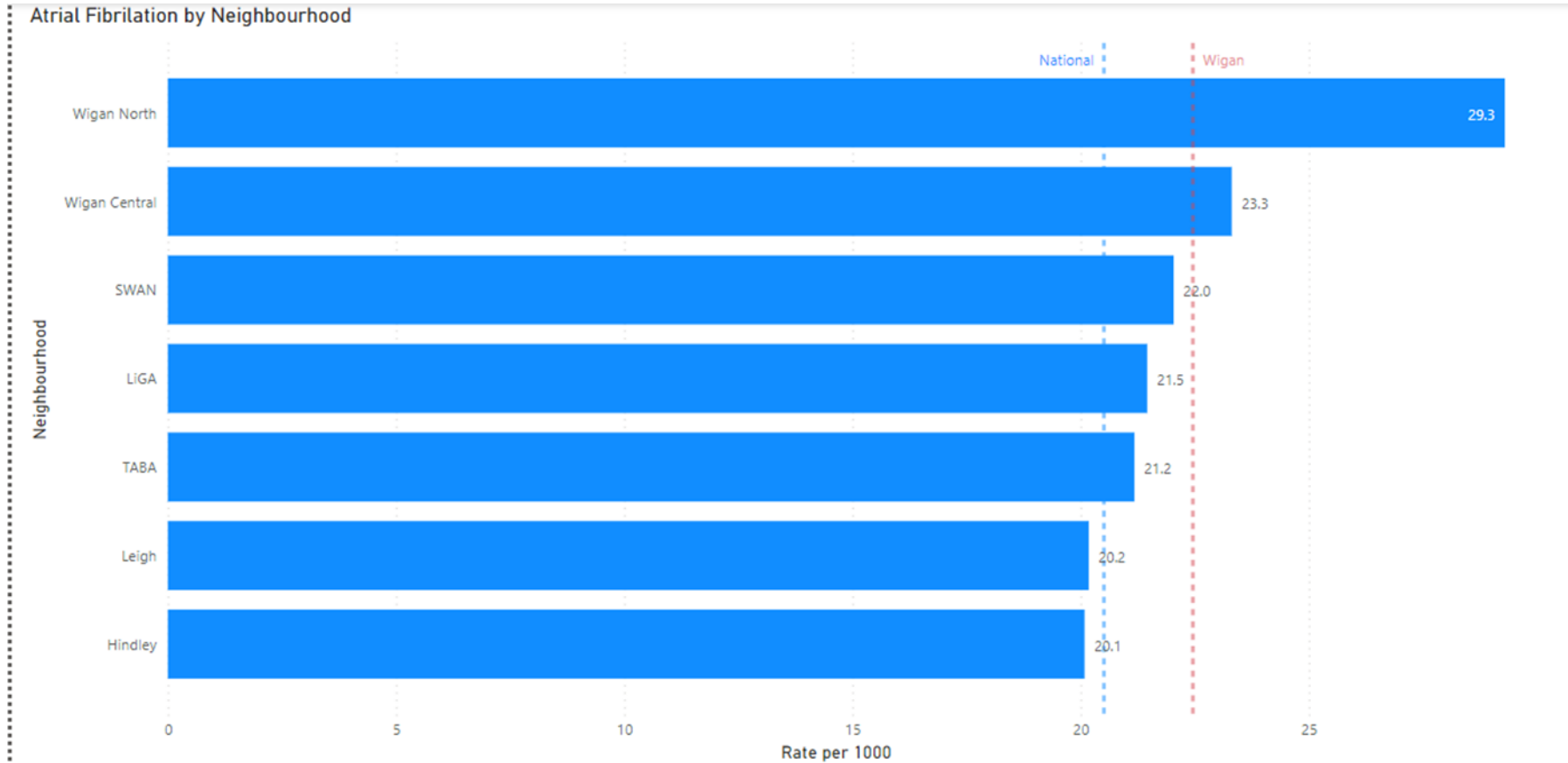

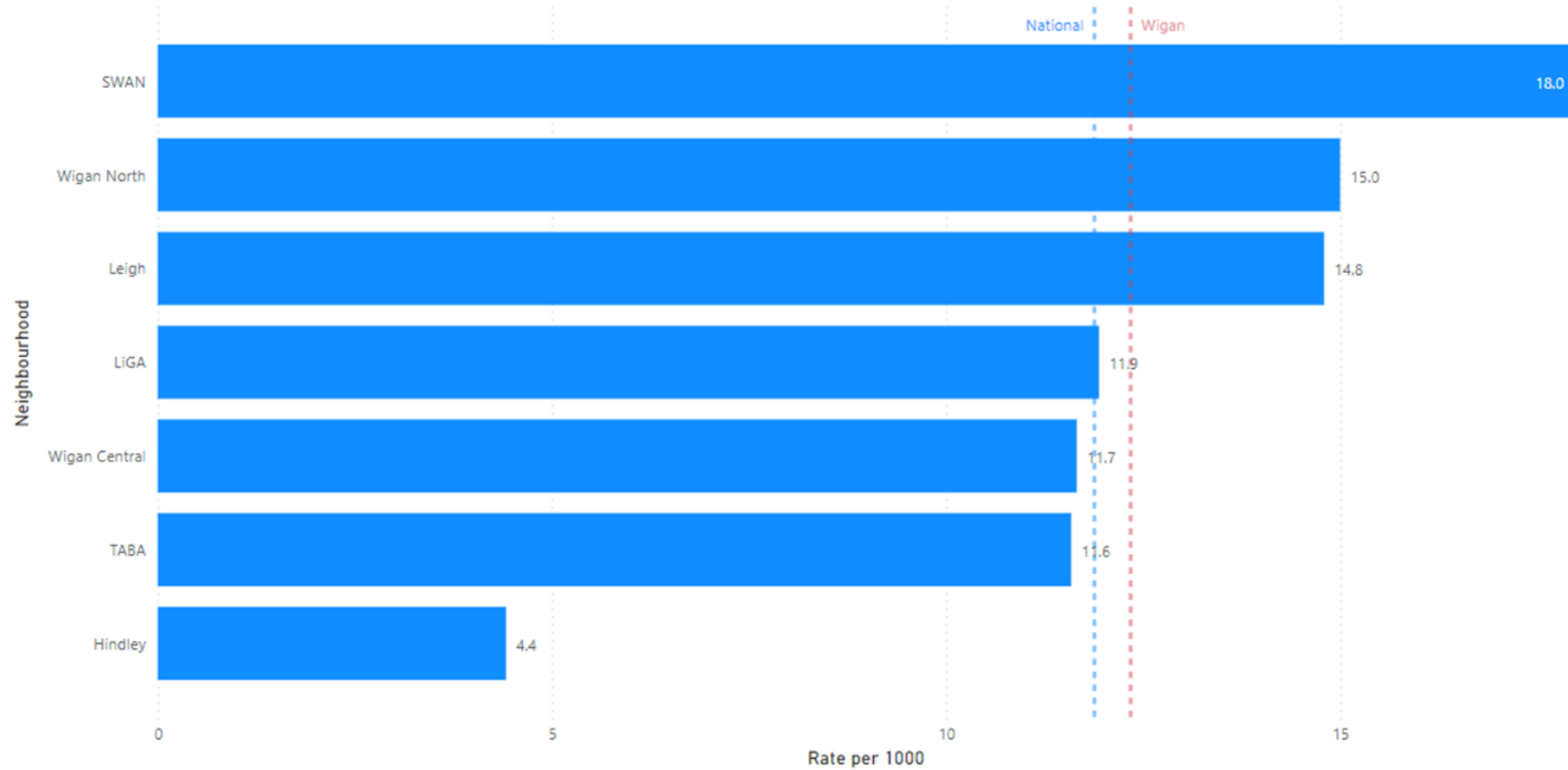

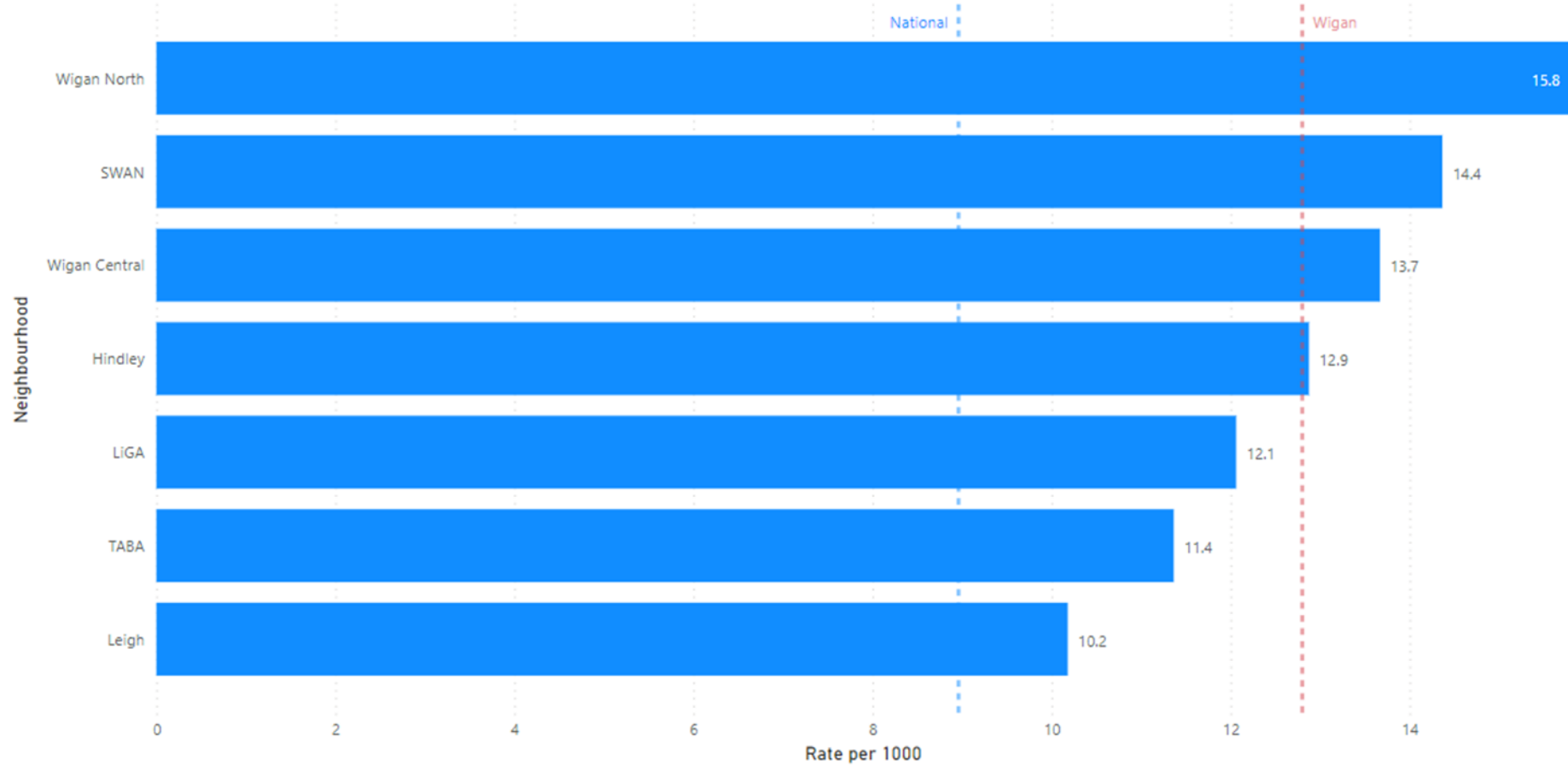
CVD (PP) by Neighbourhood

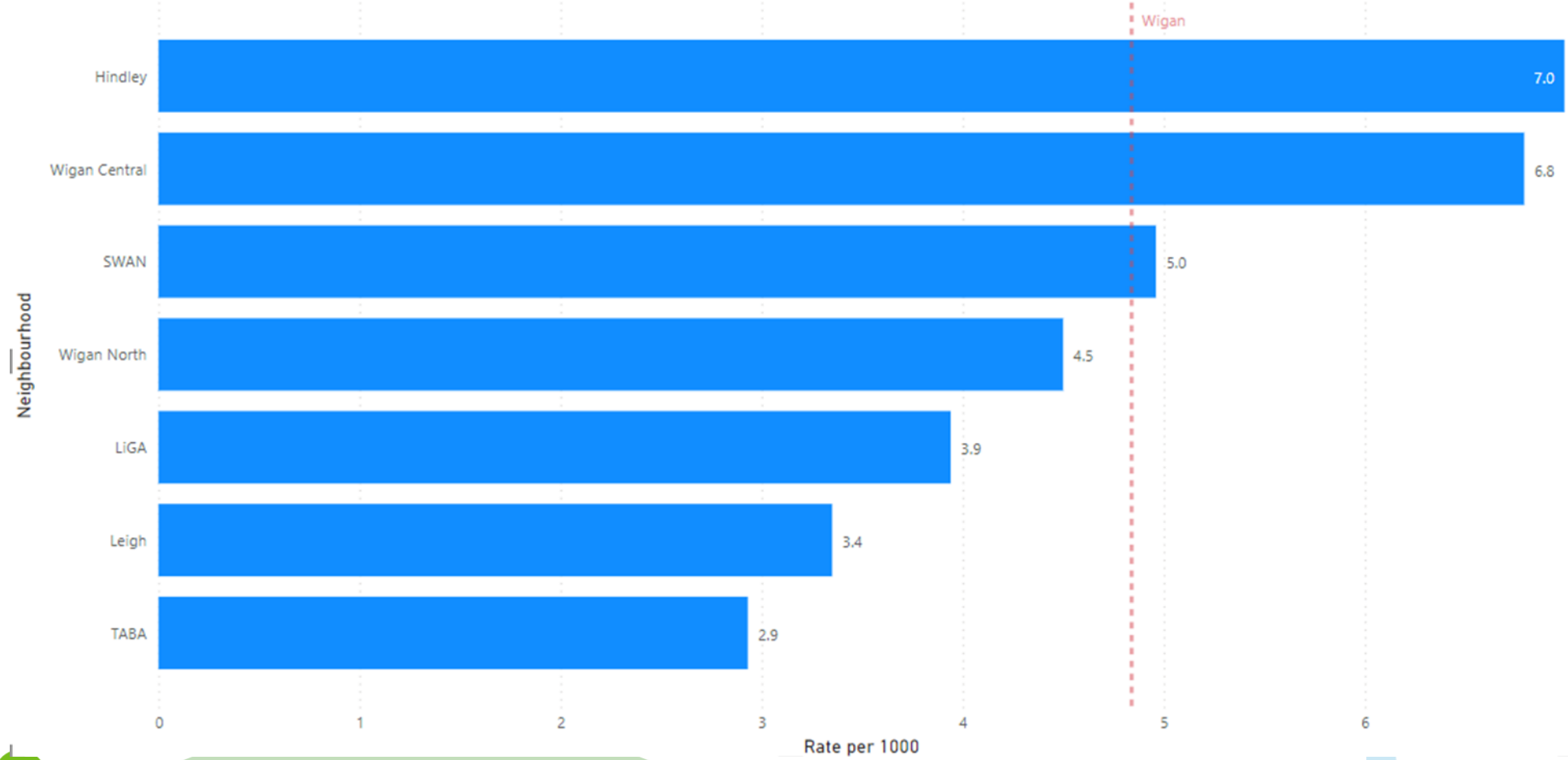
Heart Failure by Neighbourhood

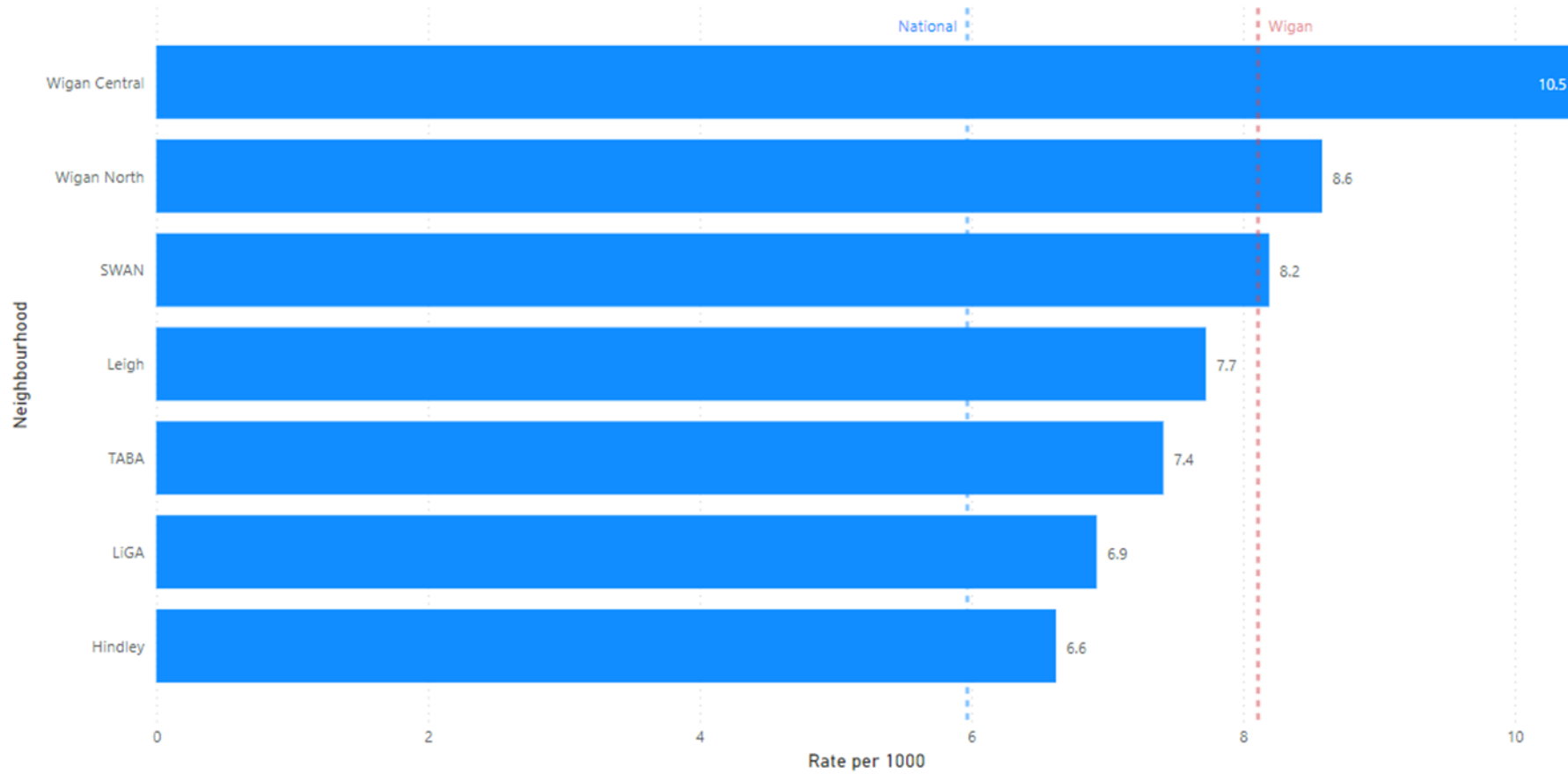
Left Ventricle Systolic Disorder by Neighbourhood

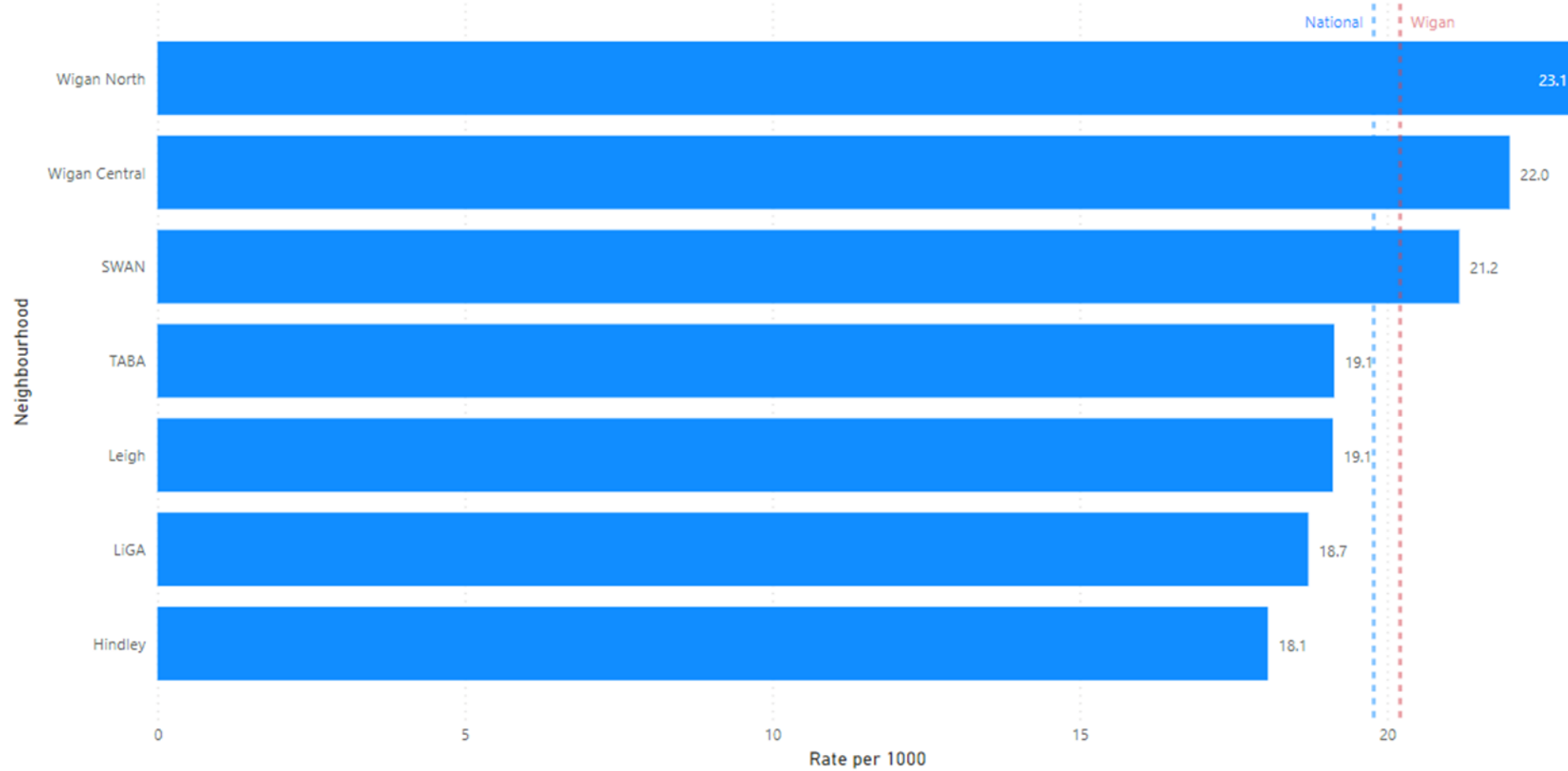
Peripheral Arterial Disease by Neighbourhood

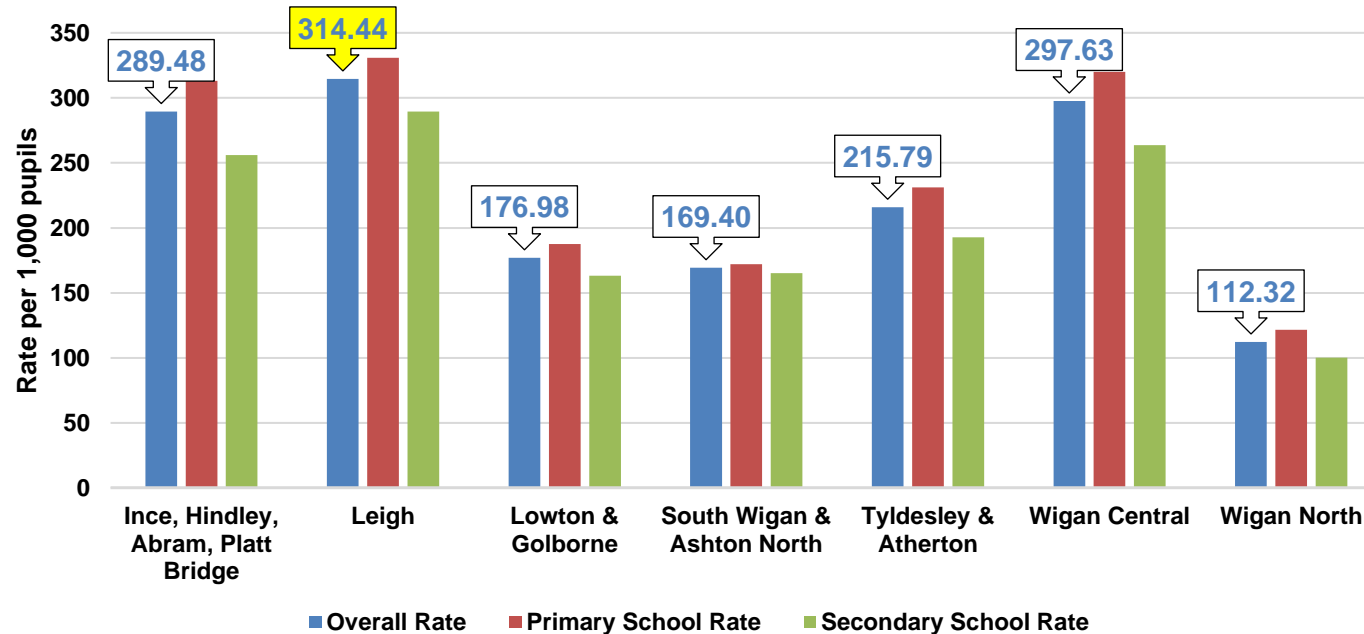

January 2021 Census



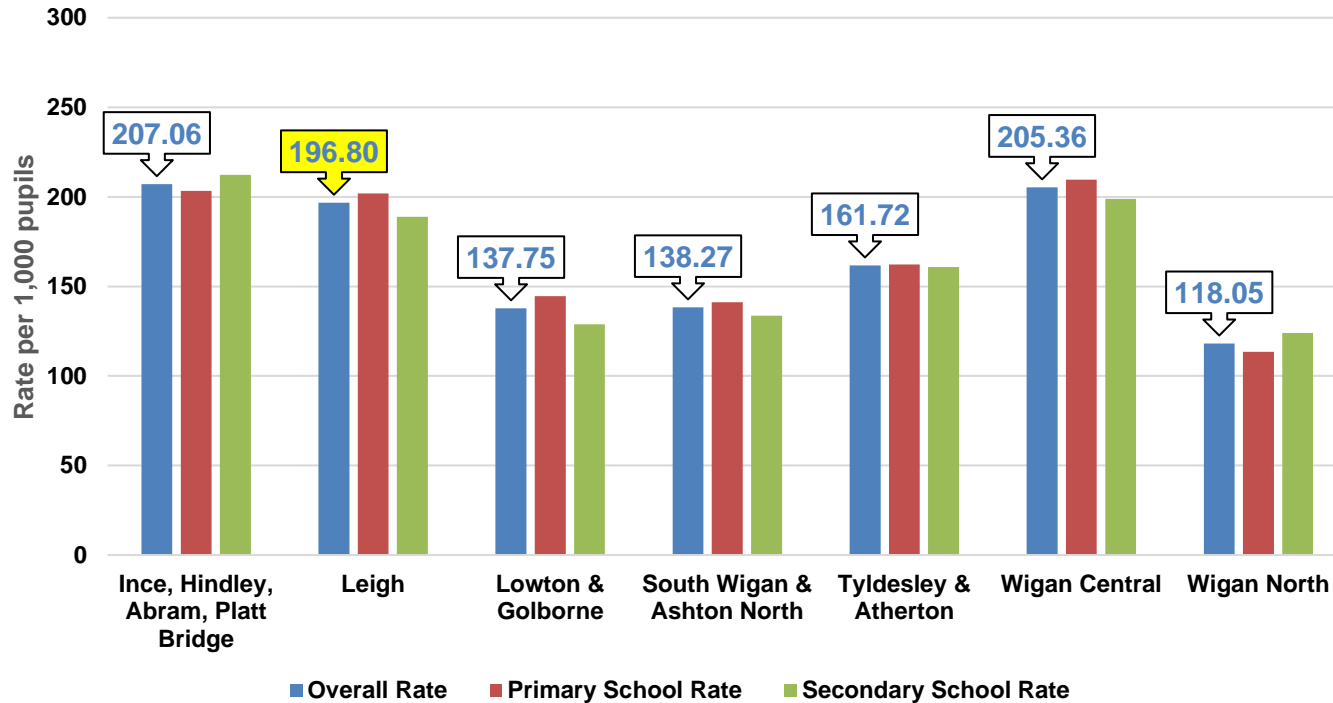

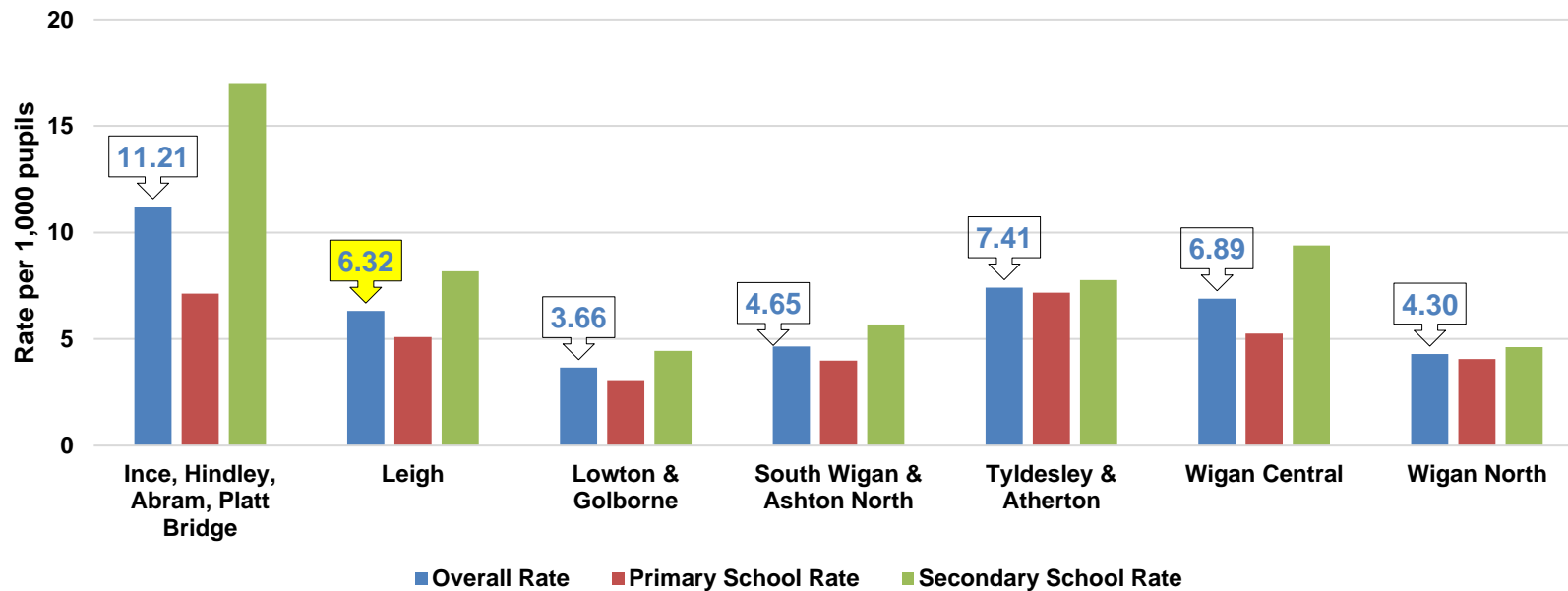

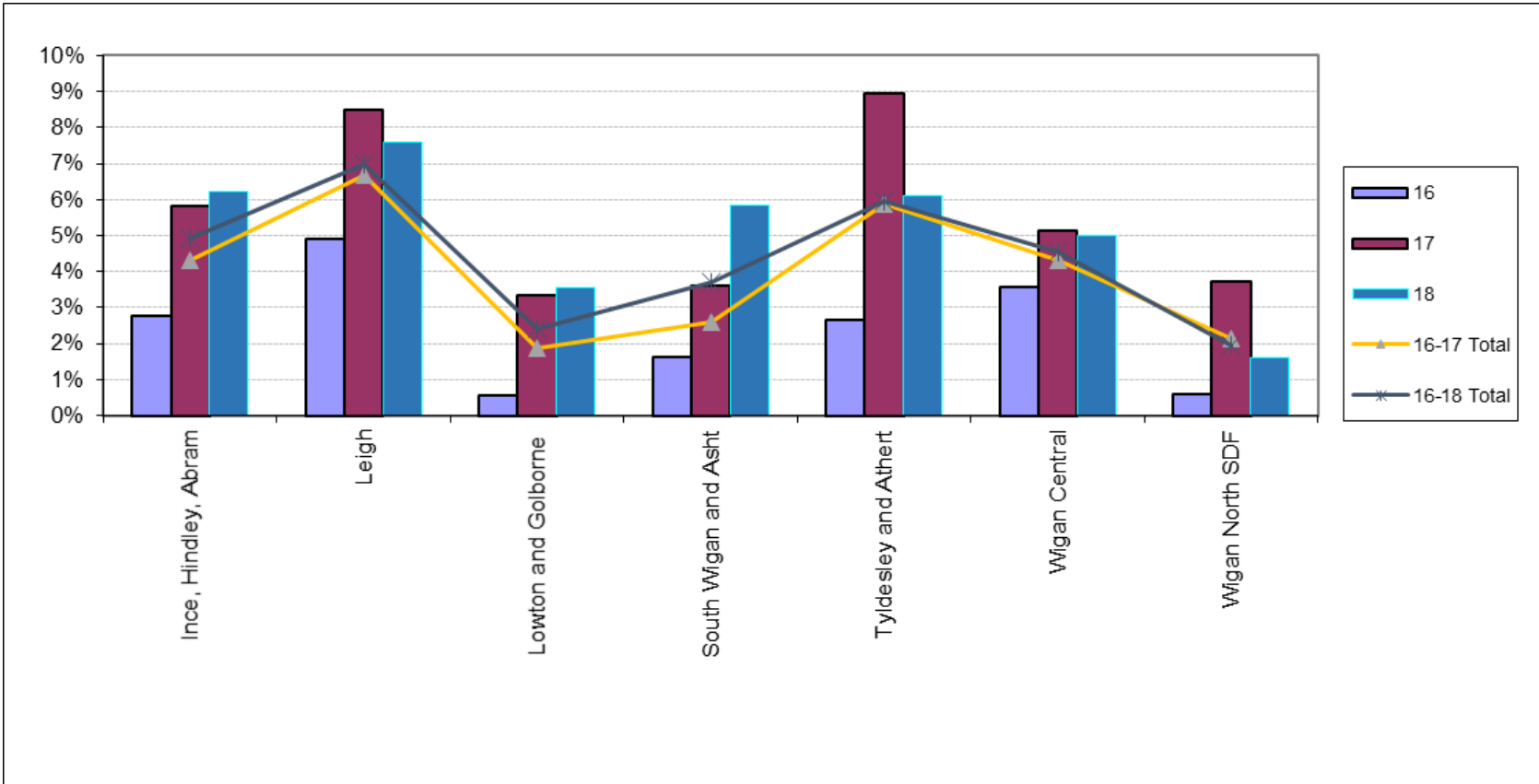

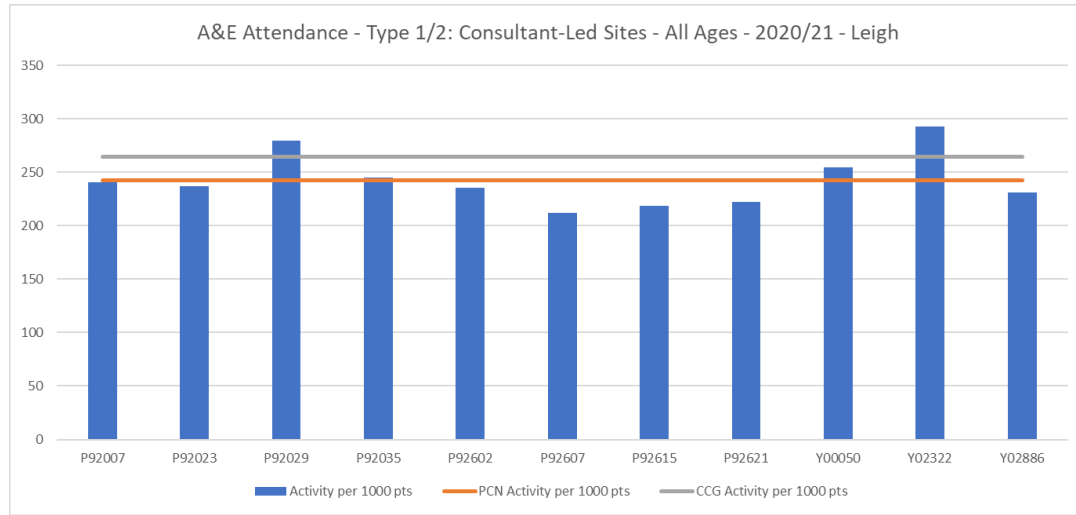

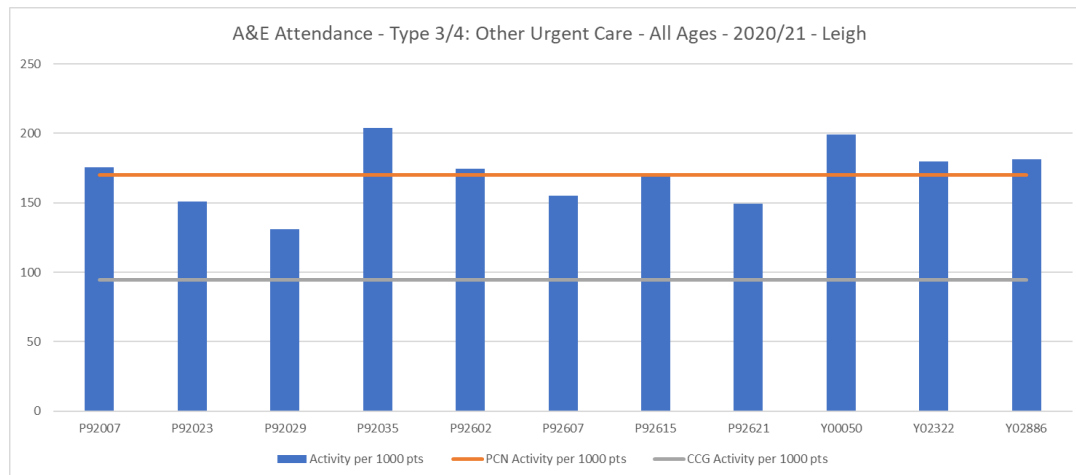

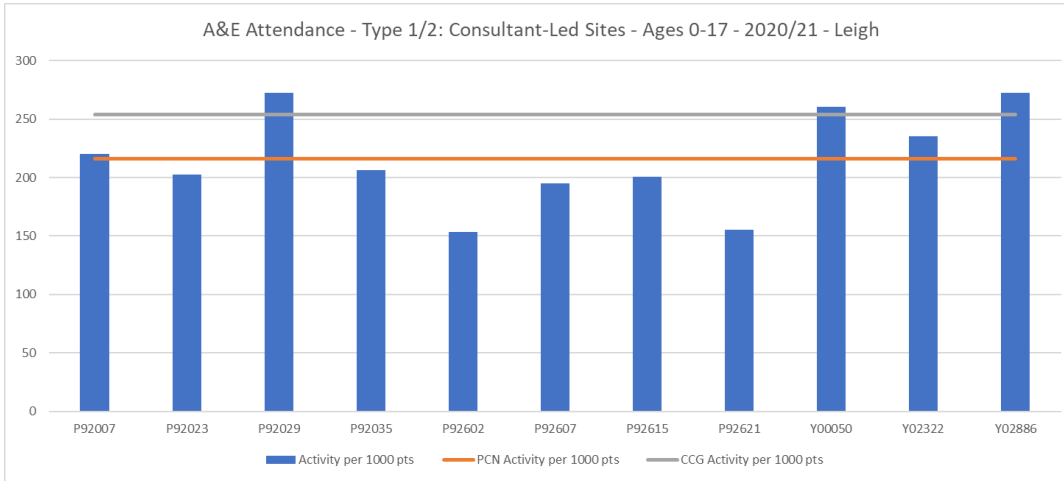
A&E Attendances – All Ages

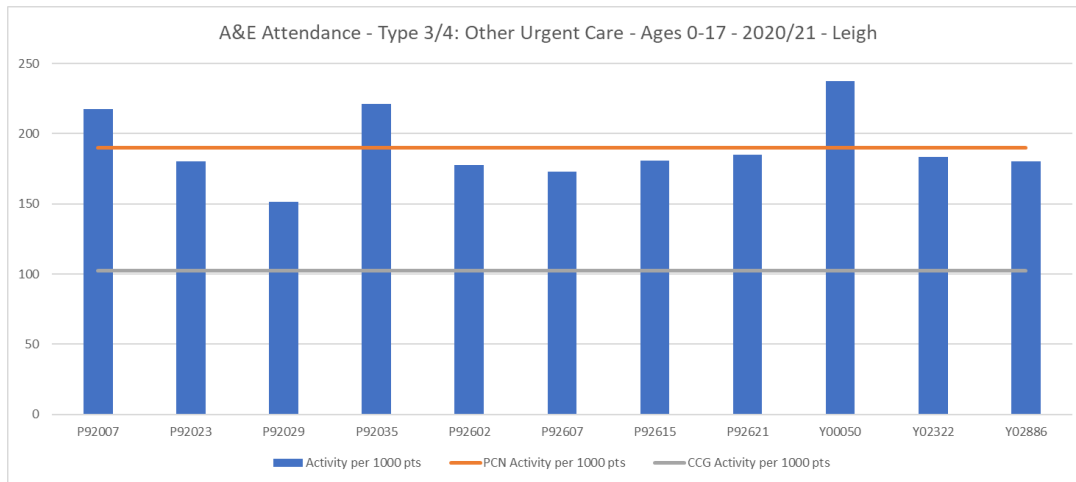


A&E Attendances – 0-17



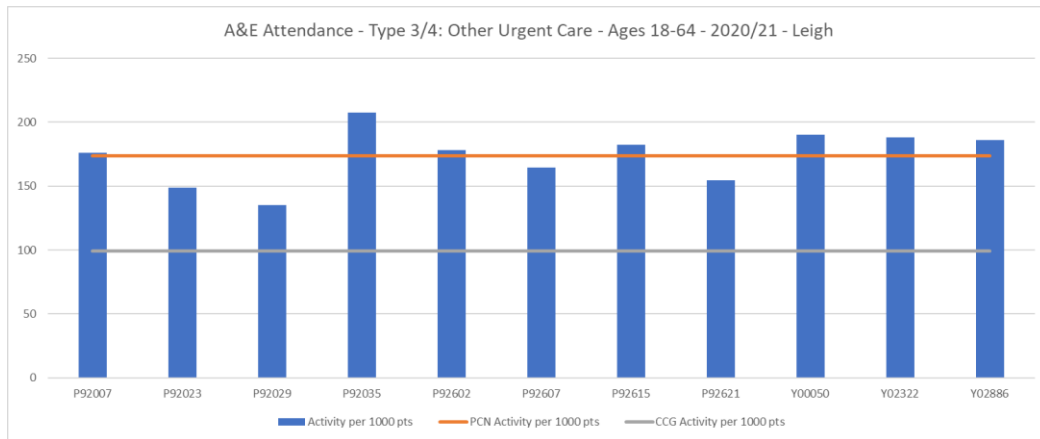
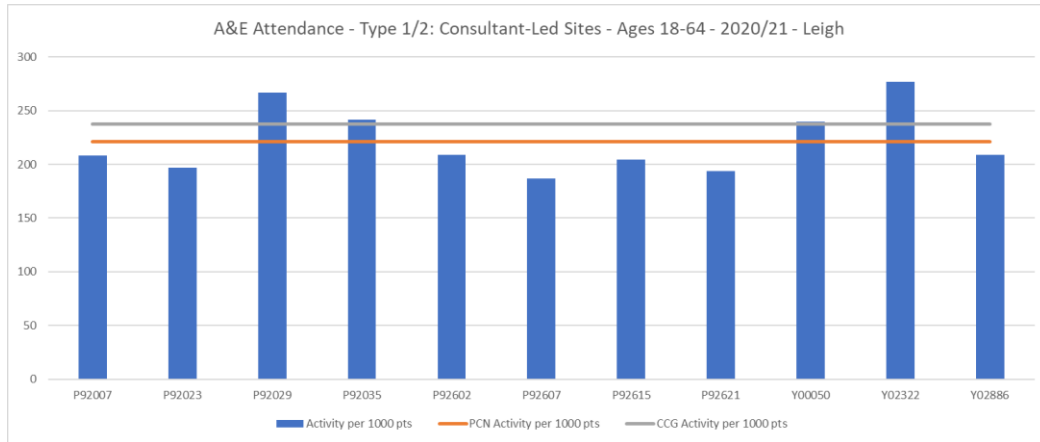

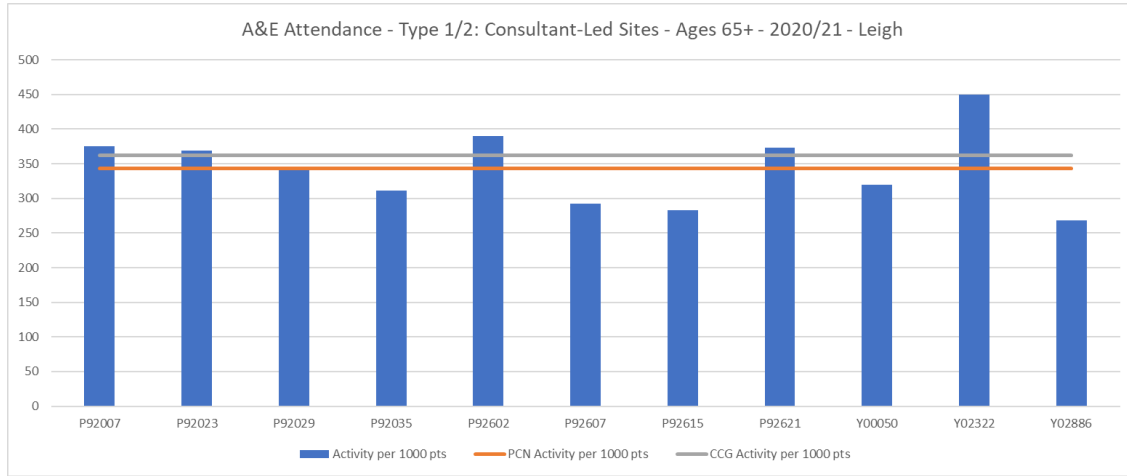


A&E Attendances – 18-64

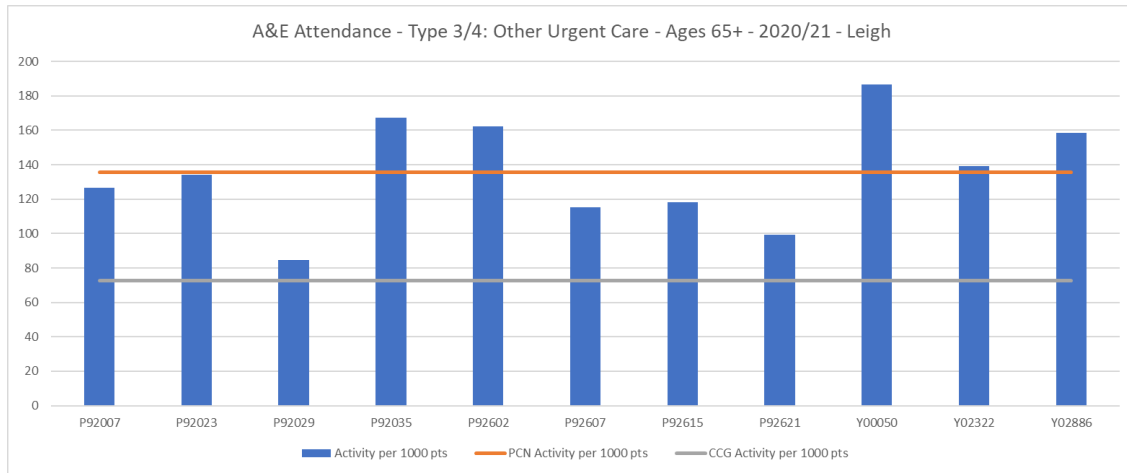

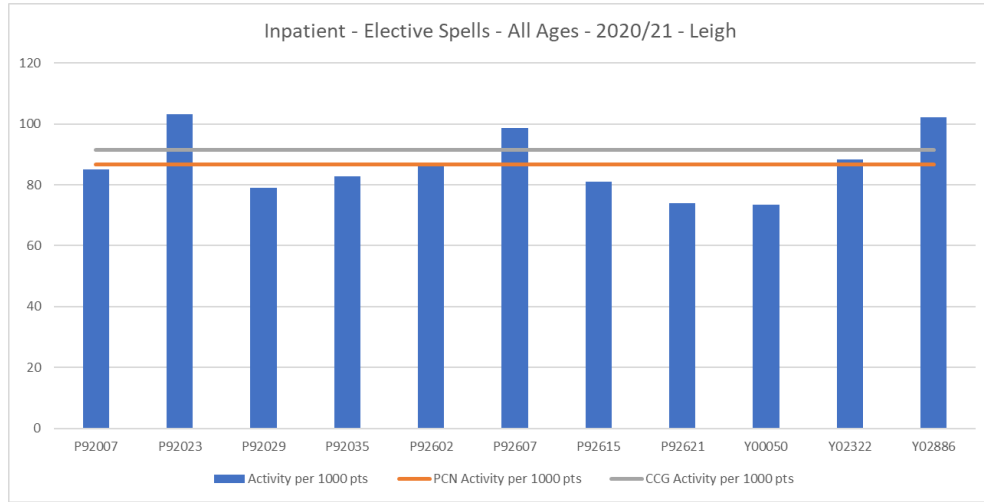
A&E Attendances – 65 and older



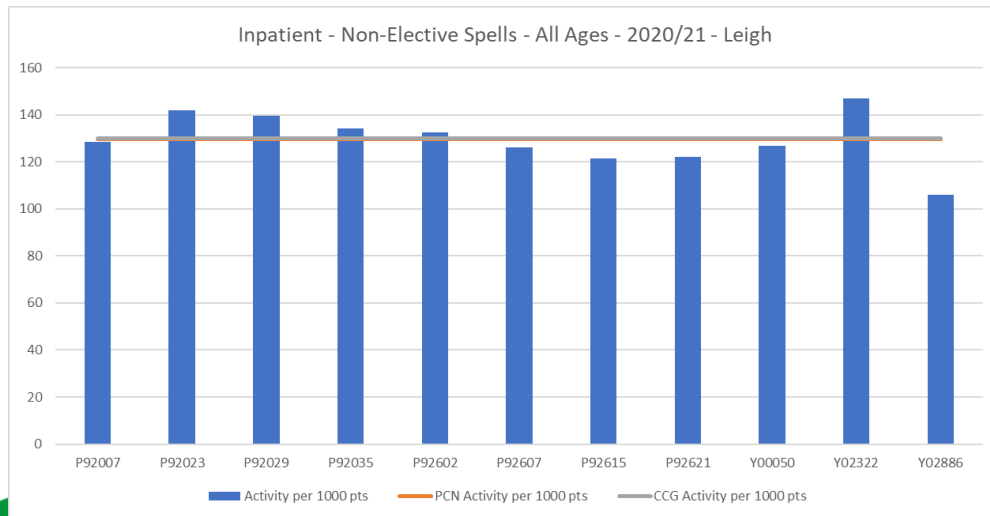

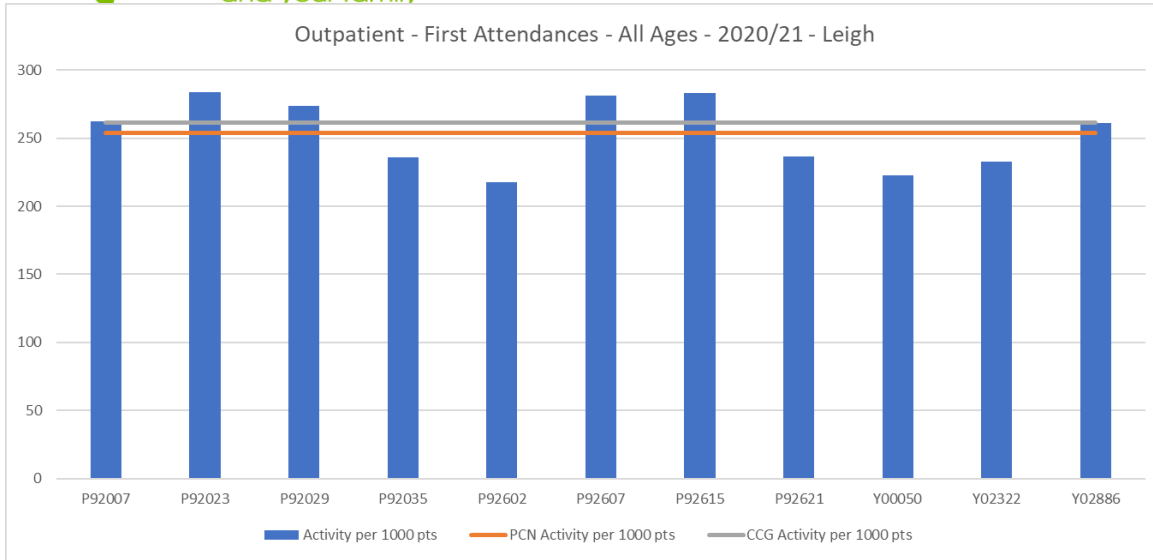

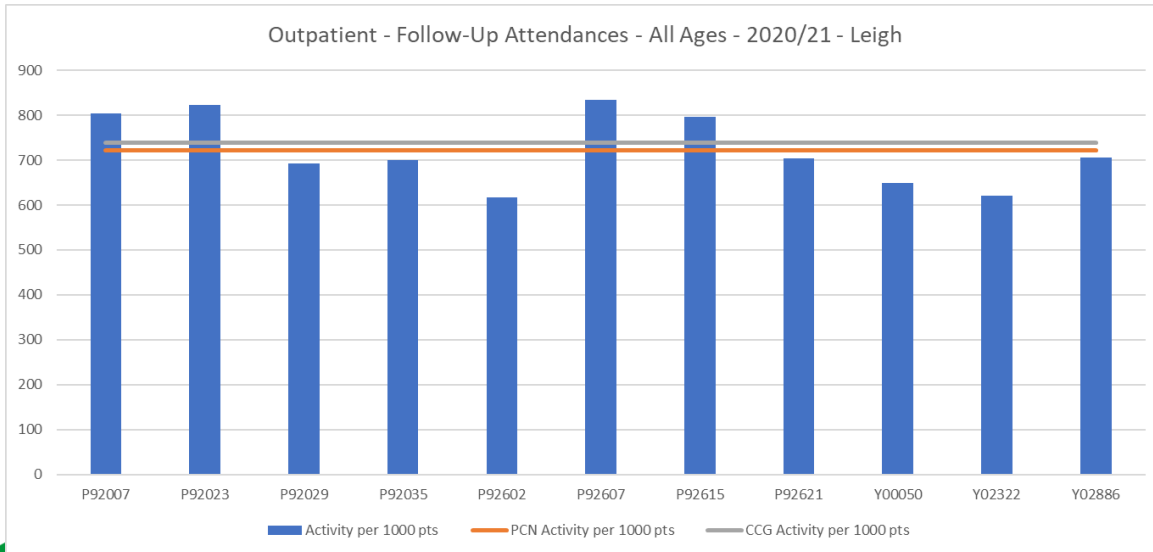

Fuel Poverty

- 10.25% of households in England are living in fuel poverty. In Wigan Borough the proportion is 10.8%, below the North West average but above the national average
- 11.6% of households in the Neighbourhood are living in fuel poverty, a decrease from 13% in 2016 but still above the Borough average
- Whilst the trend in most LSOAs has been positive, Pennington East, Pennington South, Lilford / Greenways and Chapel Street / Guest Street have all seen an increase in the number of households living in fuel poverty. The increase has been most significant in Chapel Street / Guest Street.

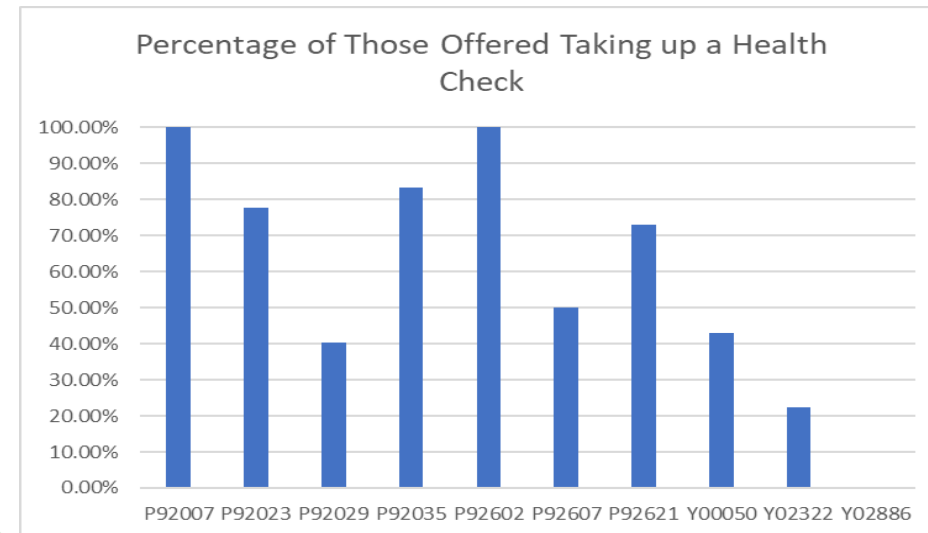
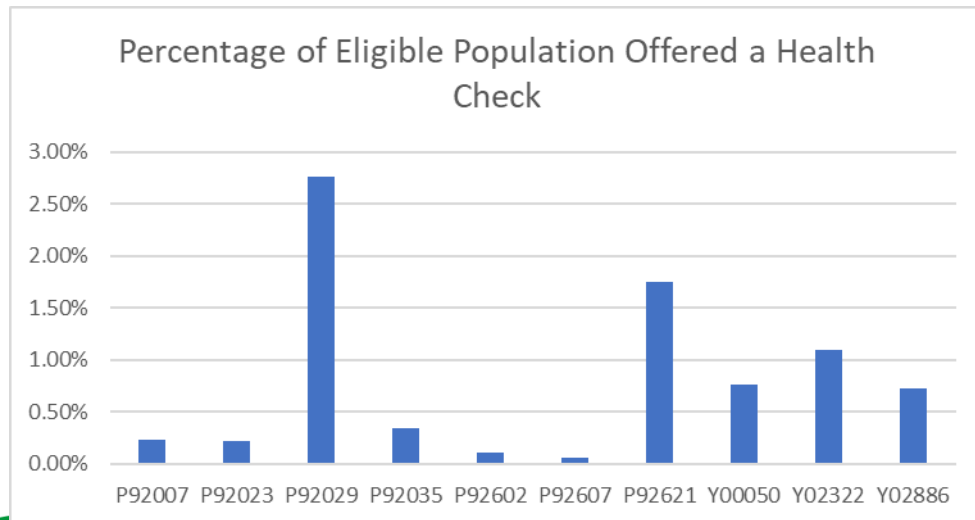

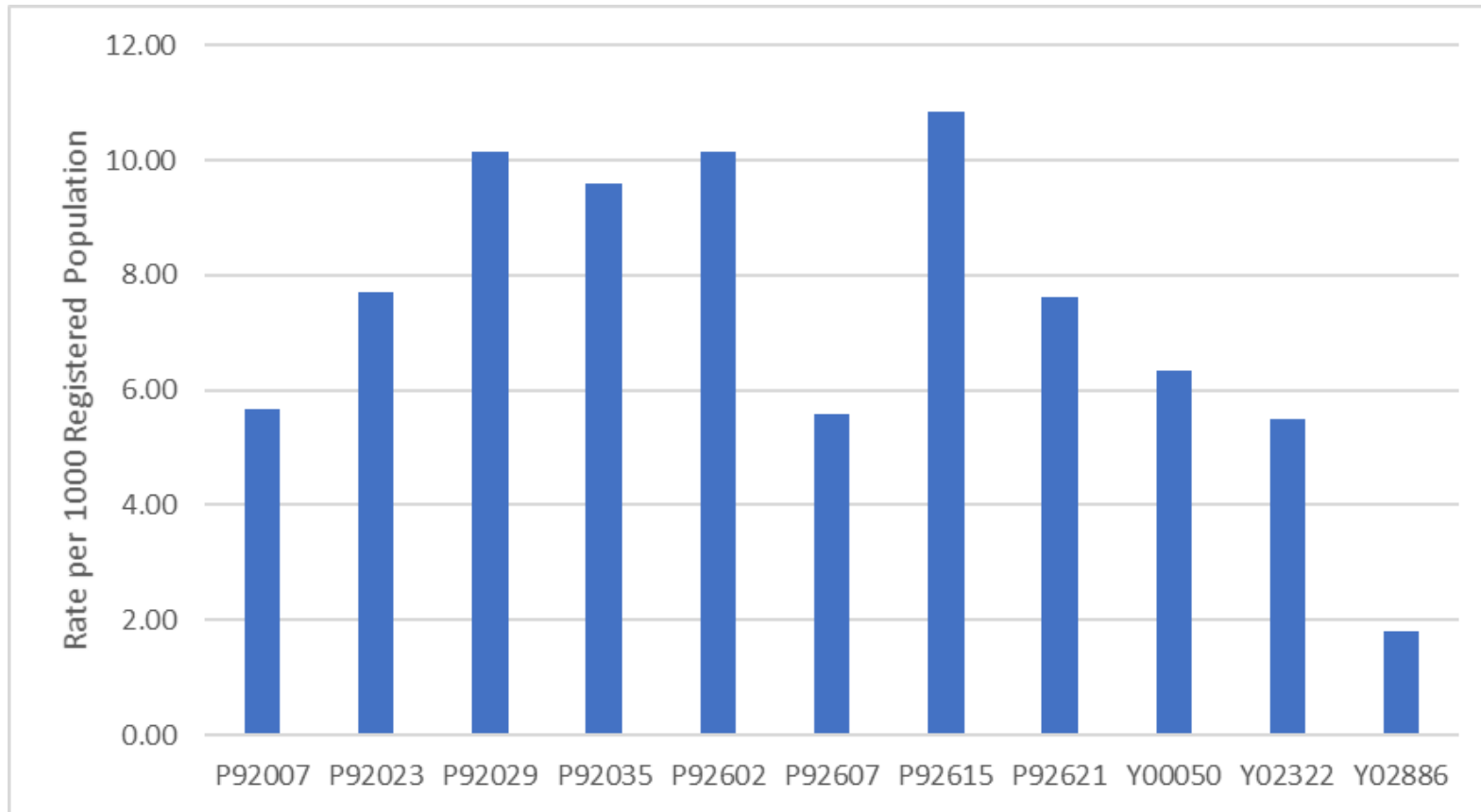

The Neighbourhood has the highest rates of people in three of the six support packages – community day support, nursing care and supported accommodation. Rates of people accessing home care and residential care is also high.

Universal Credit Claimants

- 20.53% of the Neighbourhood's working age population (16-64 year olds) were in receipt of Universal Credit as at June 2021.
- 7.46% of working age population claiming Universal Credit were in employment with 13.04% not in employment.
- At a Borough level 15.53% of the working age population (16-64 year olds) were in receipt of Universal Credit as at June 2021.
- 6.01% of the working age population claiming Universal Credit were in employment with 9.52% not in employment.

Place and Community Safety

- 24% of the Borough's High Risk Domestic Abuse and 25% of the Borough's Medium Risk Domestic Abuse cases came from the Leigh Neighbourhood (2020/21). Abram ward has the highest prevalence of cases – double the ward average – whilst Siddow Common and Higher Folds North are two of the top three LSOAs in the Borough.

Place and Community Safety

- Leigh had the highest number of anti-social behaviour incidents, with rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour accounting for significantly the highest proportion, followed by neighbour nuisance.
- Vehicle nuisance also featured comparatively highly for this type of incident whilst the highest number of begging / vagrancy incidents were located here.
- The greenspace of Bickershaw Country Park accounted for 39 incidents – 28 of these being vehicle nuisance. Parsonage Retail Park – in particular the fast-food outlets – accounted for 32 incidents – primarily rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour. King Street facilities – primarily the bus station – accounted for 24 incidents, primarily rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour. Glebe Street residential area accounted for 21 incidents – including malicious communications, vehicle and neighbour nuisance, rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour. Other hotspots included the long residential stretch of Wigan Road (n19 – primarily neighbours and rowdy / inconsiderate) and Prescott Street residential area (n15 – malicious communications, rowdy / inconsiderate and neighbour nuisance).
- Leigh reported the highest number of Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service ASB incidents during the three years 2018/19 to 2020/21 and after a significant drop in number of incidents in 2019/20 had returned to close to 2018/19 levels by 2020/21 (10.18 per 1,000 population). Deliberate Fires (Loose Refuse) had marked an increase in 2020/21 to above the number in 2018/19 whilst number of Fire Fighter Hostility incidents had also increased.

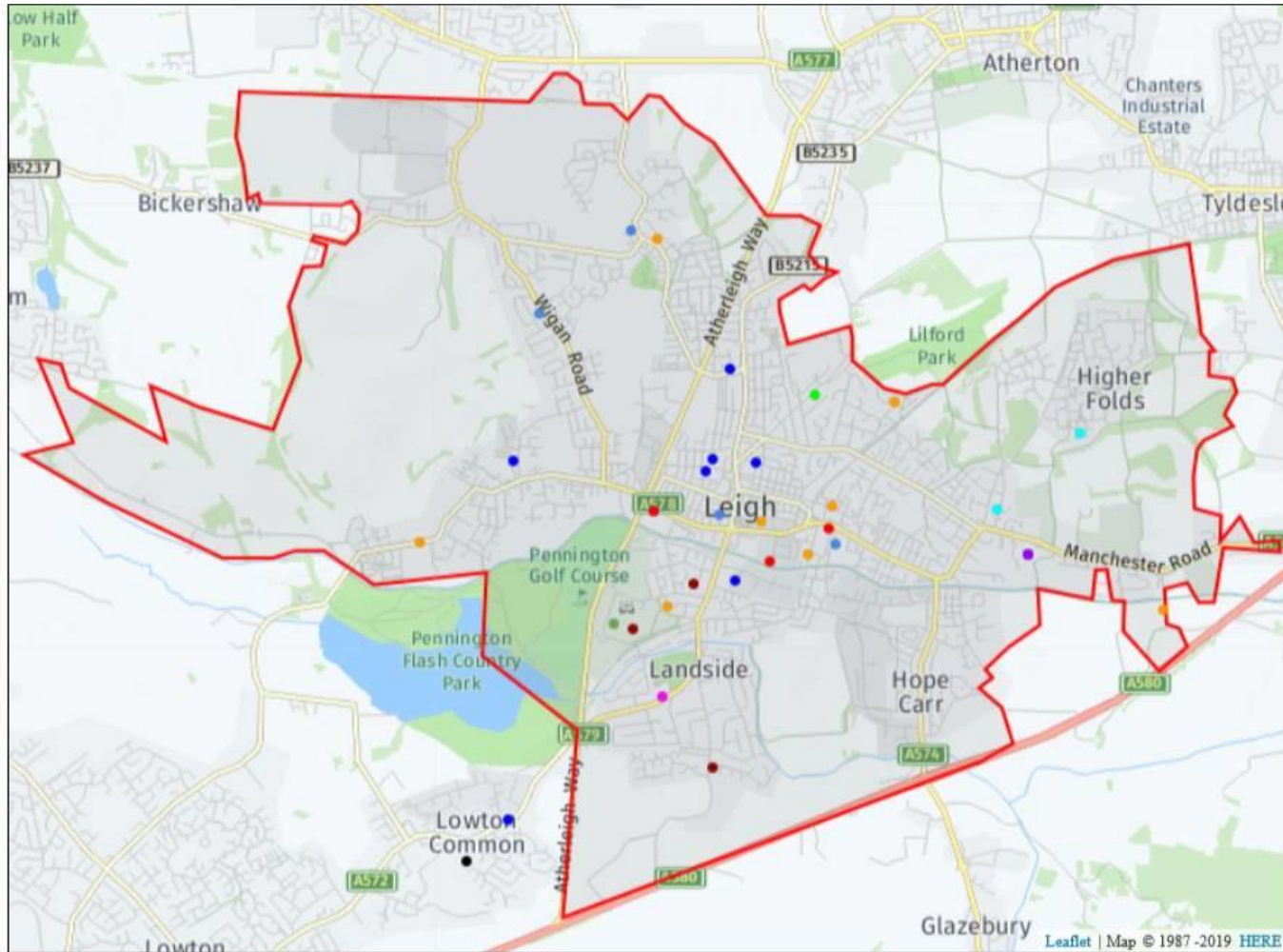

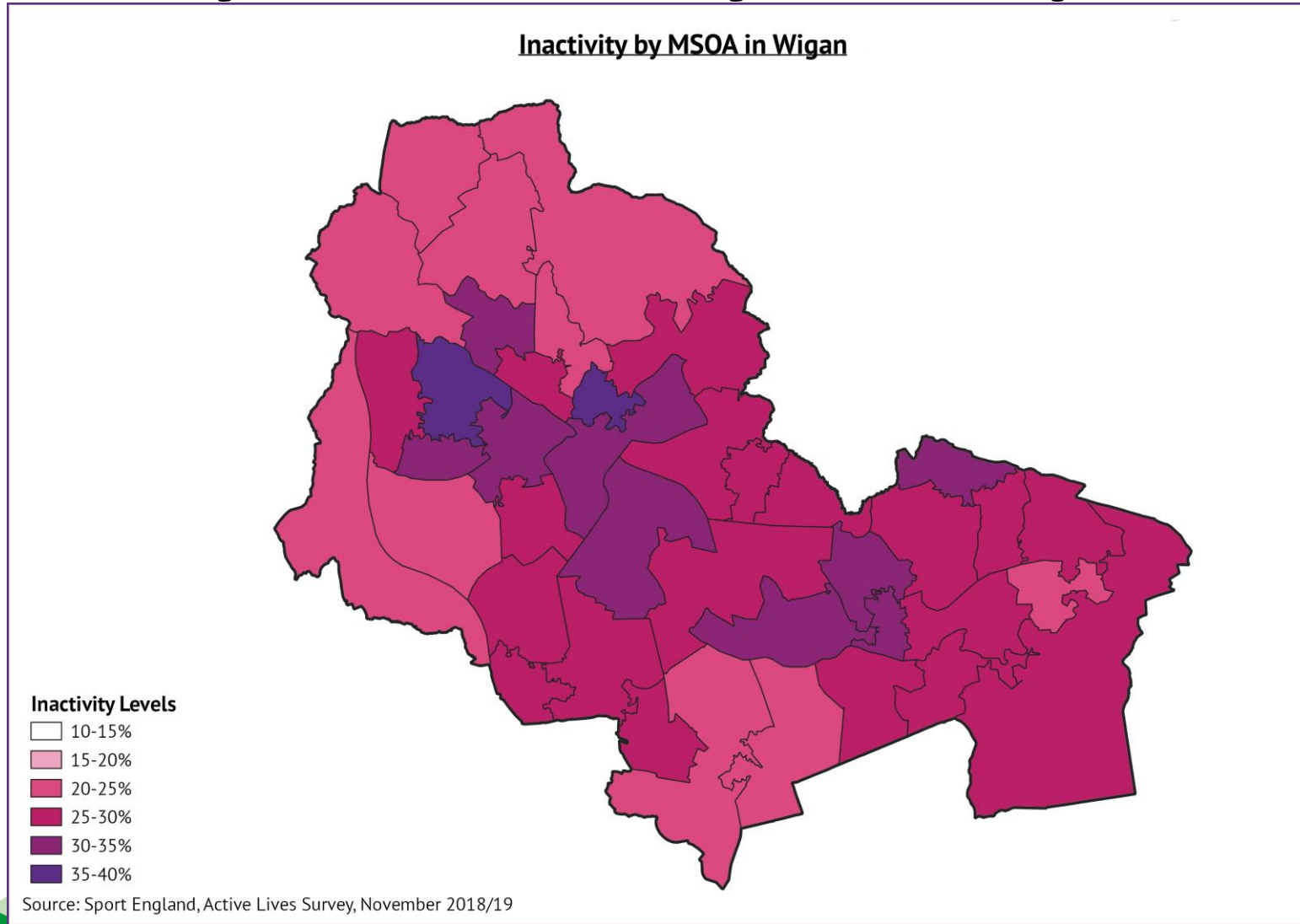
