Population

The Neighbourhood has a higher proportion of over-65s to under-16s.

The gender split of male and female is in line with the Borough profile. The percentage of BAME and limiting disability population is below the Borough average.



Start Well

The Neighbourhood has the second lowest rate of children in receipt of free school meals and the third lowest rate of children with special educational needs and children looked after.

The Neighbourhood has the highest percentage of children achieving school readiness (2019).



Hospital Activity



The Neighbourhood has below Borough average attendance rates for both consultant-led and other urgent care settings. However P92647 is in the top ten practices in the Borough for all-age attendance from consultant-led sites. P92642 reports the Borough-highest attendance rate for 0-17 age cohort.

The Neighbourhood has above Borough average attendance rates for elective admissions but below average for non-elective admissions. P92647 stands out for both categories, with significantly the highest attendance rate for elective admissions in the Borough.

The Neighbourhood has a marginally above Borough average attendance rate for outpatient attendances. Again P92647 stands out, recording the Borough high rate for both first and follow-up attendances.




Long Term Conditions



- The Neighbourhood has significantly above-Borough-average prevalence (rates per 1000 registered patients) for asthma, palliative care, cardiovascular disease and COPD – the highest prevalence in the Borough
- The Neighbourhood also has notably above-Borough-average prevalence of hypertension, obesity, dementia, depression, epilepsy, heart failure and stroke / TIA
- The Neighbourhood reports the lowest prevalence levels of mental health conditions in the Borough







Live Well

9.3% of households in the Neighbourhood are living in fuel poverty, a decrease from 9.9% in 2016, although five LSOAs have seen an increase in the last year

A much lower percentage of the eligible population were offered health checks than the Borough average however a higher than Borough average percentage took up the offer.

SWAN reported the second lowest number of Police and GMFRS ASB incidents, with the highest totals of GMP contributed by rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour and neighbour nuisance and deliberate fires / deliberate fires loose refuse the highest for GMFRS.





Community Link Workers



Community Link Worker referral rates are significantly higher than the Borough average.

The Neighbourhood has above Borough average rates for mental health, ASC, benefits and welfare, bereavement, domestic abuse, employment, family problems, financial advice, frailty, housing, mental health, social isolation, transport and support for carers. Mental health, health & wellbeing and social isolation are are the most prevalent reasons for referral.



Population - Demographics

- 48.9% of the Neighbourhood population are male and 51.1% female, in line with the Borough profile
- 1.95% of the Neighbourhood population are from BAME communities, below the Borough average of 2.7%
- 9.3% of the Neighbourhood population reported a life-limiting disability, below the Borough average of 10.96%



Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
 - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
 - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
 - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.
 - The rate of shielded patients in each LSOA.





Impact of Covid






Disease Prevalence High Dependency & LTC Group: Chronic Kidney Disease






Disease Prevalence High Dependency & LTC Group: Diabetes






Disease Prevalence Cardiovascular : Coronary Heart Disease






Disease Prevalence Cardiovascular: Hypertension






Disease Prevalence Respiratory : Asthma






Disease Prevalence Respiratory : COPD








Covid-19 Vaccination – Borough Overview





As at 6th March 2022 over 655,000 vaccinations had been delivered. 93% of over 70s had received the booster vaccination.









Musculoskeletal Group: Rheumatoid Arthritis






Disease Prevalence Musculoskeletal Group: Osteoporosis






Disease Prevalence Lifestyle Group: Smoking






Disease Prevalence Lifestyle Group: Obesity






Disease Prevalence High Dependency & LTC Group: Cancer



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




Disease Prevalence Mental Health & Neurology: Dementia






Disease Prevalence Mental Health & Neurology: Depression








Disease Prevalence Mental Health & Neurology: Epilepsy



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


Disease Prevalence Cardiovascular: Atrial Fibrillation




Disease Prevalence Cardiovascular: Heart Failure


Cardiovascular: Left Ventricular Systolic Disorder



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

Cardiovascular: Peripheral Arterial Disease






Disease Prevalence Cardiovascular : Stroke & TIA

SWAN has the second lowest rate of pupils in receipt of Free School Meals.










Pupil Population – Children Looked After

■ Secondary School Rate





26% of Wigan South 16-18 year olds were 'Not Known'.



A&E Attendances – All ages








A&E Attendances – 0-17








A&E Attendances – 18-64






A&E Attendances – 65 and older




Elective and non-elective admissions





Fuel Poverty

- 10.25% of households in England are living in fuel poverty. In Wigan Borough the proportion is 10.8%, below the North West average but above the national average
- 9.3% of households in the Neighbourhood are living in fuel poverty, a decrease from 9.9% in 2016
- Whilst the trend in most LSOAs has been positive, Highfield, Winstanley / Highfield, Hawkley North, Hawkley and Marus Bridge East have all seen increases in the number of households living in fuel poverty.



Health Check Uptake

3.48% of the eligible Borough population were offered Health Checks by their GP in 2020/21 – a significant decline on previous years

12.71% of eligible patients across the Borough took up the offer – a slight increase on previous years.





Rate of referral in the Neighbourhood is 10.36, significantly above the Borough average of 6.75.





Universal Credit Claimants

- 10.04% of the Neighbourhood's working age population (16-64 year olds) were in receipt of Universal Credit as at June 2021.
- 4.21% of working age population claiming Universal Credit were in employment with 5.84% not in employment.
- At a Borough level 15.53% of the working age population (16-64 year olds) were in receipt of Universal Credit as at June 2021.
- 6.01% of the working age population claiming Universal Credit were in employment with 9.52% not in employment.

Place and Community Safety

- SWAN reported the second lowest number of Police ASB incidents, with the highest totals contributed by rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour and neighbour nuisance.
- Hotspots included a range of settings on Warrington Road including residential areas,
 Premier Inn and Total Fitness (n12 neighbours, rowdy / inconsiderate, noise), Horne Grove
 (n10 rowdy / inconsiderate), Wigan St Judes rugby / social club (n9 rowdy /
 inconsiderate), Fisher Close (n9 rowdy / inconsiderate, neighbours, malicious
 communications), a range of settings along Holmes House Avenue complex including public
 house, The Winstanley Centre and St Aidan's Church (n9 rowdy / inconsiderate).
- SWAN saw a decrease in GMFRS ASB incidents in 2019/20 followed by an increase in 2020/21 to a rate of 1.84 per 1,000 population. The number of Deliberate Fires had almost halved in 2019/20 however was back to close to 2018/19 totals by 2020/21. The number of Deliberate Fires (Loose Refuse) had also increased




