

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from Wigan, in the context of a research project on access to education for recently arrived secondary school aged migrant girls. Please may you provide me with answers to the following questions:

1) Do you collect data on children from migrant [1] families newly arrived in your area? Do you collect data on the *gender* of these children? Do you collect data on the *age* of these children?

The LA do not collect this data as a data set. Individual teams will keep information for their service involvement which differs dependent on need i.e. Housing, children's social care, public health, education of children where English is an additional language, etc. All these data sets combined would not answer these questions in full as we cannot be confident of accurate total numbers.

2) If/where possible, we would like to see information on gender and age for the 4 below questions:

Here, the term migrant refers to families or children who recently moved to the UK from a foreign country so that the UK effectively becomes their new country of usual residence. They can have different migration status in the UK (refugees, asylum-seekers, regular migrants on work or family visas, undocumented migrants, etc).
