

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request information about the steps Wigan Council is taking to comply with the National Institute of Clinical Excellence's (NICE) Guideline NG6 on *Excess winter deaths and illness and the health risks associated with cold homes*.

My questions are:

- 1) What steps is your local authority Health & Wellbeing Board taking to meet *Recommendation 1: Develop a strategy*

We do not have a specific strategy for excess winter deaths and cold homes – but do have a comprehensive programme to address these things through the AWARM collaborative that supports owner occupiers.

In addition, we have a pro-active team of Housing Standards Officers that assess the warmth as well as the safety of privately rented homes. We offer advice, support and incentives to landlords to help improve the energy efficiency of privately rented homes. Engagement takes place with tenants to also raise awareness of support available.

- 2) What steps is your local authority Health & Wellbeing Board taking to meet *Recommendation 2: Identify a point of contact (health and housing referral service) for people living in cold homes*.

There is an information page on the Council website that offers advice and support to stay warm. This is made up of general advice links to organisations such as Energy Trust and Welfare Support as well as link through to the AWARM service. AWARM is a FREE service that works in partnership with the Citizen's Advice Bureau, Greendoctor, Age UK and other public agencies and can offer:

- Help to improve the efficiency of your home
- Benefit entitlement checks
- Boiler replacements, loft and wall Insulation and draught proofing (subject to qualifying criteria)
- Handy person service
- Winter fuel payment, fuel vouchers, support with fuel debt
- Electric oil filled radiators
- Keep warm packs
- Carbon monoxide detectors, smoke alarms, home adaptations.

People can self-refer to AWARM but other agencies can also refer into the AWARM service.

In addition, the Council have been holding a series of events across the borough to reach people within the community to offer advice and support with the cost of living, this includes support for keeping warm and dealing with energy bills: The Here For You campaign [Here for you \(wigan.gov.uk\)](http://wigan.gov.uk)

AWARM work closely with the Housing Standards Team to pass over any enquiries from private tenants to ensure the appropriate support is provided.

# Key Findings



## Population

The Neighbourhood has a higher proportion of over-65s to under-16s.

The gender split of male and female is in line with the Borough profile. The percentage of BAME and limiting disability population is below the Borough average.



## Start Well

The Neighbourhood has the second lowest rate of children in receipt of free school meals and the third lowest rate of children with special educational needs and children looked after.

The Neighbourhood has the highest percentage of children achieving school readiness (2019).

# Key Findings

## Hospital Activity



The Neighbourhood has below Borough average attendance rates for both consultant-led and other urgent care settings. However P92647 is in the top ten practices in the Borough for all-age attendance from consultant-led sites. P92642 reports the Borough-highest attendance rate for 0-17 age cohort.

The Neighbourhood has above Borough average attendance rates for elective admissions but below average for non-elective admissions. P92647 stands out for both categories, with significantly the highest attendance rate for elective admissions in the Borough.

The Neighbourhood has a marginally above Borough average attendance rate for outpatient attendances. Again P92647 stands out, recording the Borough high rate for both first and follow-up attendances.

# Key Findings

## Long Term Conditions



- The Neighbourhood has significantly above-Borough-average prevalence (rates per 1000 registered patients) for asthma, palliative care, cardiovascular disease and COPD – the highest prevalence in the Borough
- The Neighbourhood also has notably above-Borough-average prevalence of hypertension, obesity, dementia, depression, epilepsy, heart failure and stroke / TIA
- The Neighbourhood reports the lowest prevalence levels of mental health conditions in the Borough





# Key Findings

## Community Link Workers



Community Link Worker referral rates are significantly higher than the Borough average.

The Neighbourhood has above Borough average rates for mental health, ASC, benefits and welfare, bereavement, domestic abuse, employment, family problems, financial advice, frailty, housing, mental health, social isolation, transport and support for carers. Mental health, health & wellbeing and social isolation are the most prevalent reasons for referral.

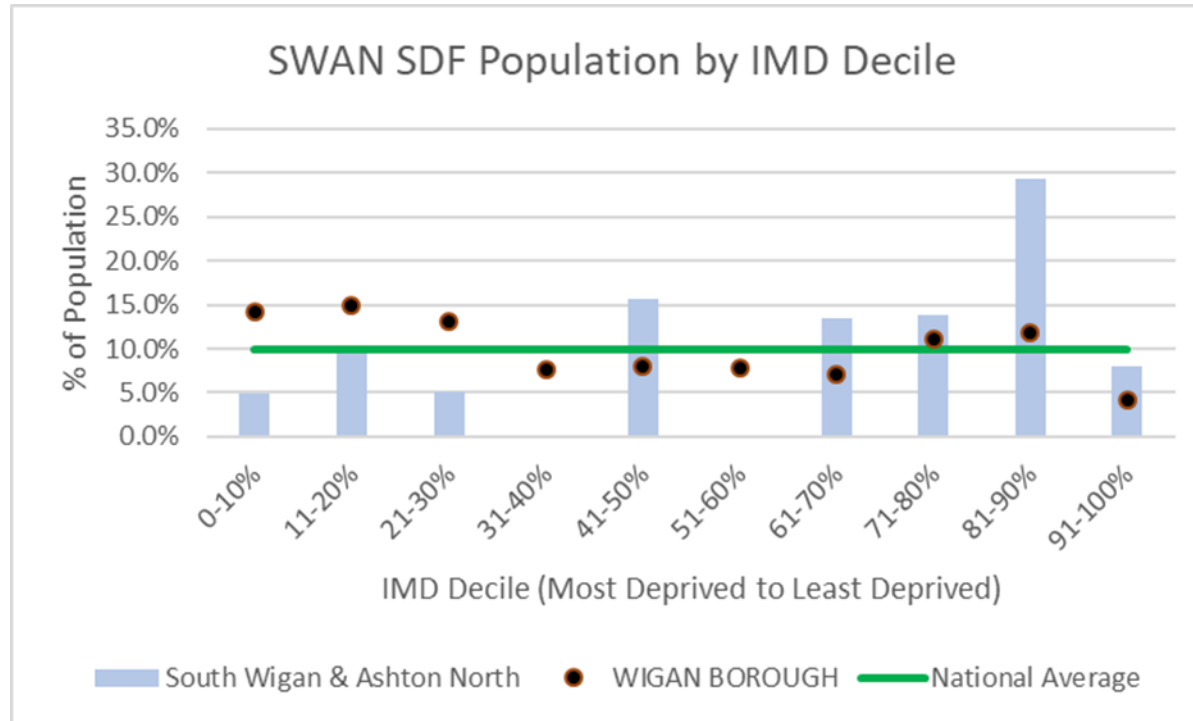

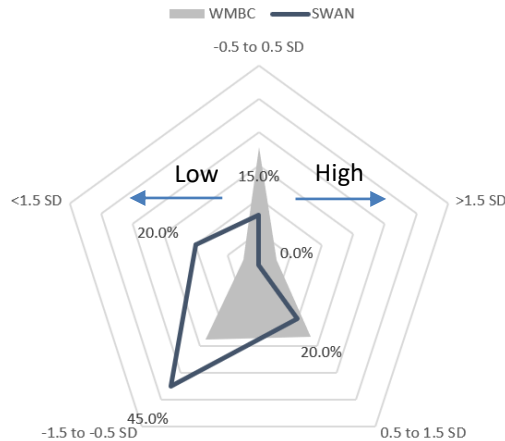
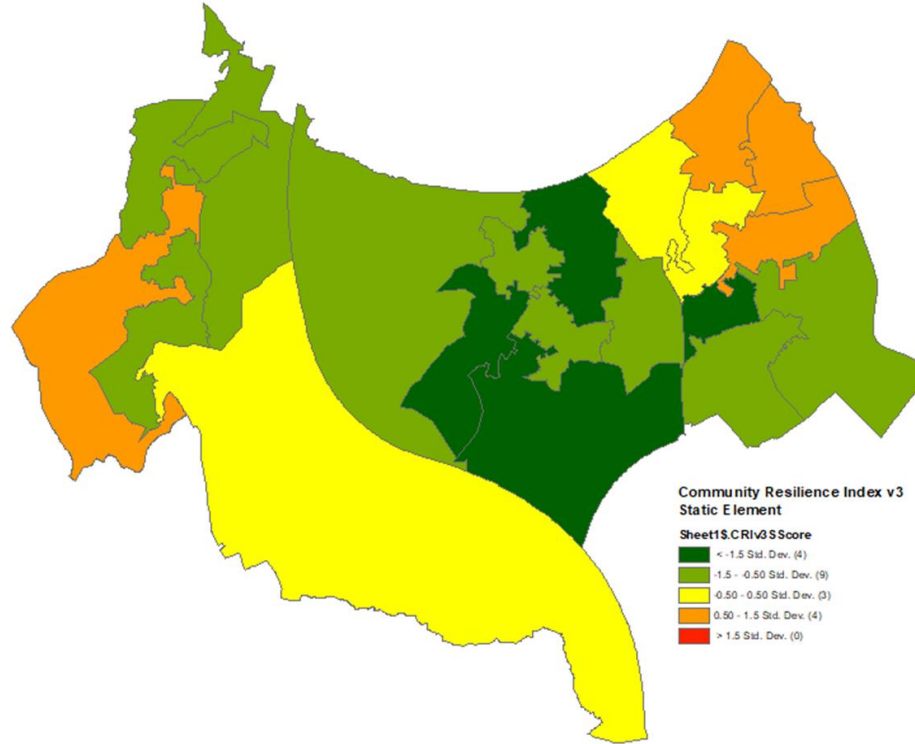
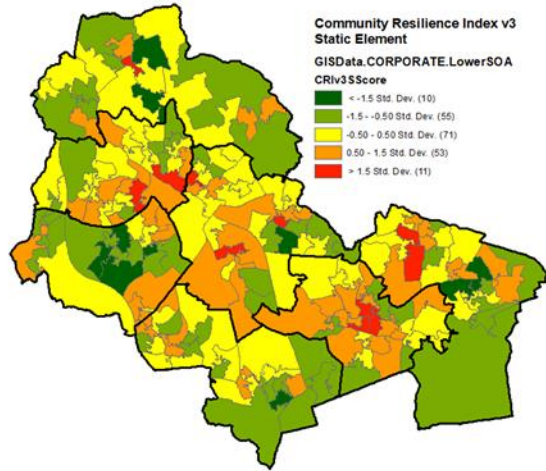
# Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
  - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
  - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
  - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.
  - The rate of shielded patients in each LSOA.

# Impact of Covid

- The Neighbourhood has the lowest rating for community resilience risk factors in the Borough
- Two practices have a high proportion of shielding patients on their registers – P92647 and P92642

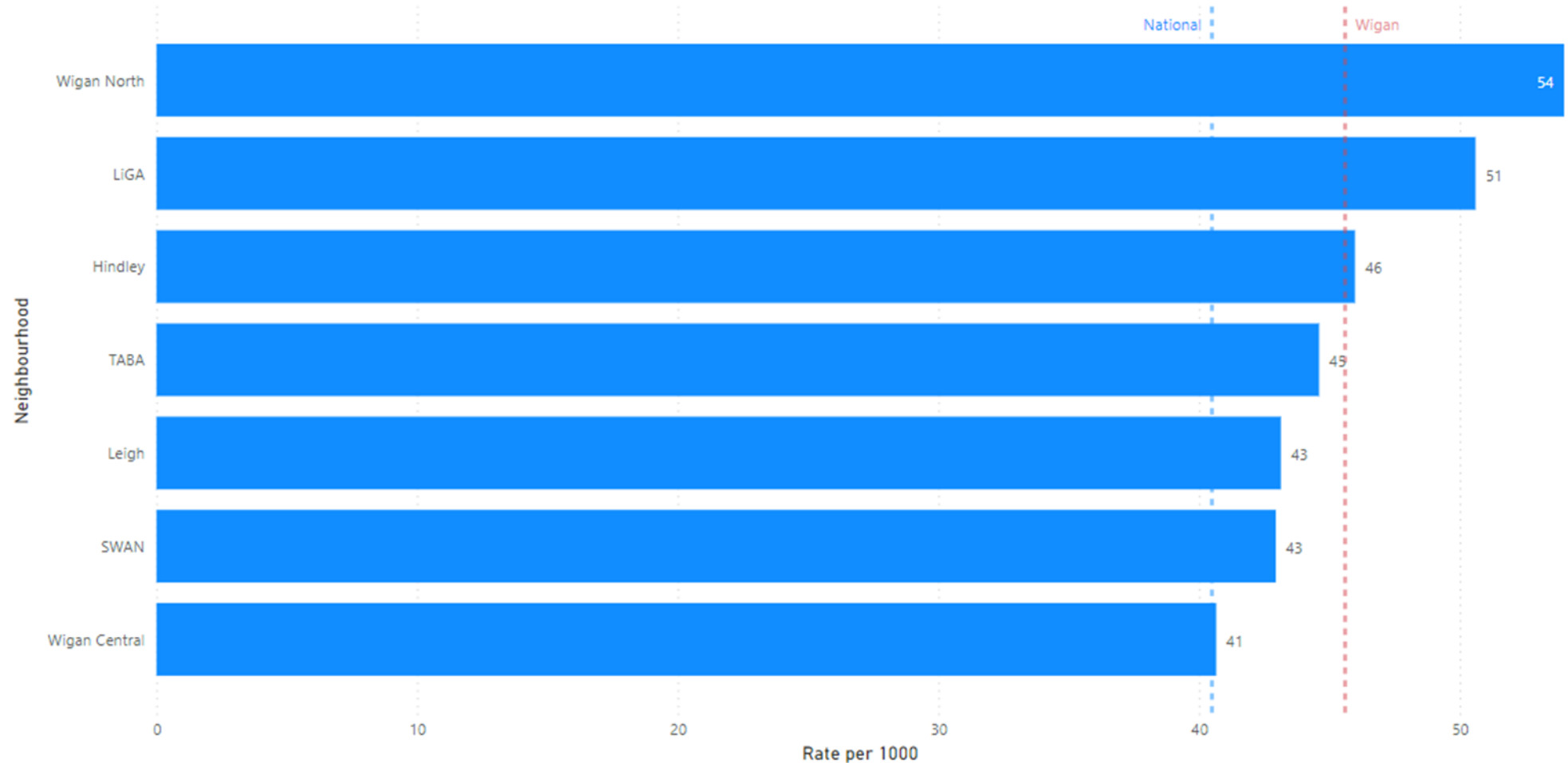

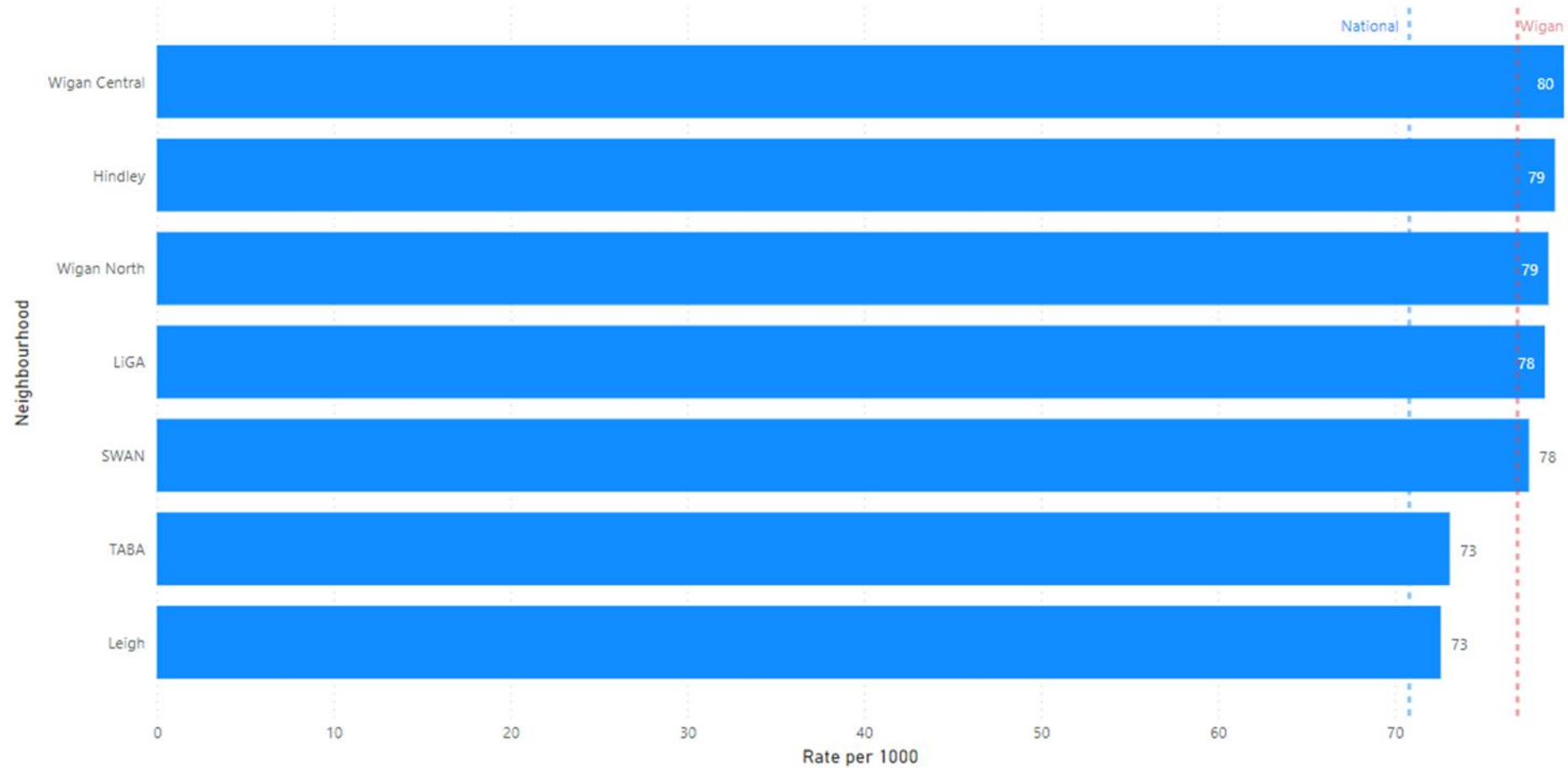
Chronic Kidney Disease by Neighbourhood

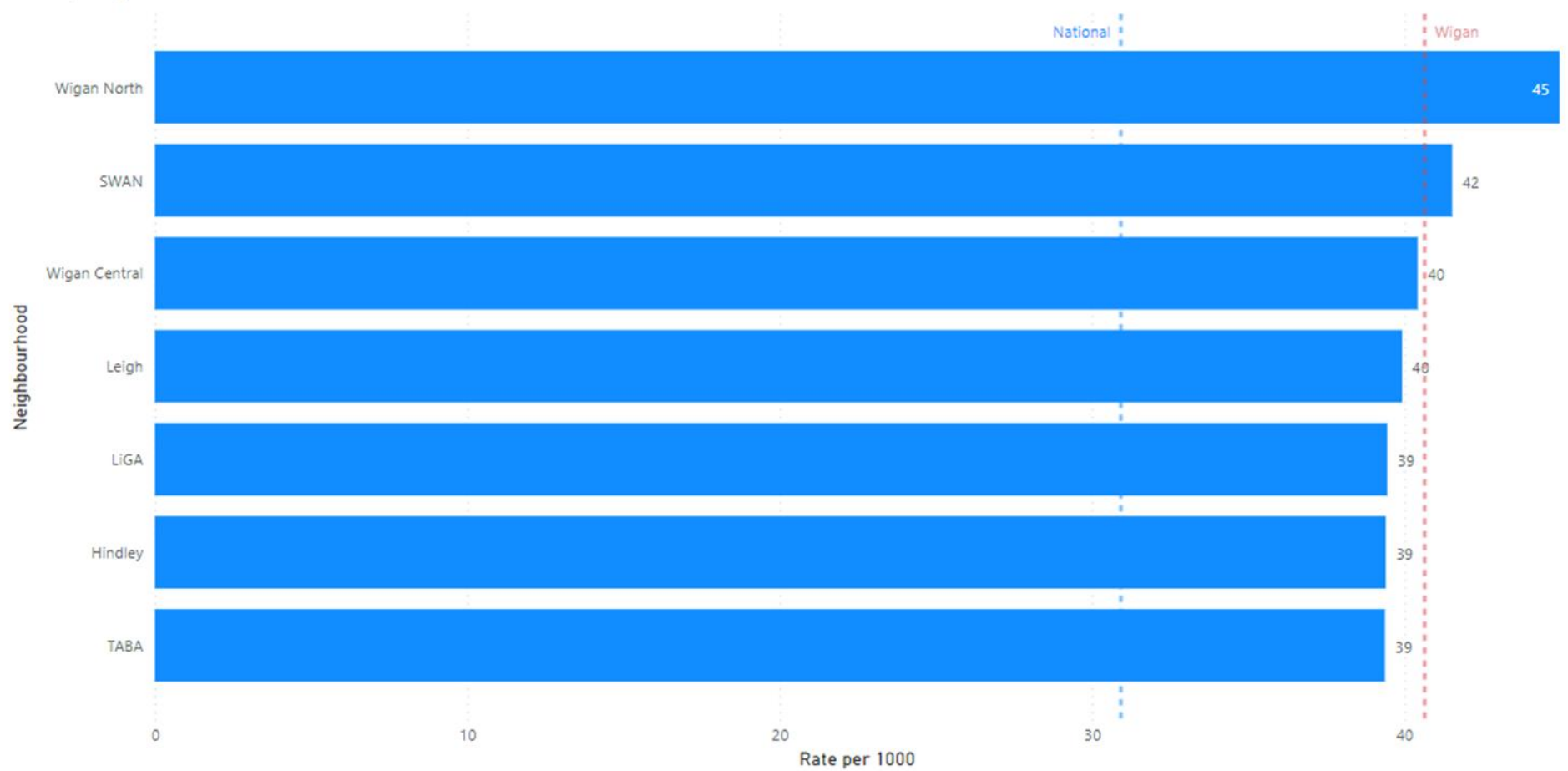
Diabetes by Neighbourhood

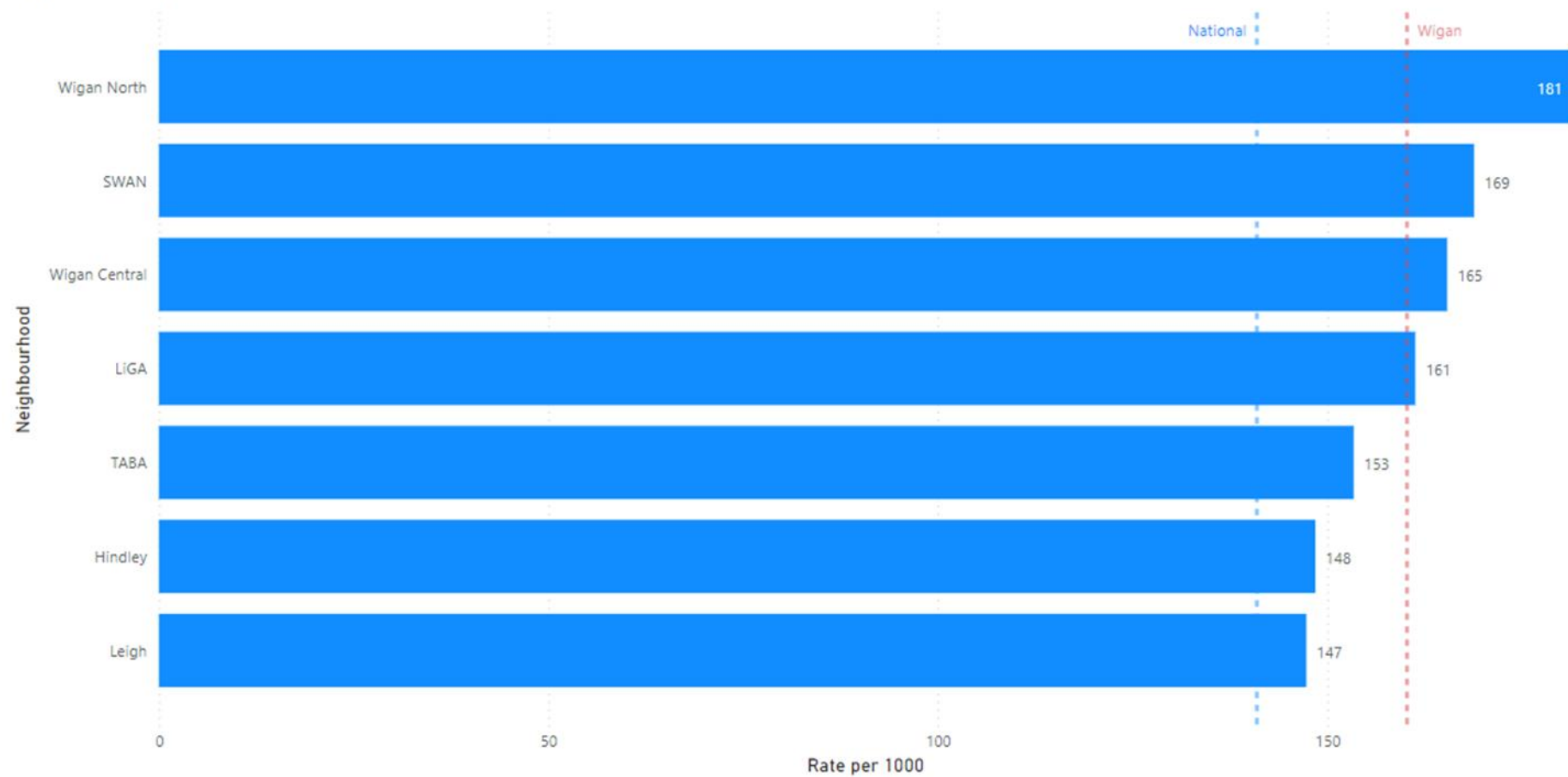
CHD by Neighbourhood

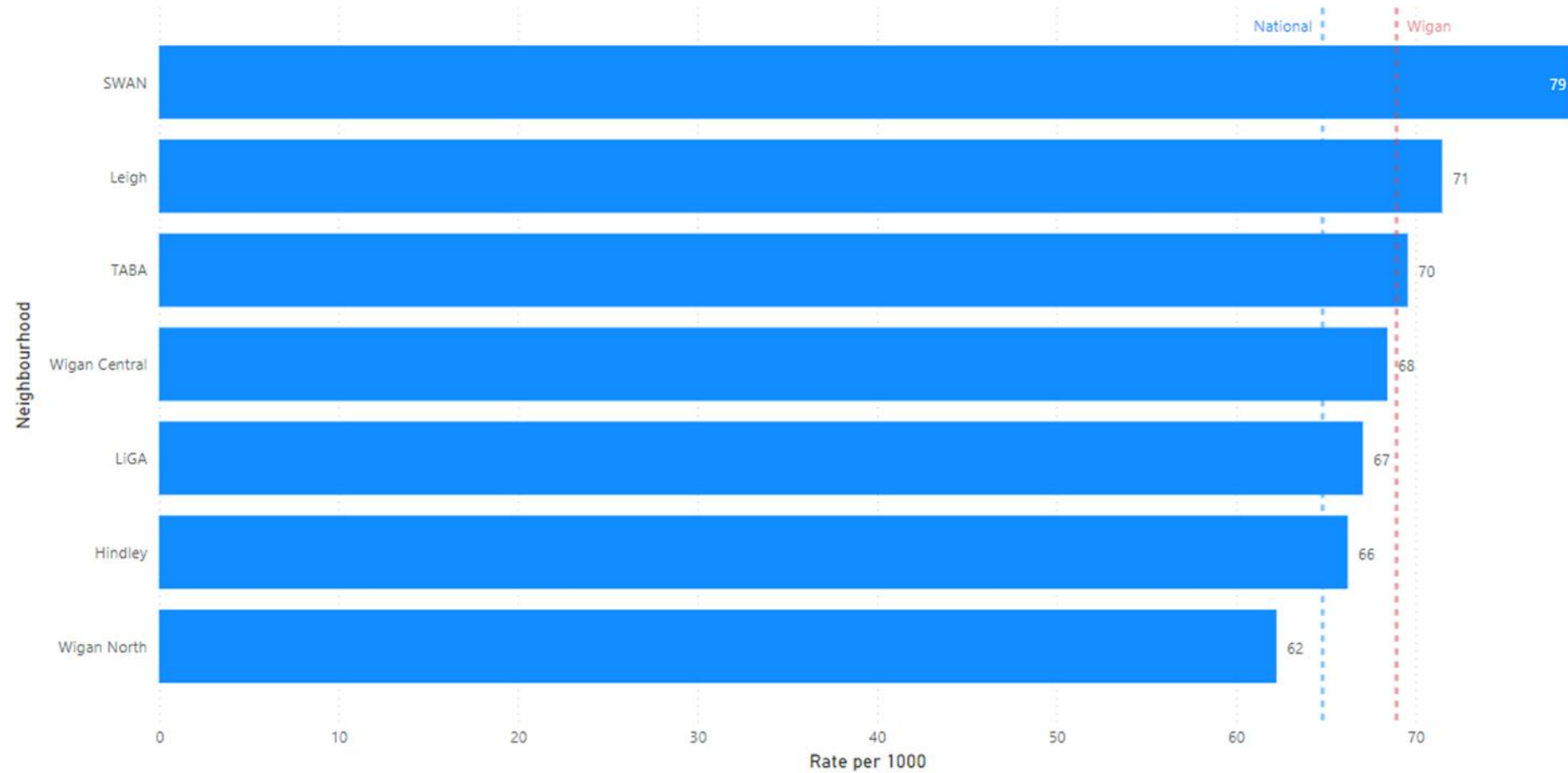

Hypertension by Neighbourhood

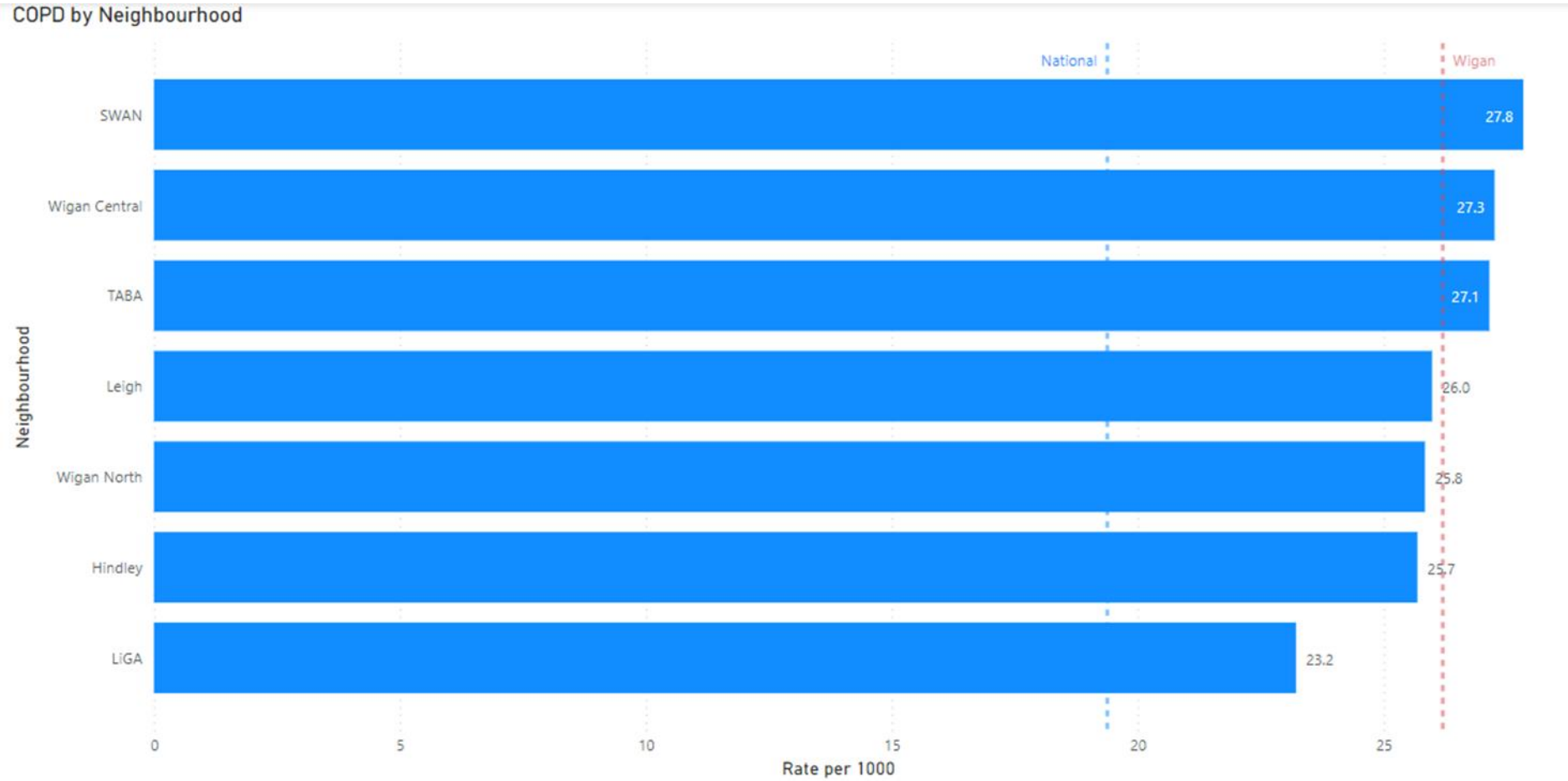

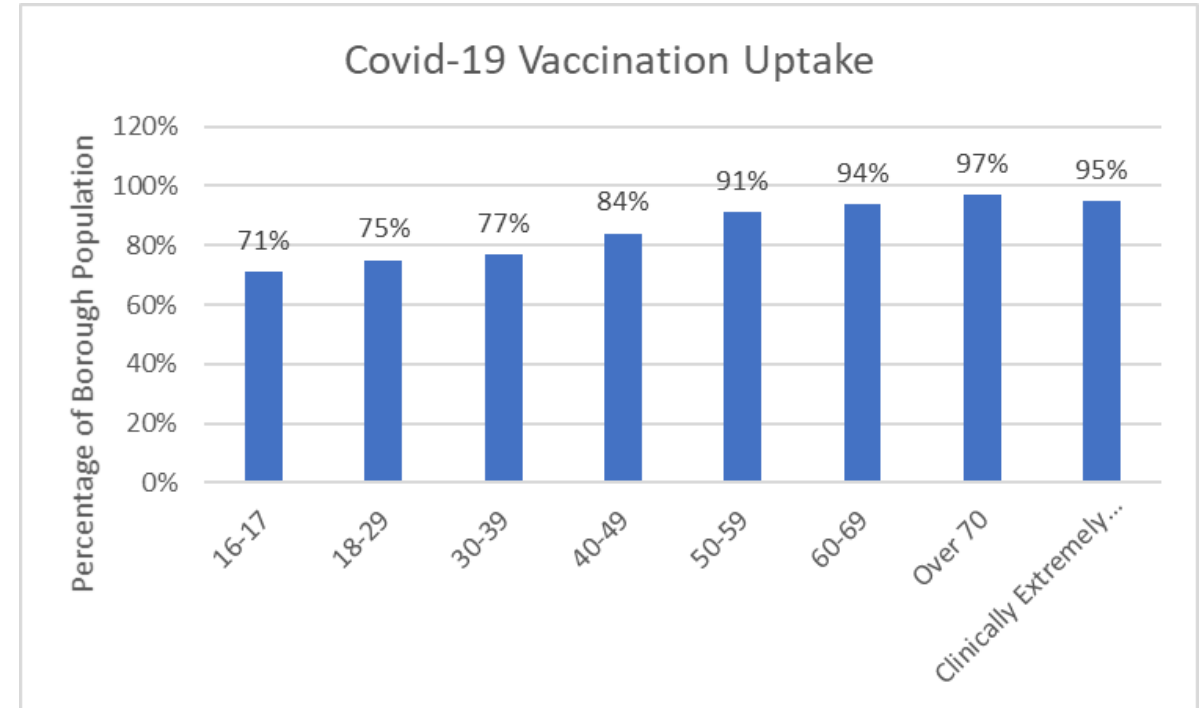
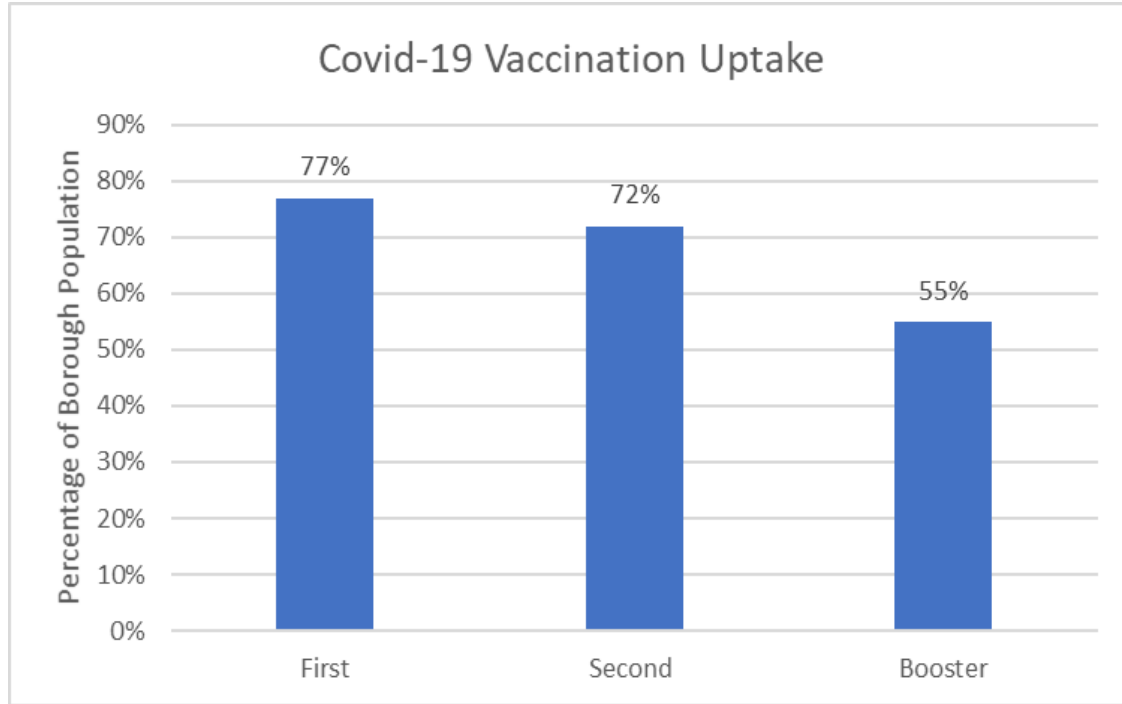
Asthma by Neighbourhood

93% of over 70s had received the booster vaccination.



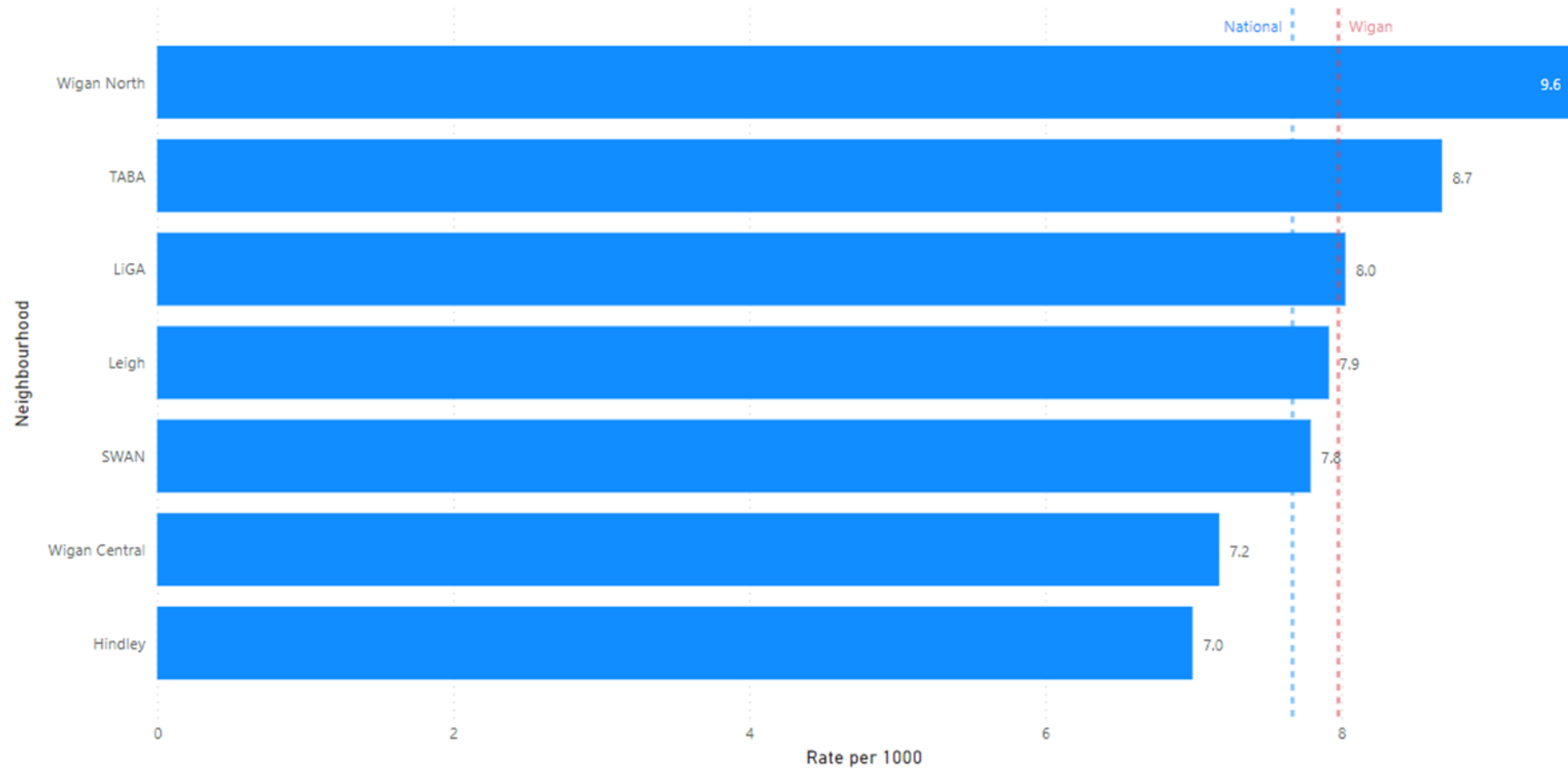

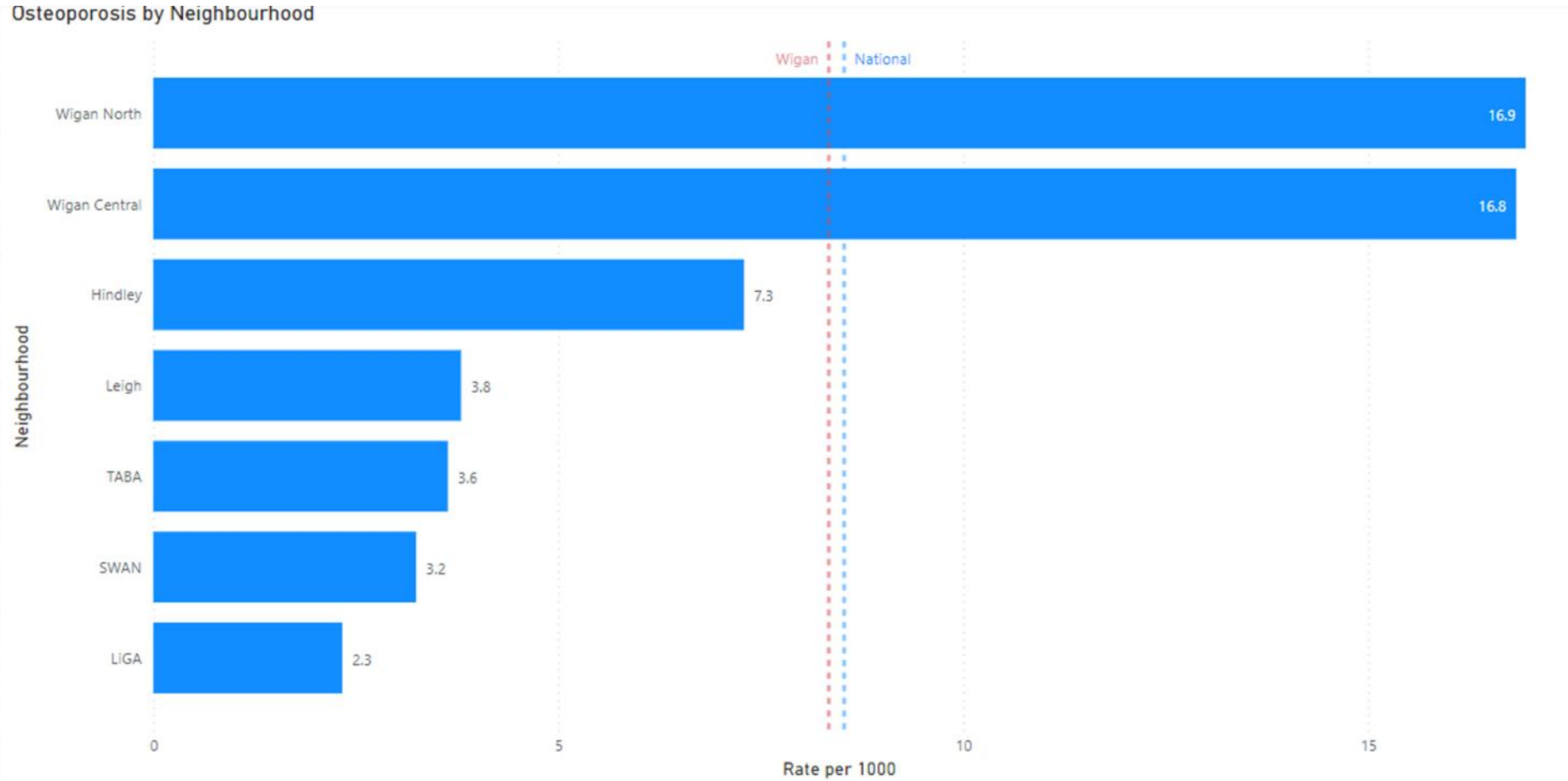
## Musculoskeletal Group: Rheumatoid Arthritis

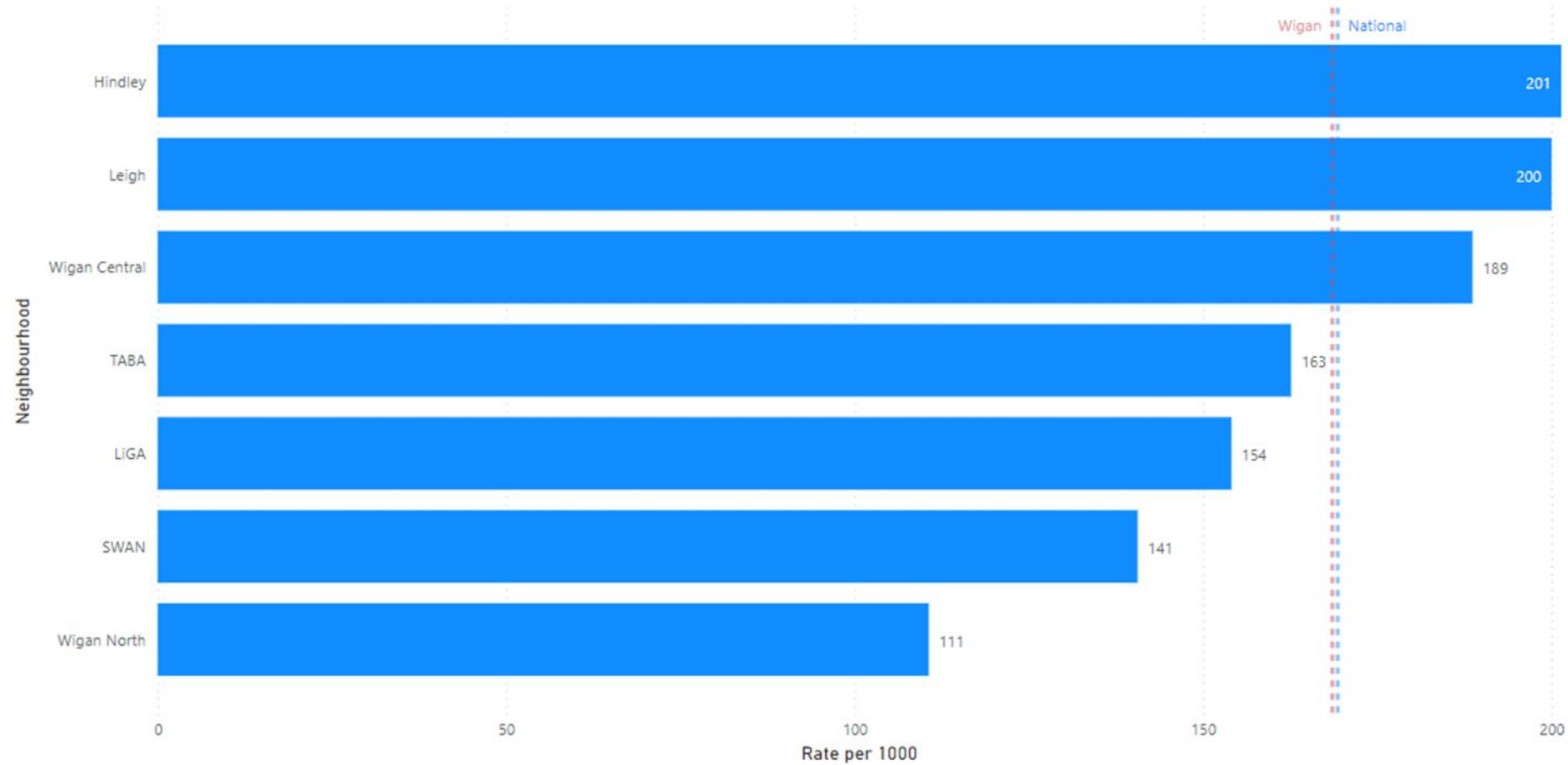

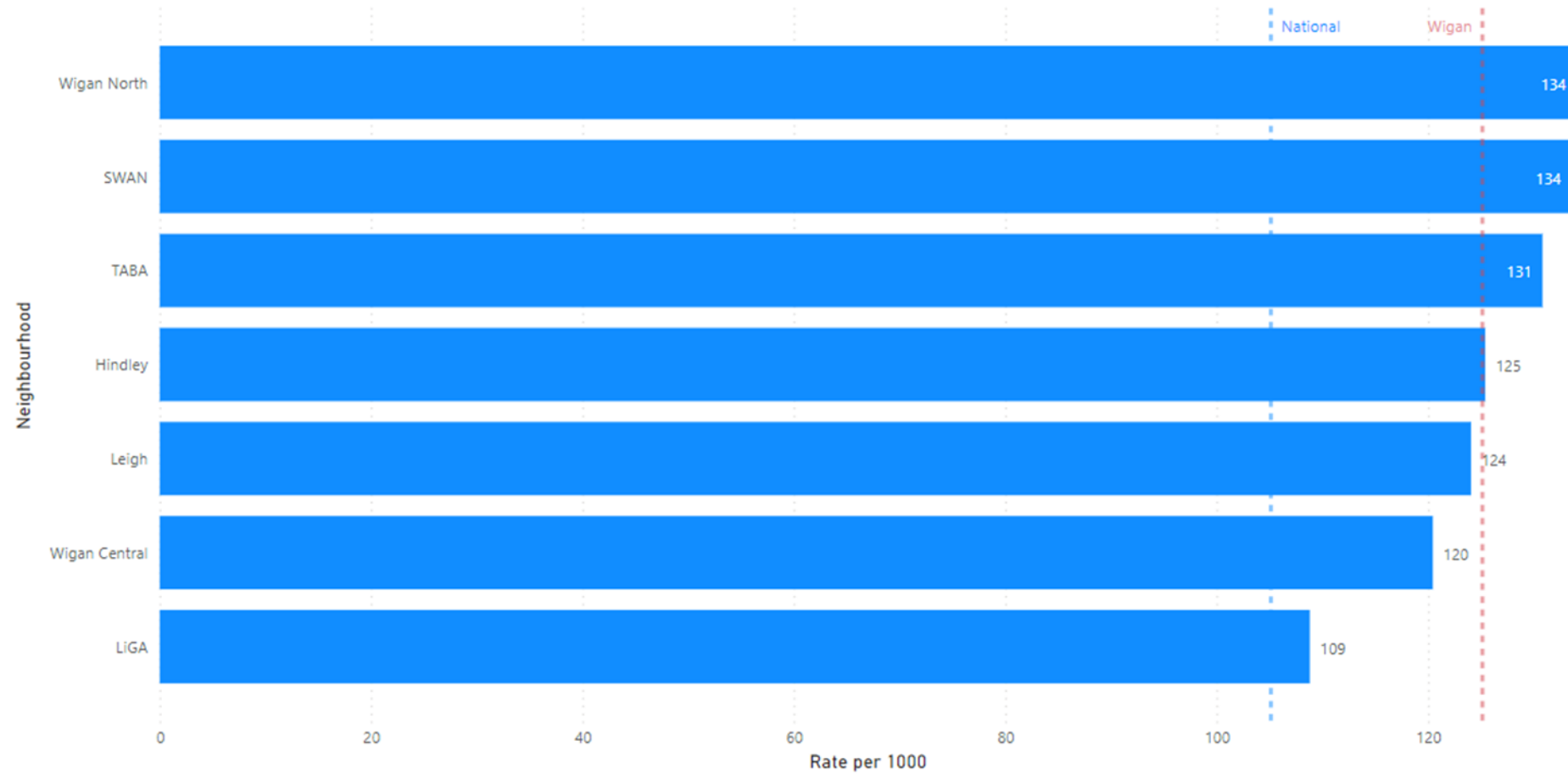
Smoking by Neighbourhood

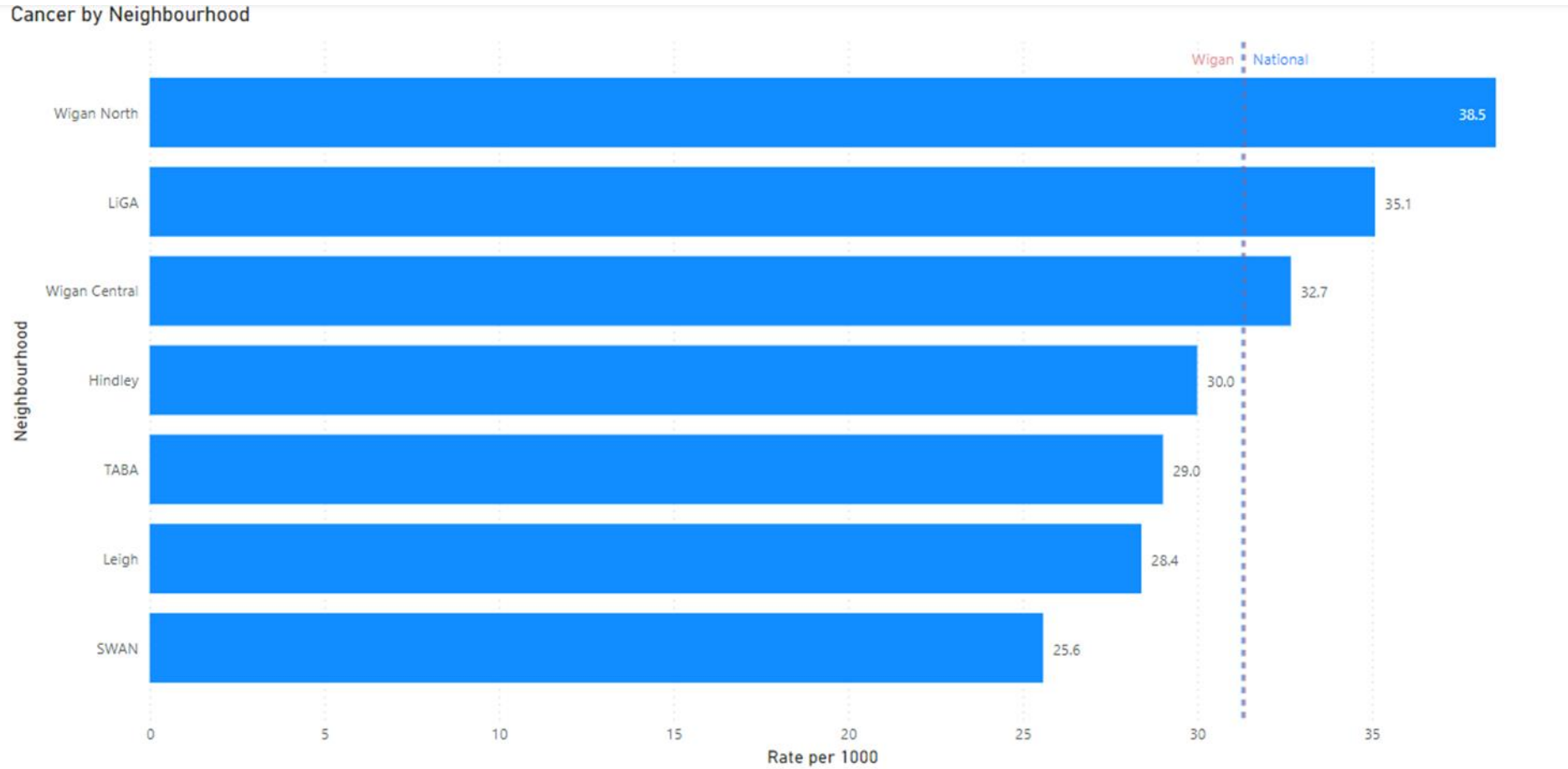

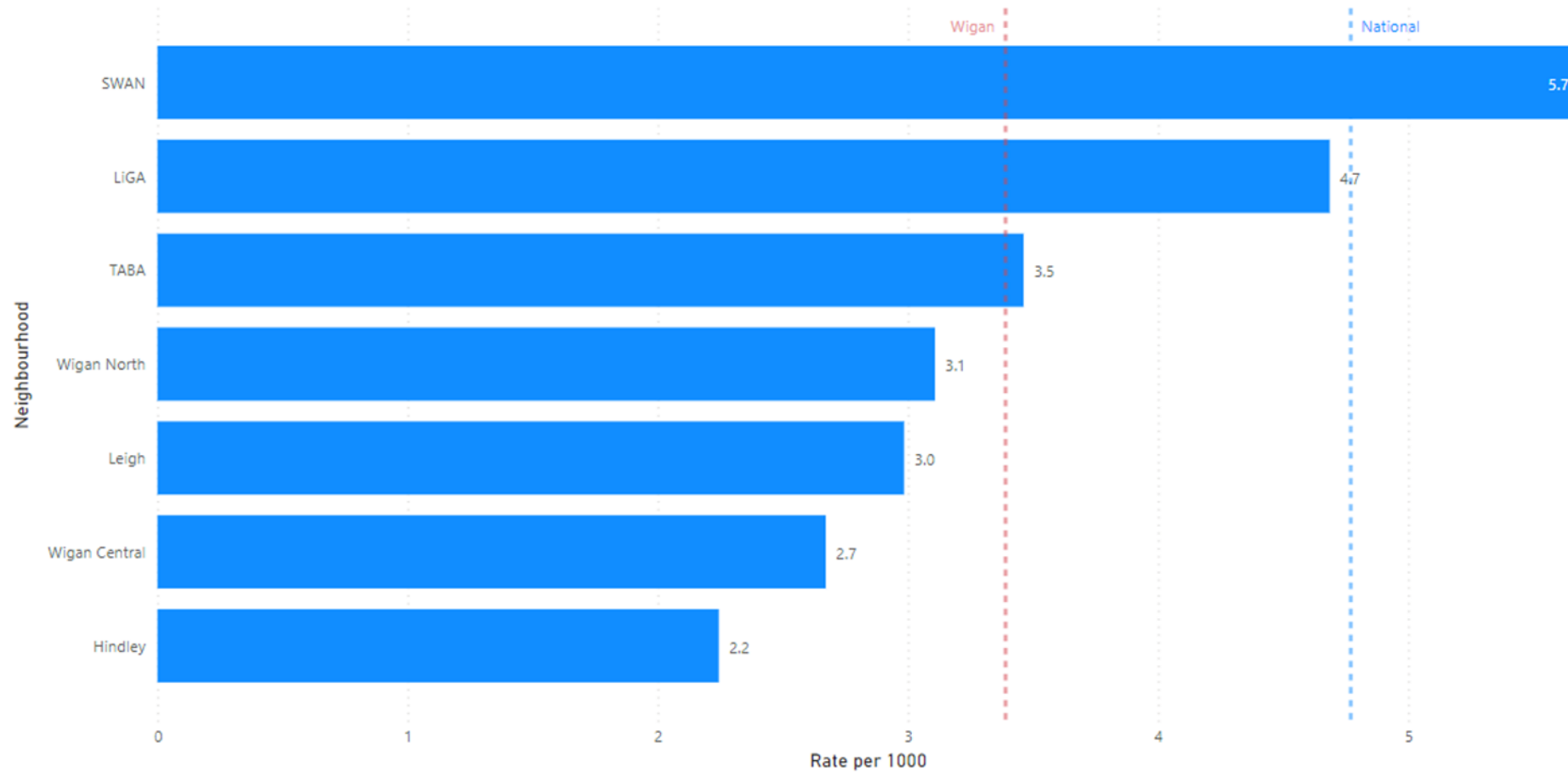

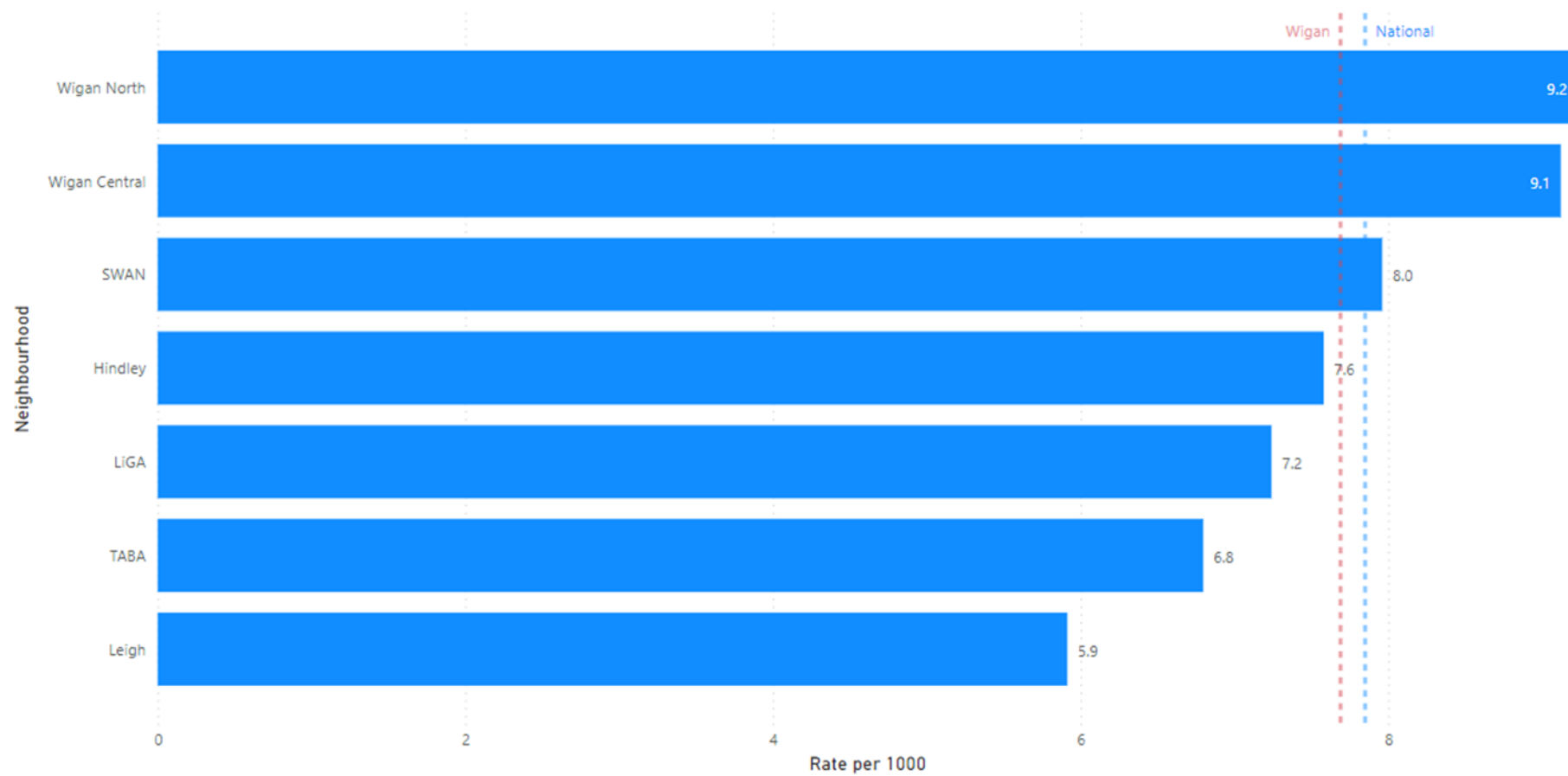
Palliative Care by Neighbourhood

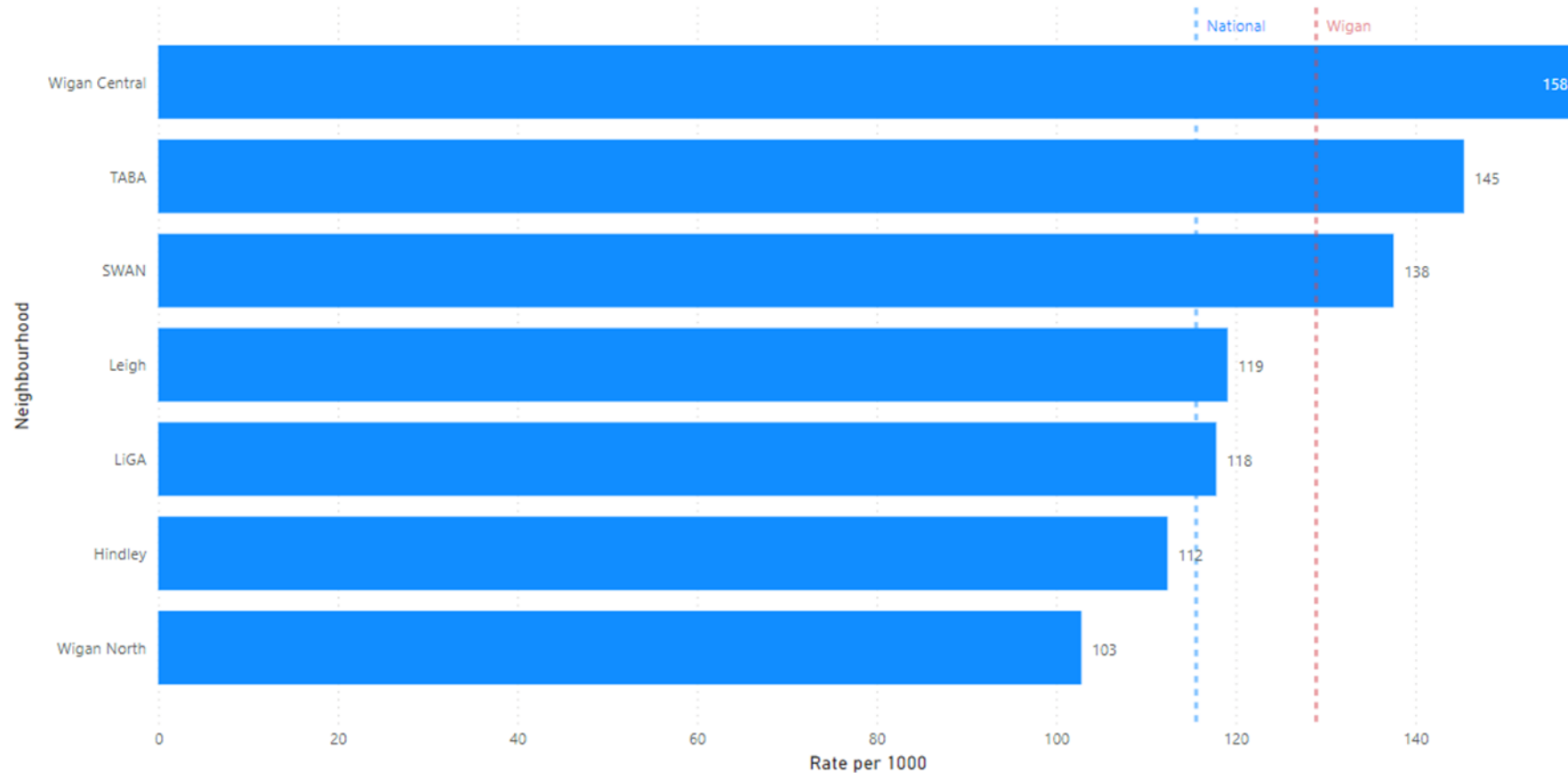

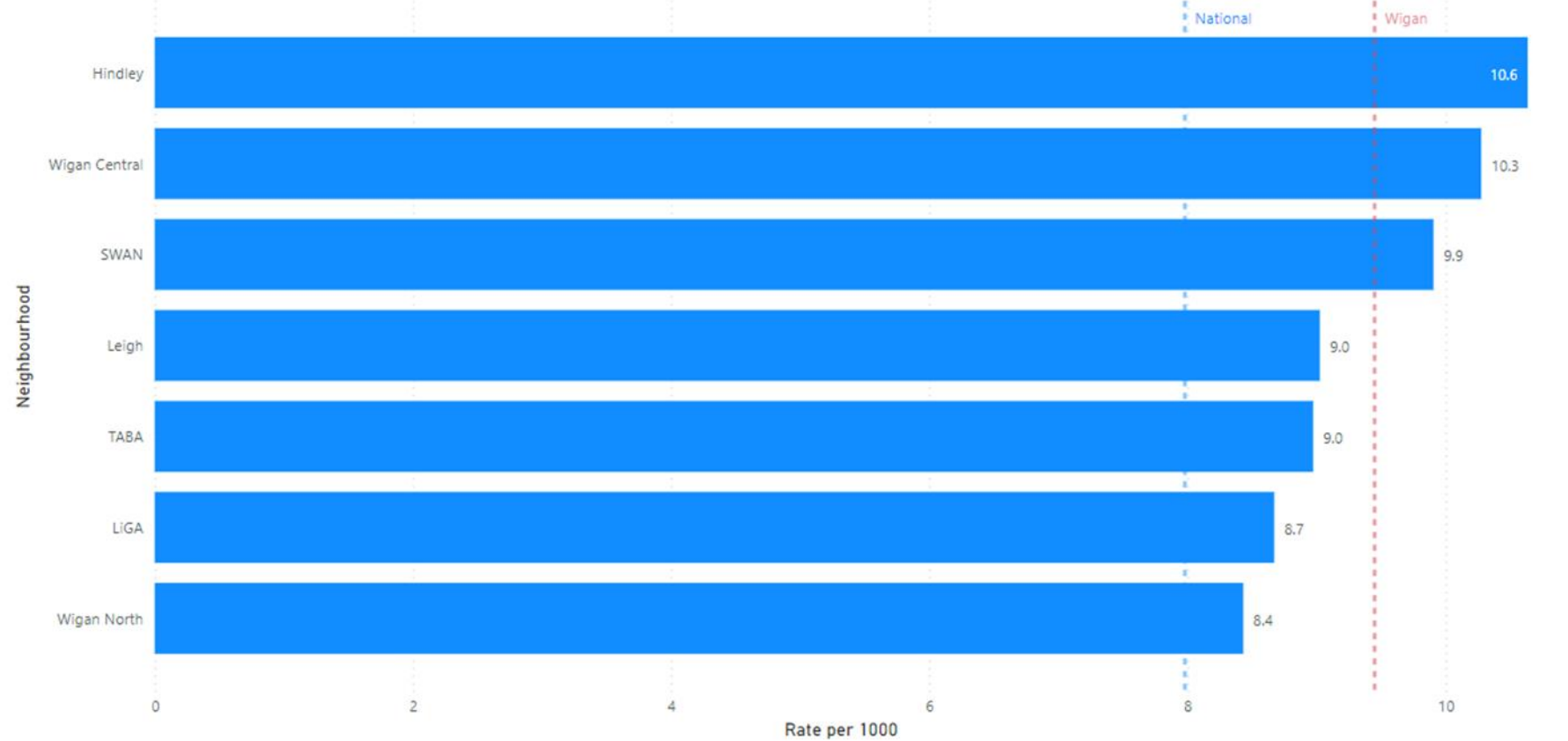
Depression by Neighbourhood

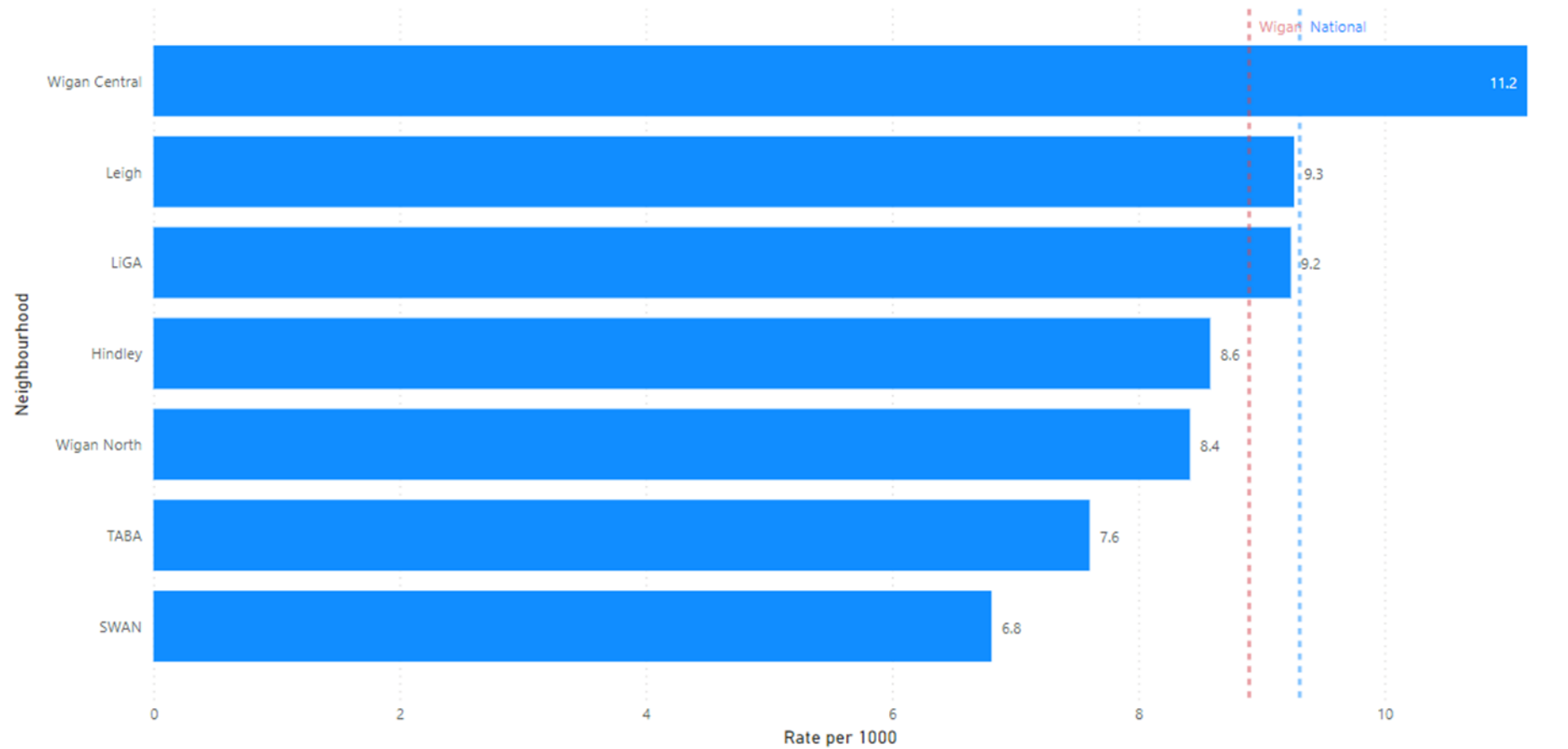
Epilepsy by Neighbourhood

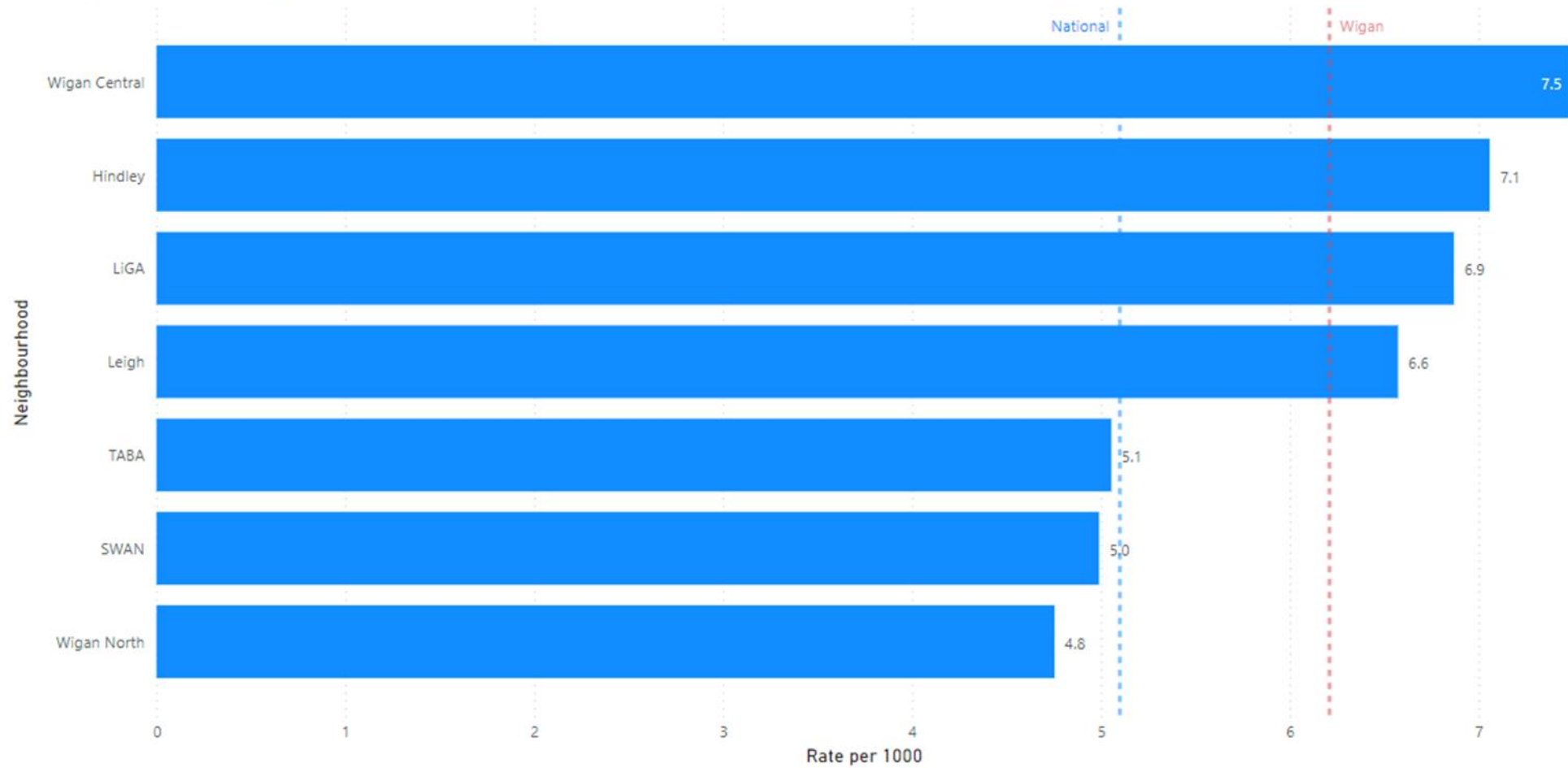
Mental Health by Neighbourhood

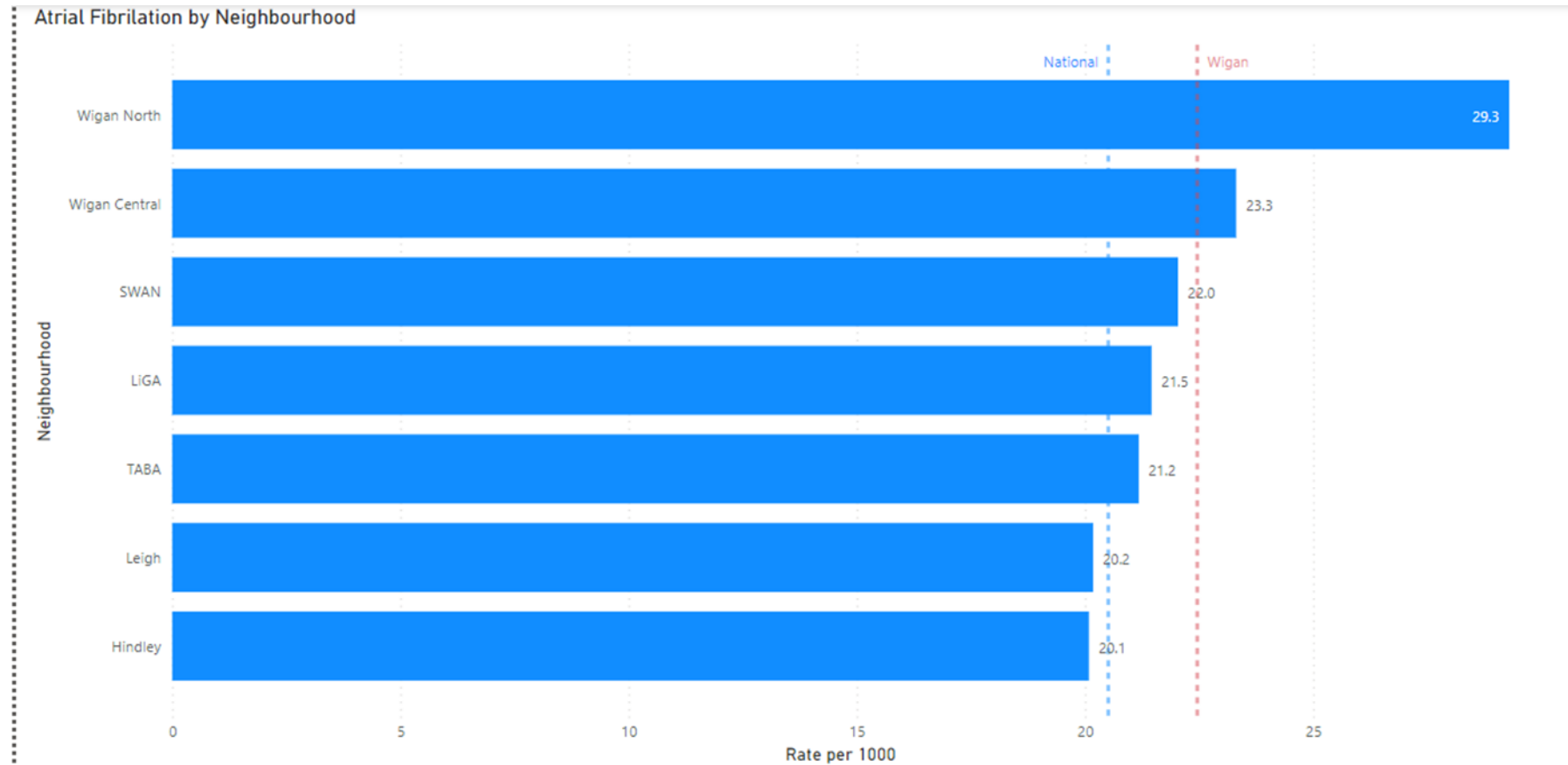

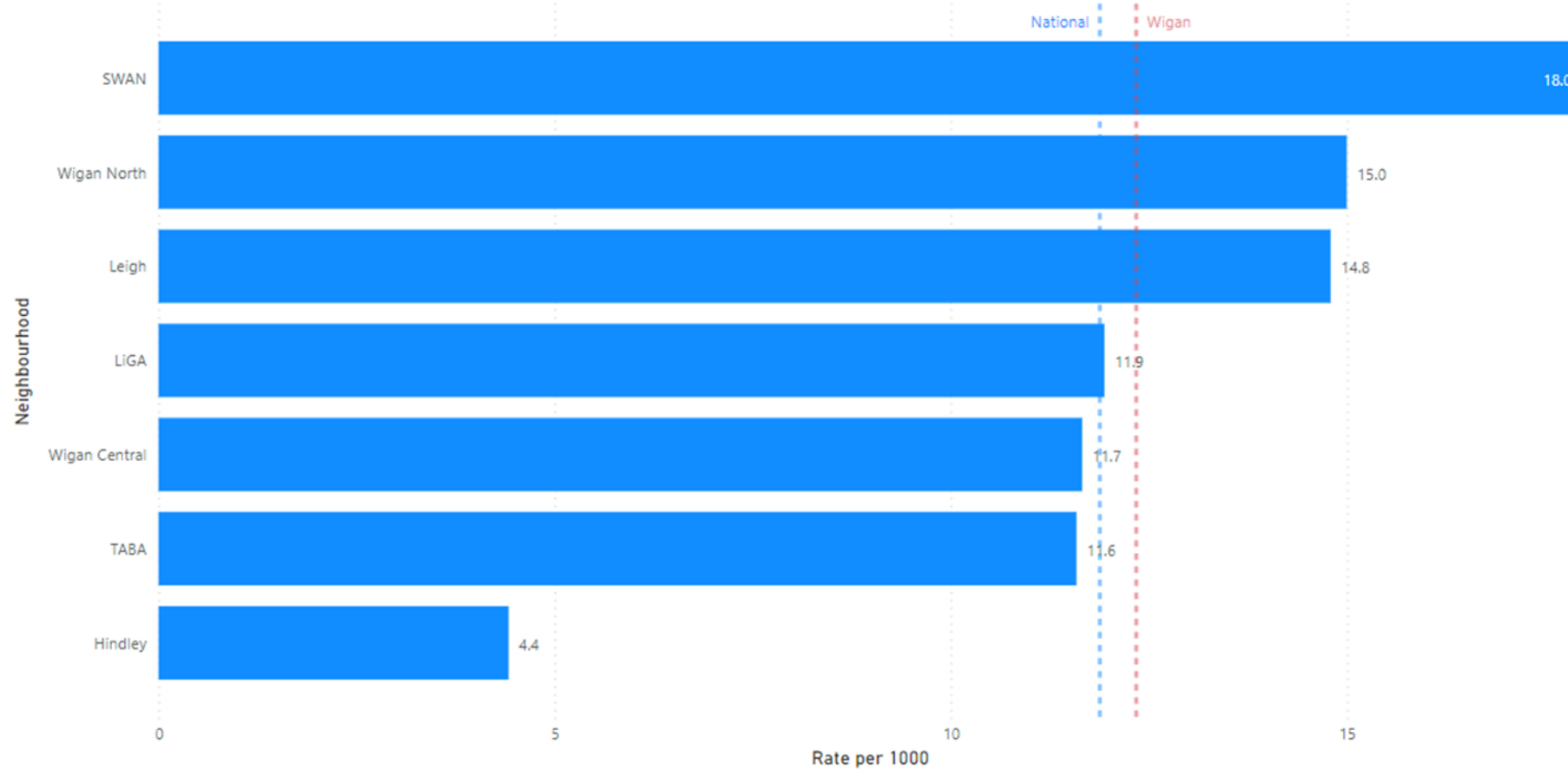

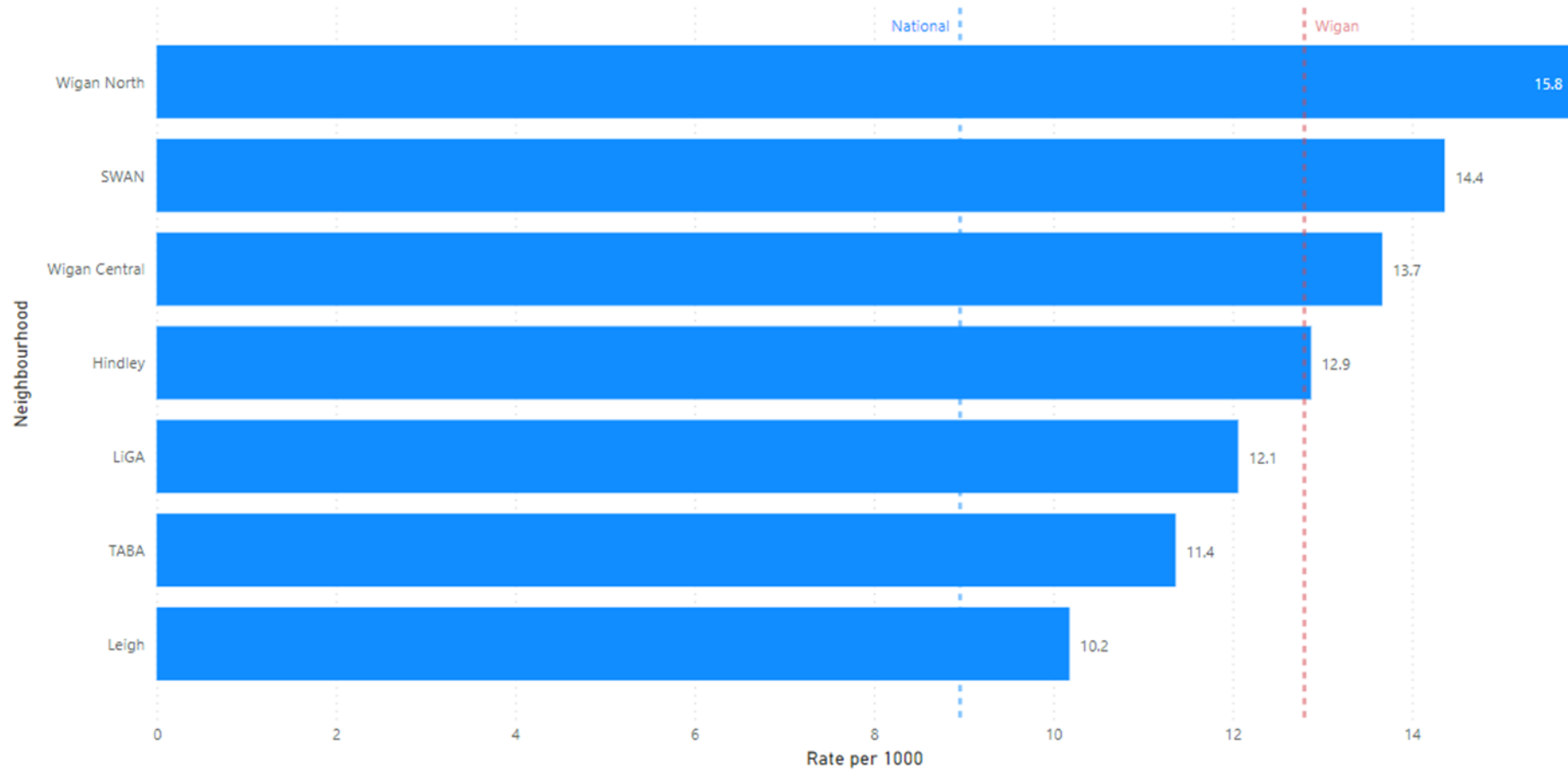
CVD (PP) by Neighbourhood

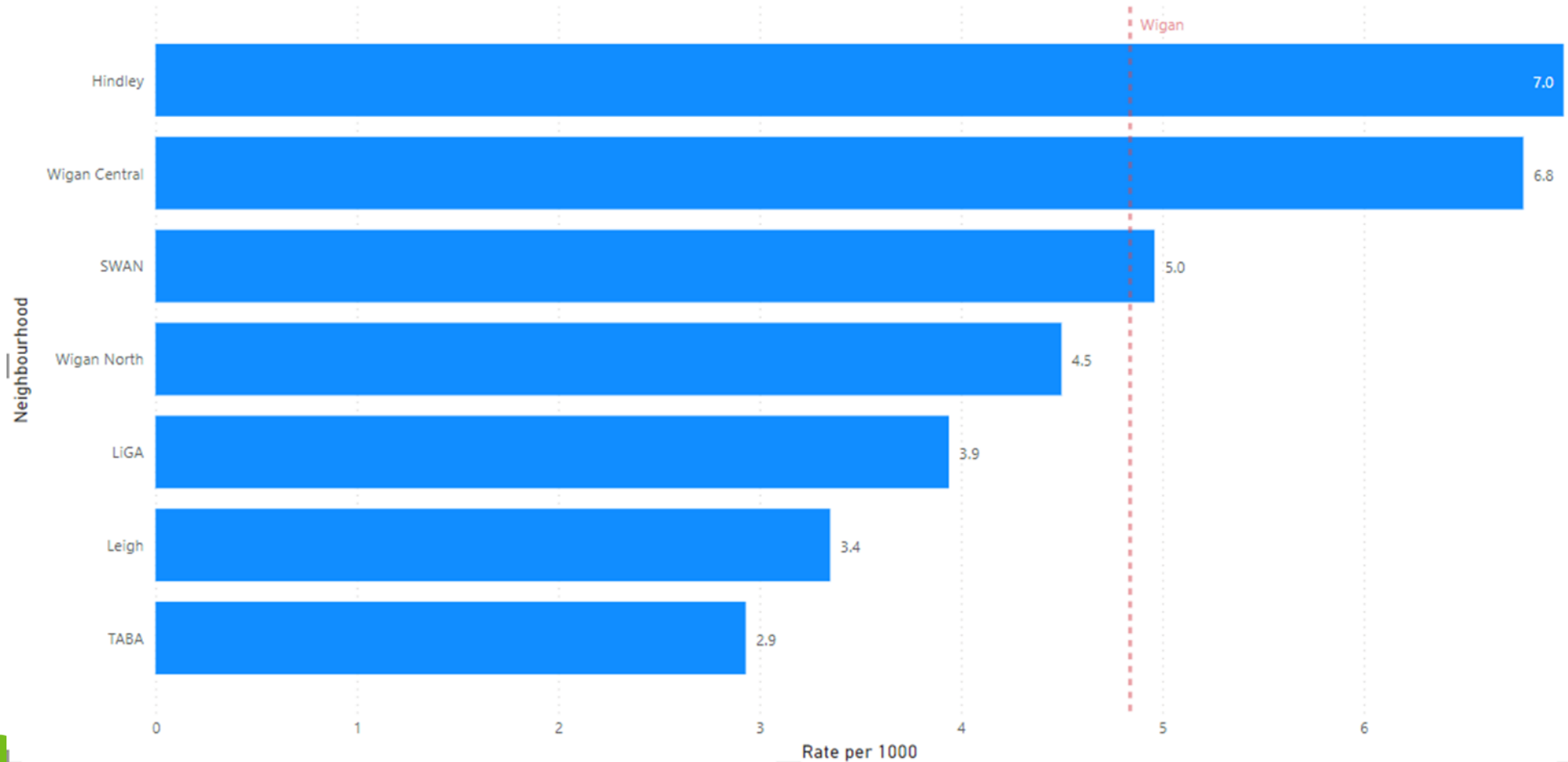
Heart Failure by Neighbourhood

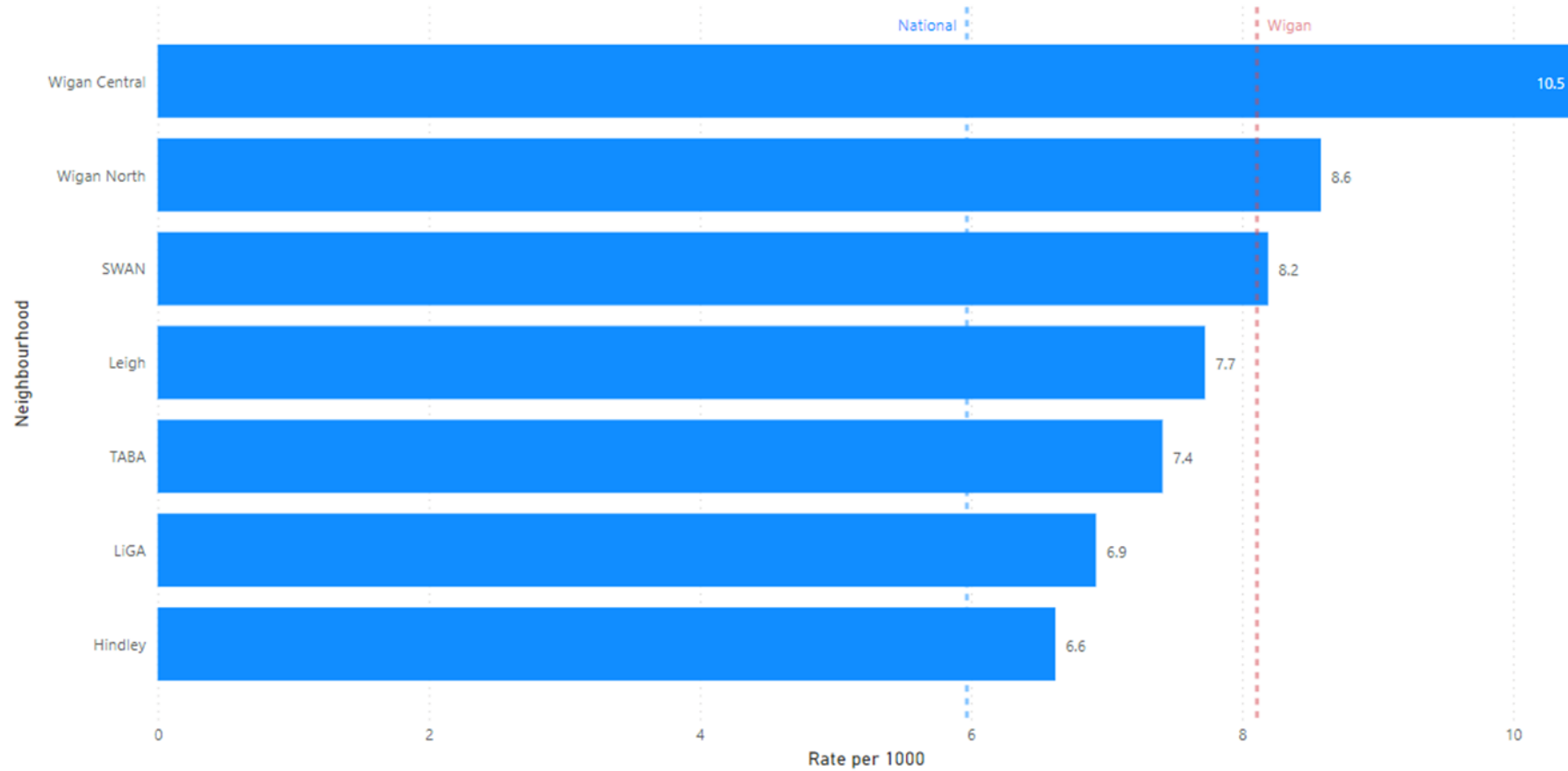

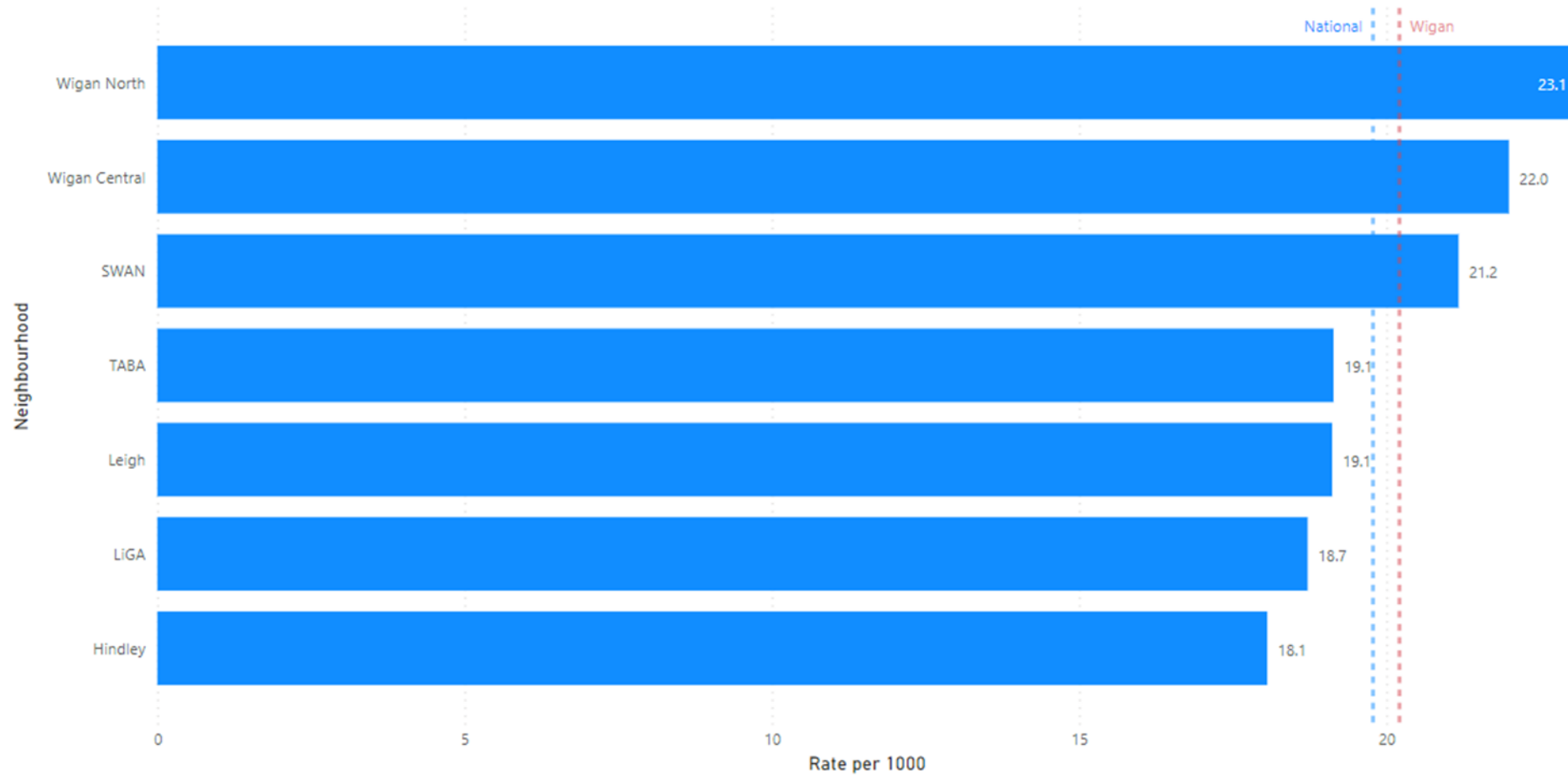
Peripheral Arterial Disease by Neighbourhood



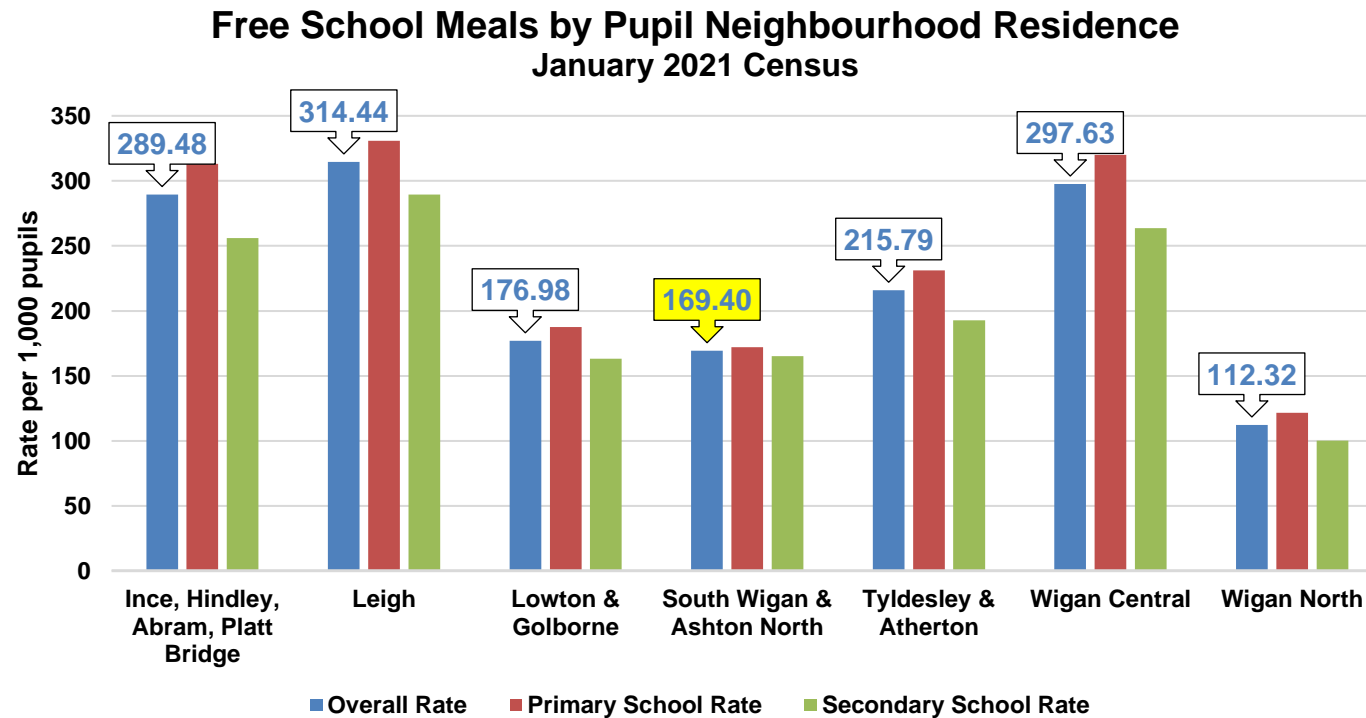

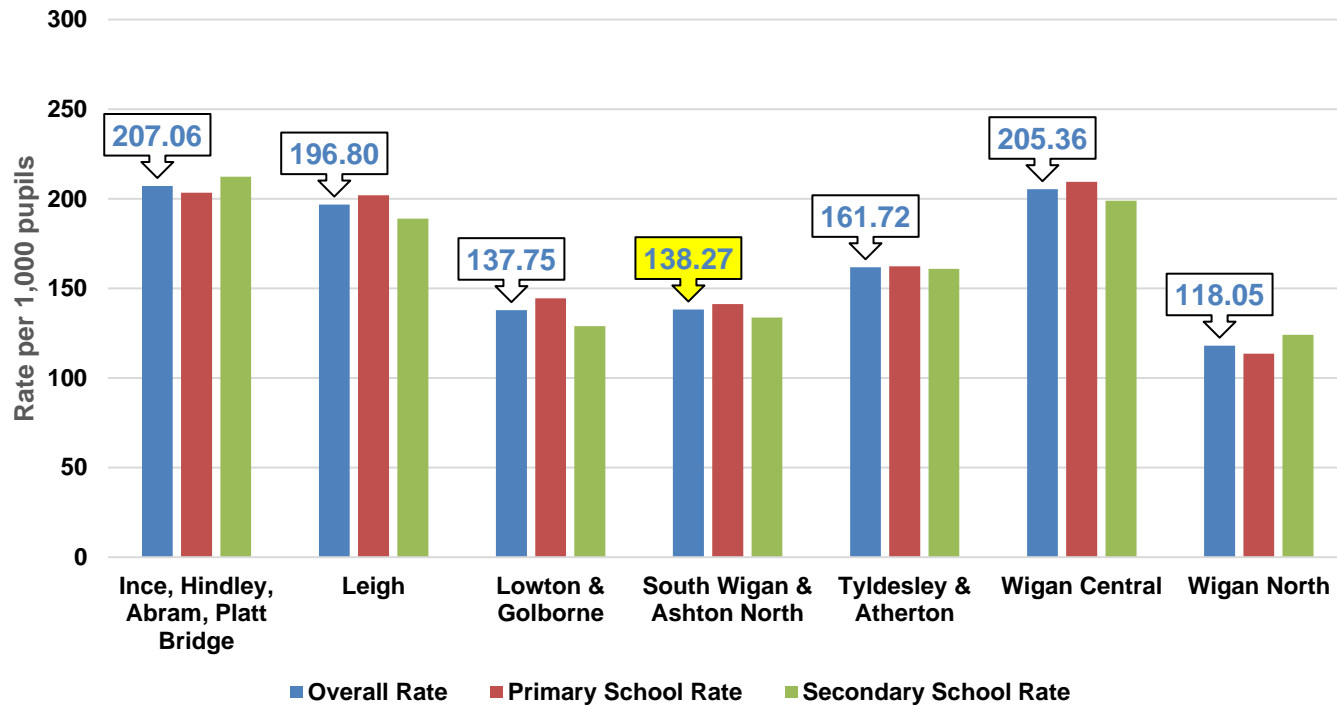

# Pupil Population – Special Educational Needs

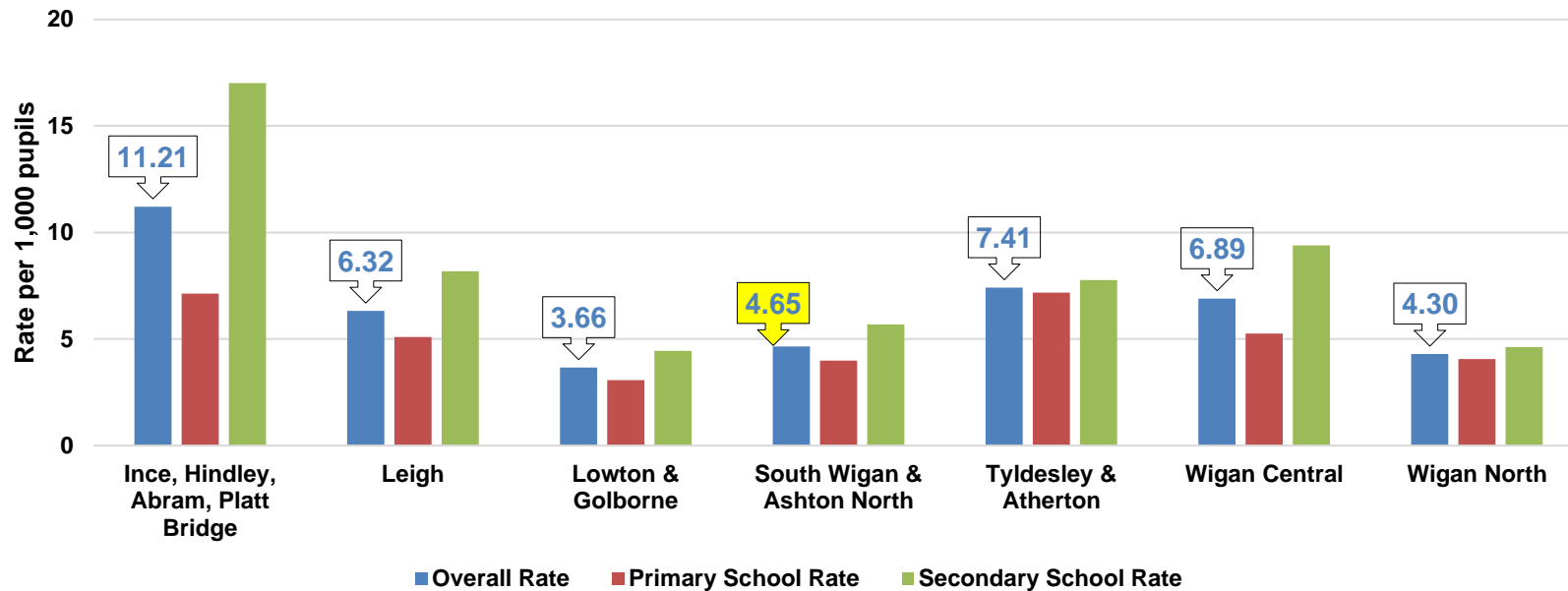
**Special Educational Needs by Pupil Neighbourhood Residence**

January 2021 Census



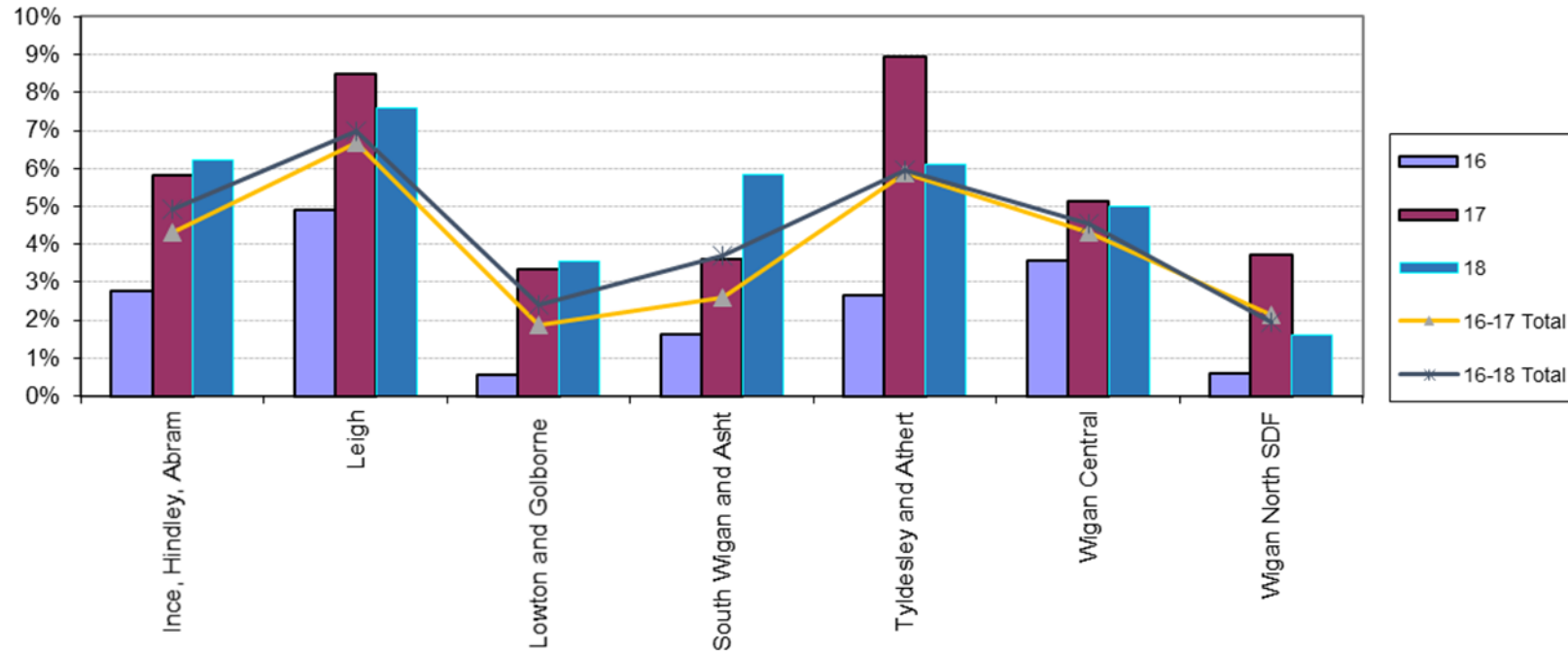

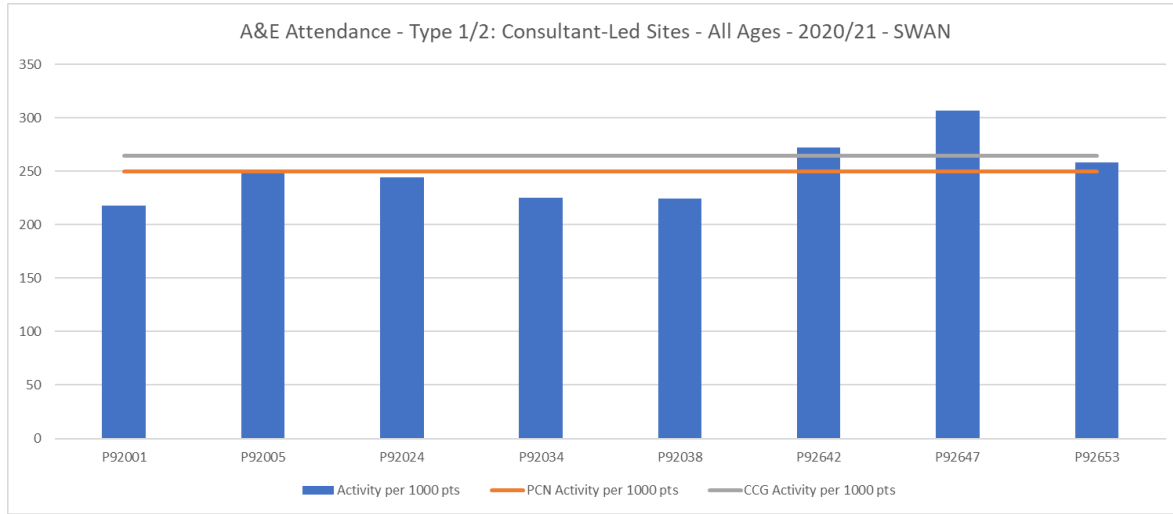

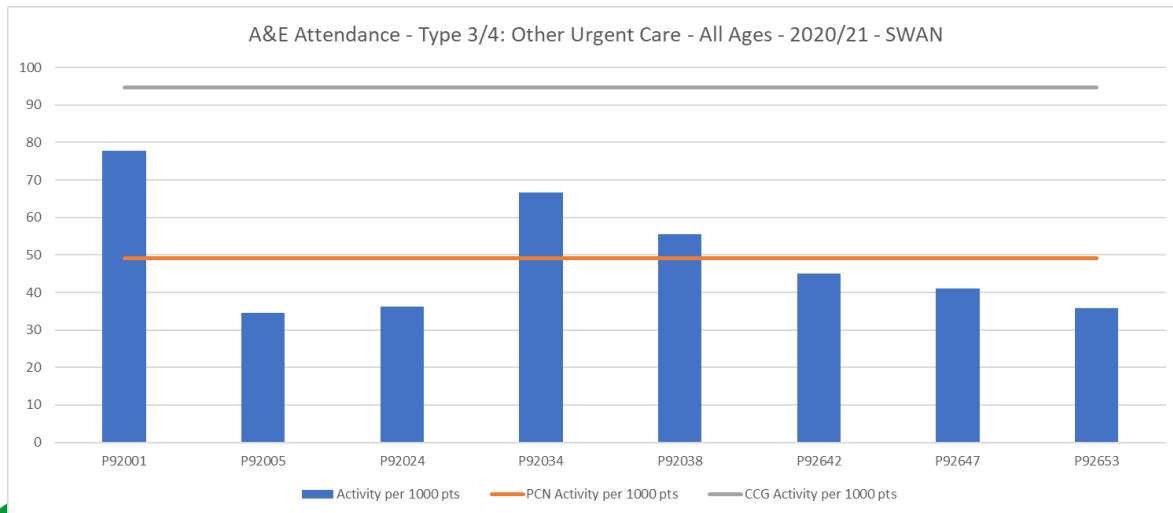

# A&E Attendances – All ages

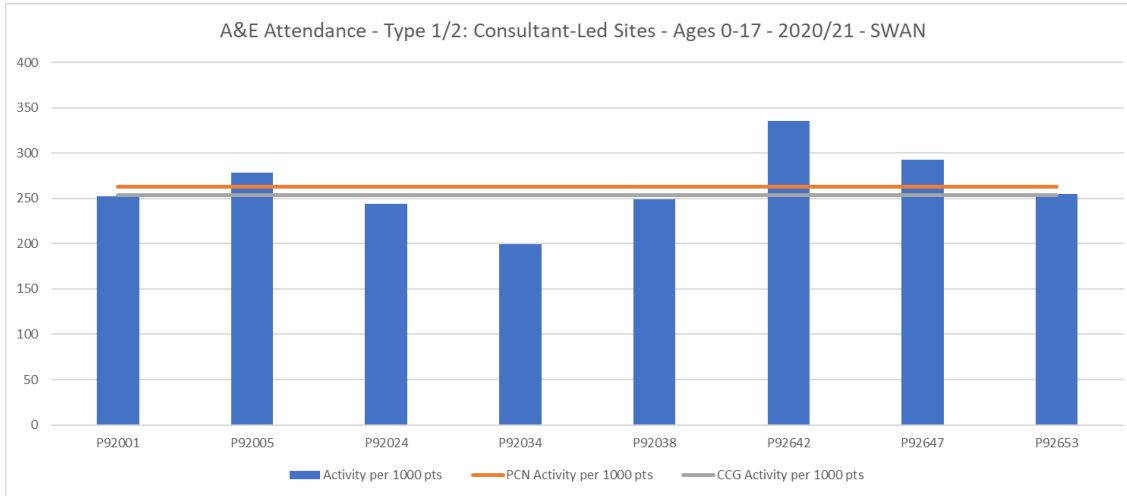

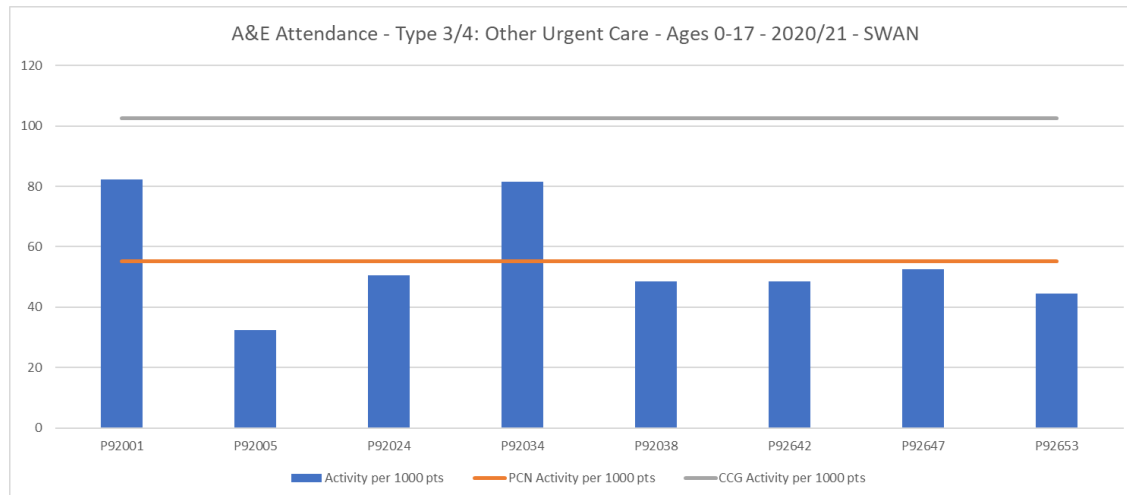




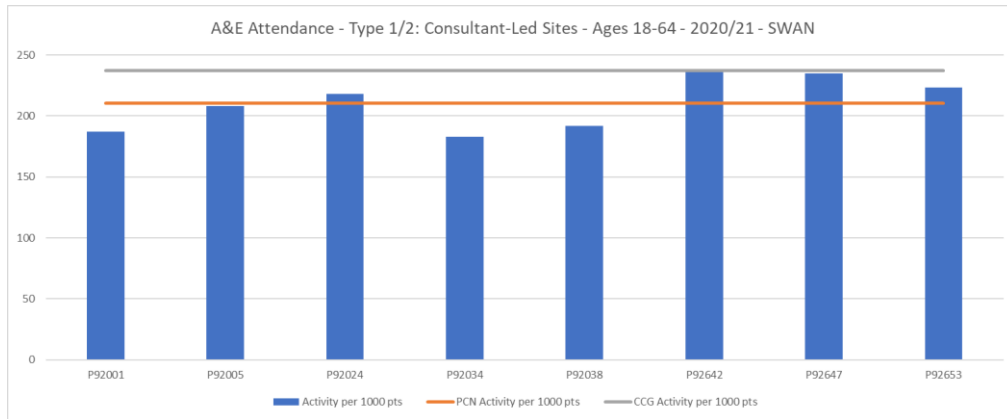
# A&E Attendances – 0-17



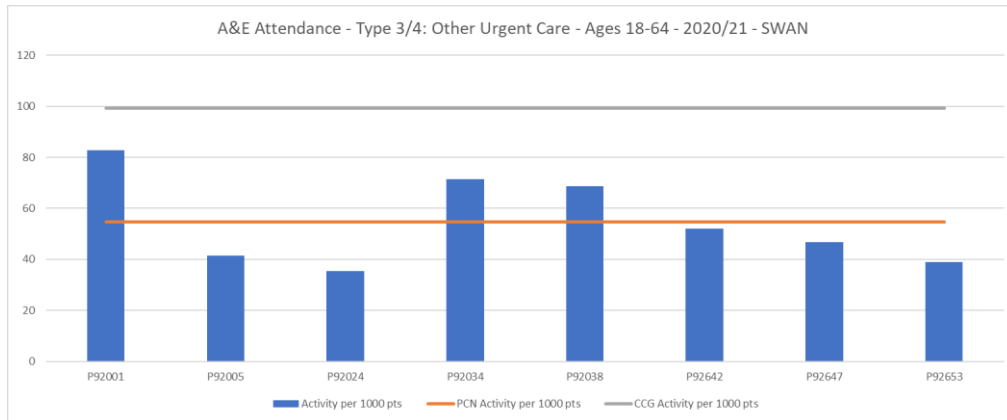

# A&E Attendances – 18-64

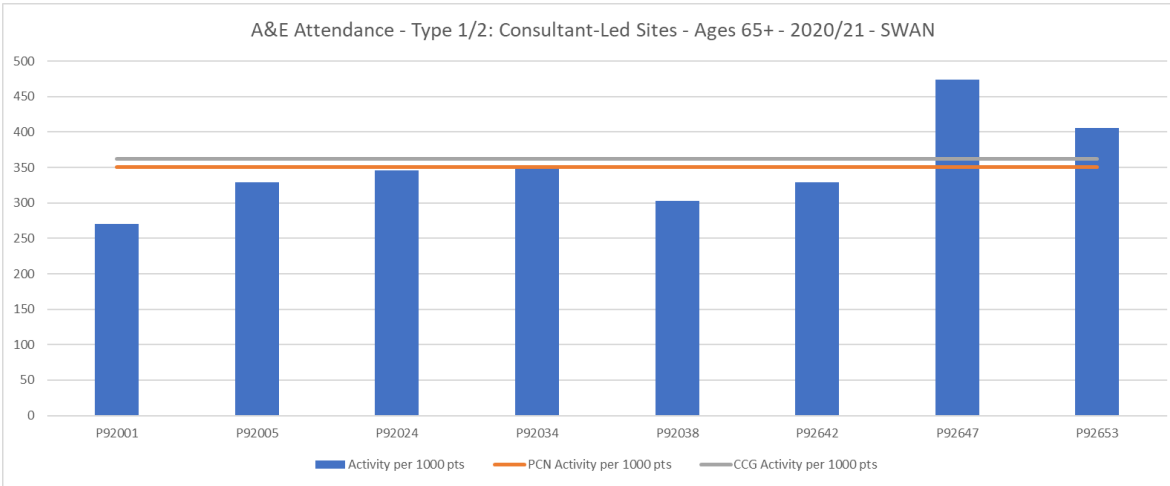

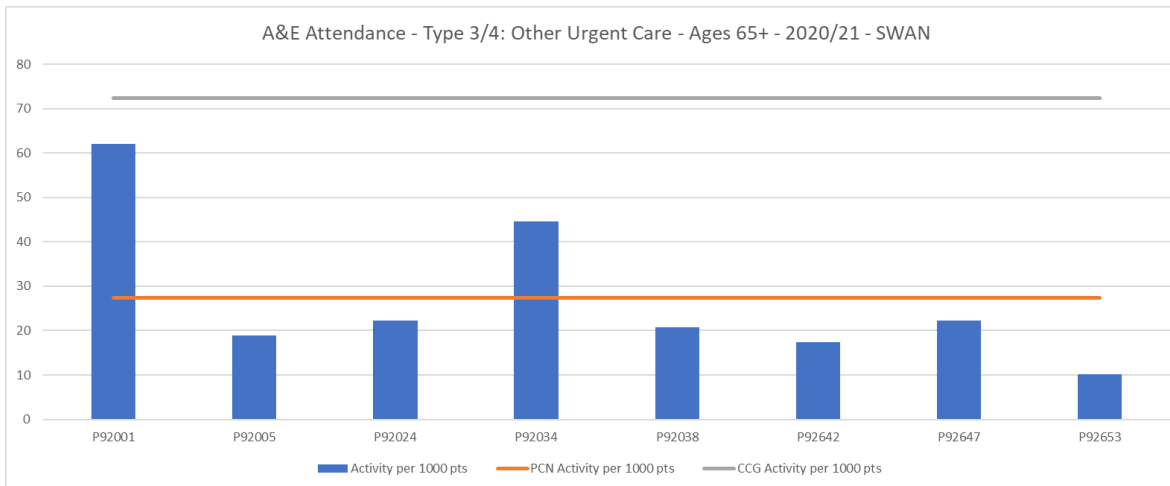

A&E Attendance - Type 1/2: Consultant-Led Sites - Ages 65+ - 2020/21 - SWAN

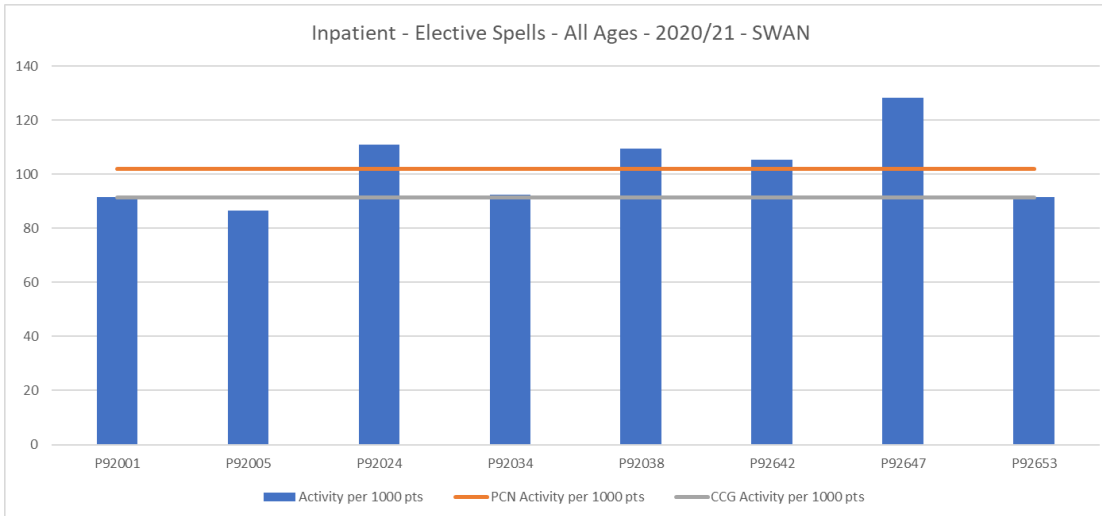

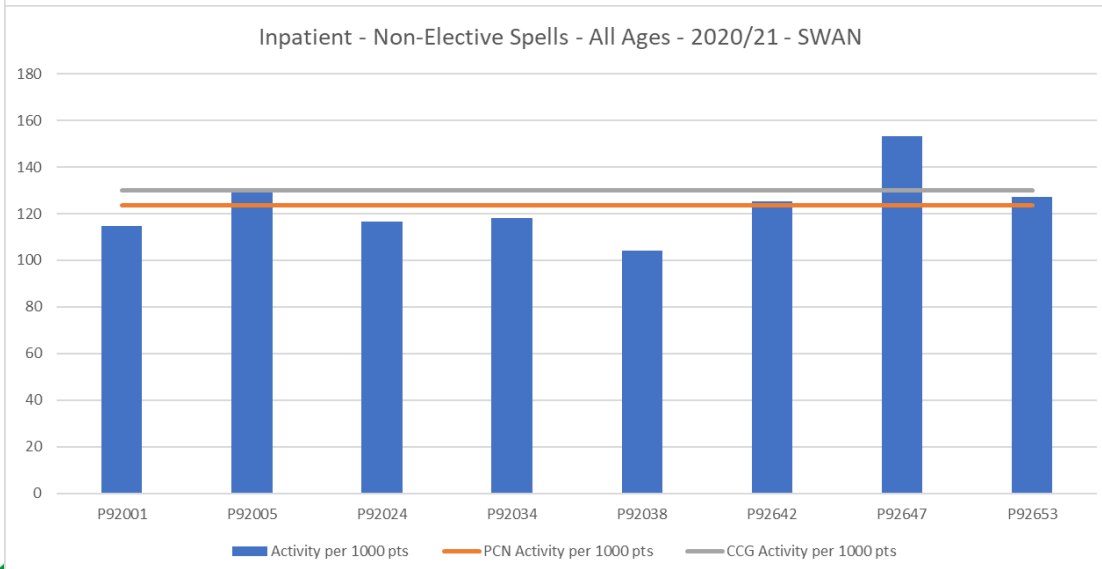
A&E Attendance - Type 3/4: Other Urgent Care - Ages 65+ - 2020/21 - SWAN



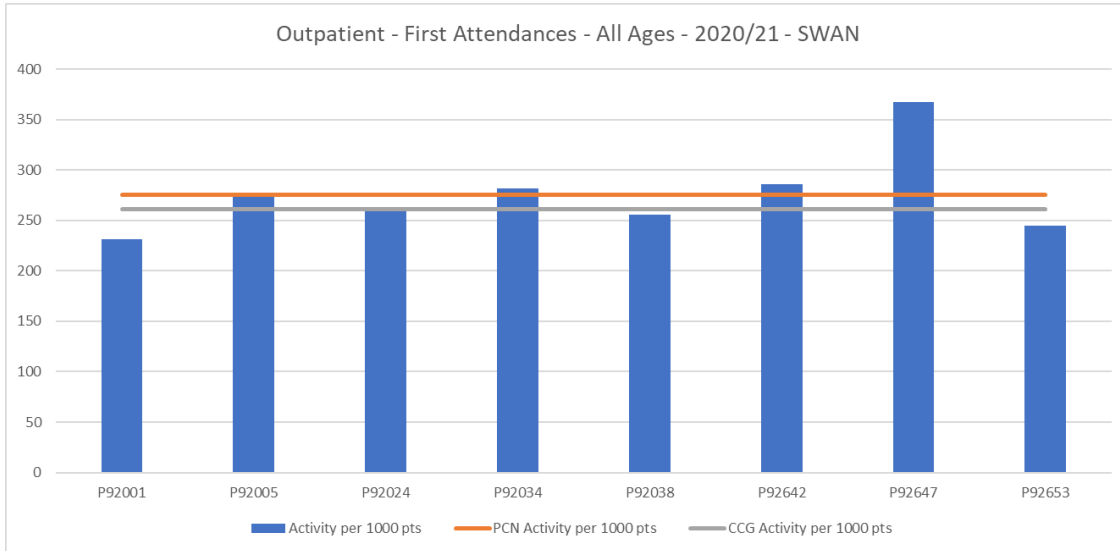

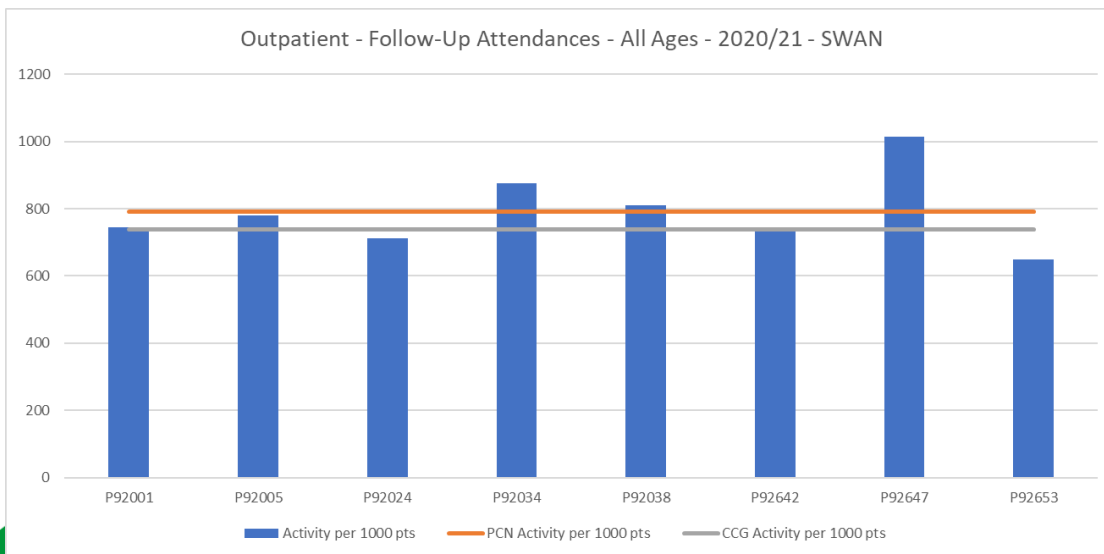

# Fuel Poverty

- 10.25% of households in England are living in fuel poverty. In Wigan Borough the proportion is 10.8%, below the North West average but above the national average
- 9.3% of households in the Neighbourhood are living in fuel poverty, a decrease from 9.9% in 2016
- Whilst the trend in most LSOAs has been positive, Highfield, Winstanley / Highfield, Hawkley North, Hawkley and Marus Bridge East have all seen increases in the number of households living in fuel poverty.

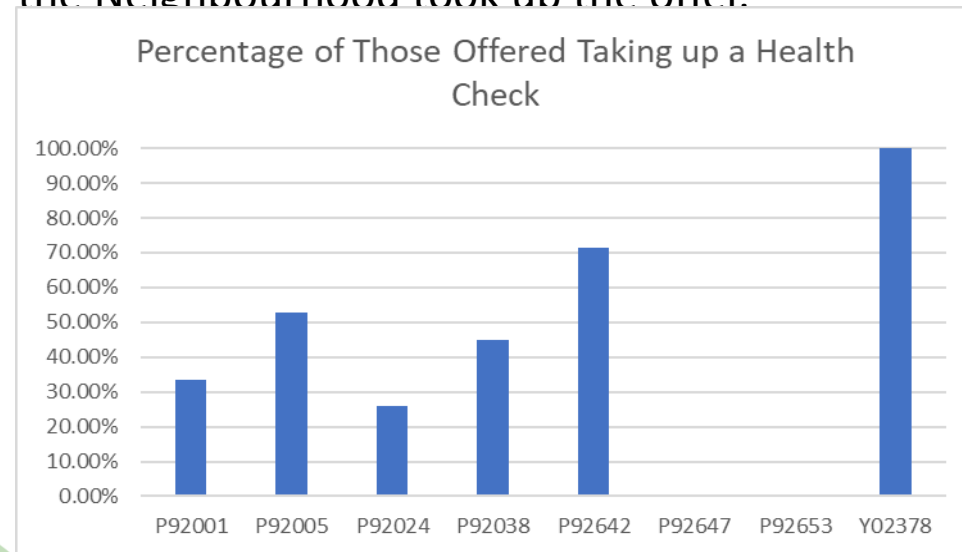
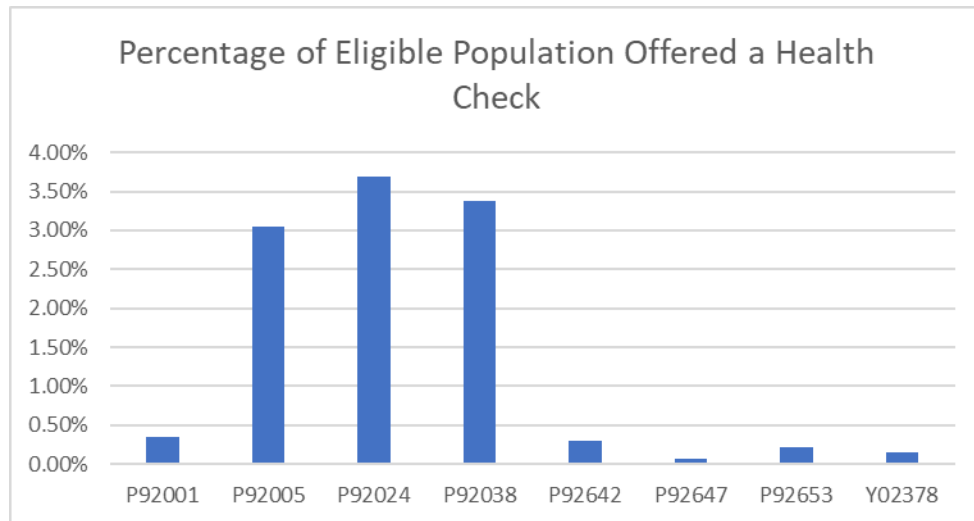

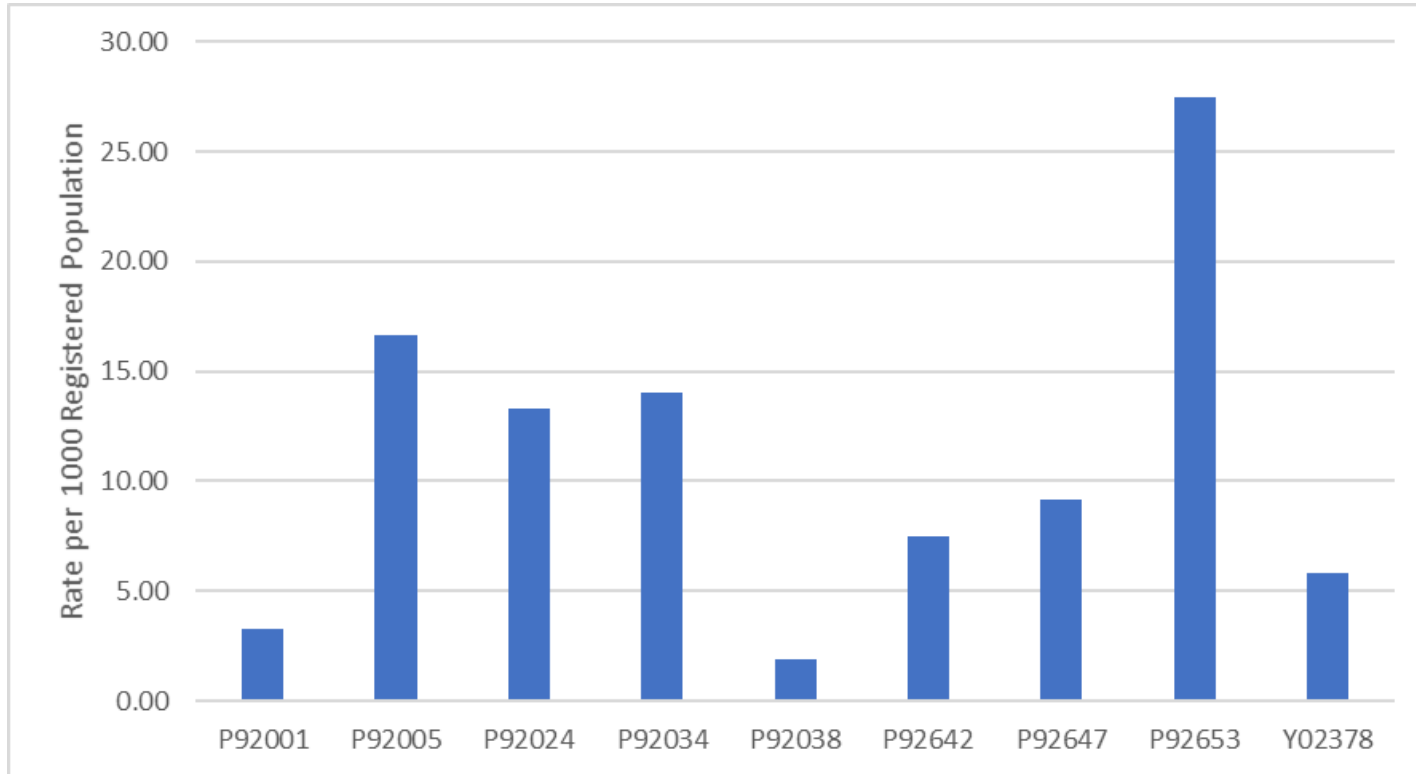

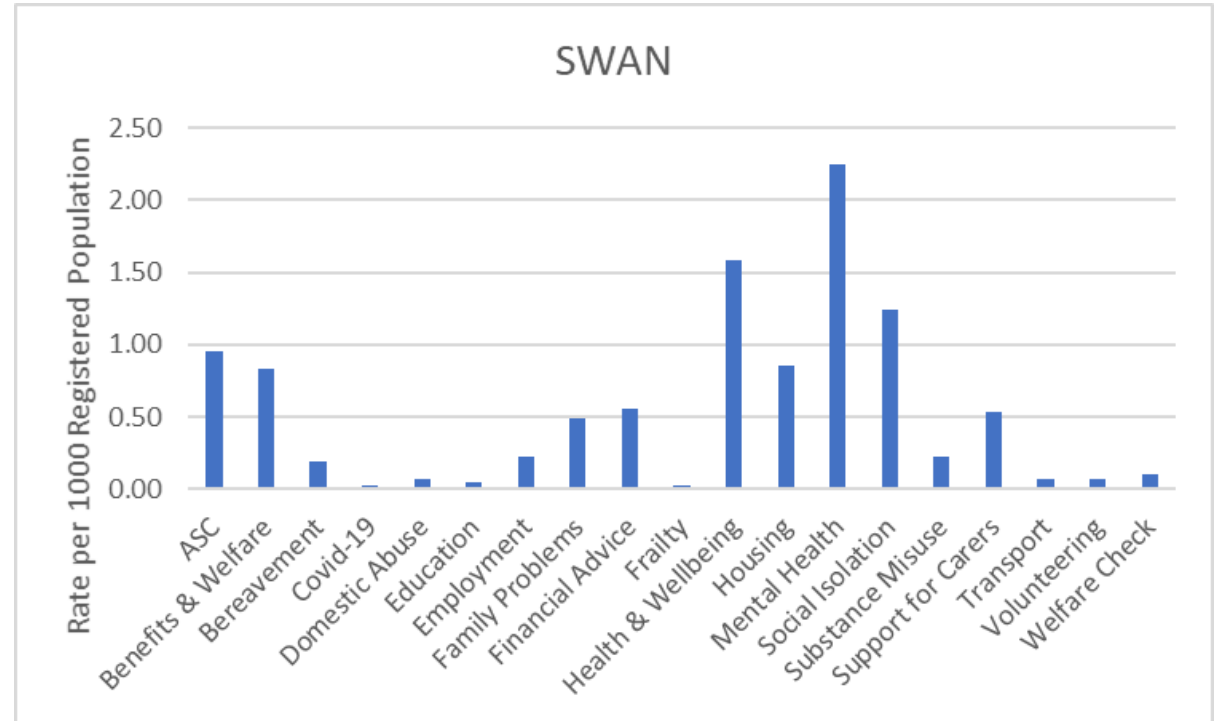

# Place and Community Safety

- SWAN reported the second lowest number of Police ASB incidents, with the highest totals contributed by rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour and neighbour nuisance.
- Hotspots included a range of settings on Warrington Road including residential areas, Premier Inn and Total Fitness (n12 – neighbours, rowdy / inconsiderate, noise), Horne Grove (n10 – rowdy / inconsiderate), Wigan St Judes rugby / social club (n9 – rowdy / inconsiderate), Fisher Close (n9 – rowdy / inconsiderate, neighbours, malicious communications), a range of settings along Holmes House Avenue complex including public house, The Winstanley Centre and St Aidan’s Church (n9 – rowdy / inconsiderate).
- SWAN saw a decrease in GMFRS ASB incidents in 2019/20 followed by an increase in 2020/21 to a rate of 1.84 per 1,000 population. The number of Deliberate Fires had almost halved in 2019/20 however was back to close to 2018/19 totals by 2020/21. The number of Deliberate Fires (Loose Refuse) had also increased

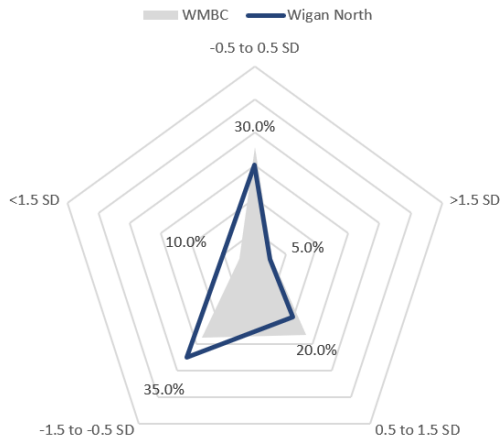
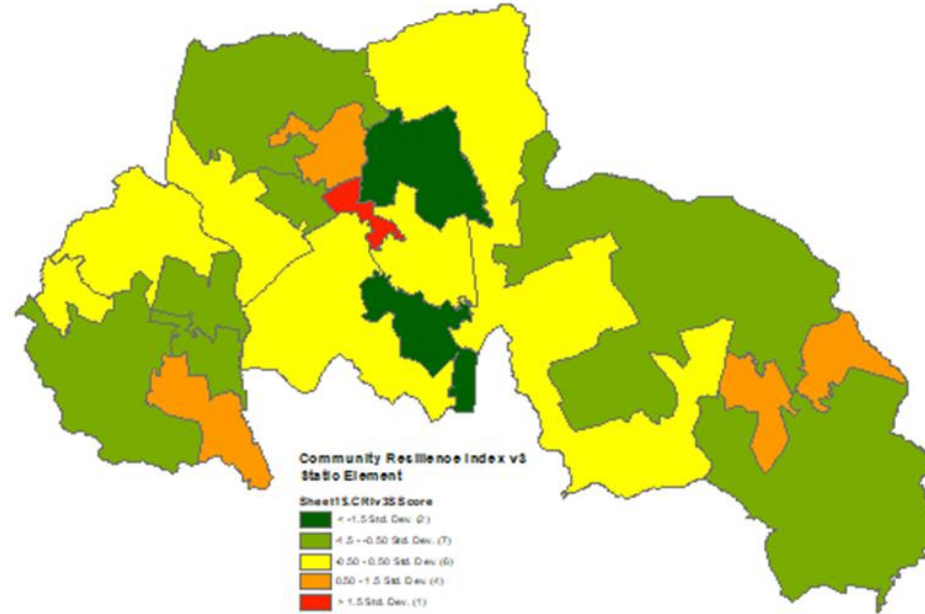
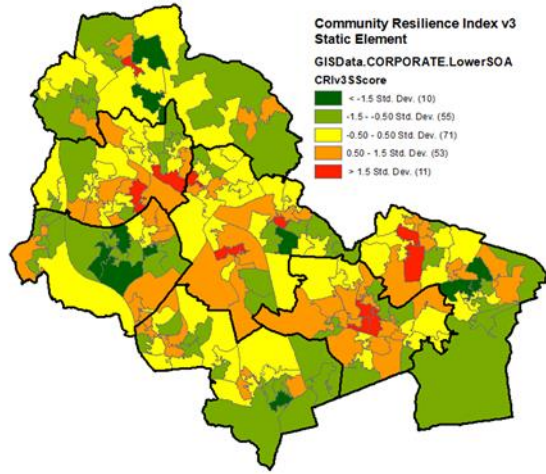
# Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
  - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
  - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
  - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.
  - The rate of shielded patients in each LSOA.

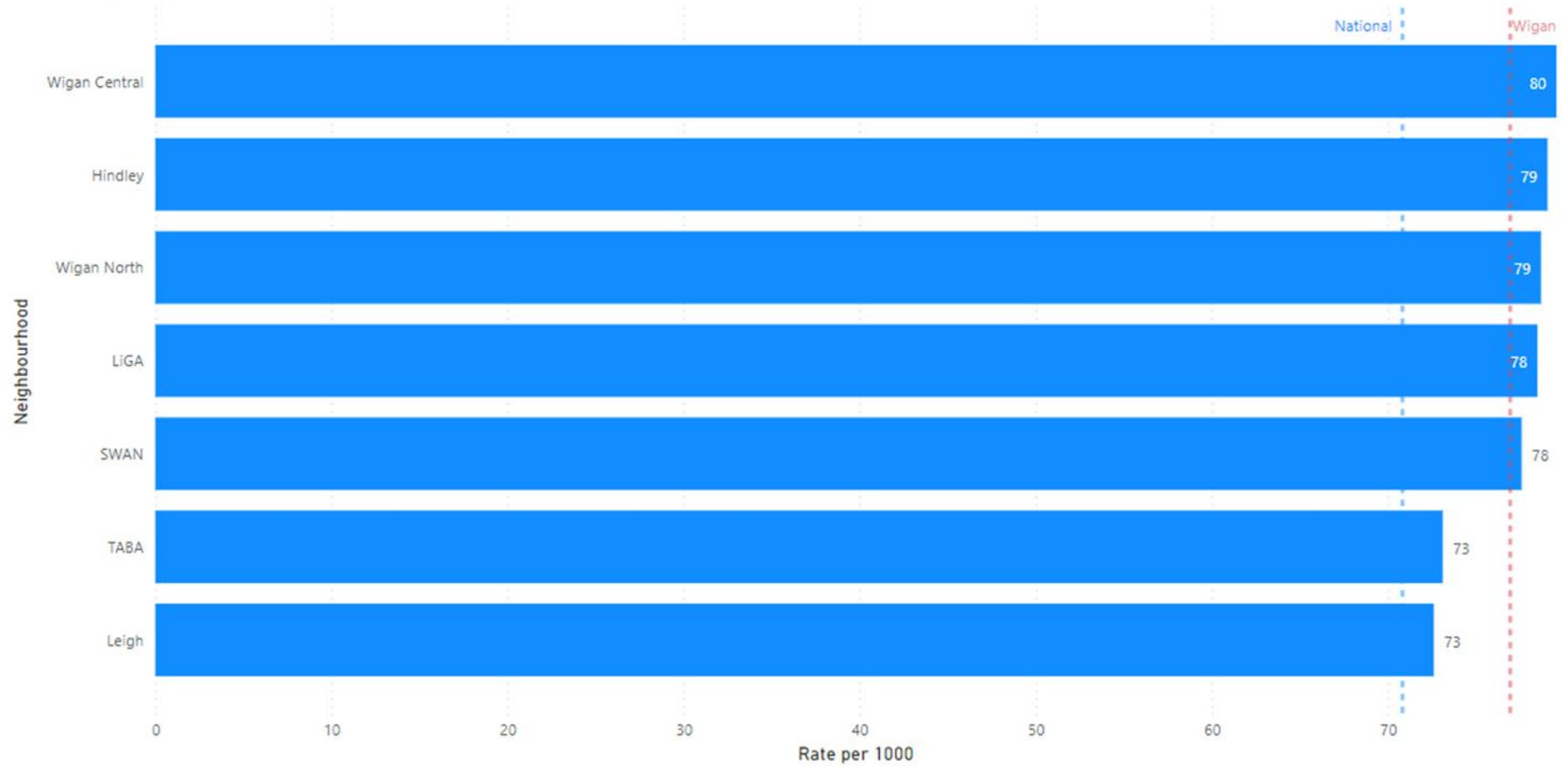

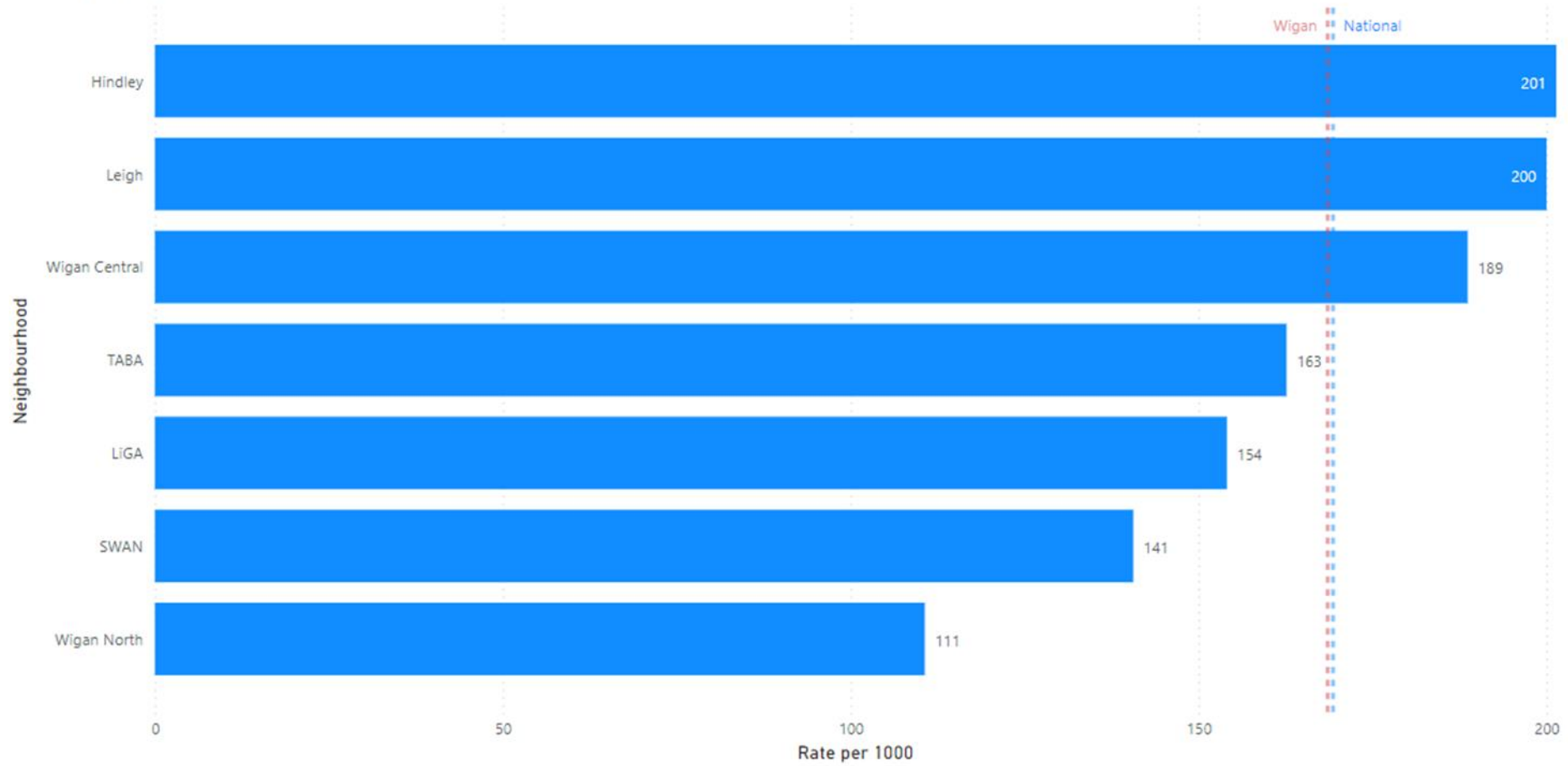

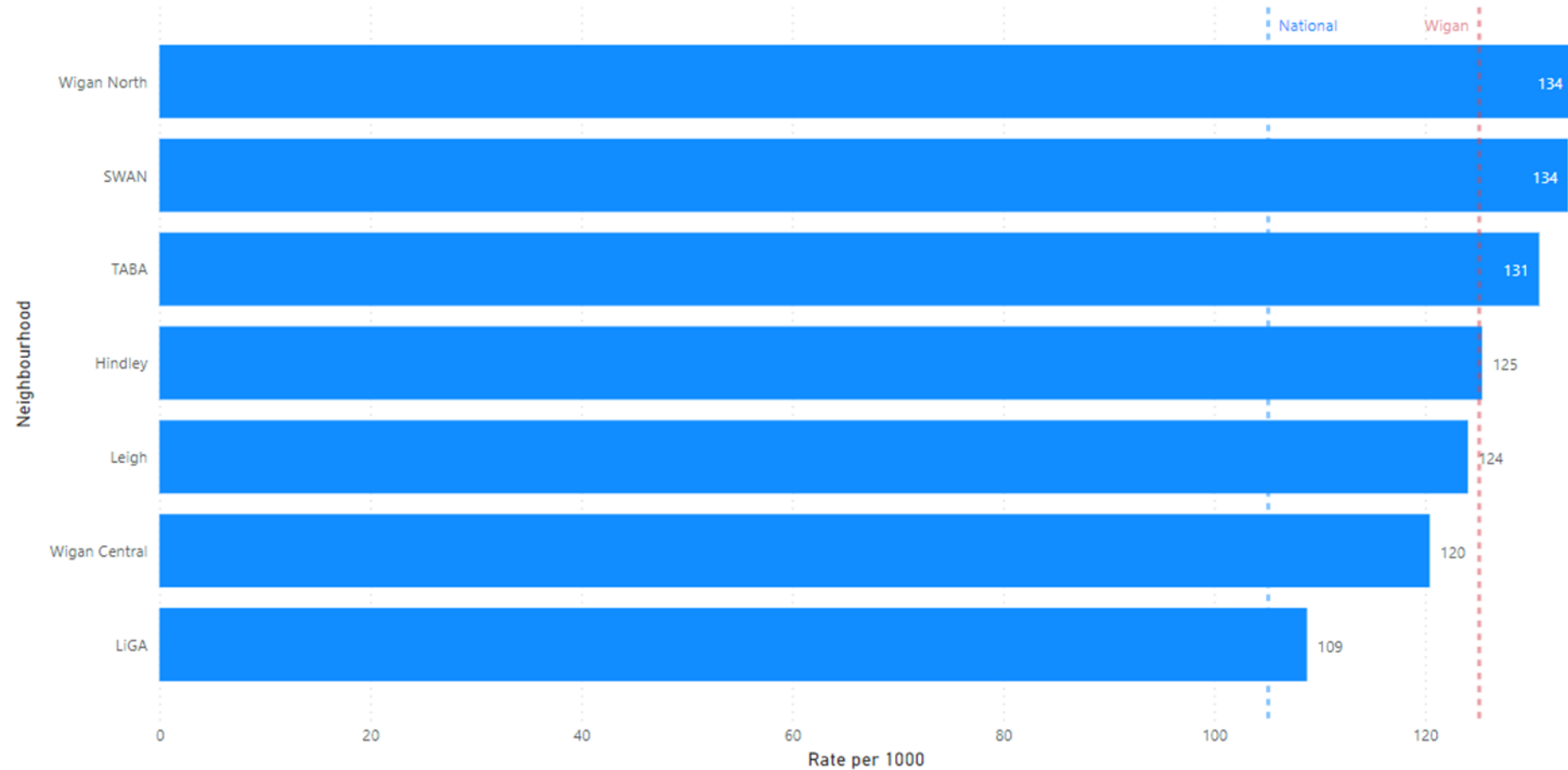

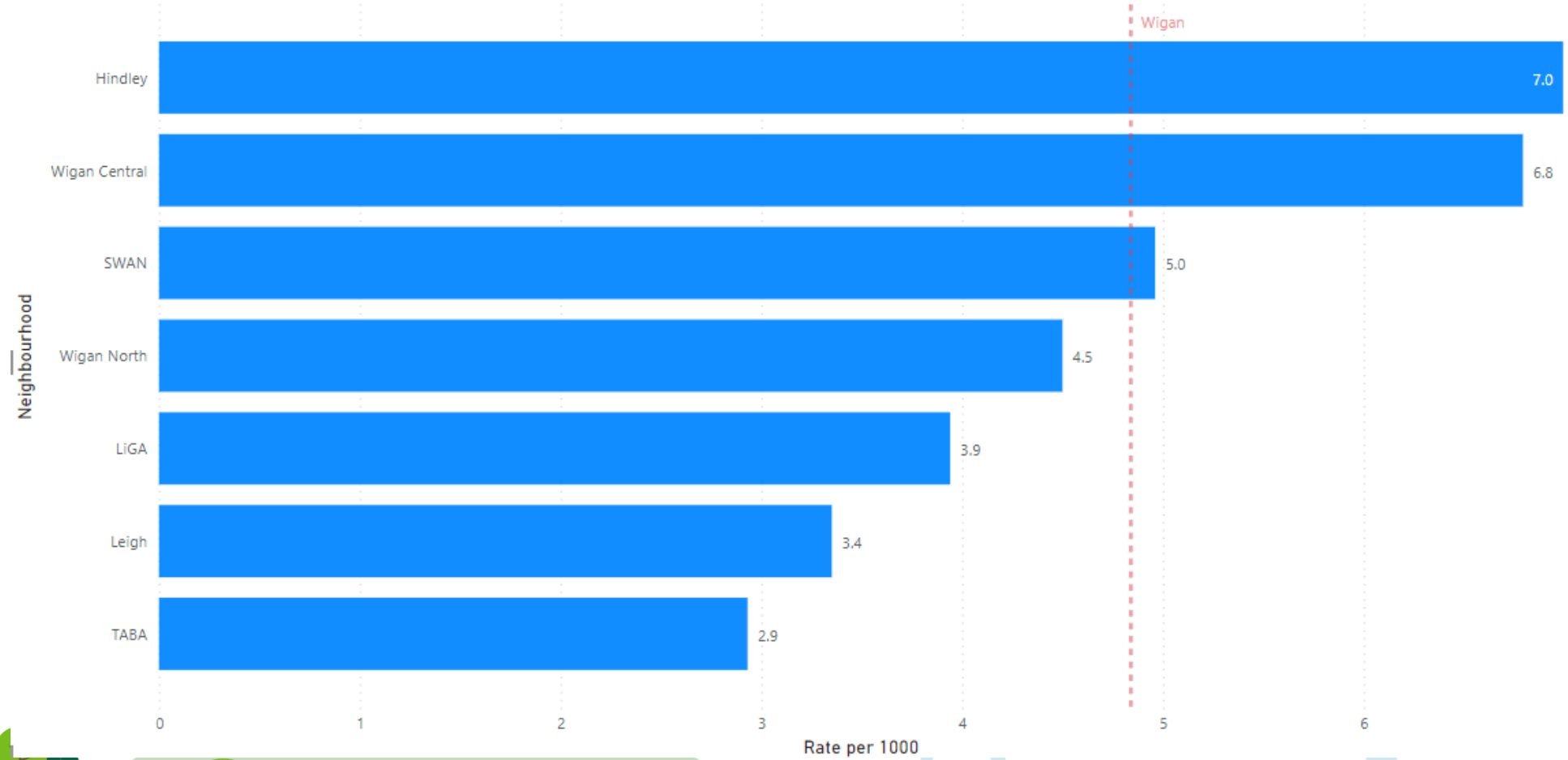

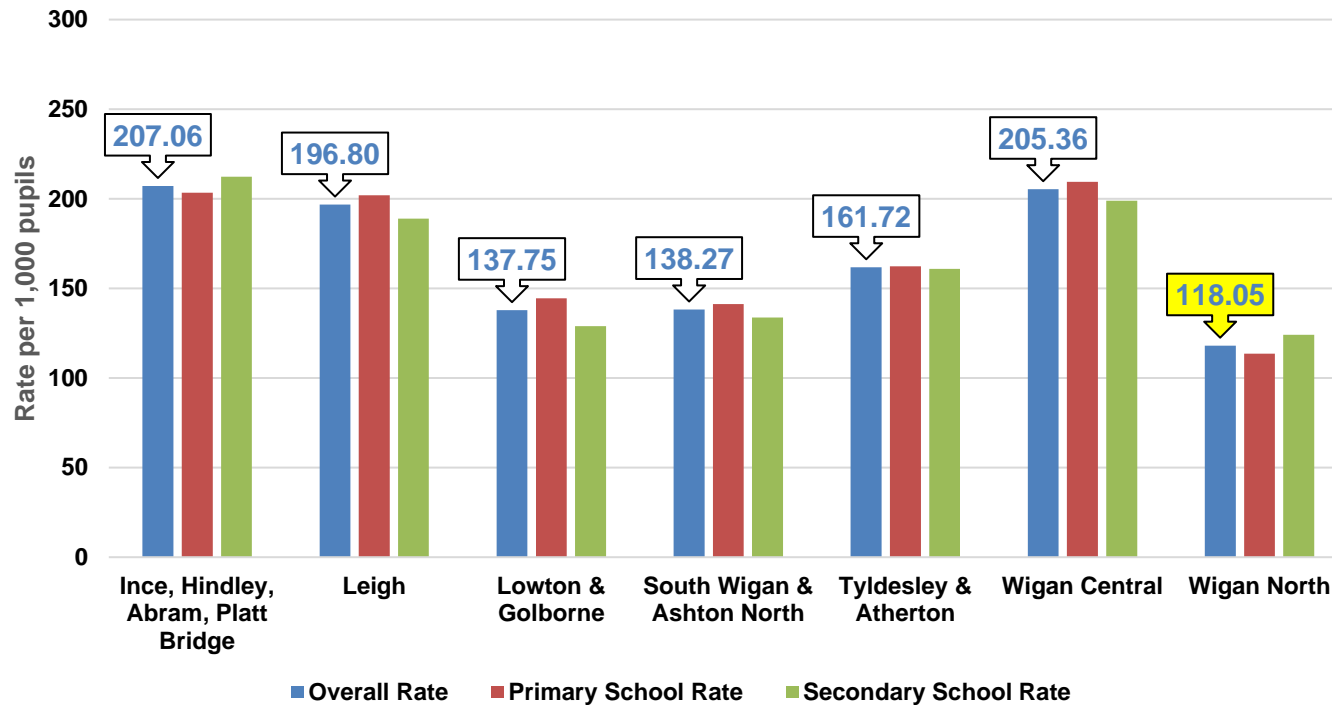

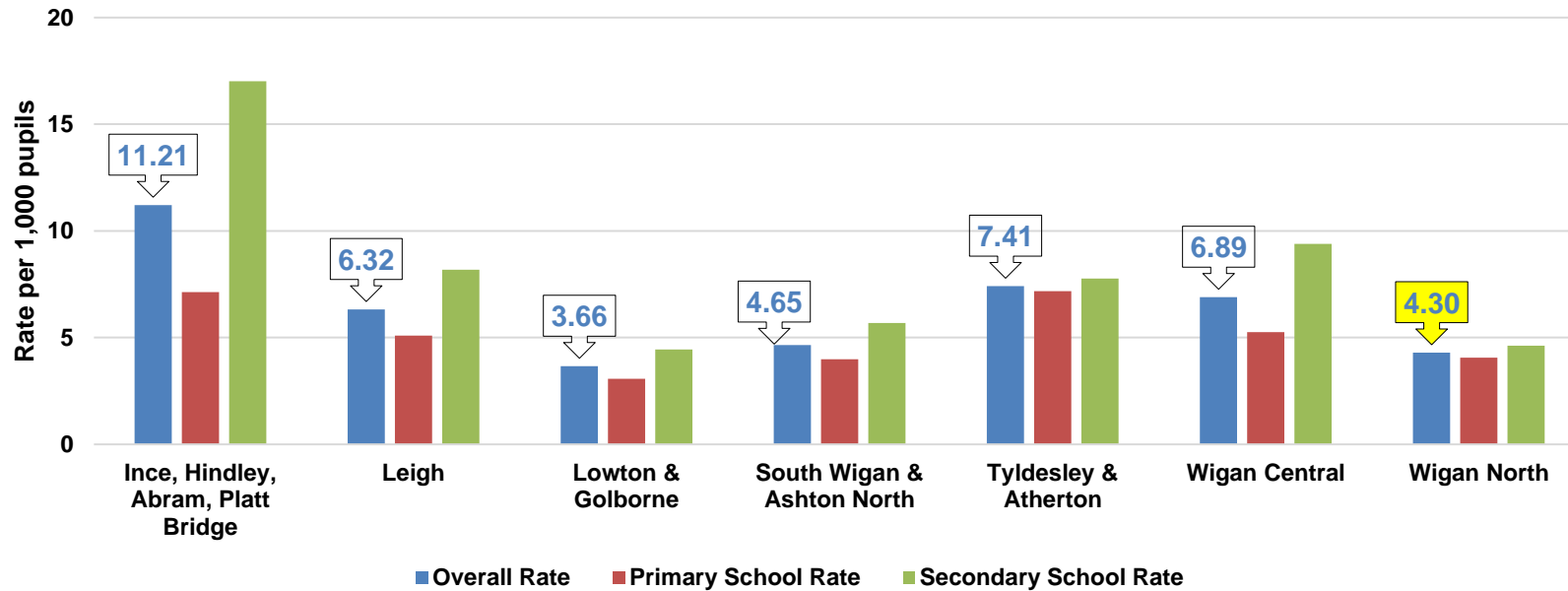

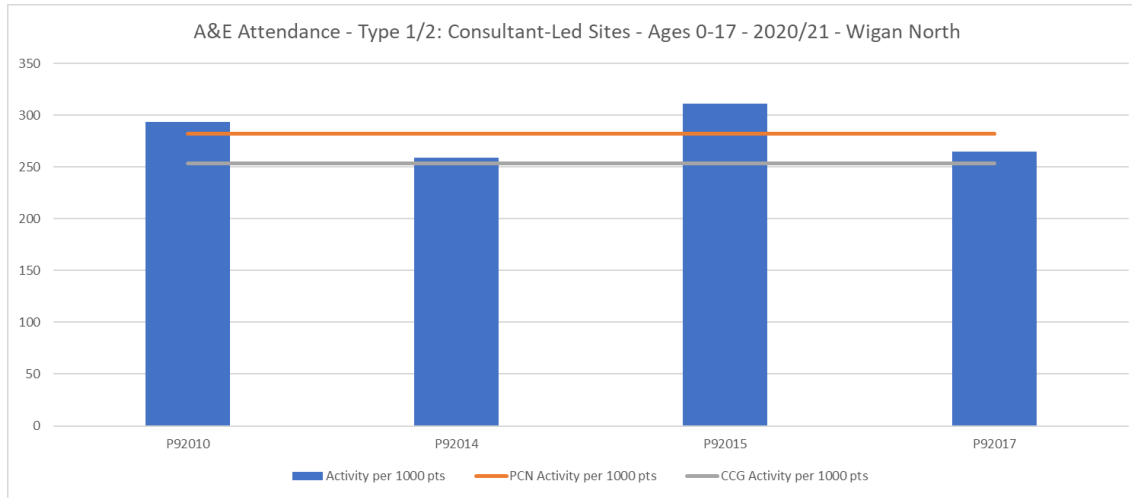
# A&E Attendances – All Ages



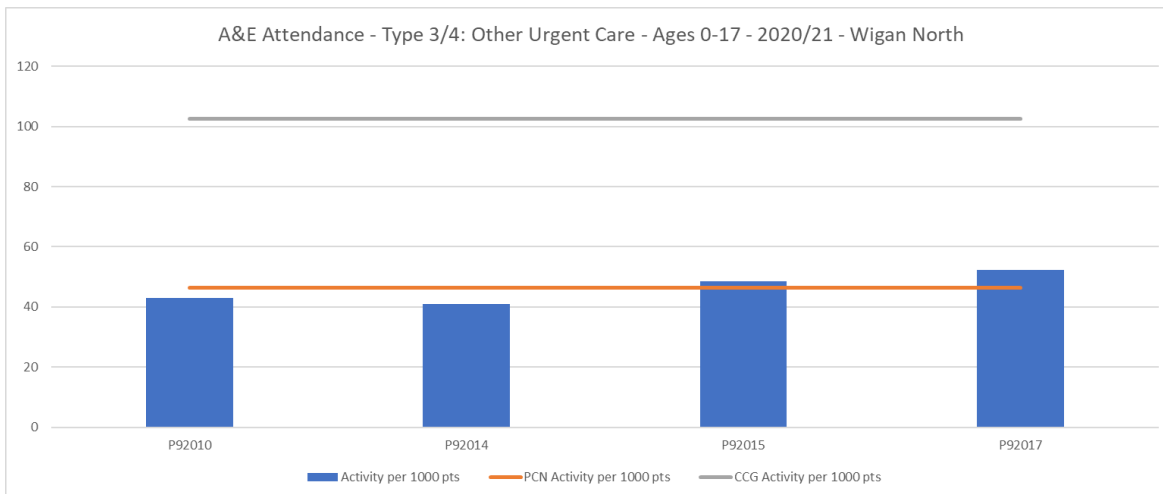

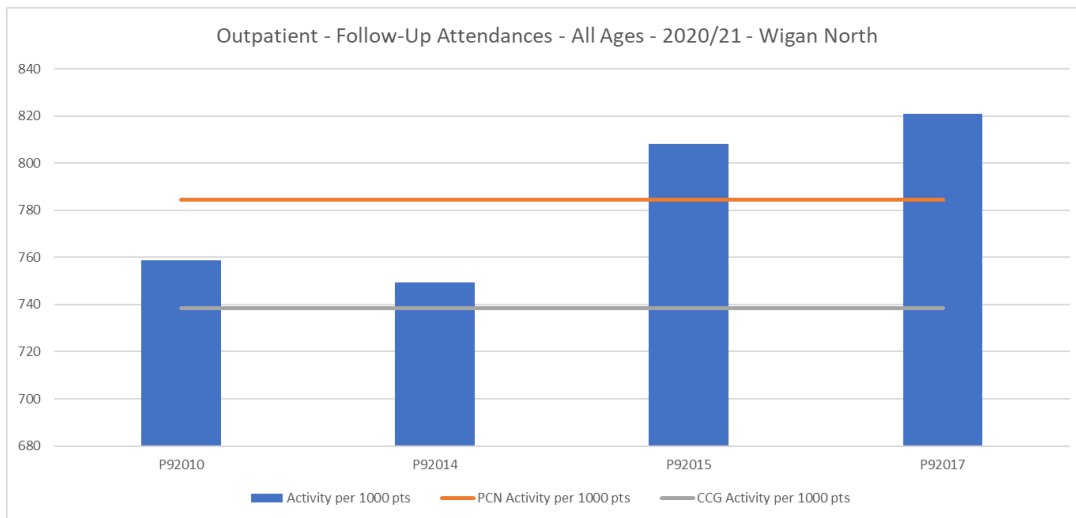

- Wigan North reported significantly the lowest number and proportion of ASB incidents during the reporting period 2020/21.
- Rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour and neighbour nuisance contributed the largest totals. Hotspots included the Britannia Hotel (n9 – rowdy / inconsiderate), Brookacre Close (n7 – malicious communications, neighbour and vehicle nuisance), Inward Drive (n6 – neighbours, hoax calls and malicious communications) however no setting recorded into double figures for incidents during the reporting period.
- Wigan North saw a consistent downward trend in GMFRS anti-social behaviour incidents over the three years 2018/19 to 2020/21 to overtake Wigan South as the Neighbourhood with the lowest number of incidents (rate 1.48 per 1,000 population). Vehicle Fires had climbed significantly in 2019/20 but returned to near previous levels a year later. Numbers of Deliberate Fires and Deliberate Fires (Loose Refuse) had fallen by almost 50% from 2018/19 to 2020/21.

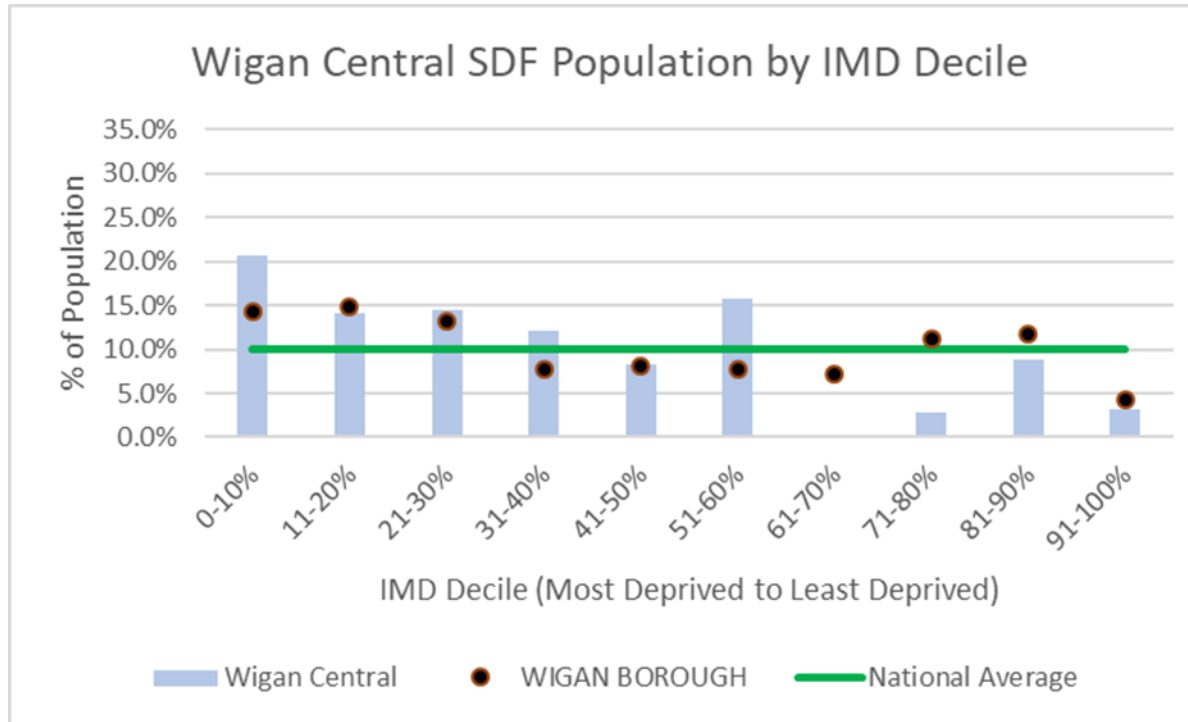

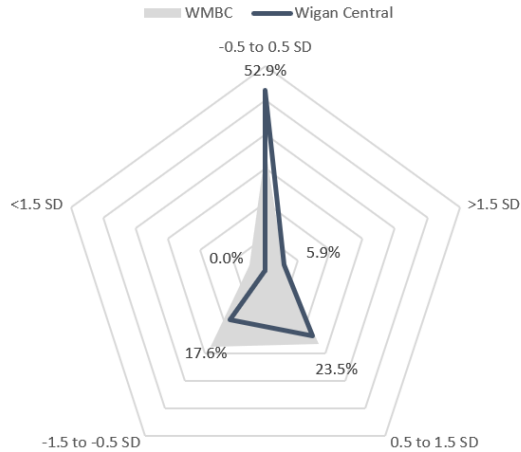
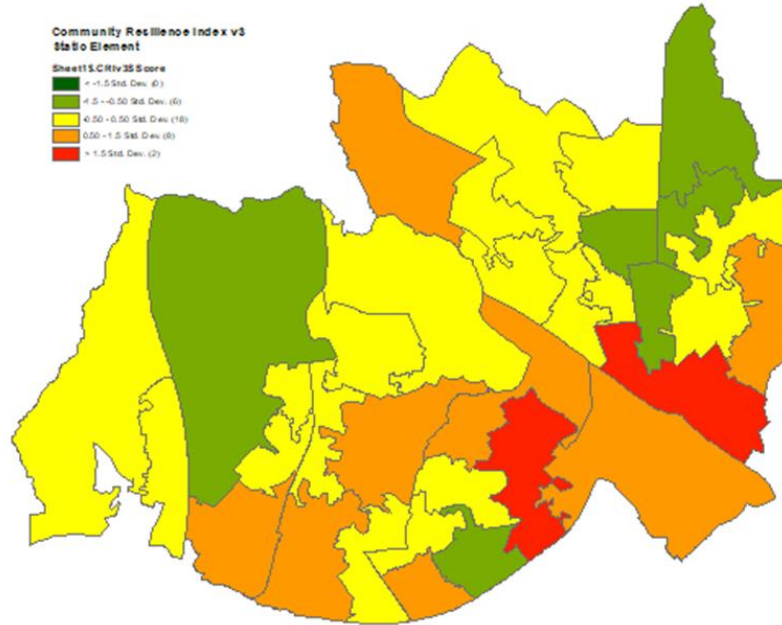
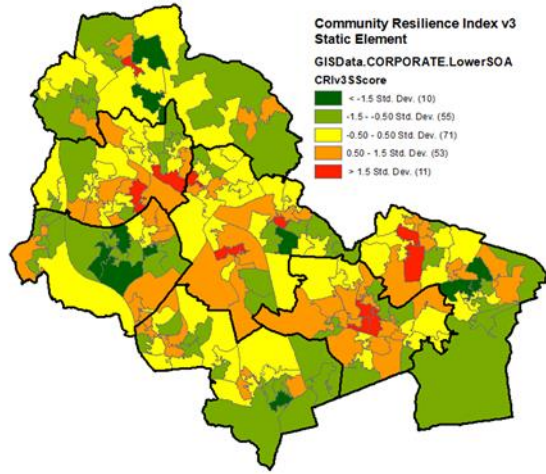
# Community Resilience Index

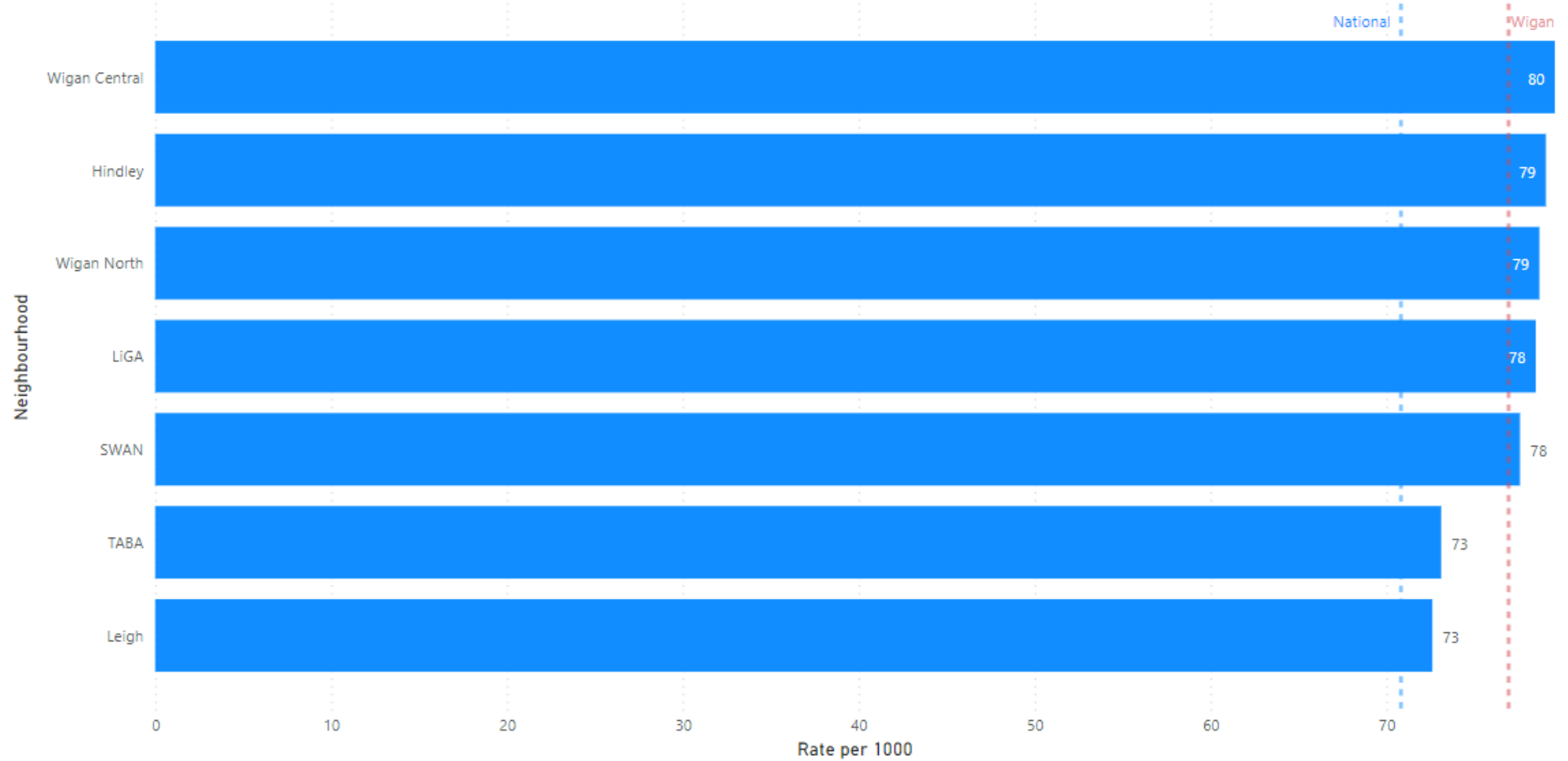

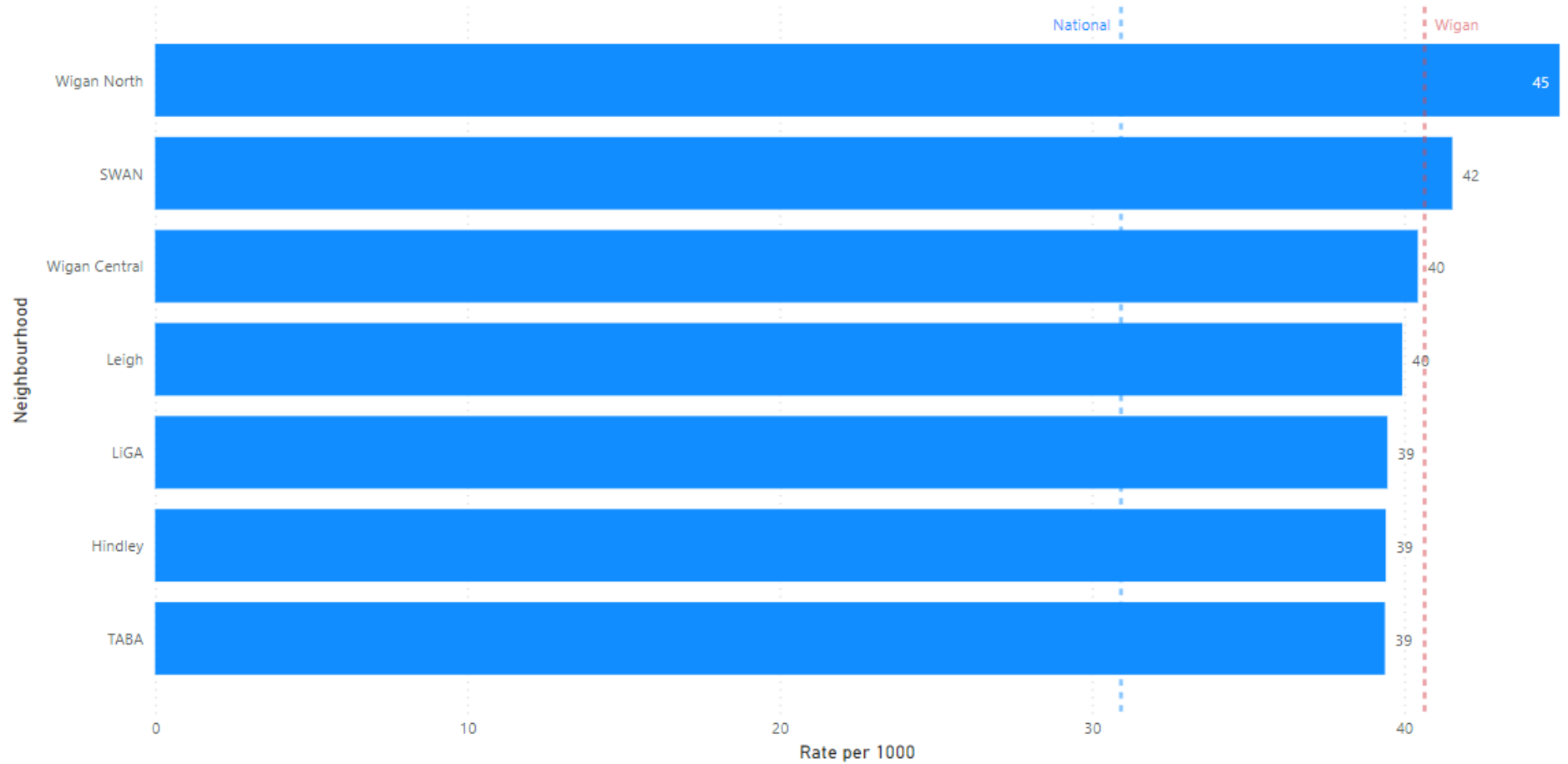

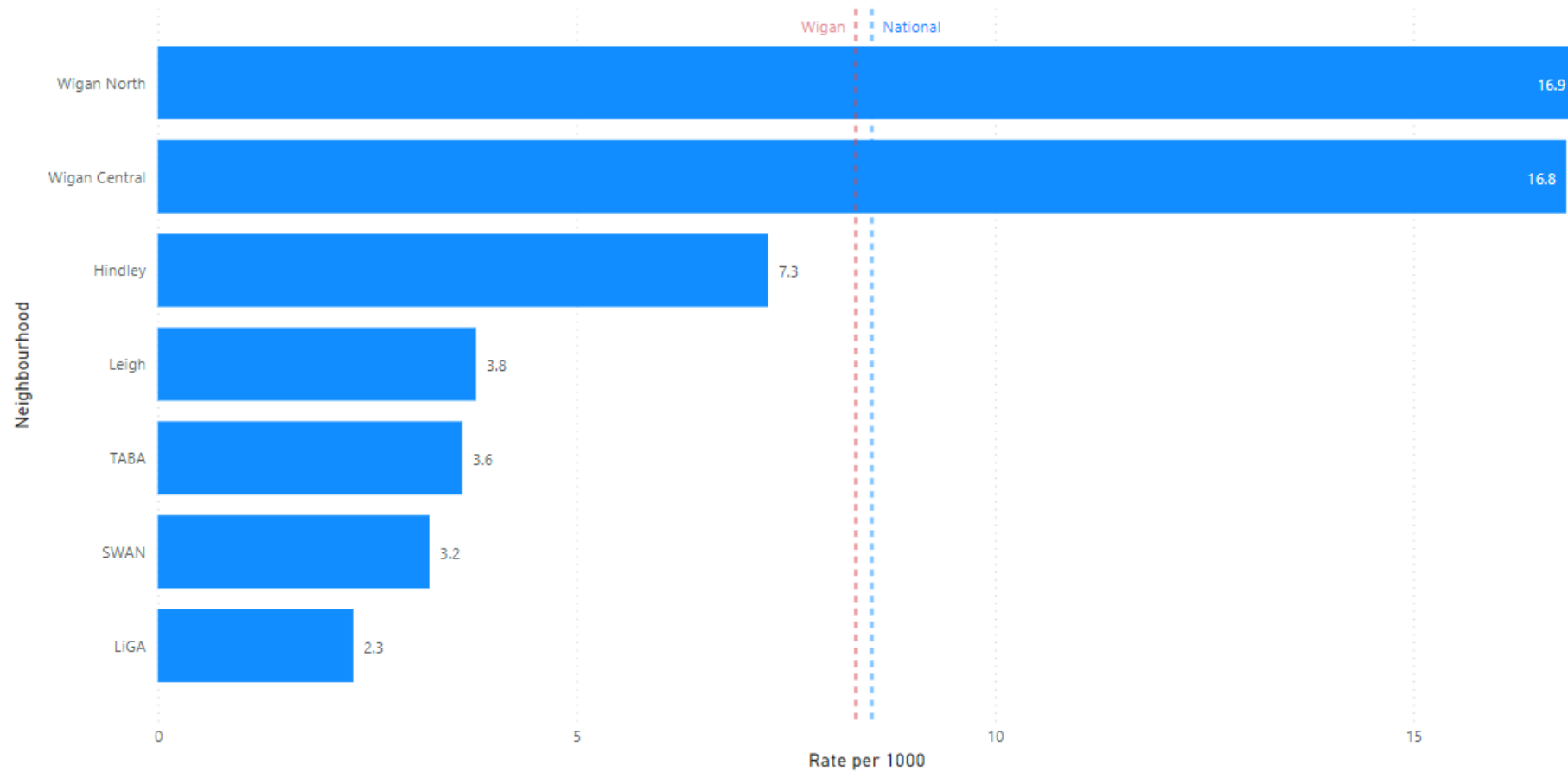

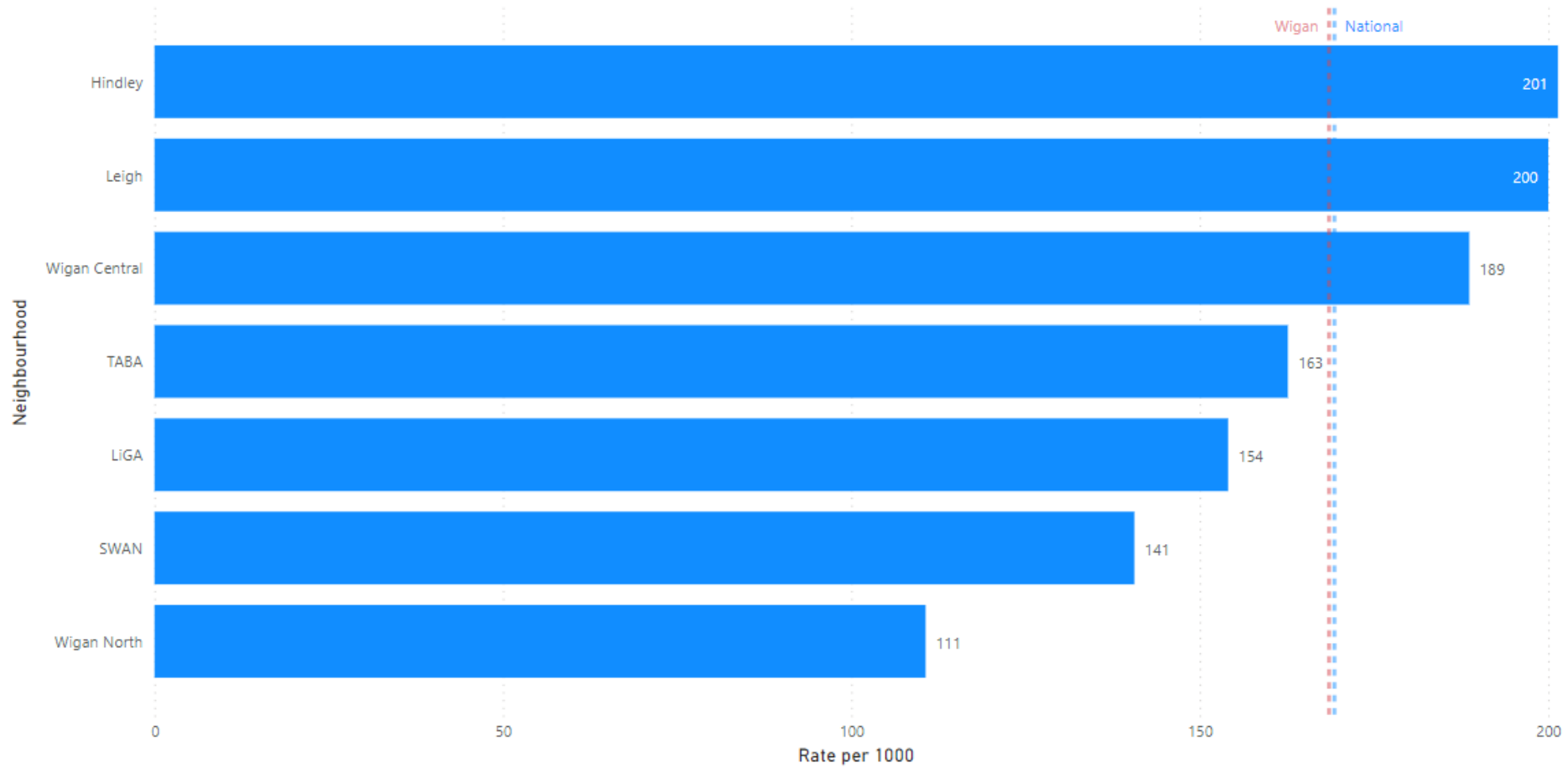

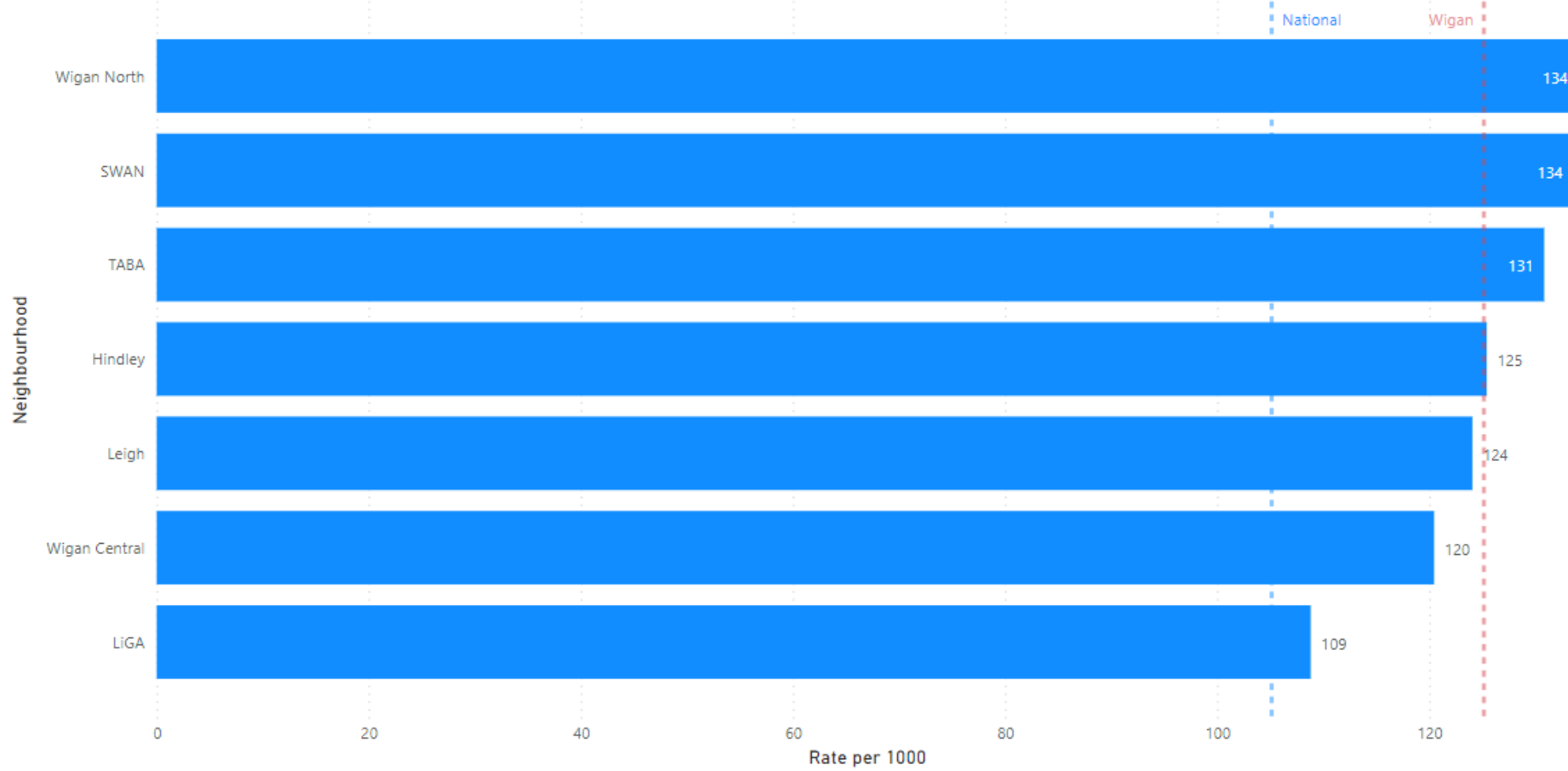

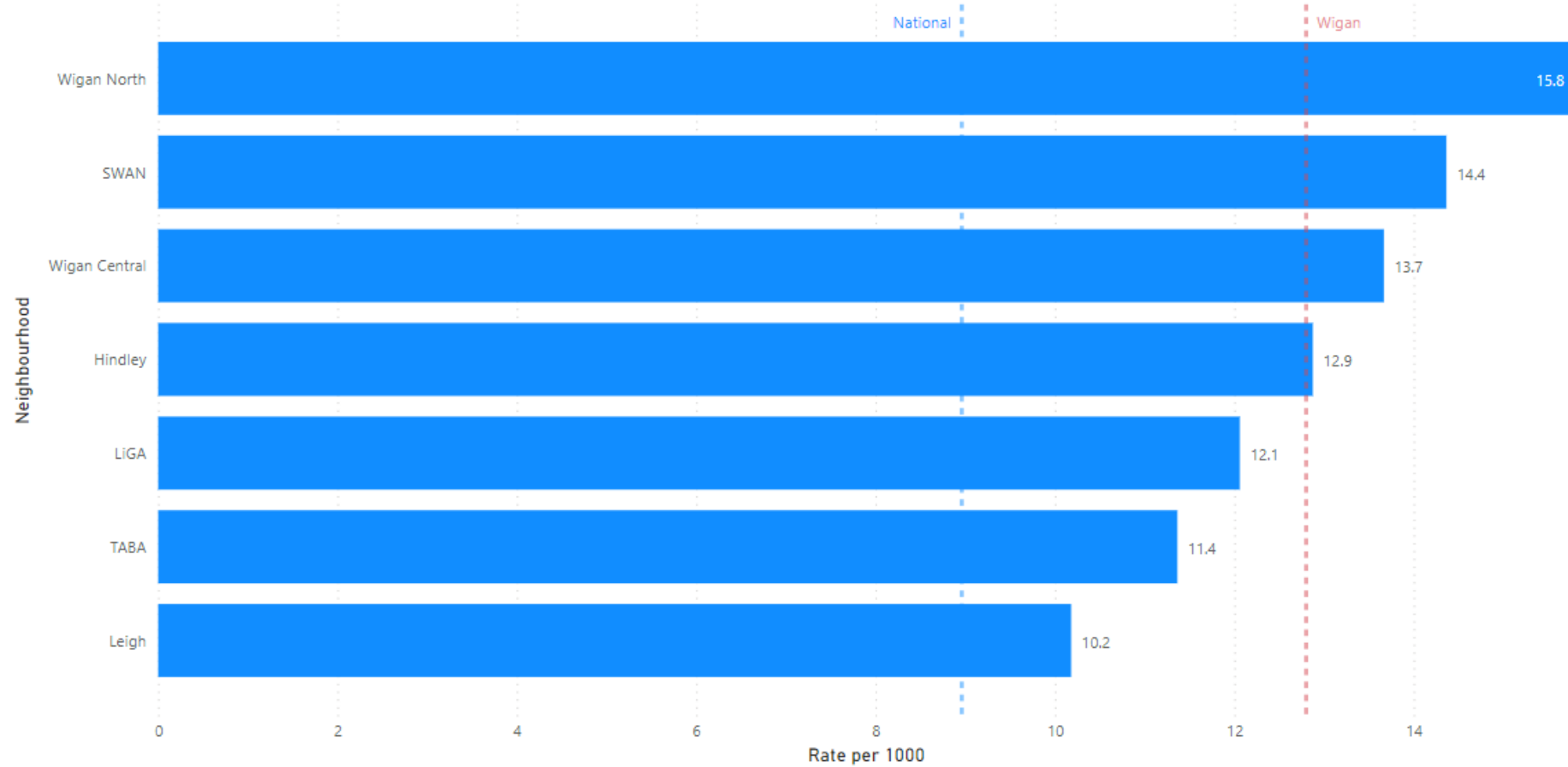

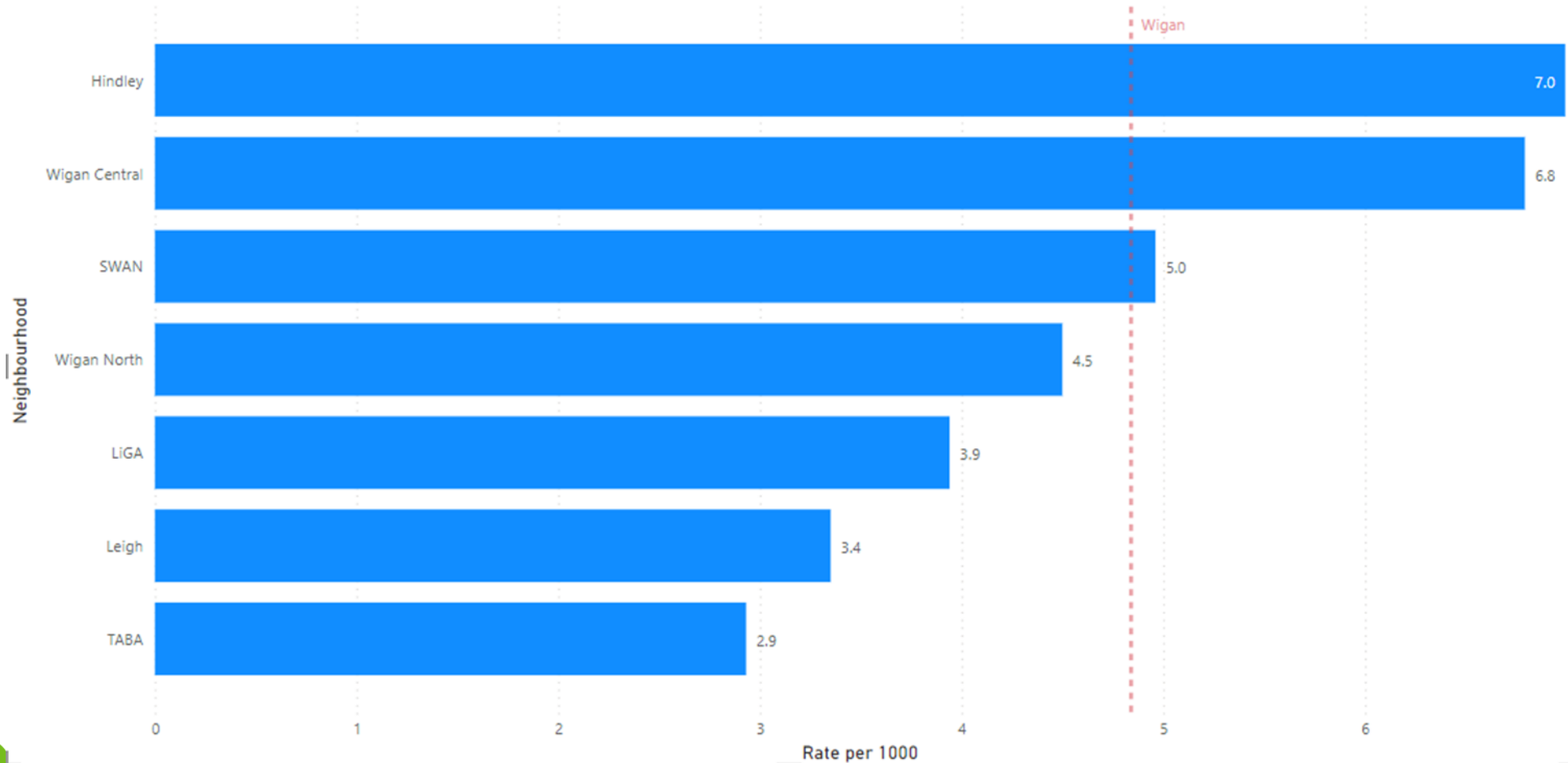

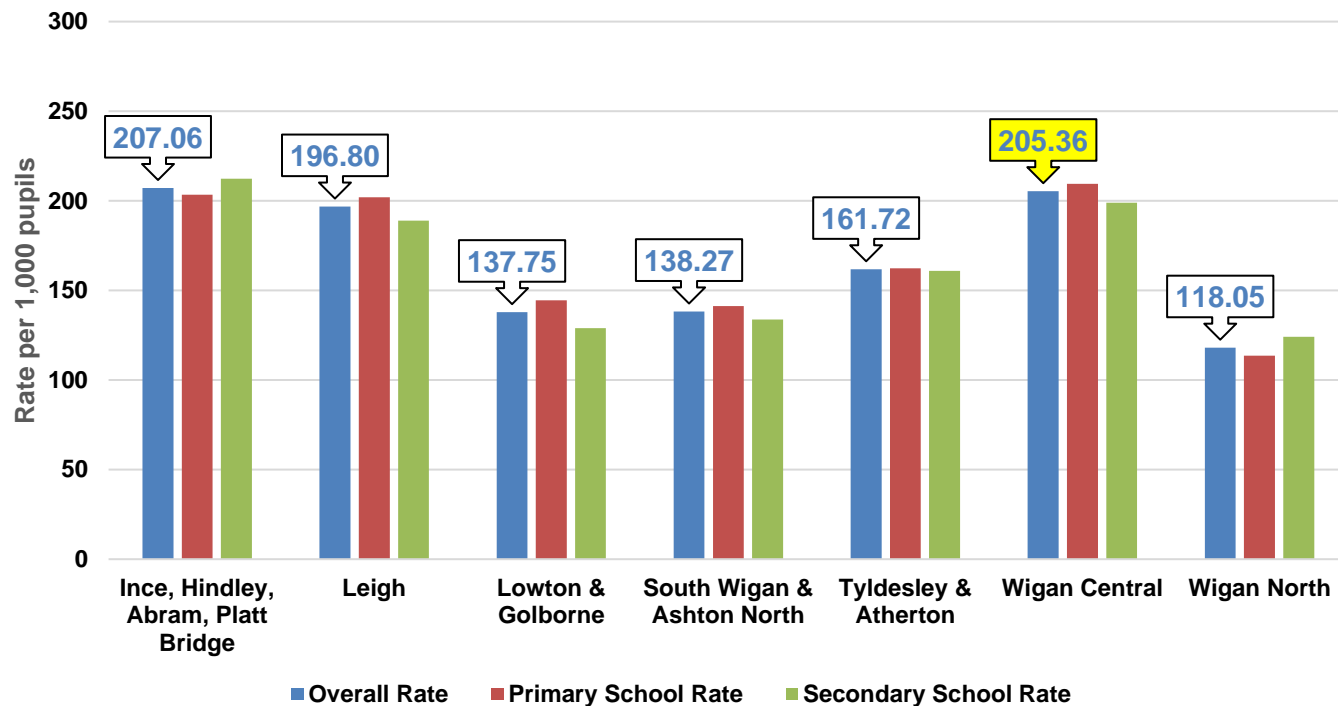

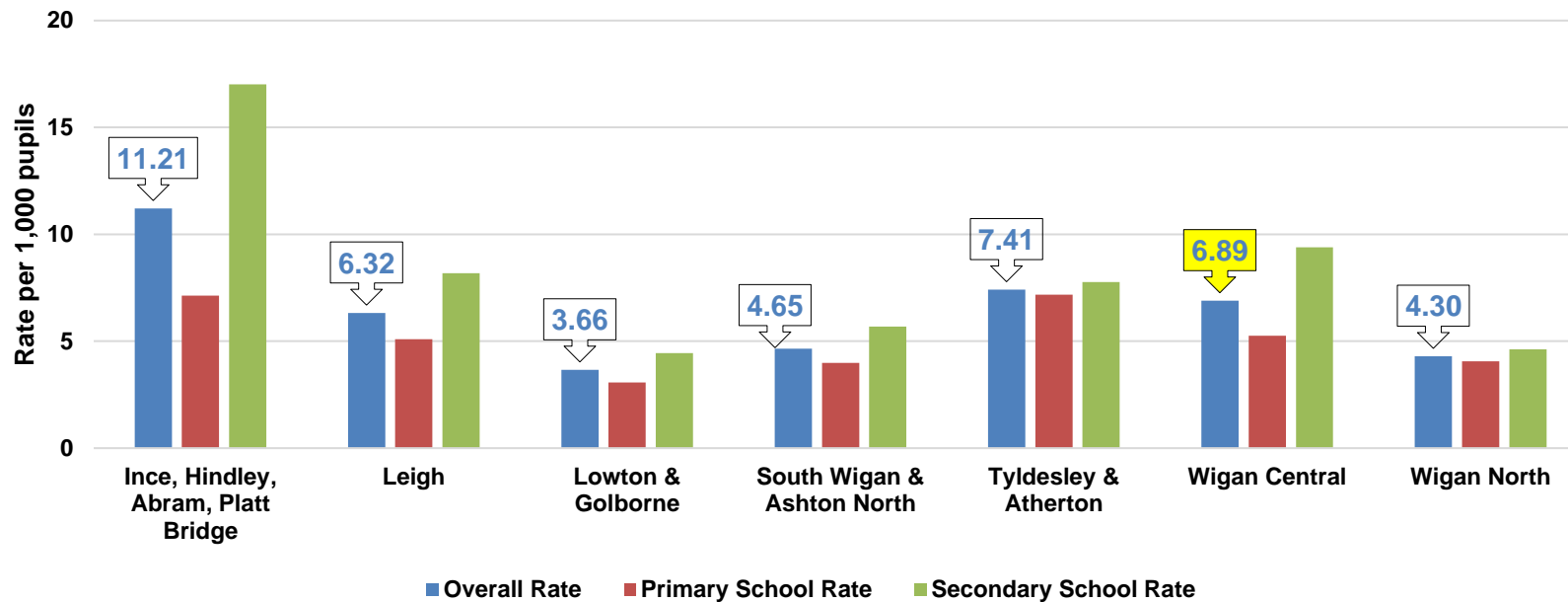

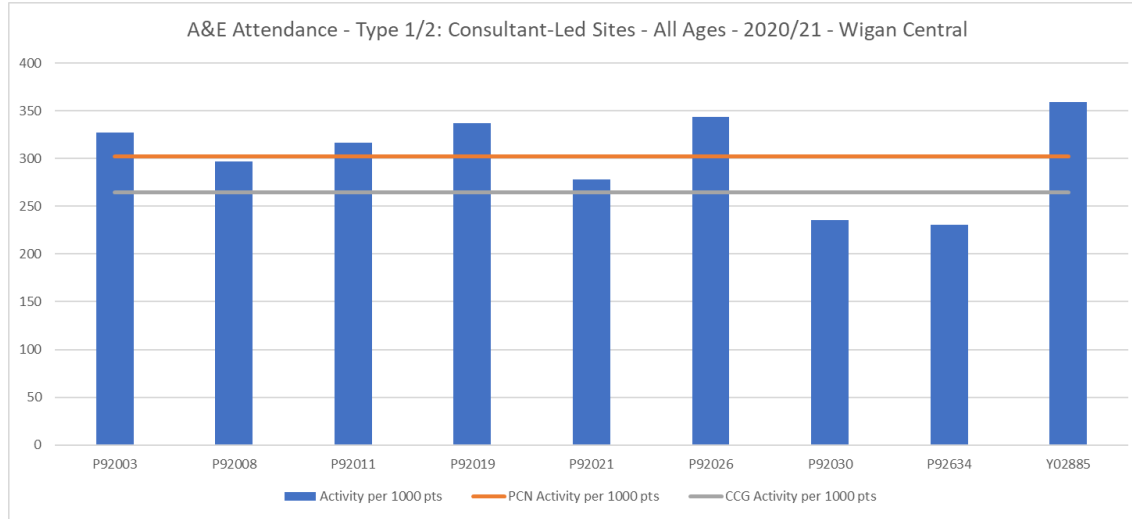

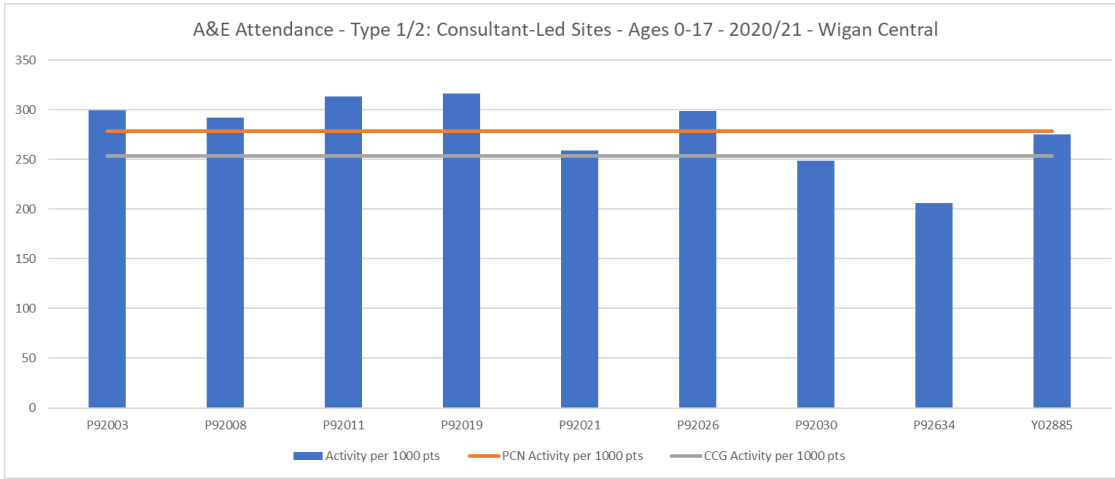

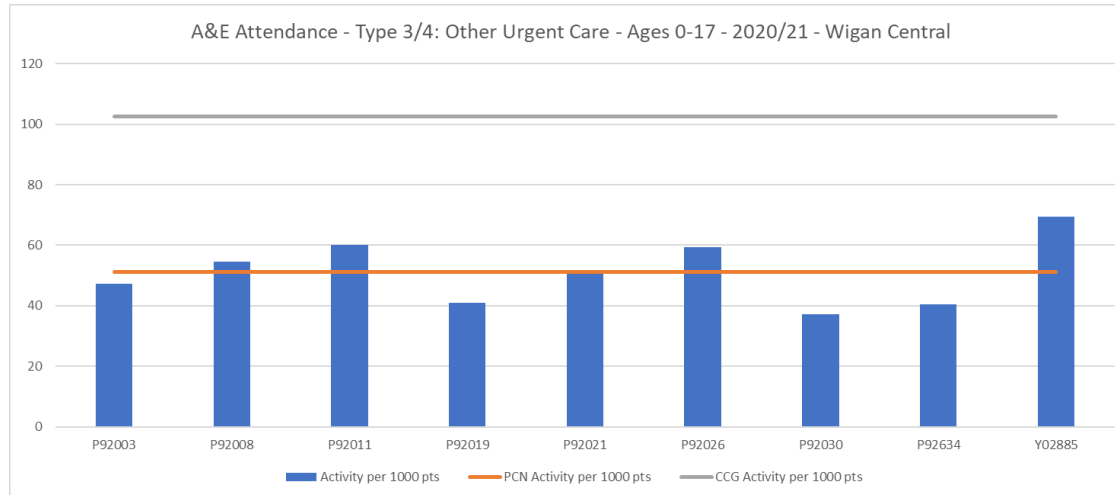




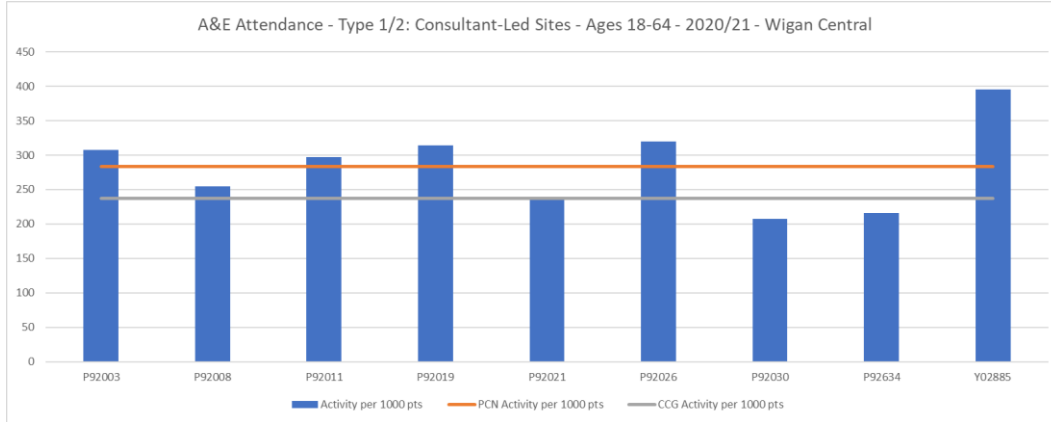
# A&E Attendances – 0-17



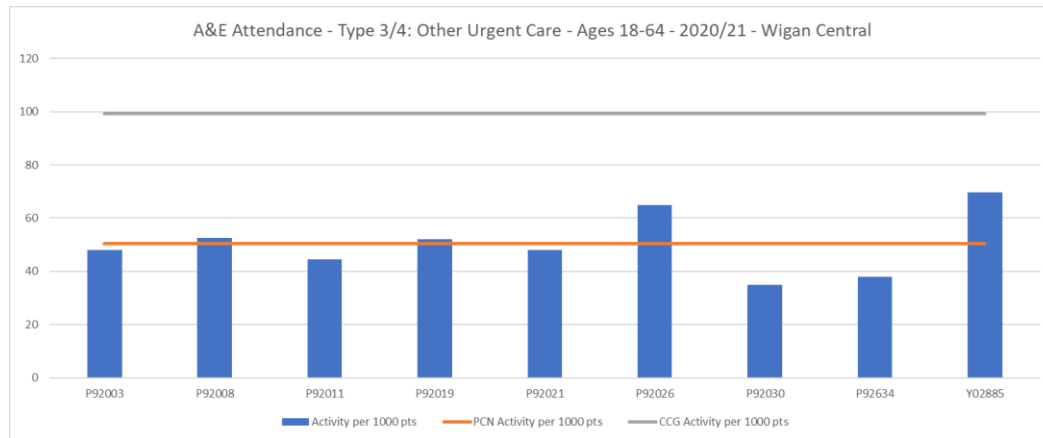

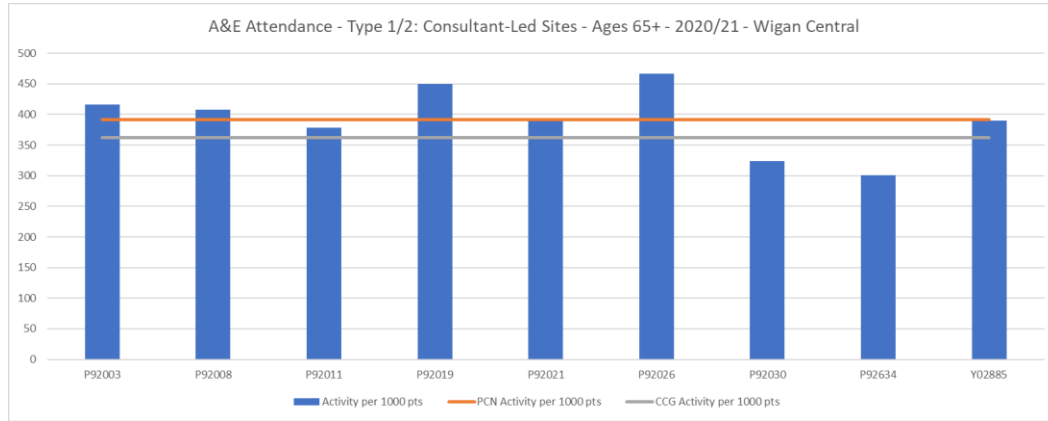
# A&E Attendances – 18-64



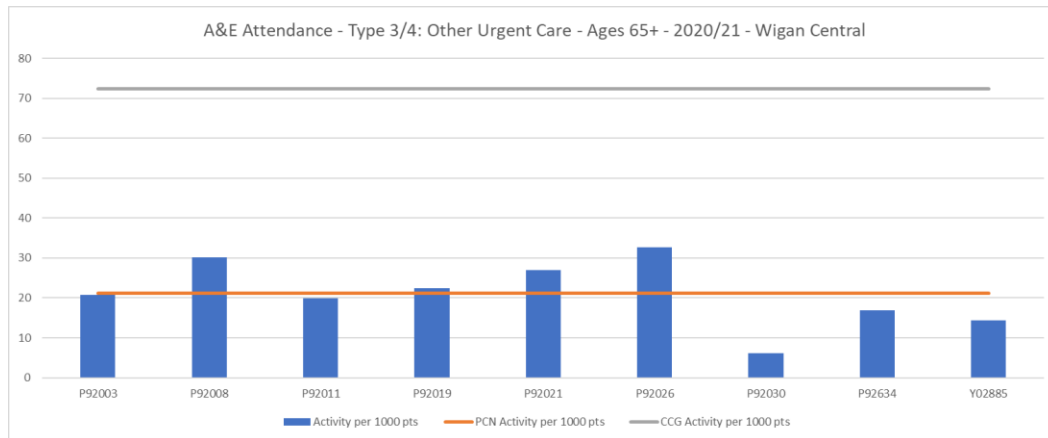

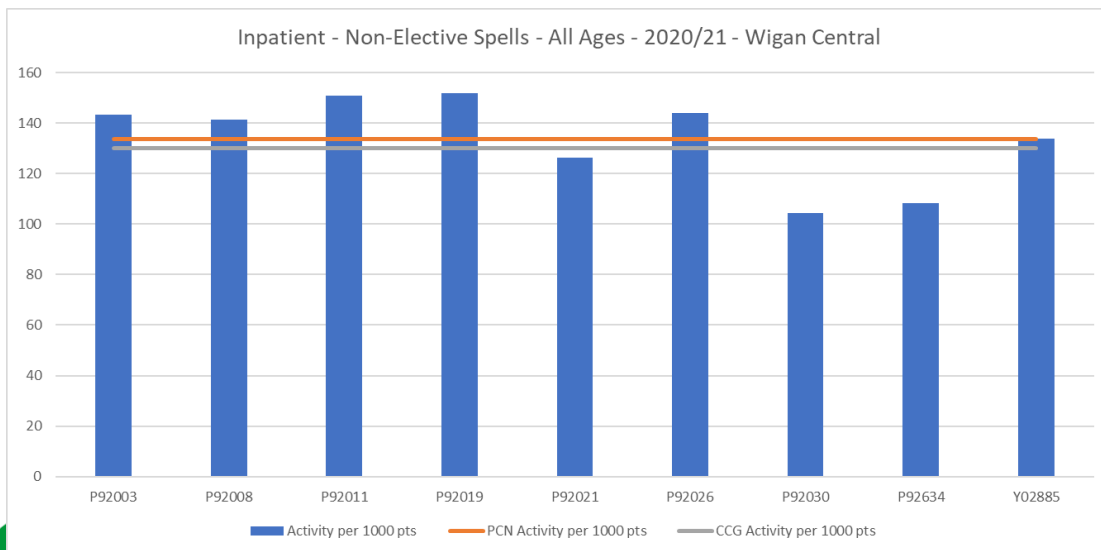

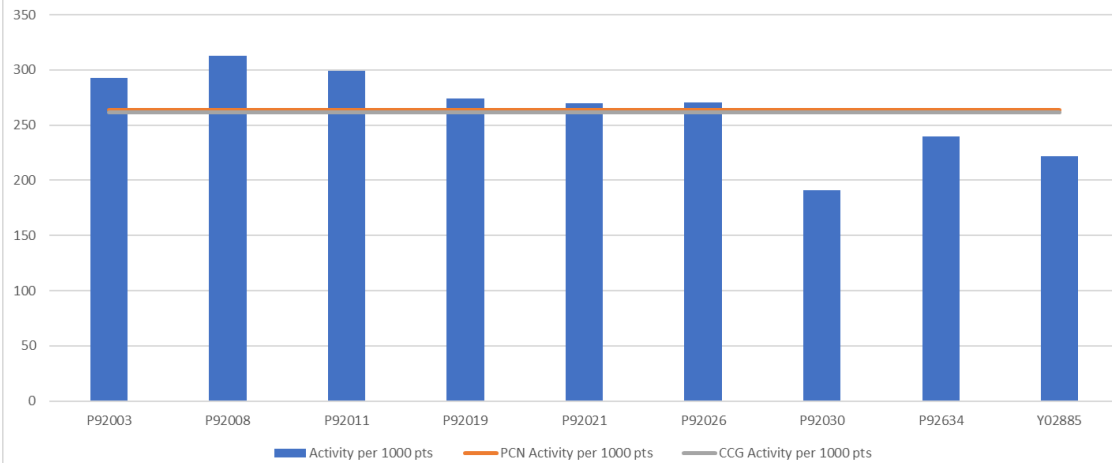

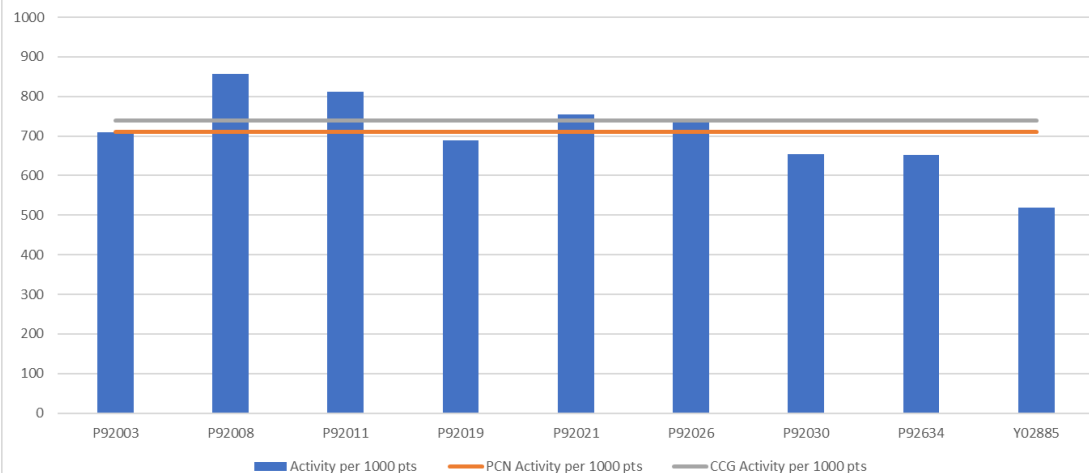

# Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
  - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
  - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
  - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.
  - The rate of shielded patients in each LSOA.

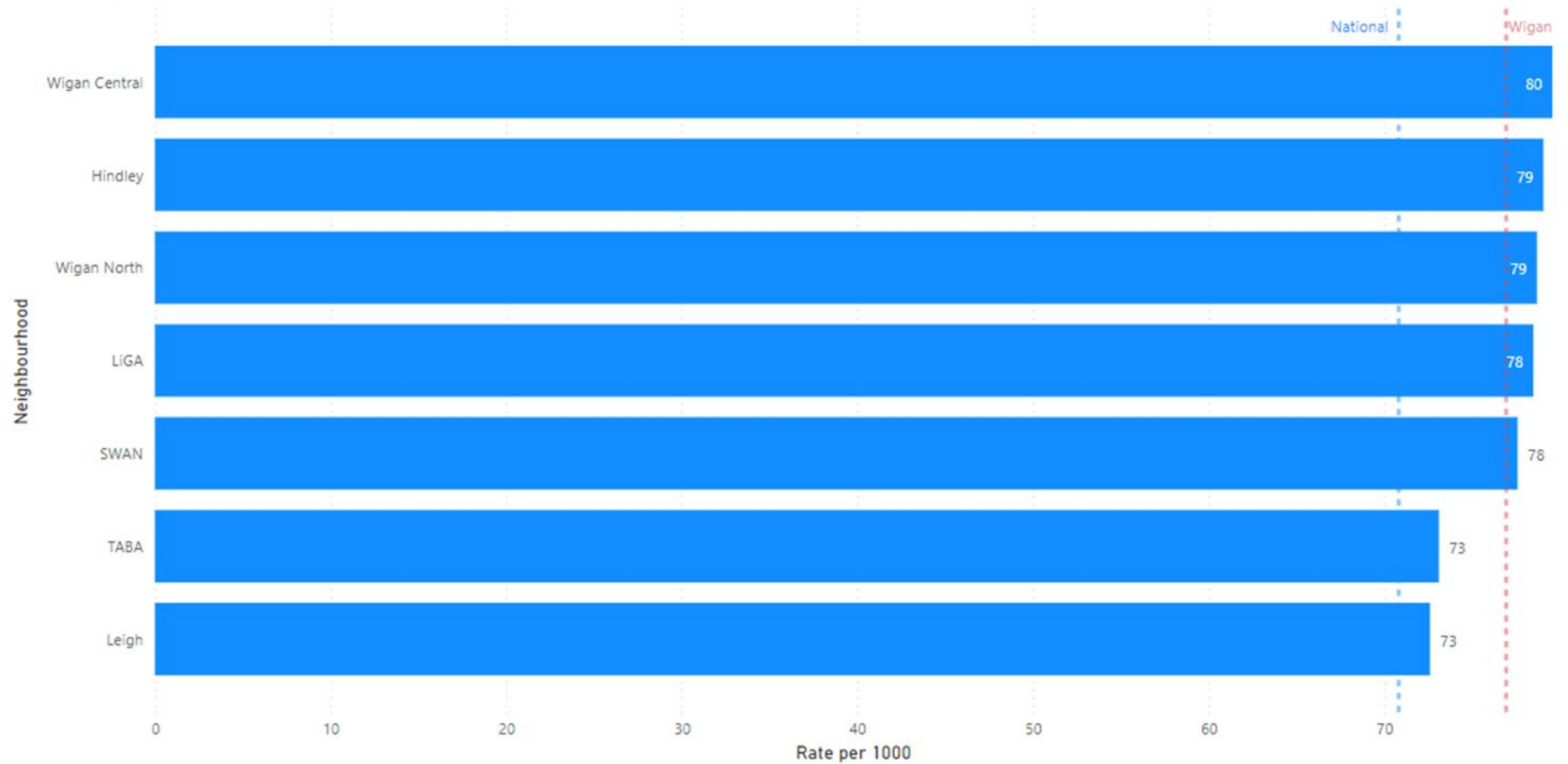

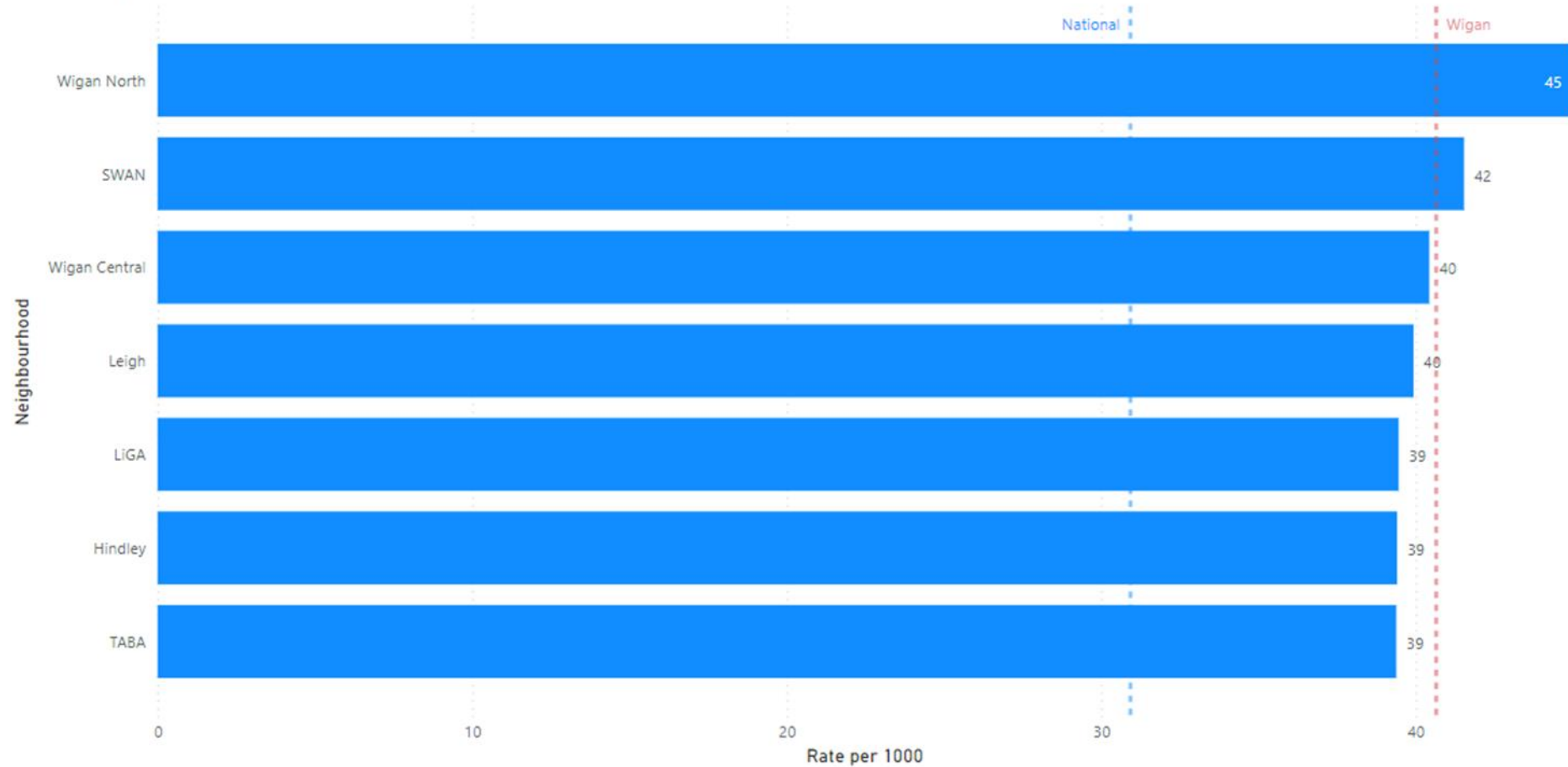

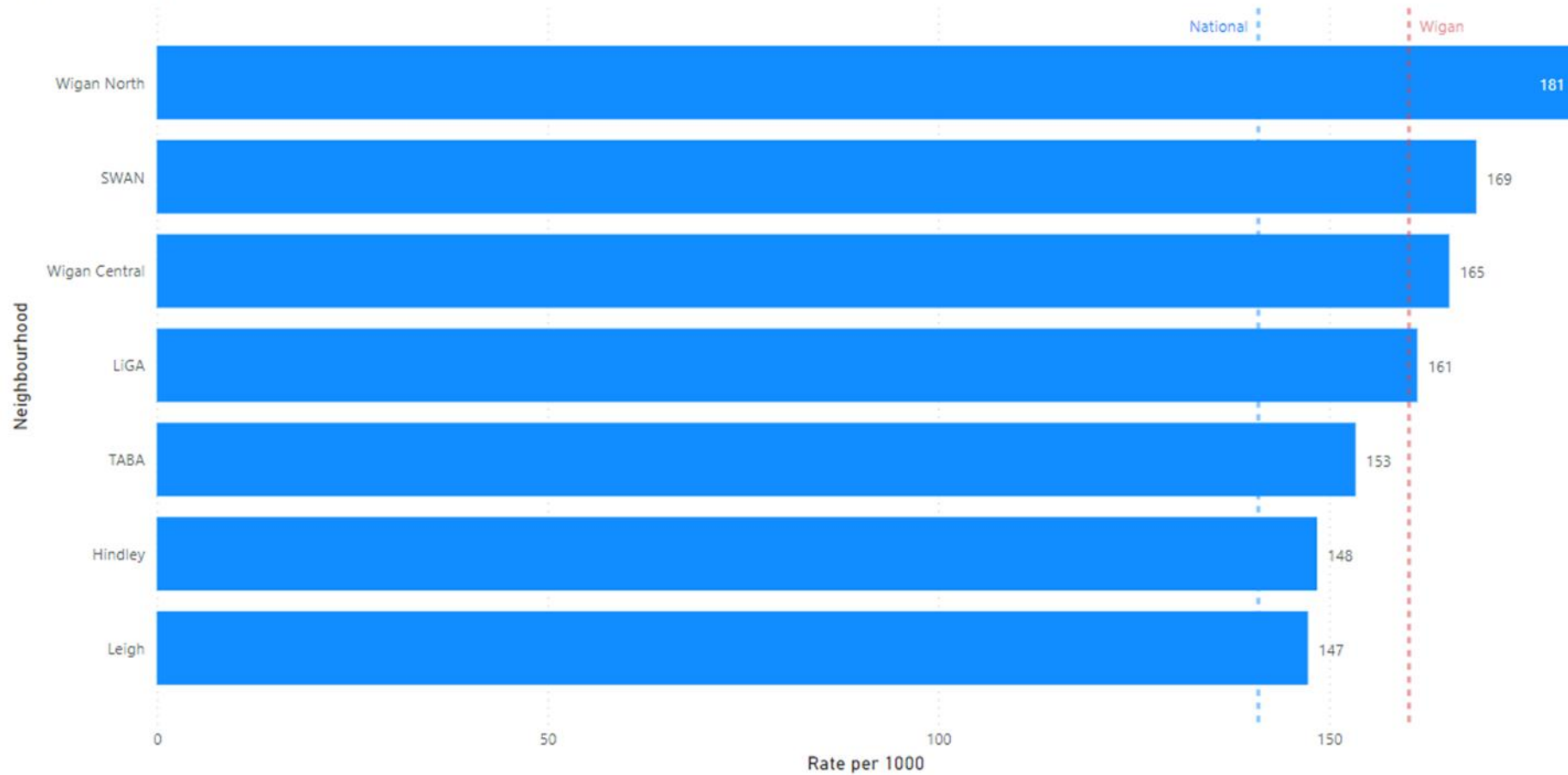

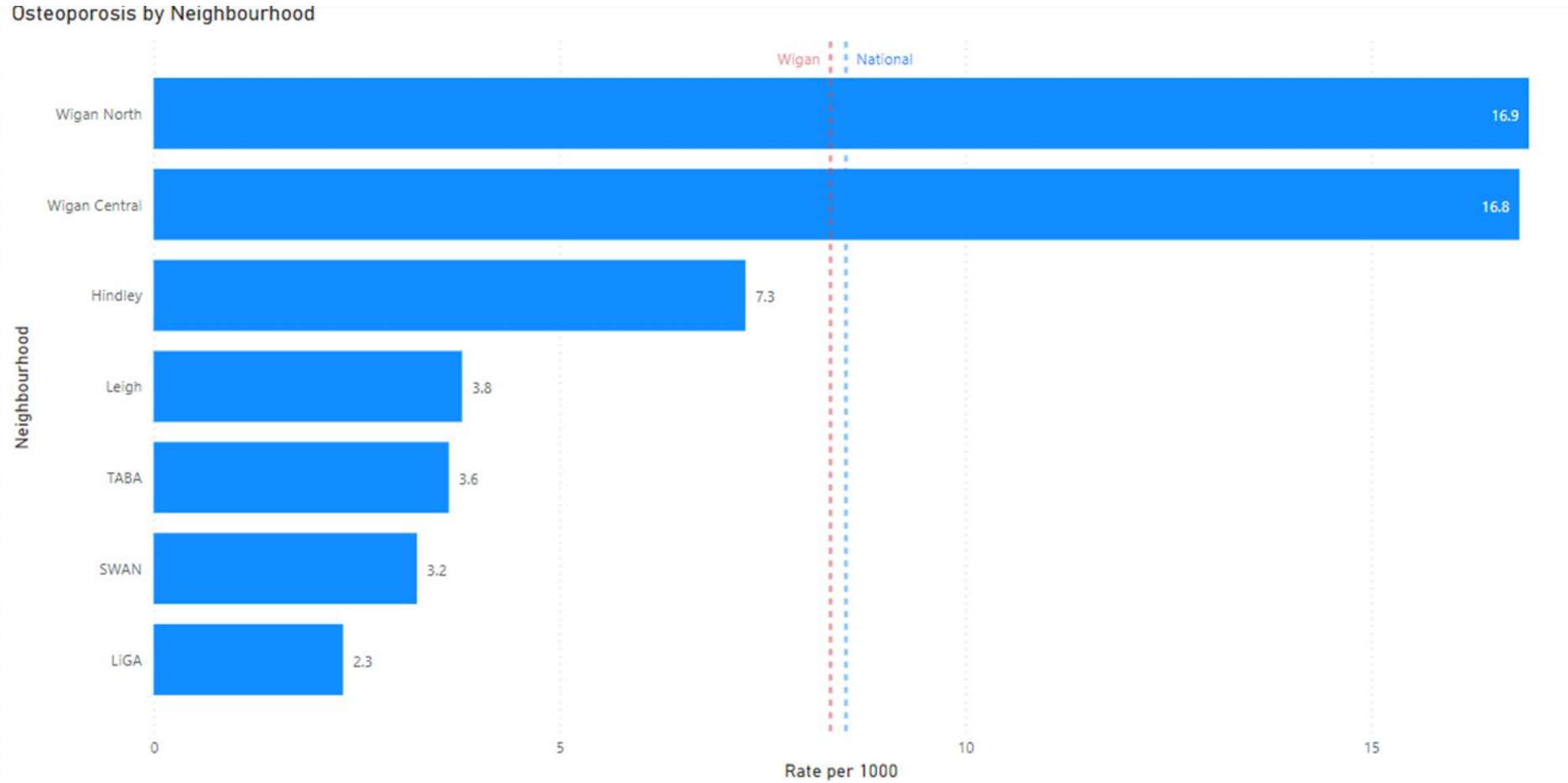

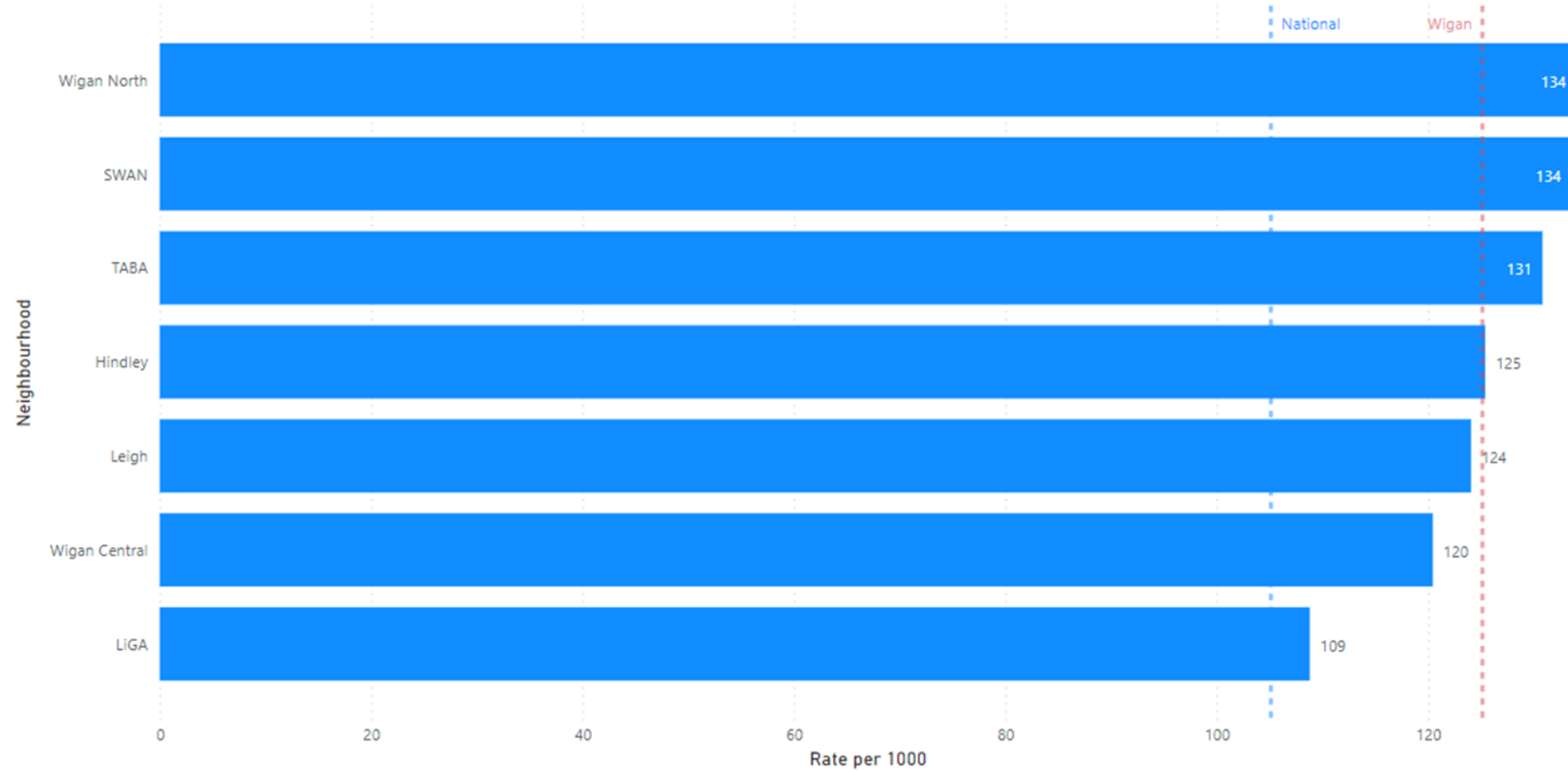

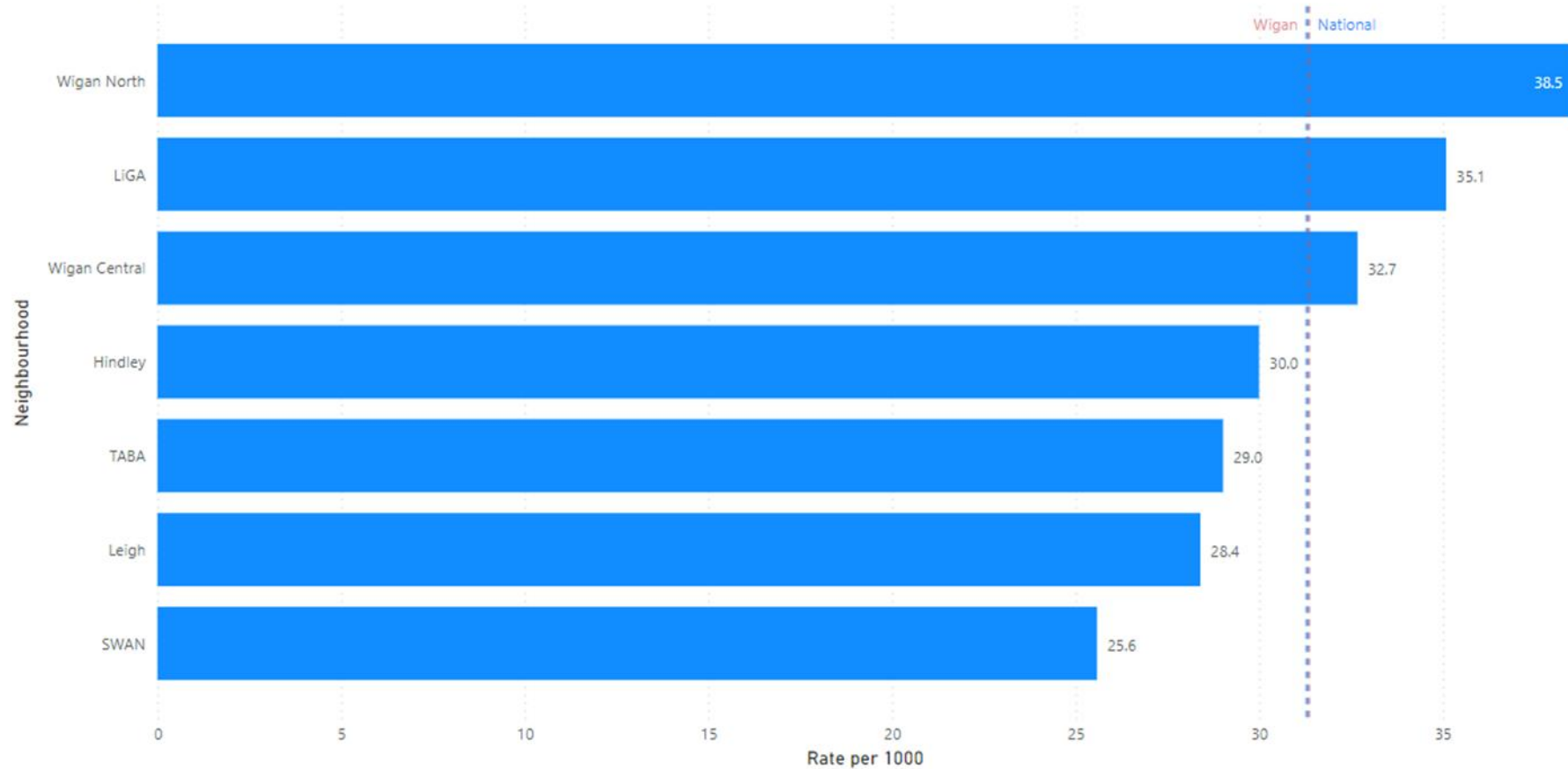

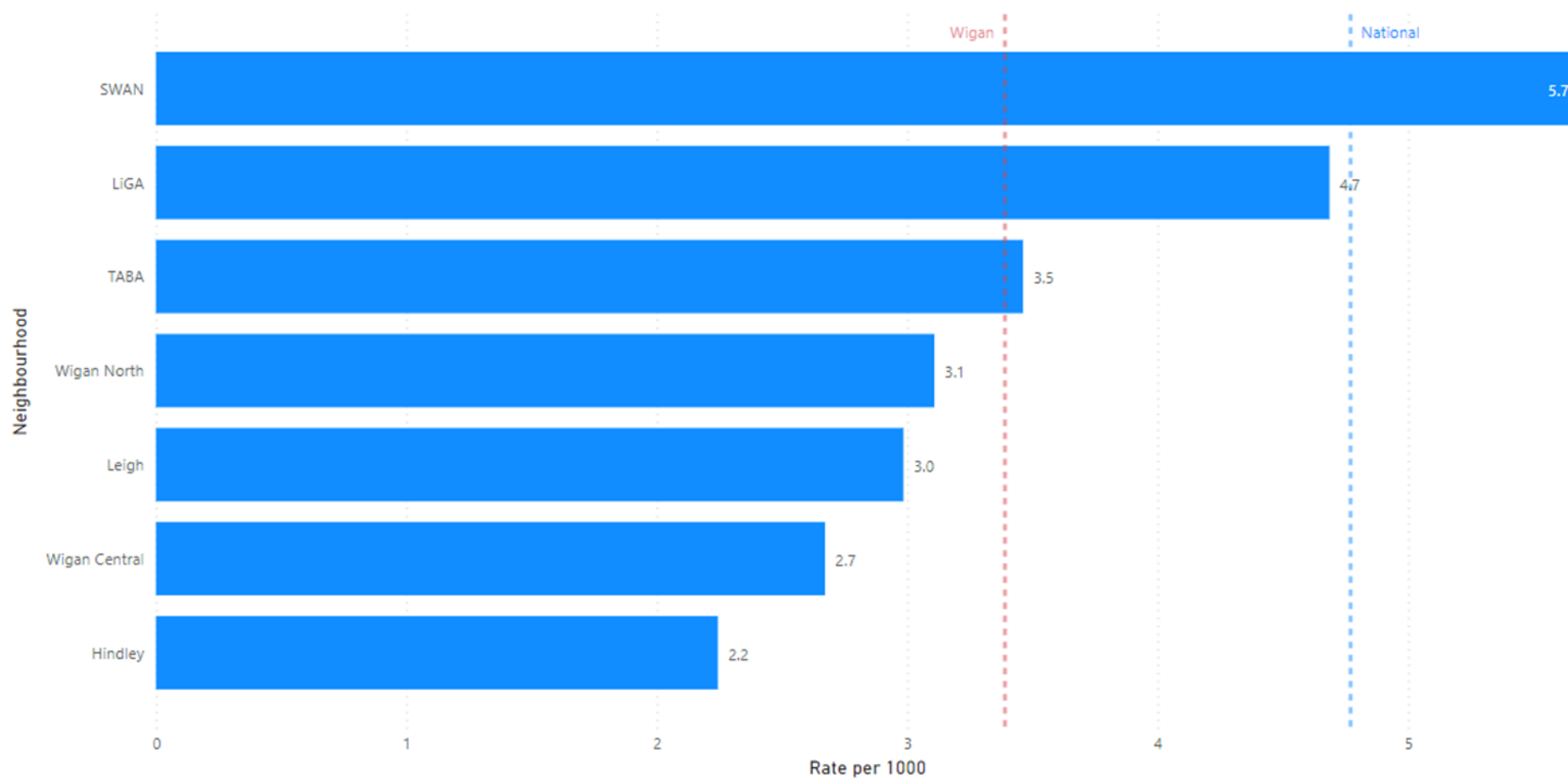

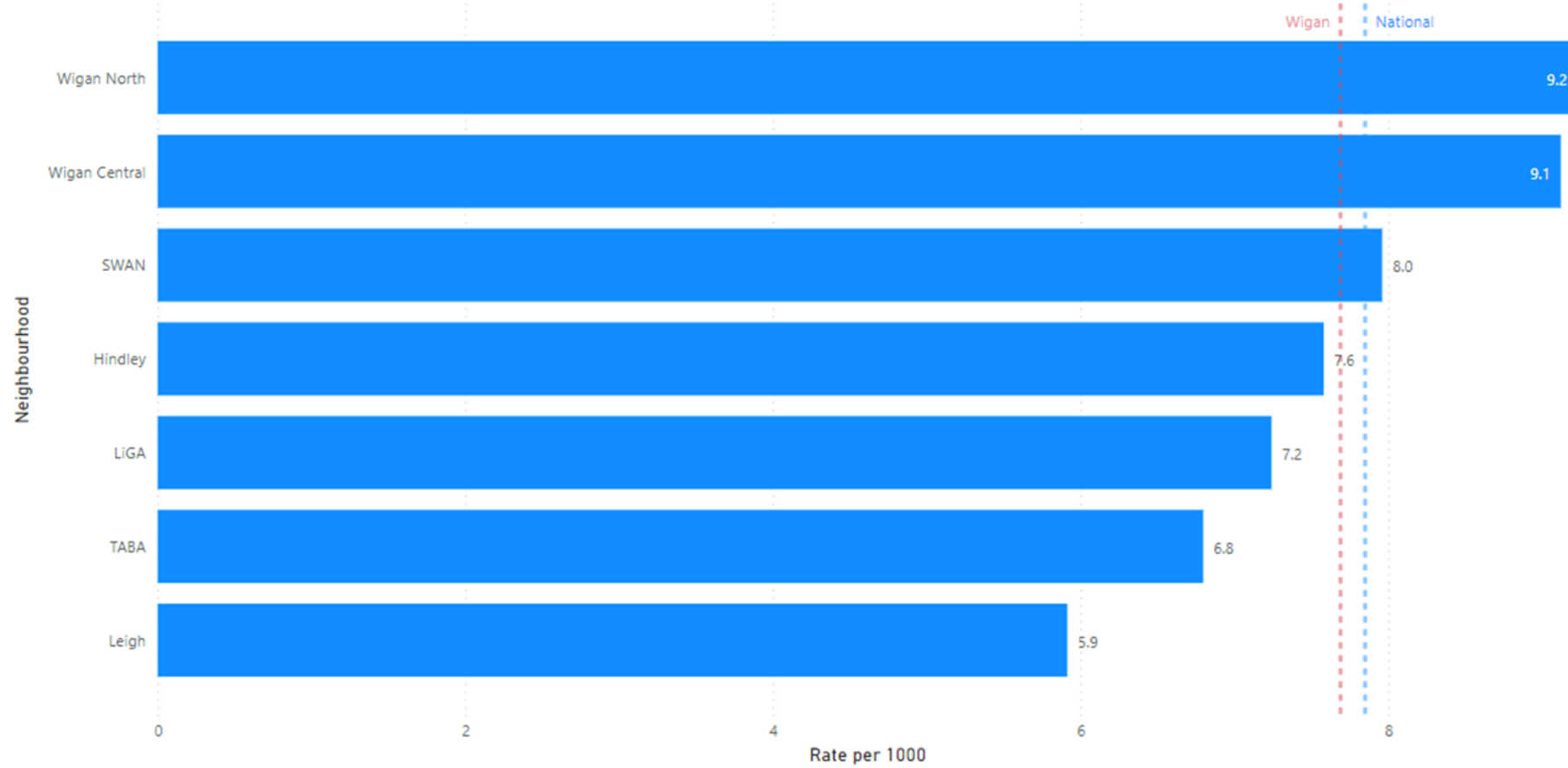

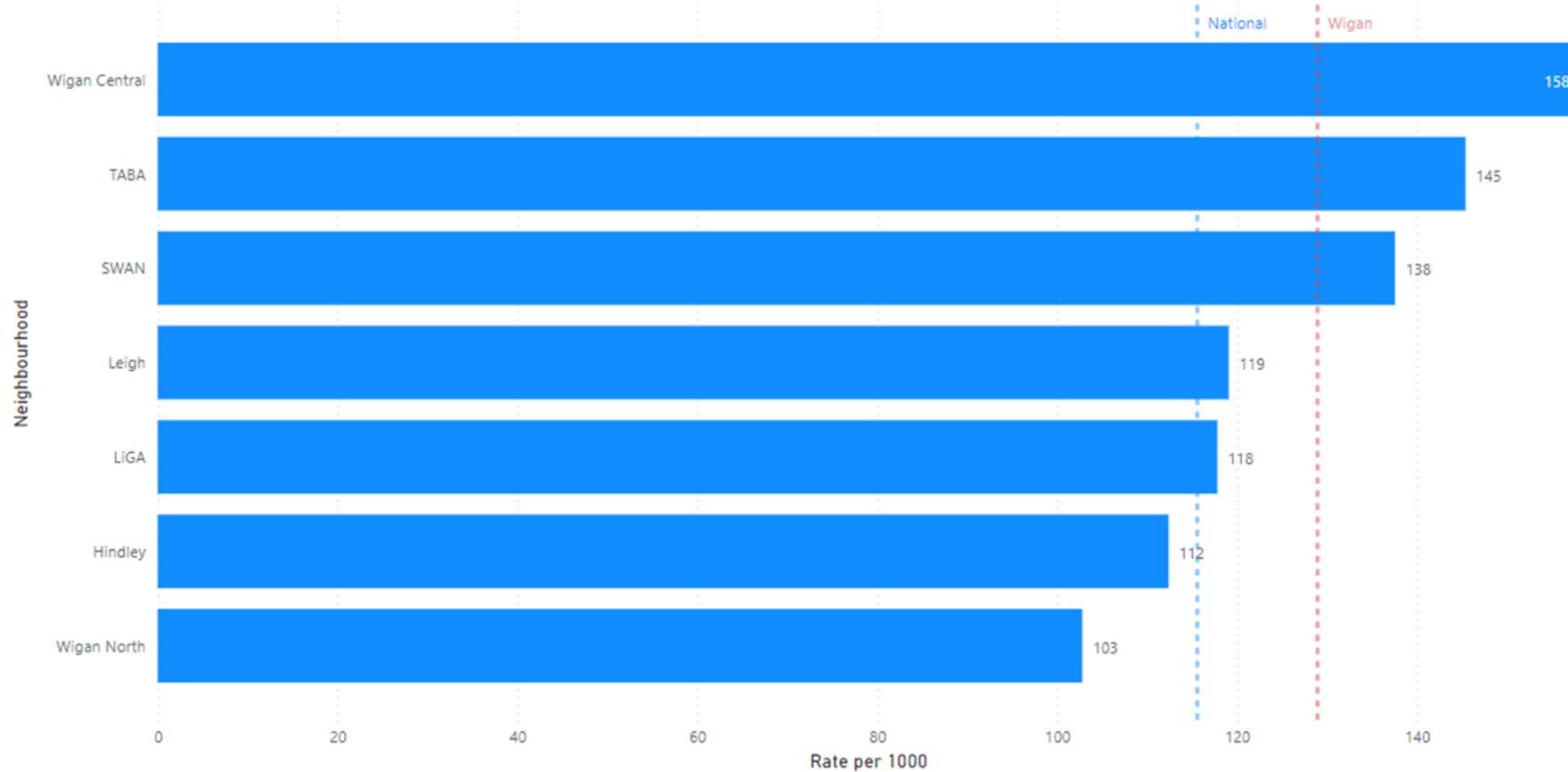

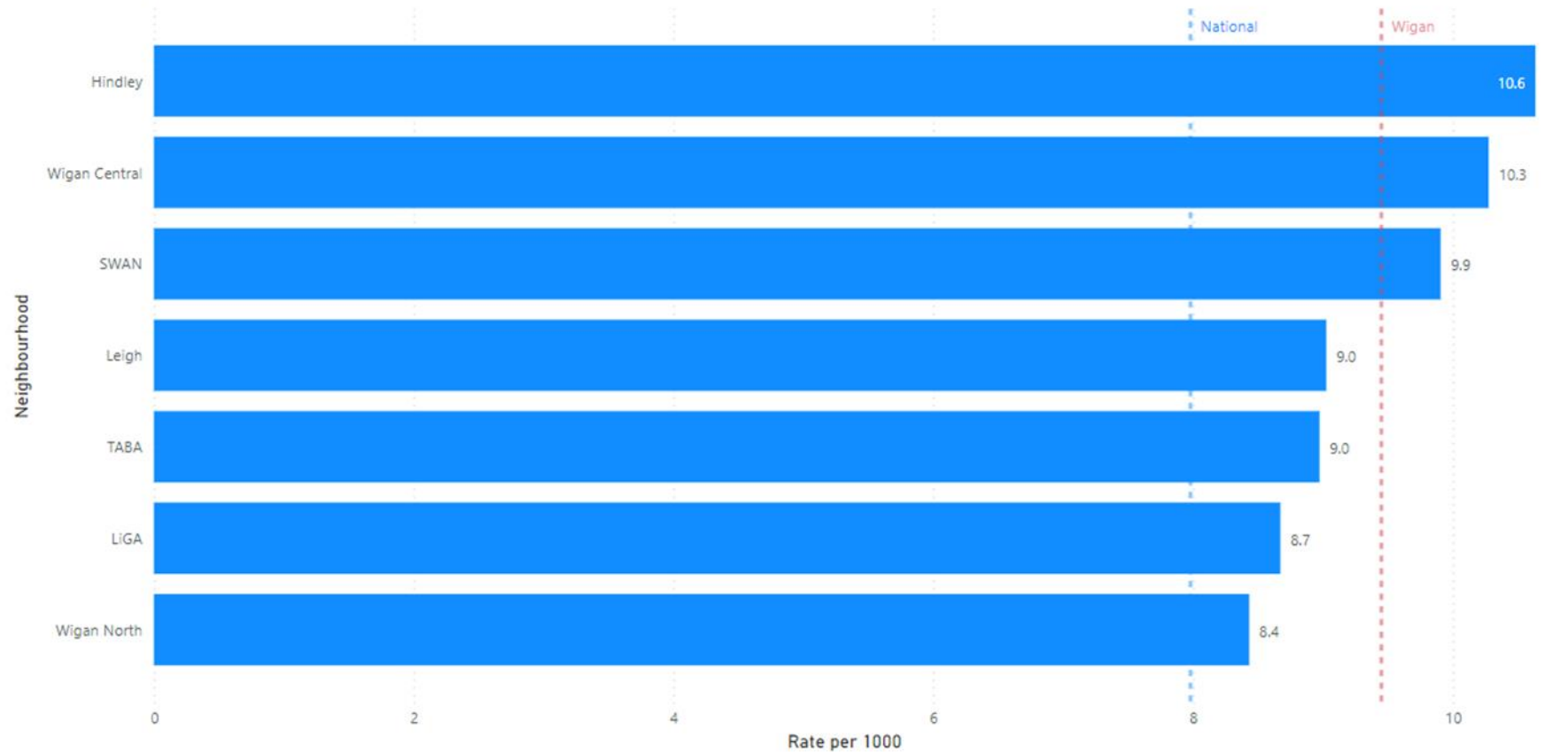

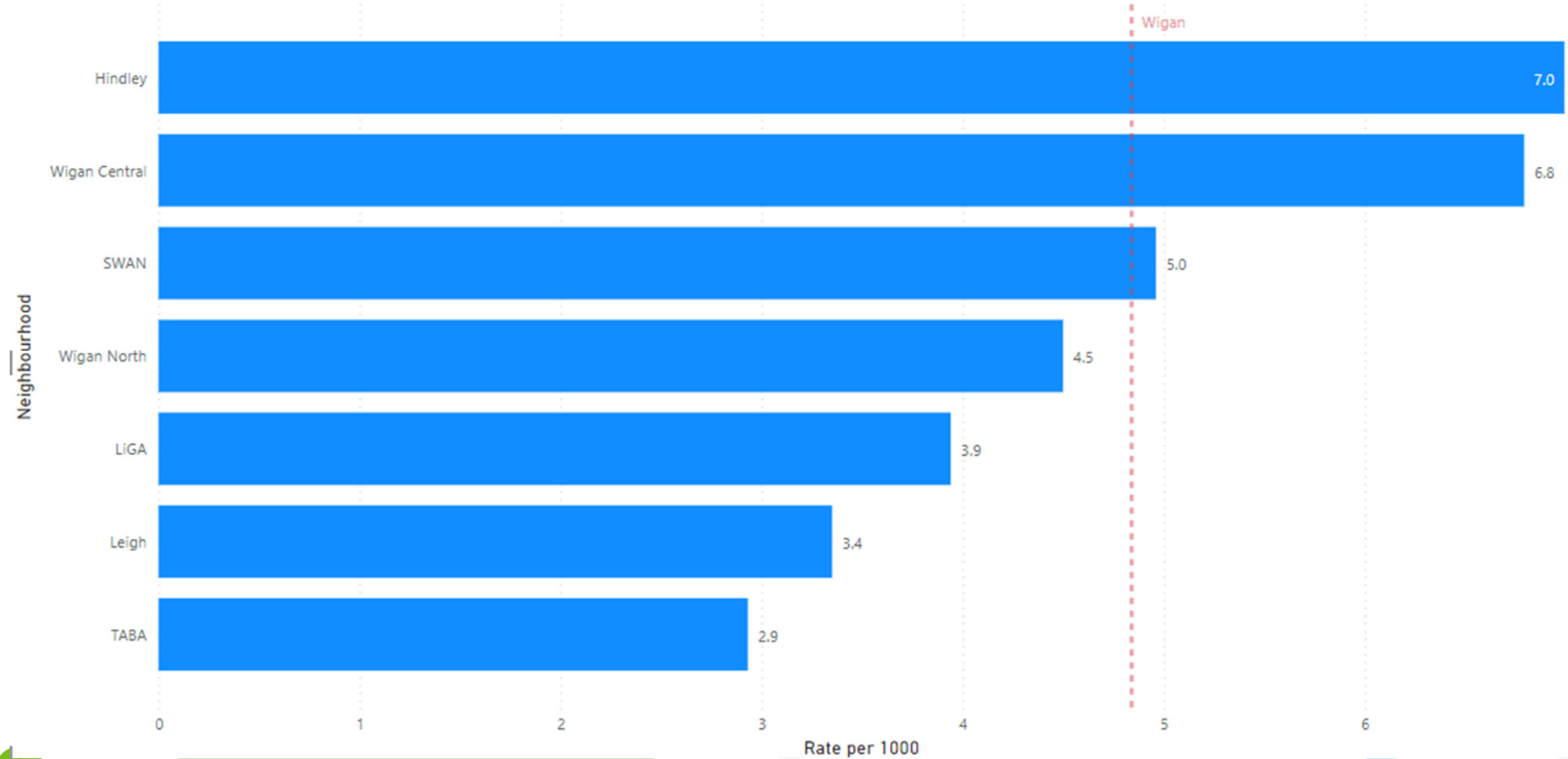

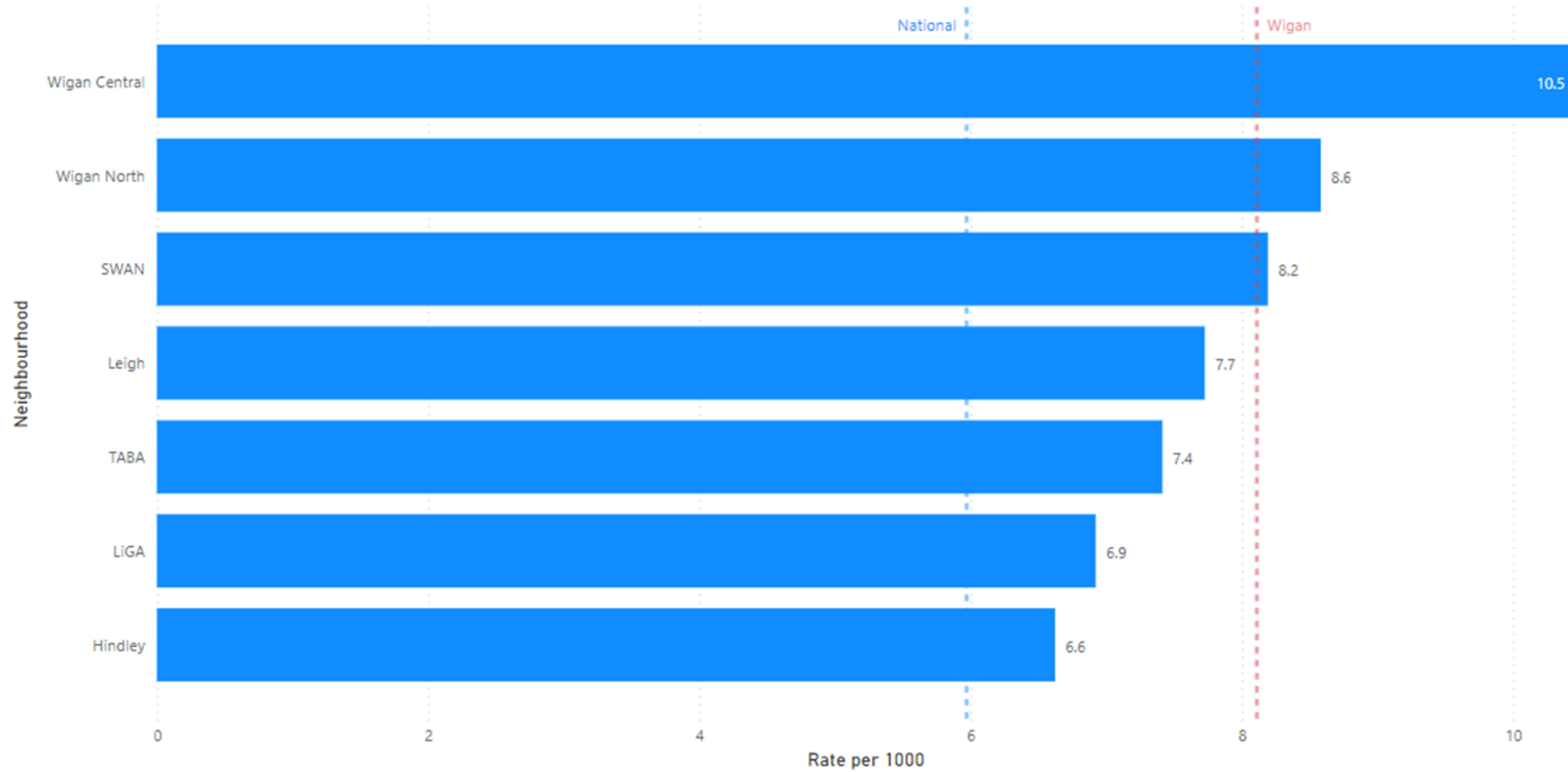

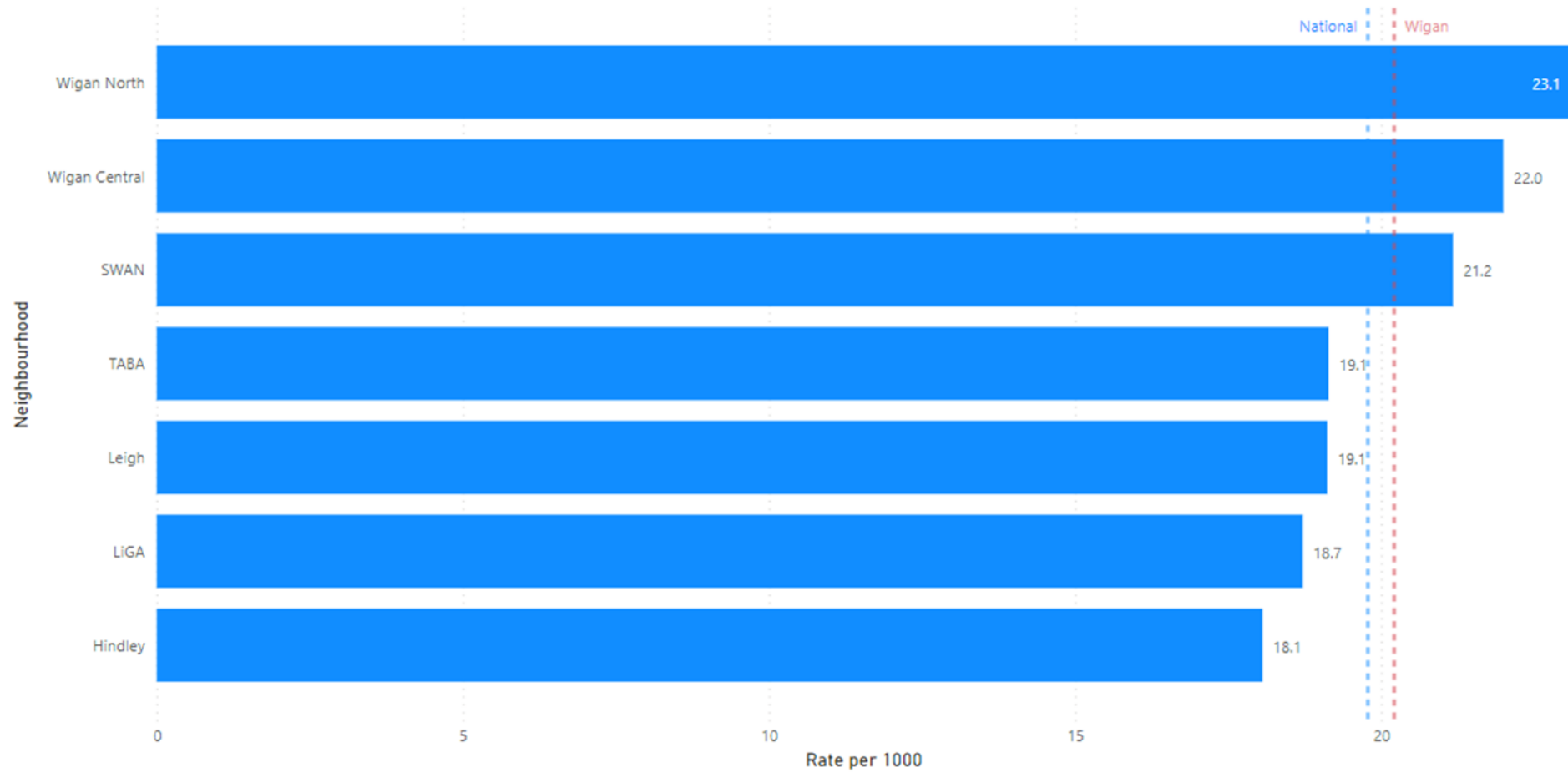

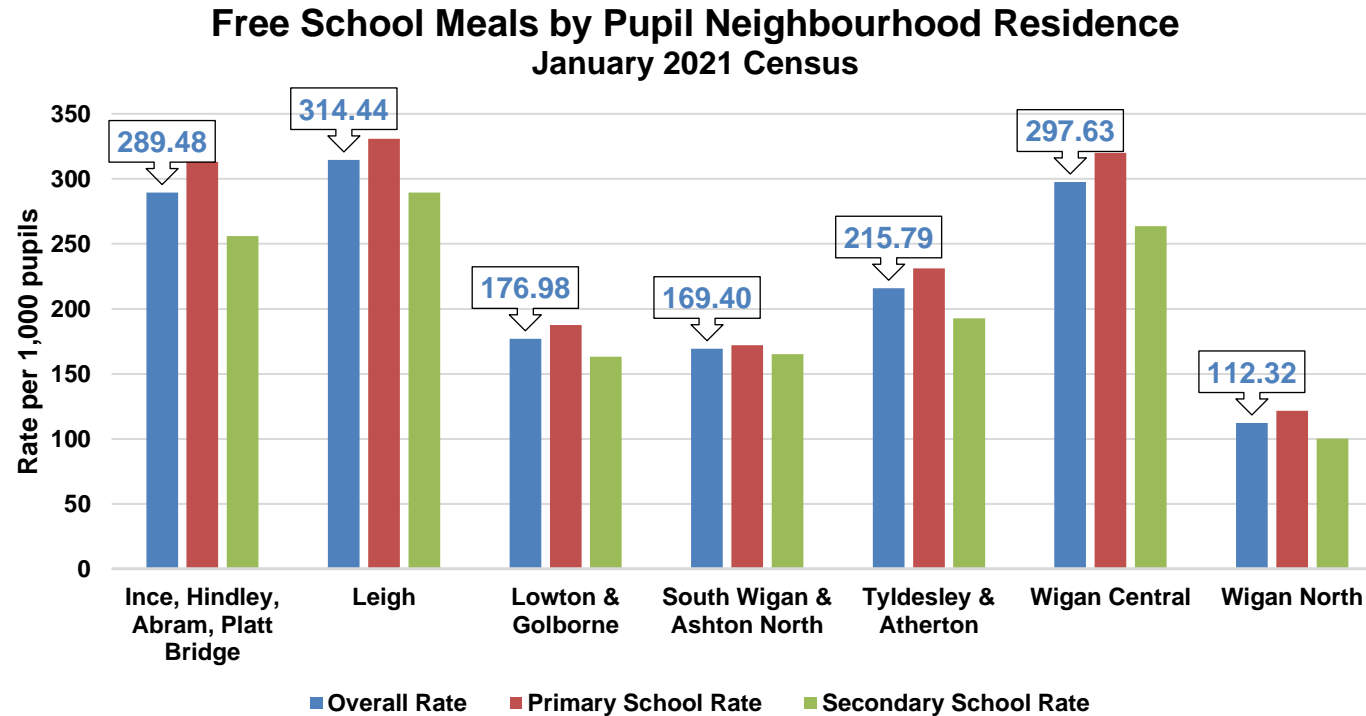

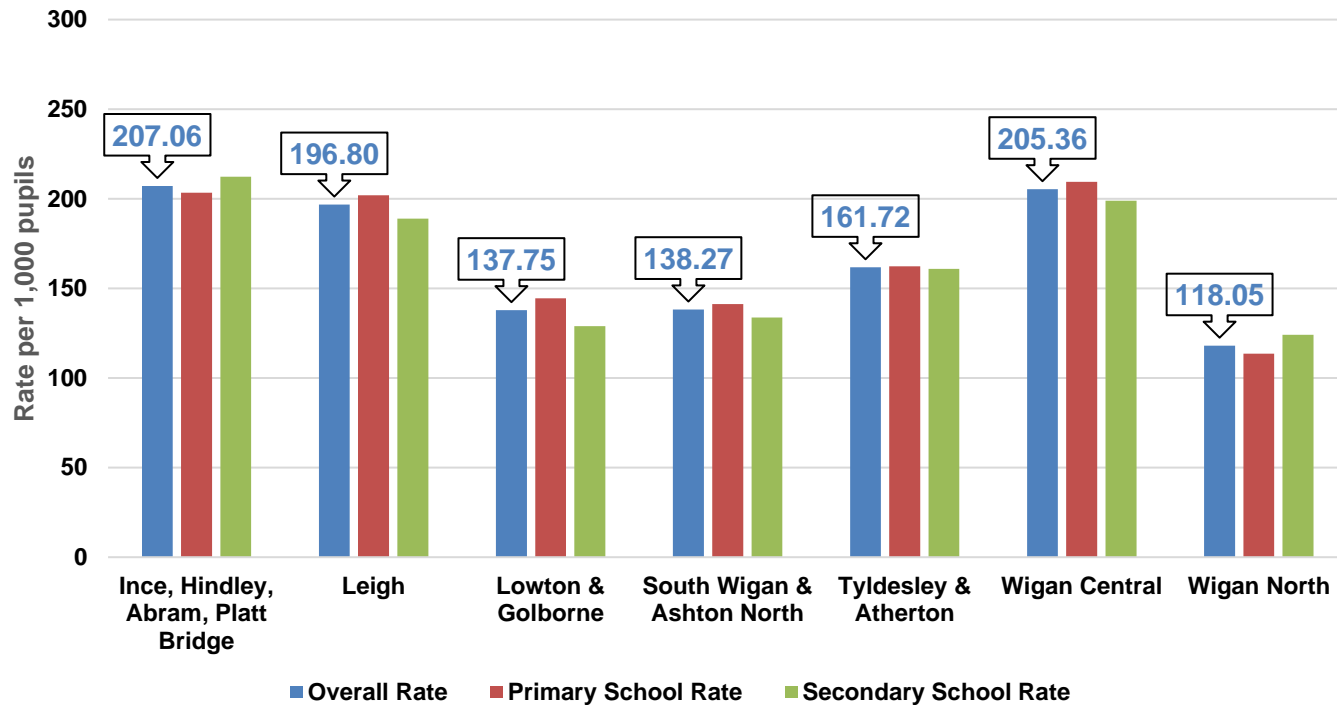

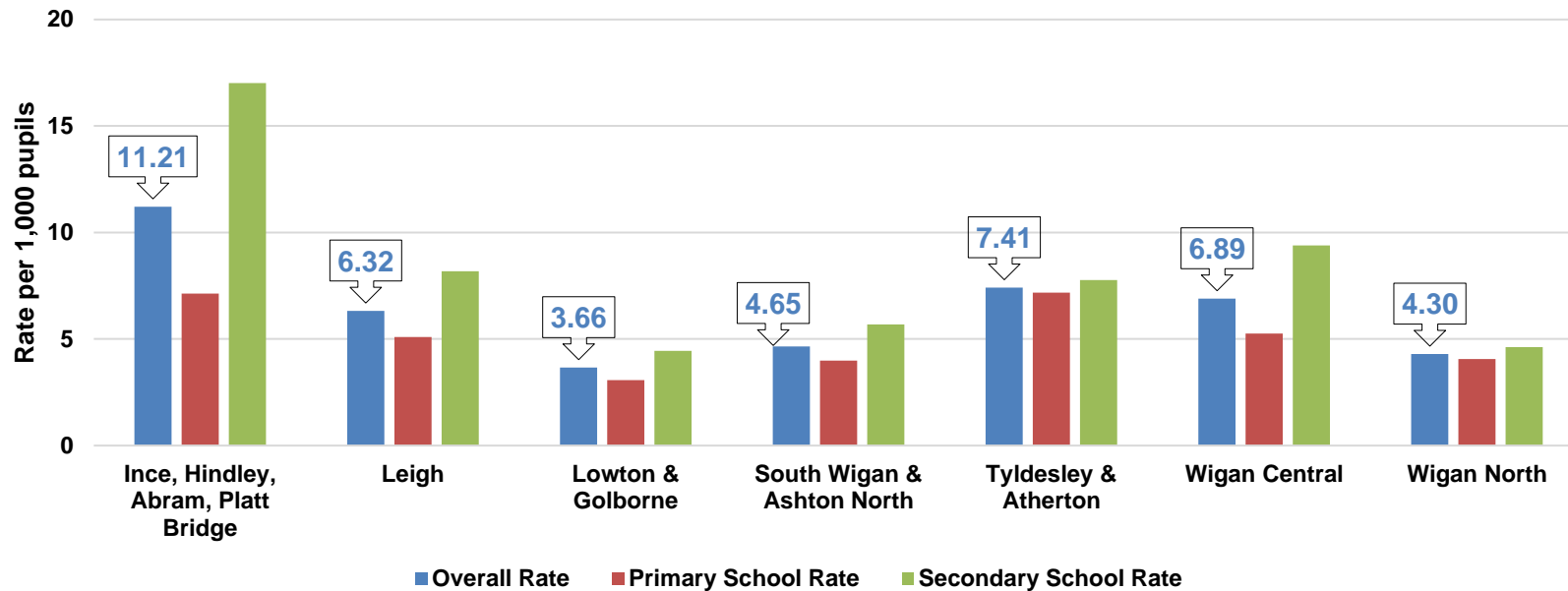
**Special Educational Needs by Pupil Neighbourhood Residence**

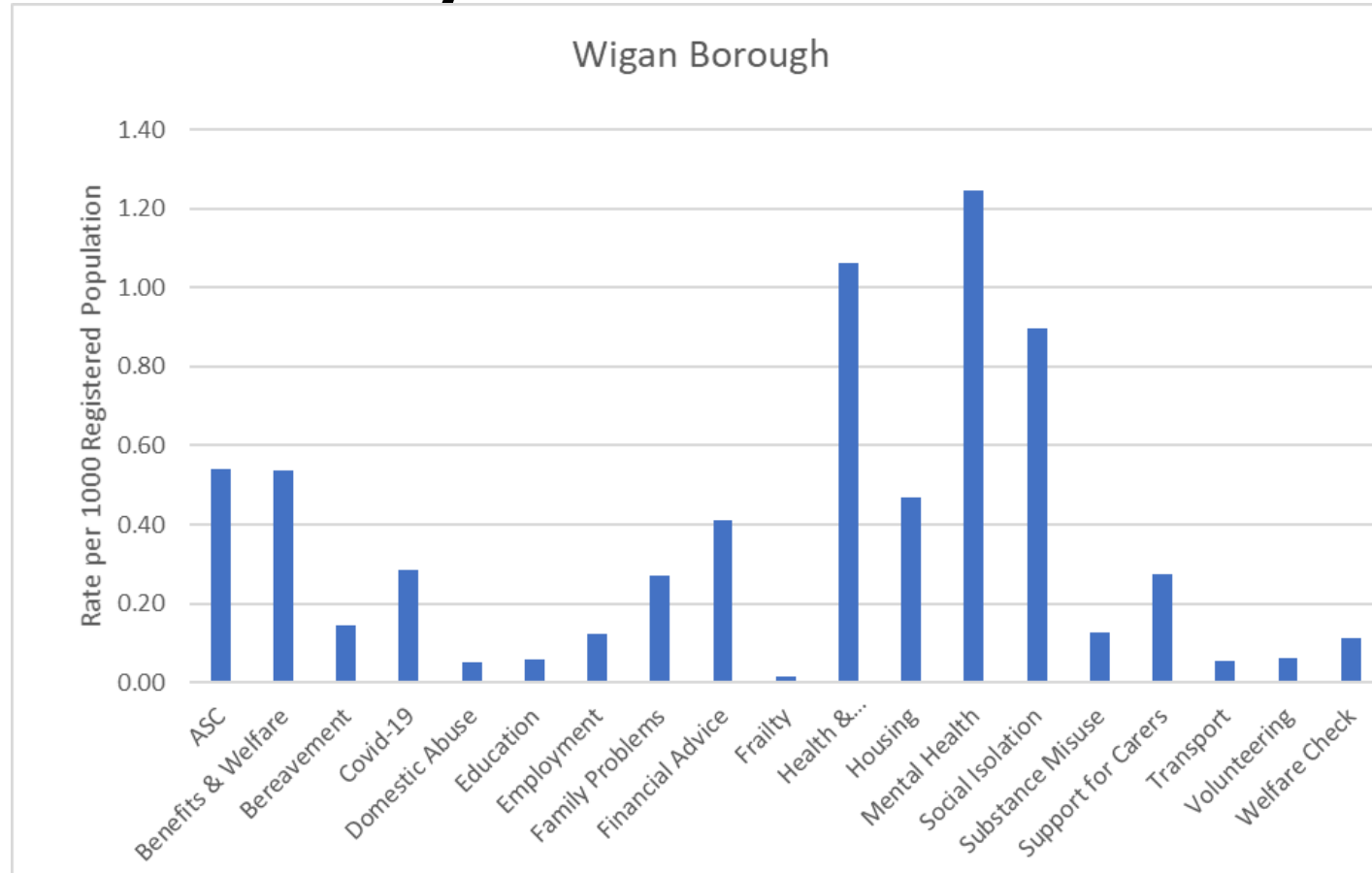

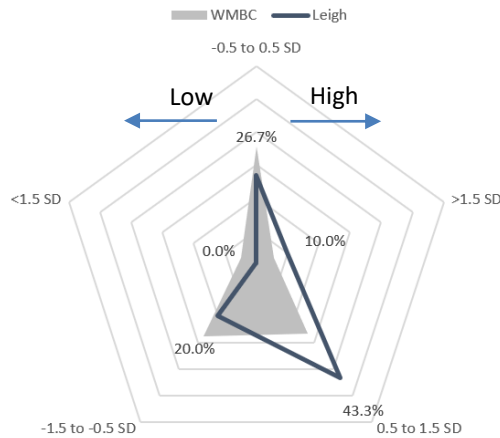
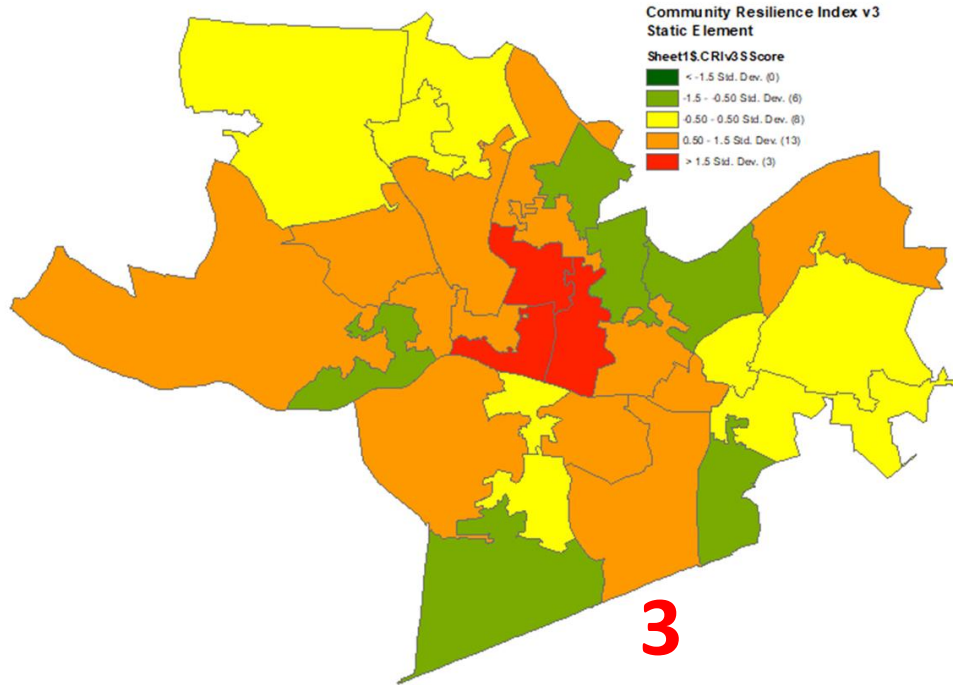
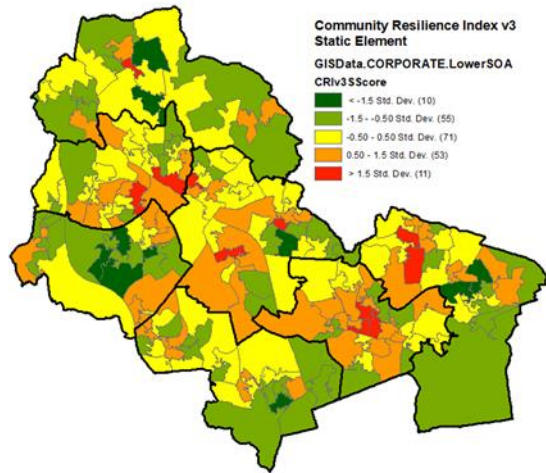
# Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
  - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.

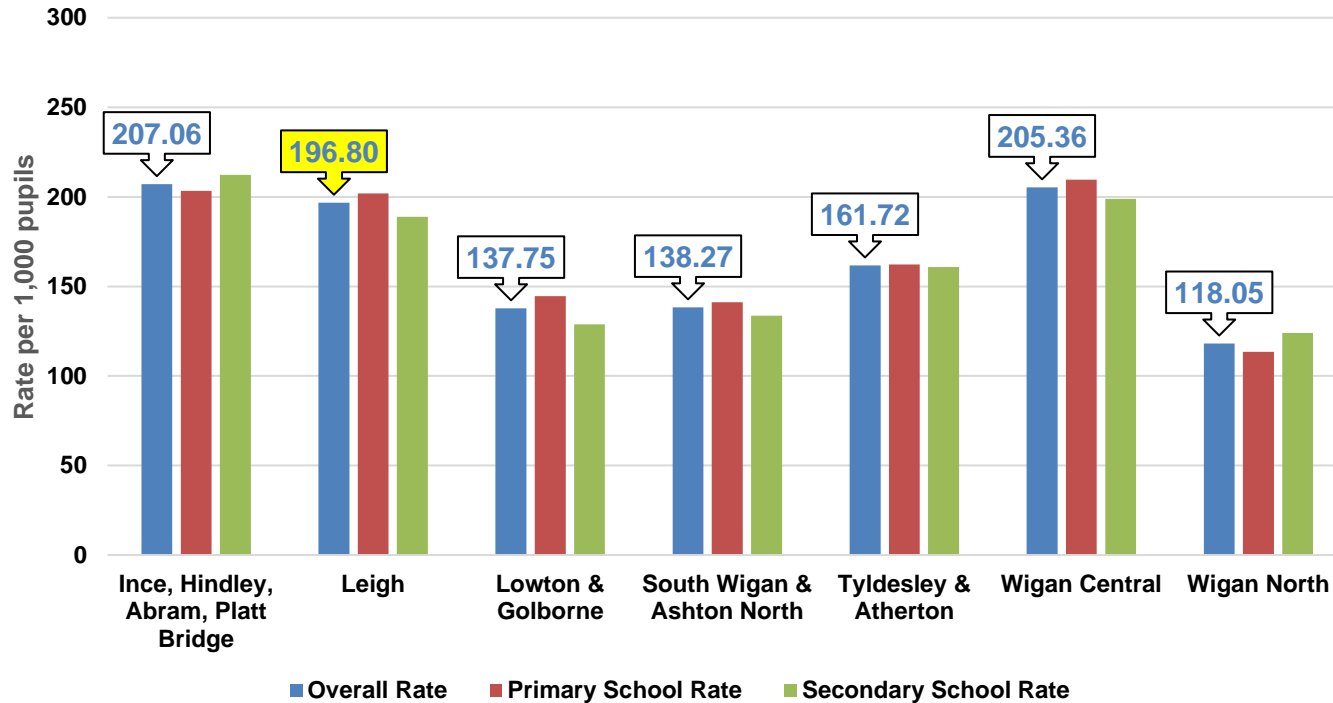

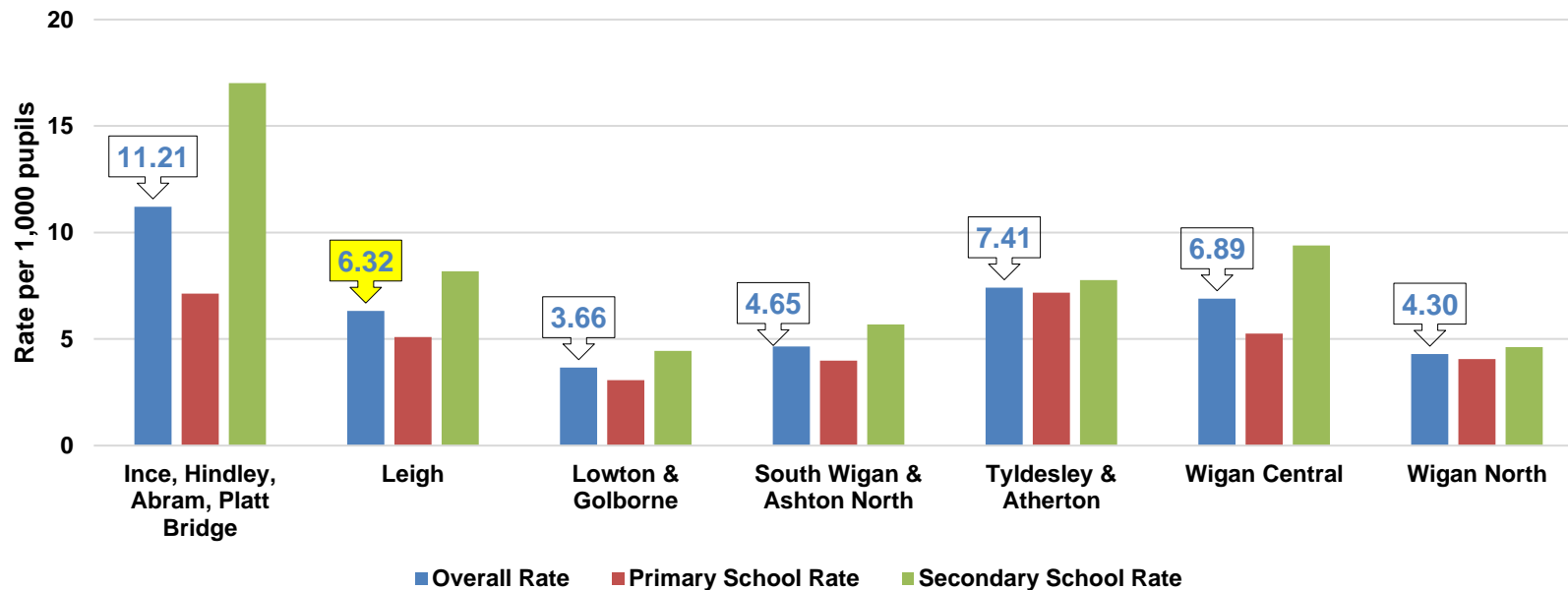

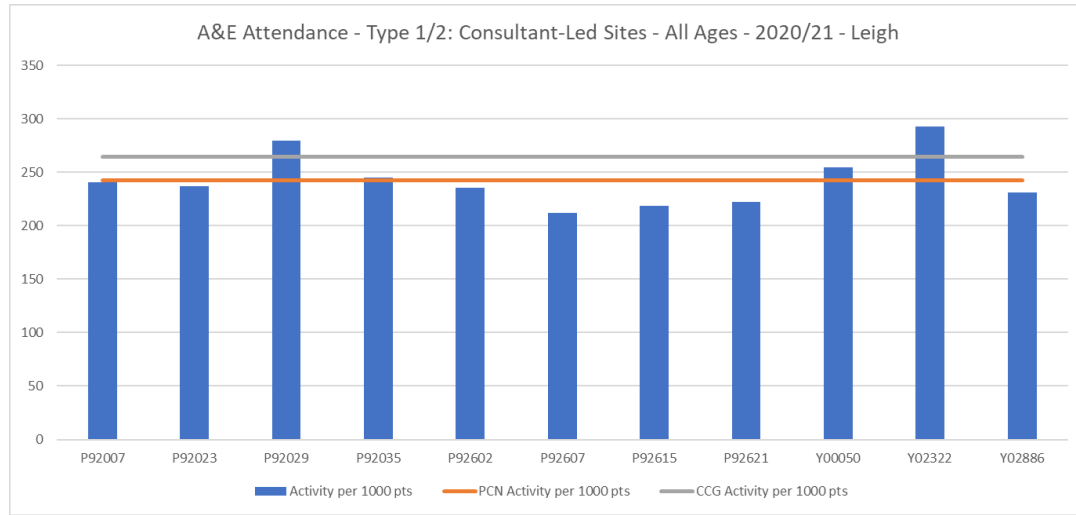

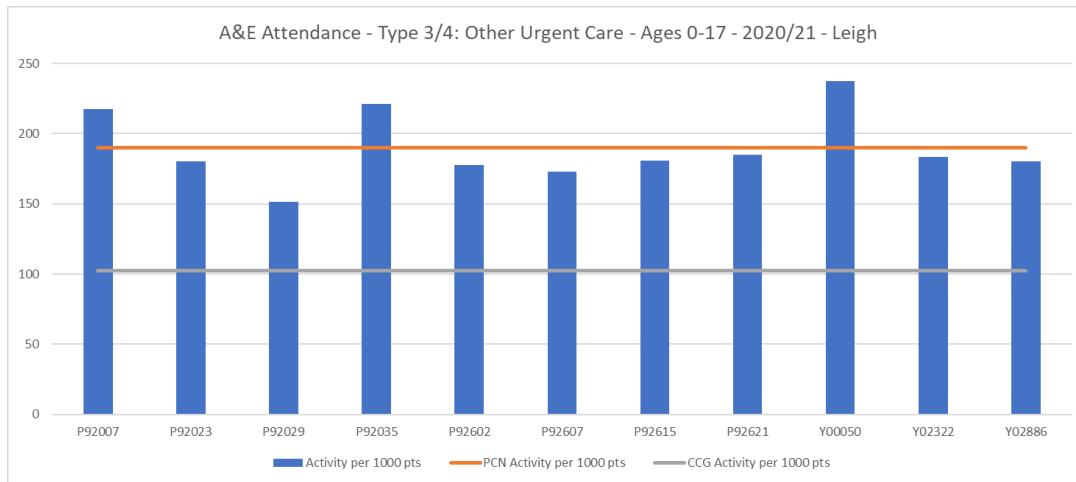


# A&E Attendances – 0-17

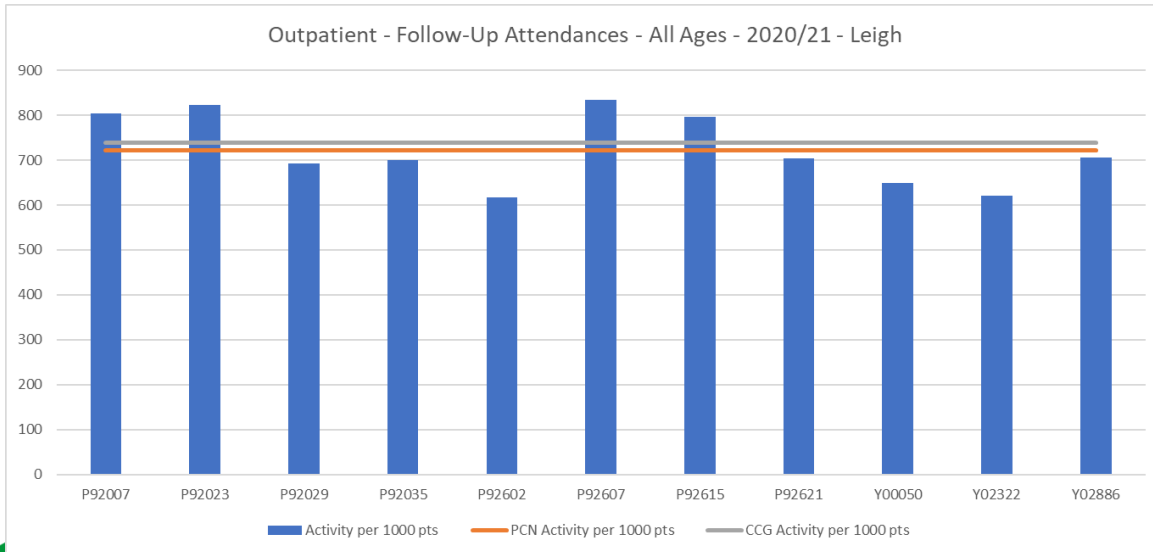

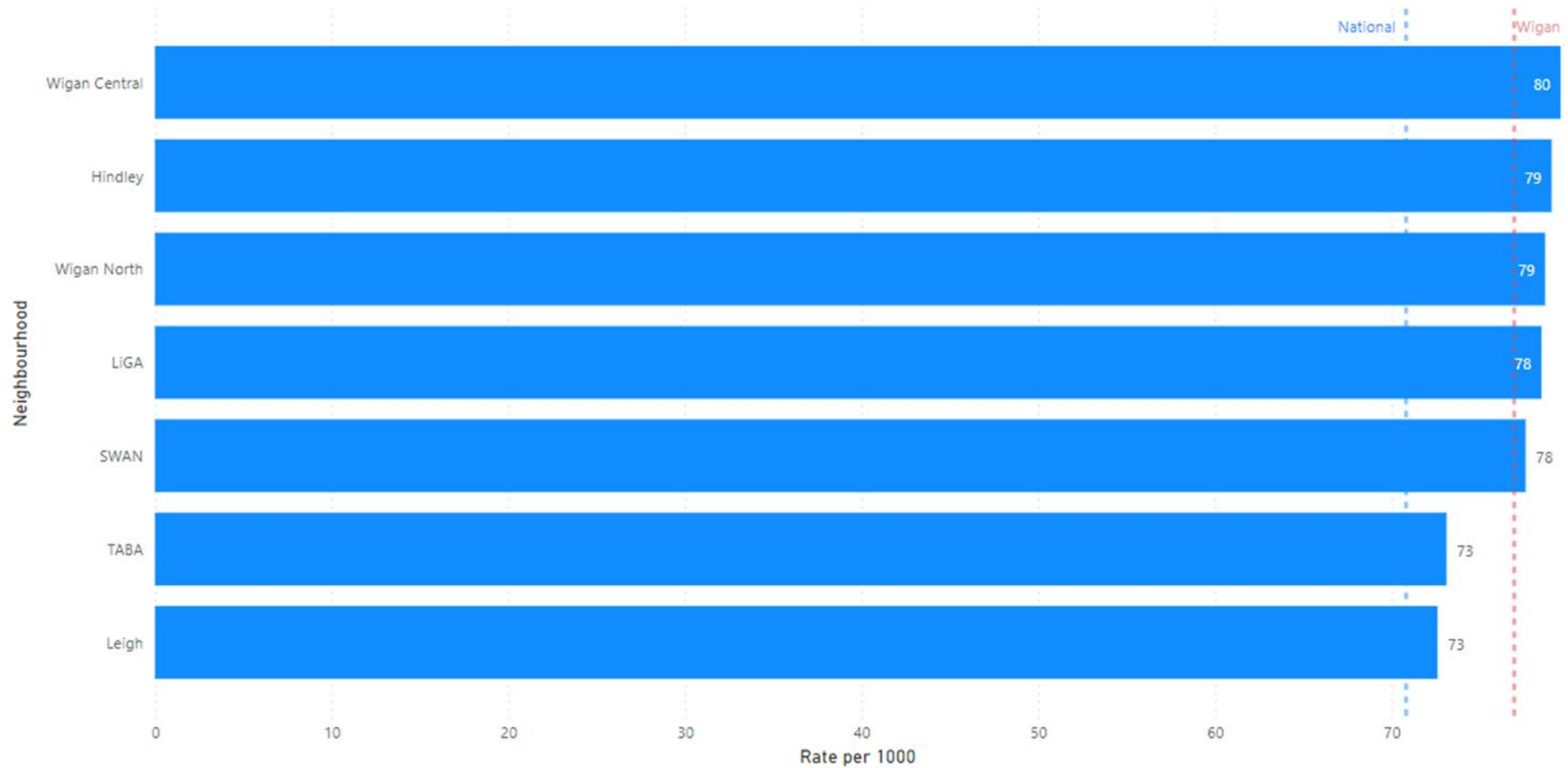

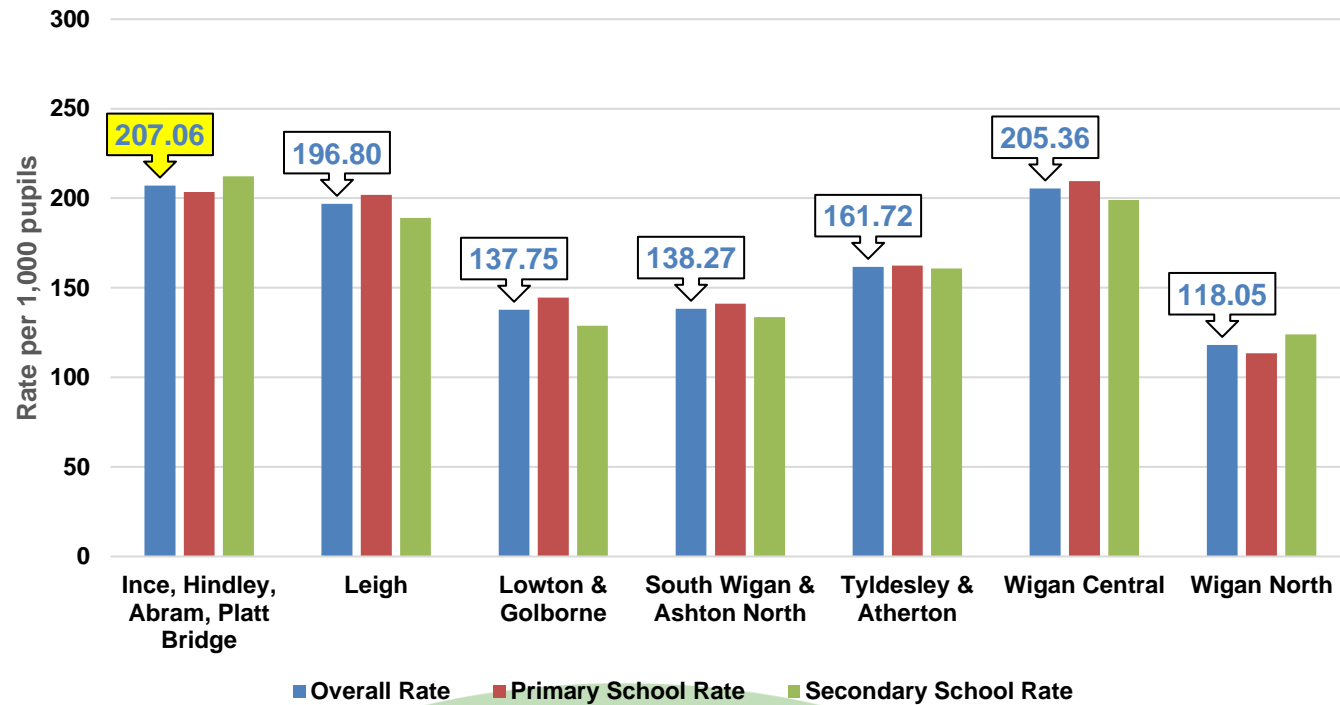

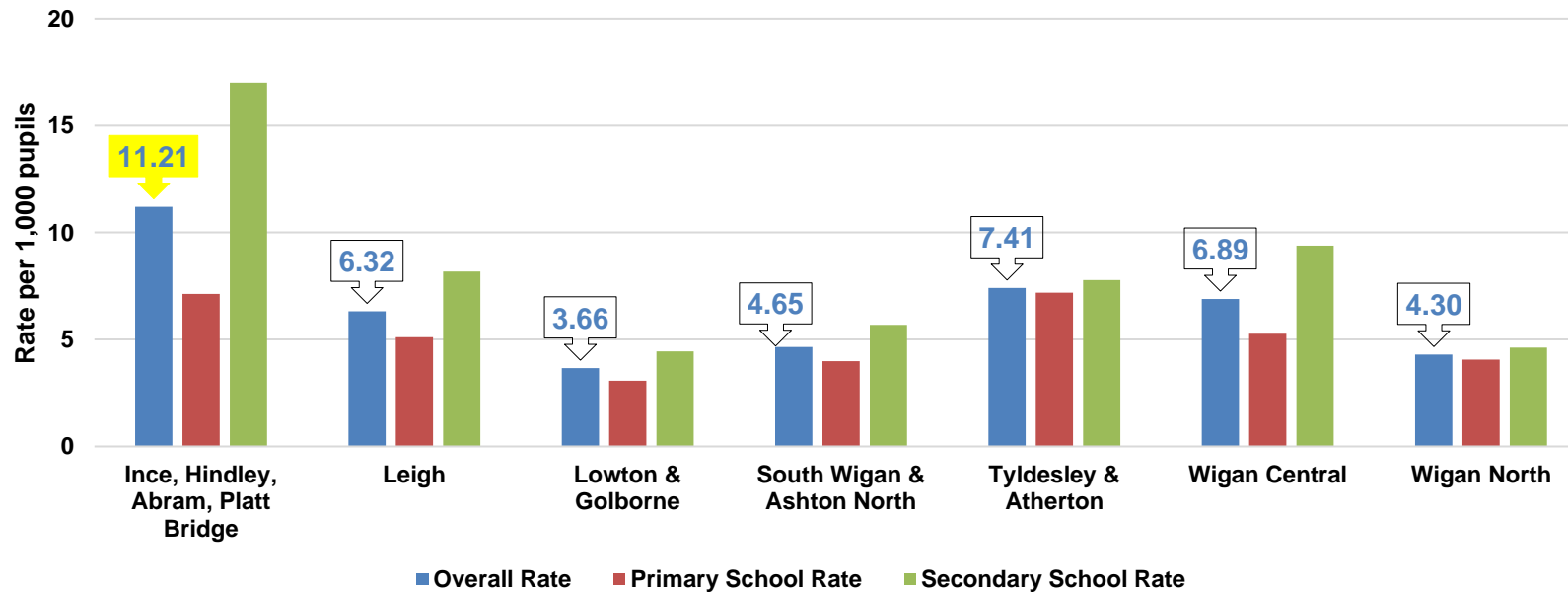

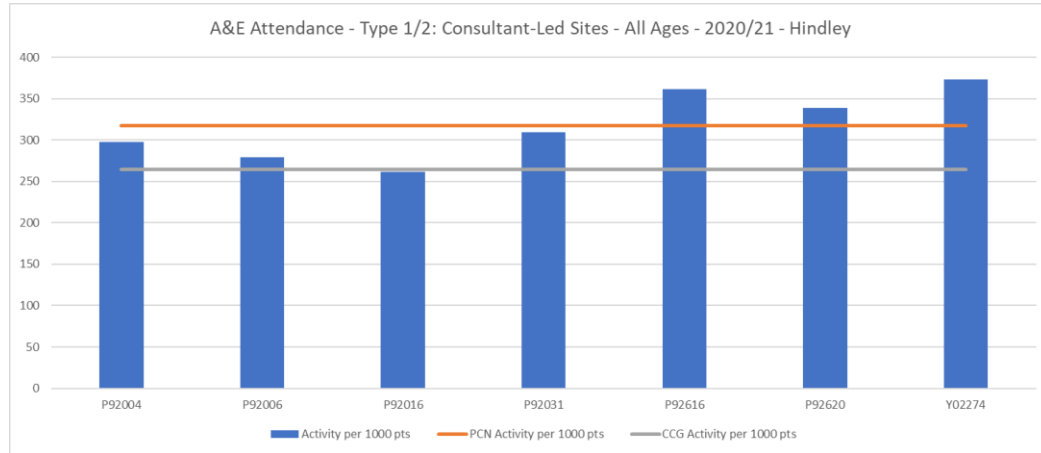

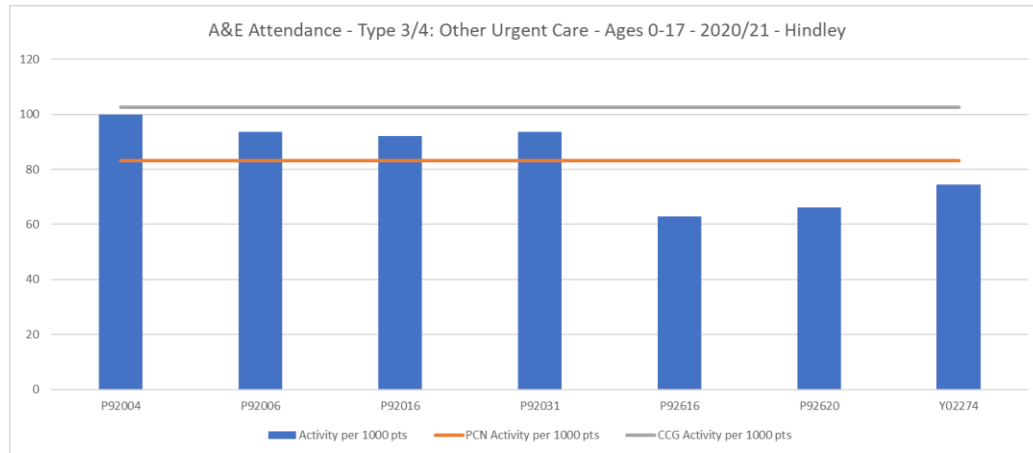

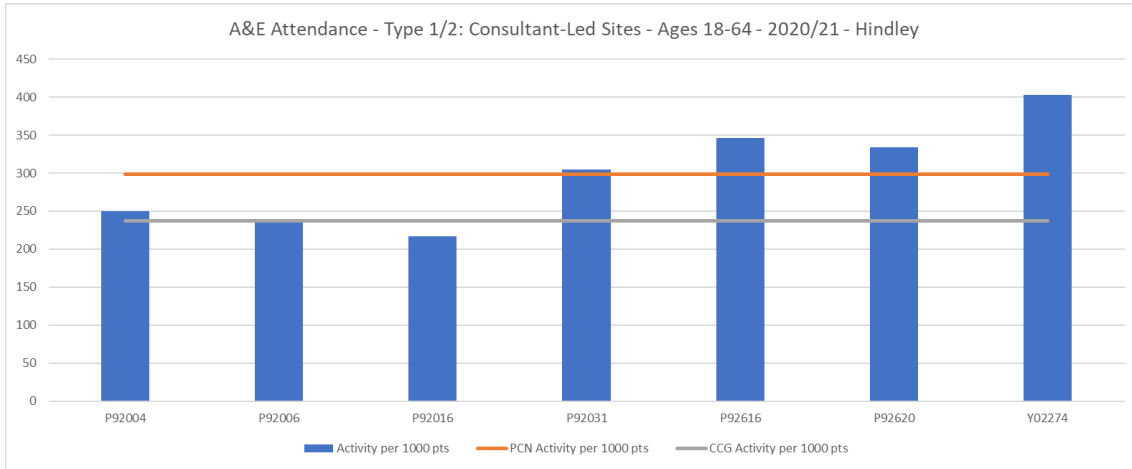

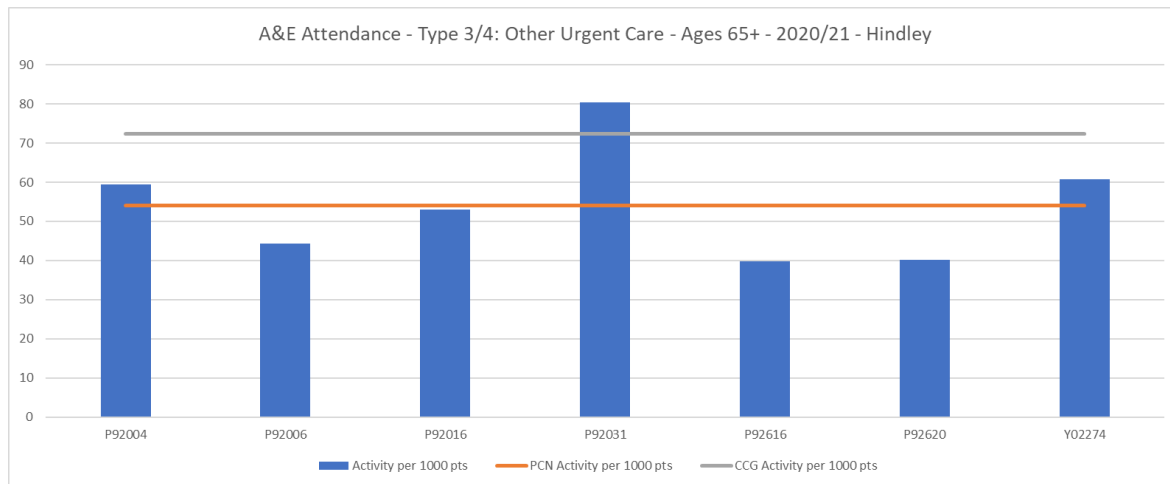

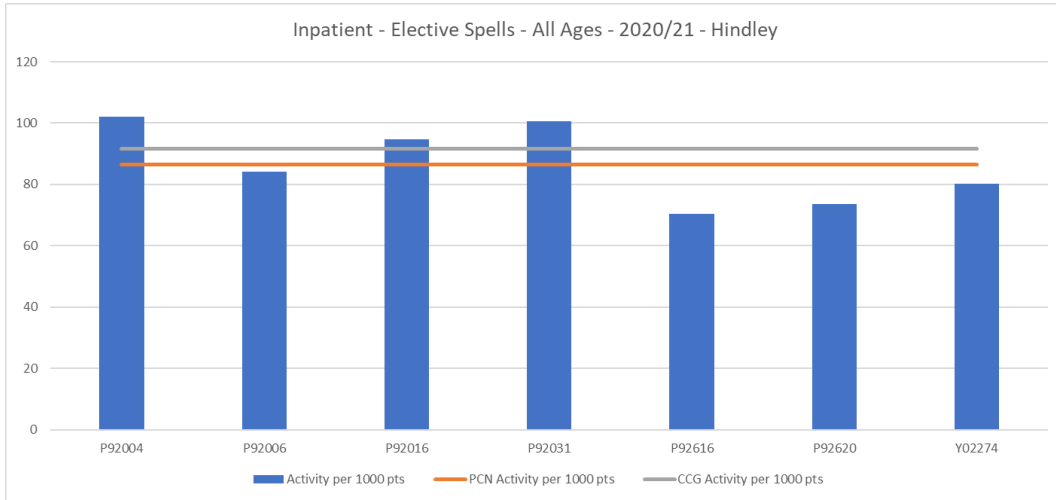
# A&E Attendances – 65 and older



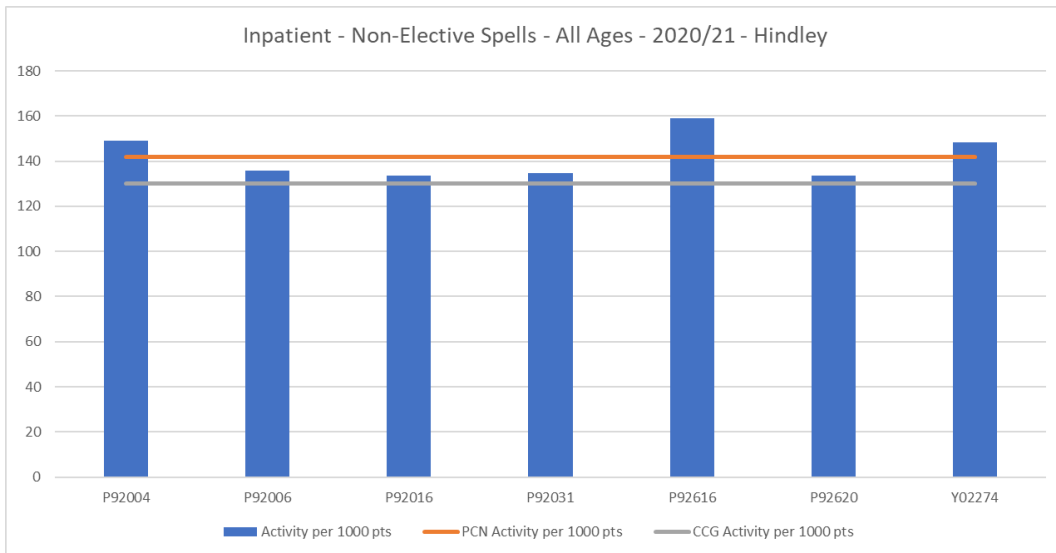

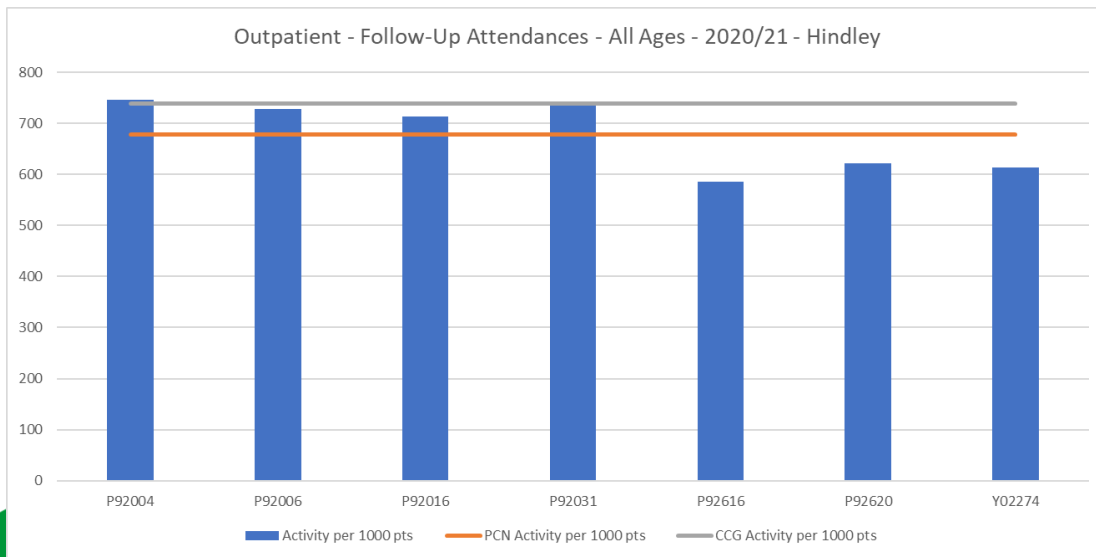

## Population

The Neighbourhood has below average rate of A&E attendances across all age groups, albeit five practices report above Borough average attendances from consultant-led sites.

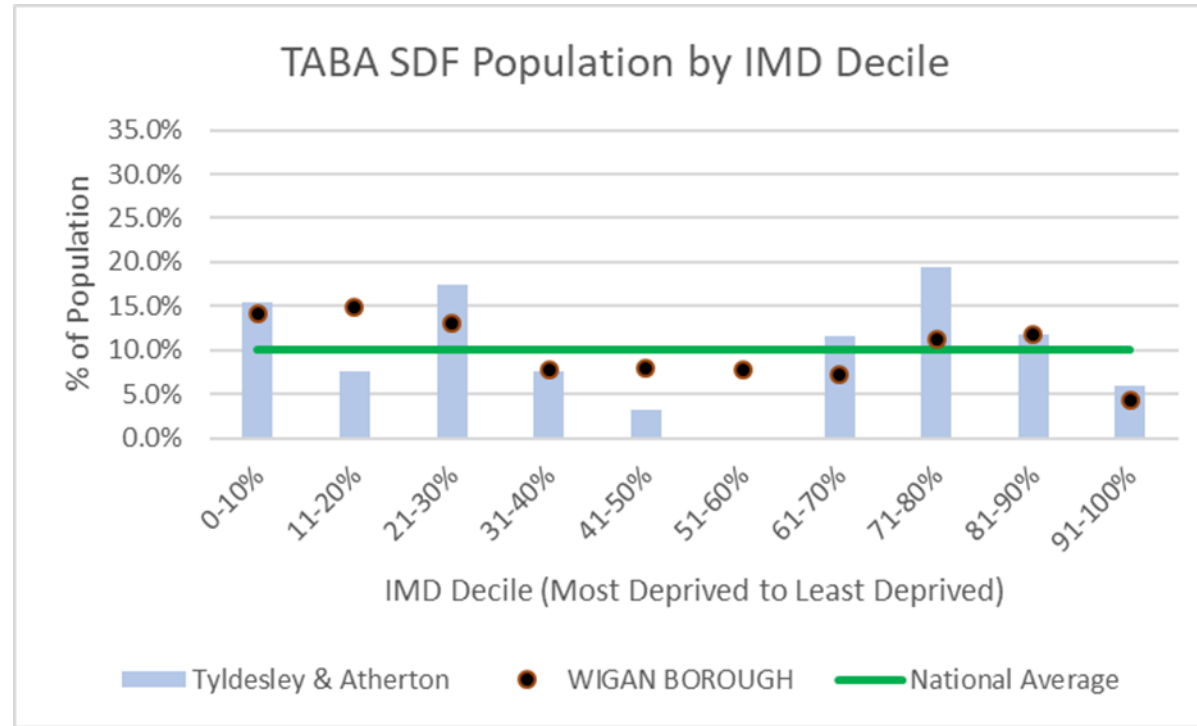

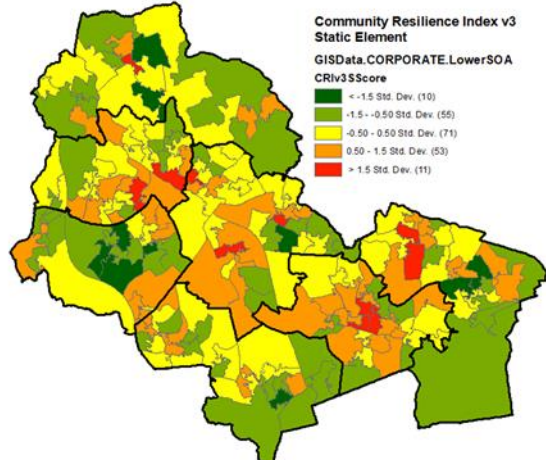
# Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
  - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
  - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
  - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.

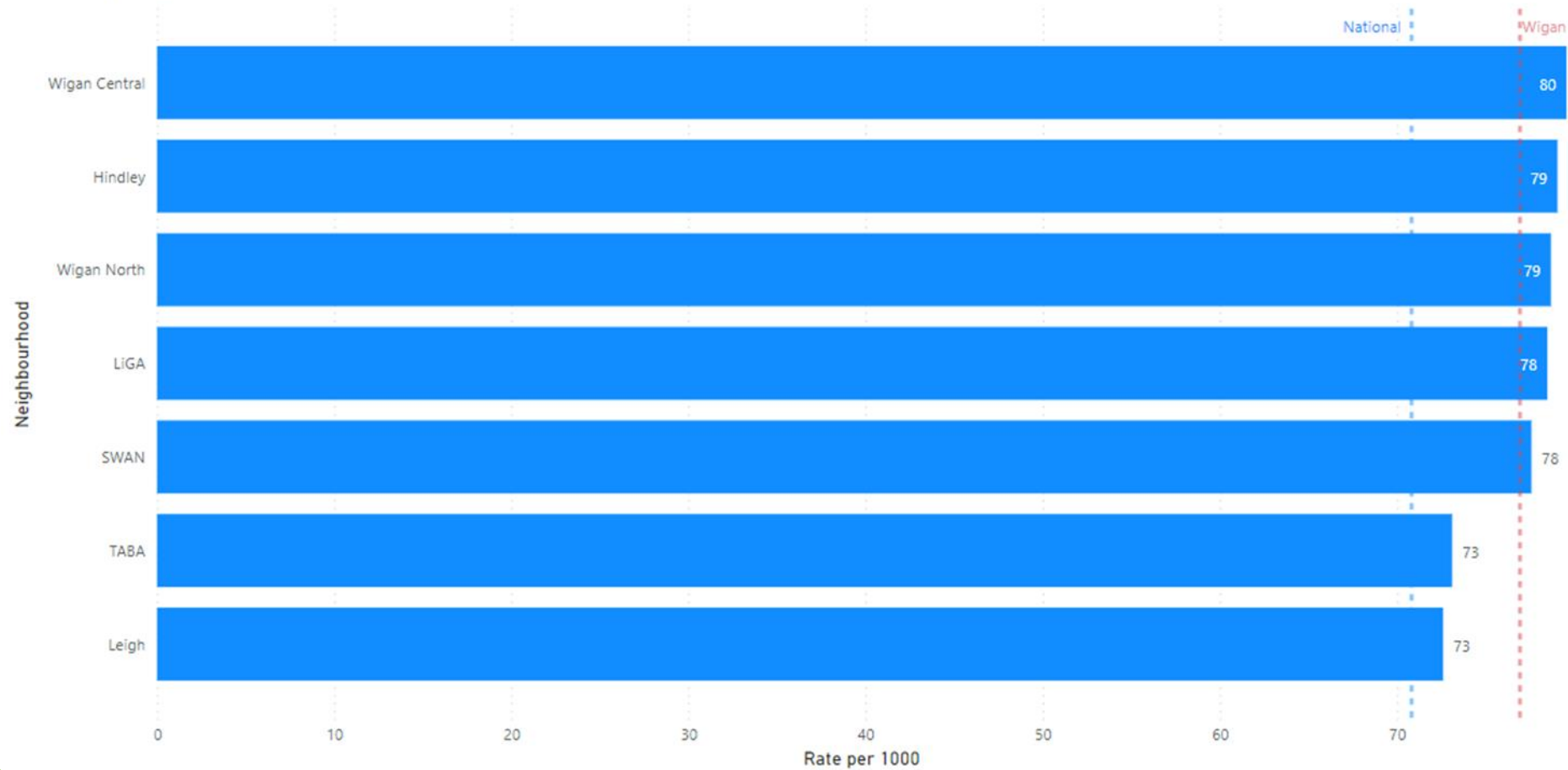

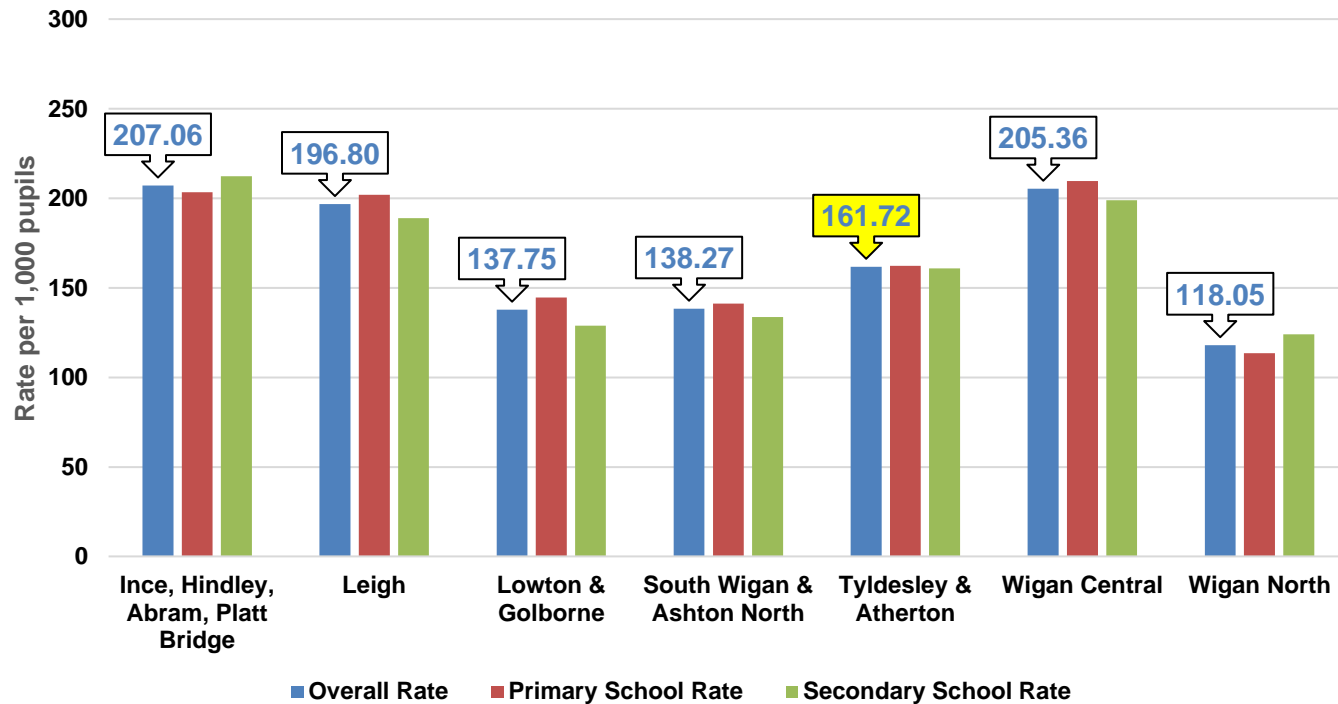

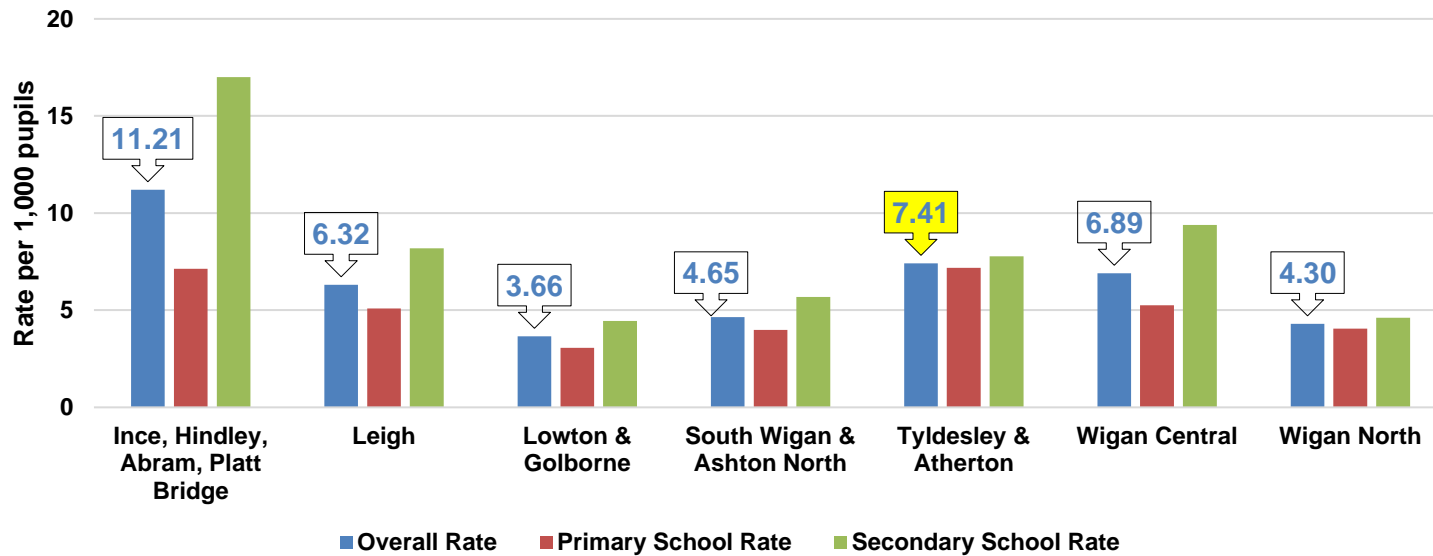

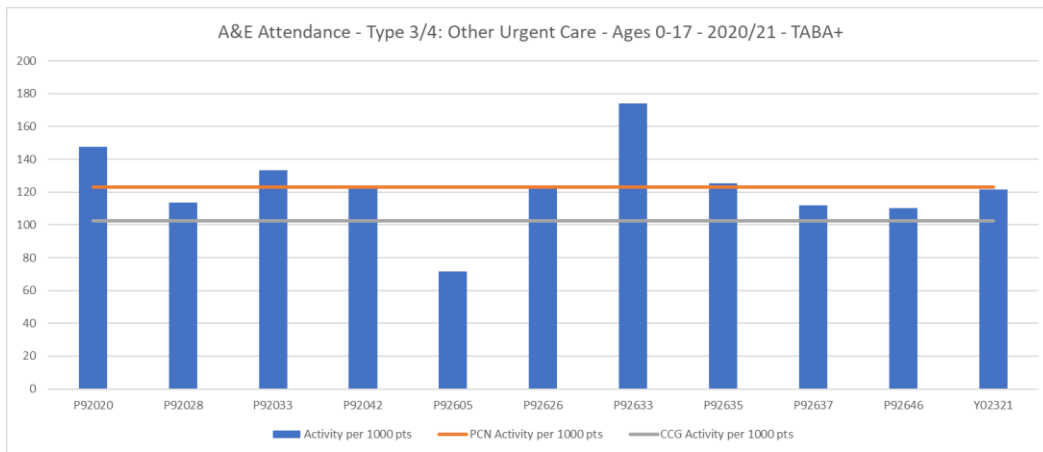

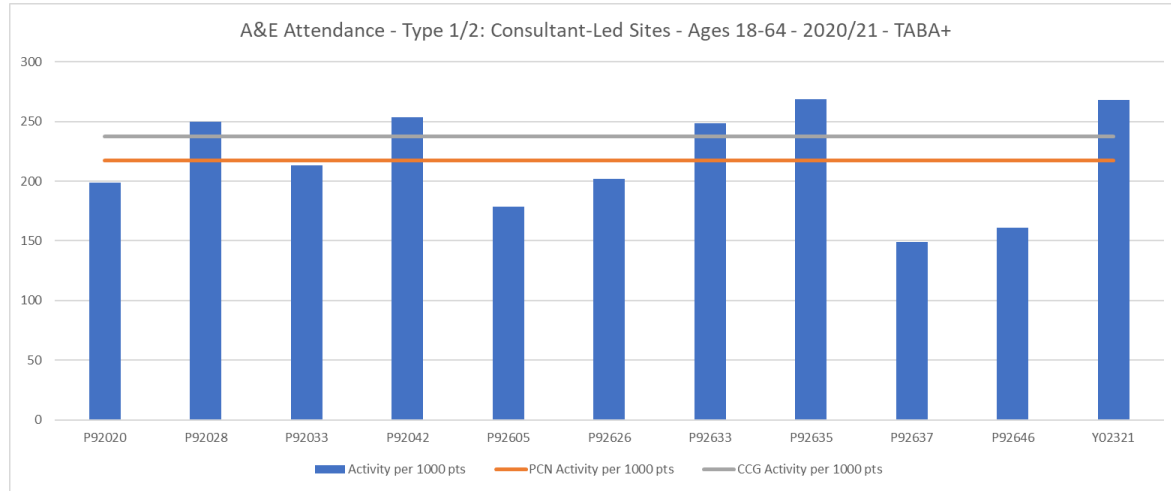

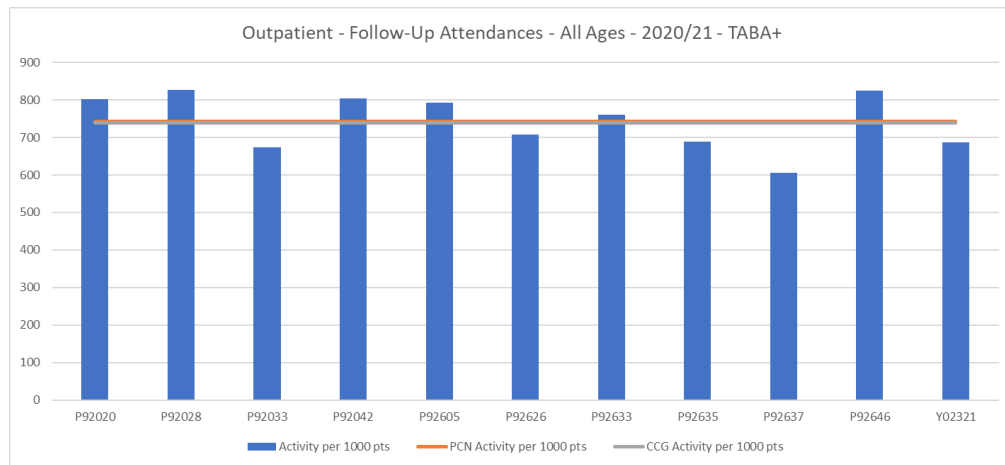

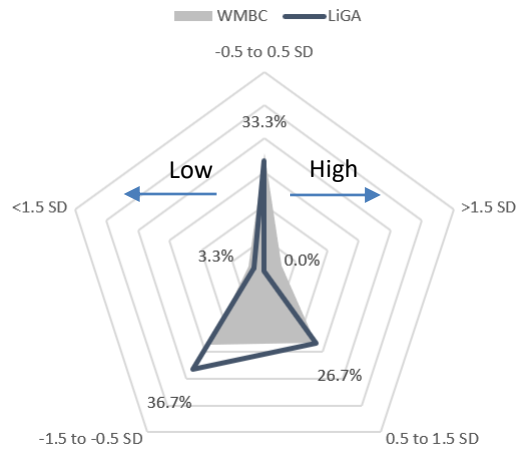
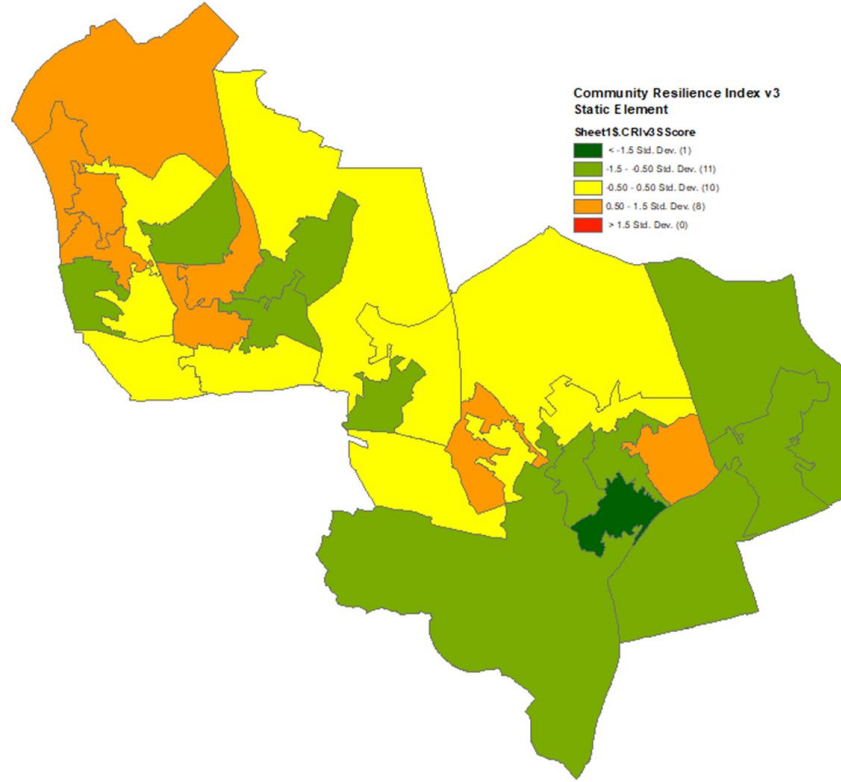
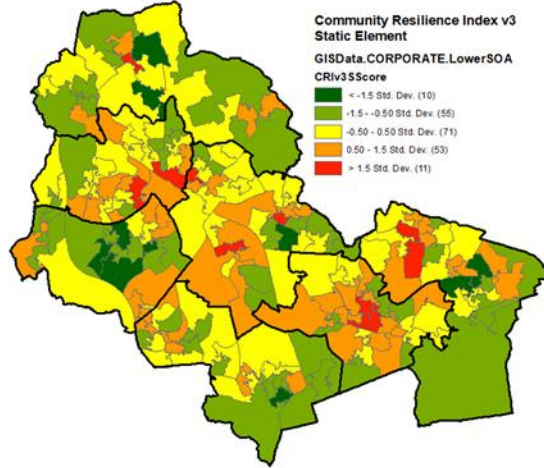
# Community Resilience Index

- This is a tool that has been developed to help identify how resilient our communities are based on a number of indicators. This tool was developed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however has since been adapted to include indicators that are believed to correlate with a higher risk geography. The measures to makeup the CRI now include:
  - The Health Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) which is a score given to each LSOA in the borough based on the risk of premature death and the impairment of quality of life through poor physical or mental health, the indicators measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality.
  - The percentage of Rented Accommodation per LSOA
  - The percentage of employees in COVID-19 impacted industries in each LSAO.
  - The rate of shielded patients in each LSOA.

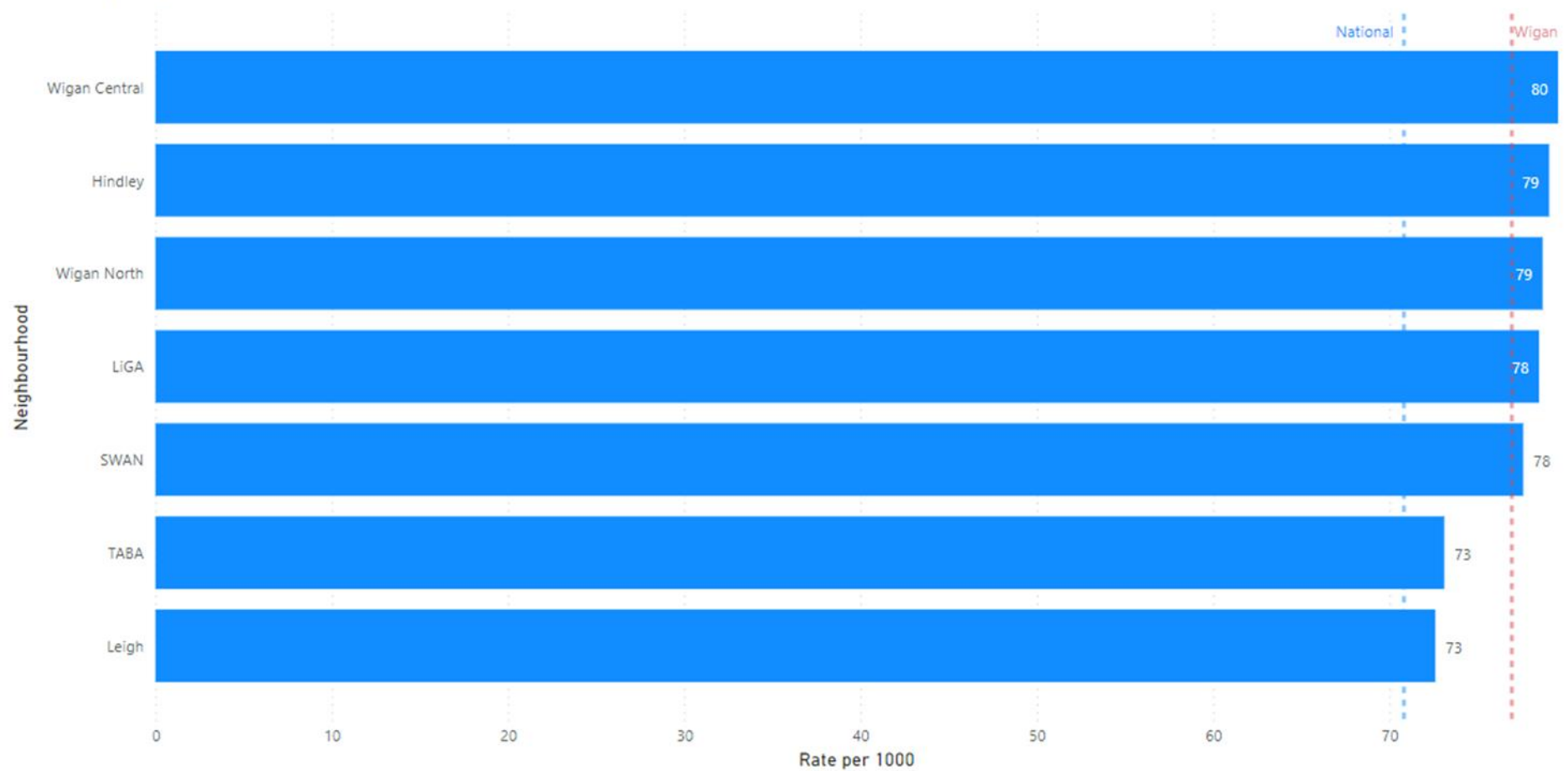

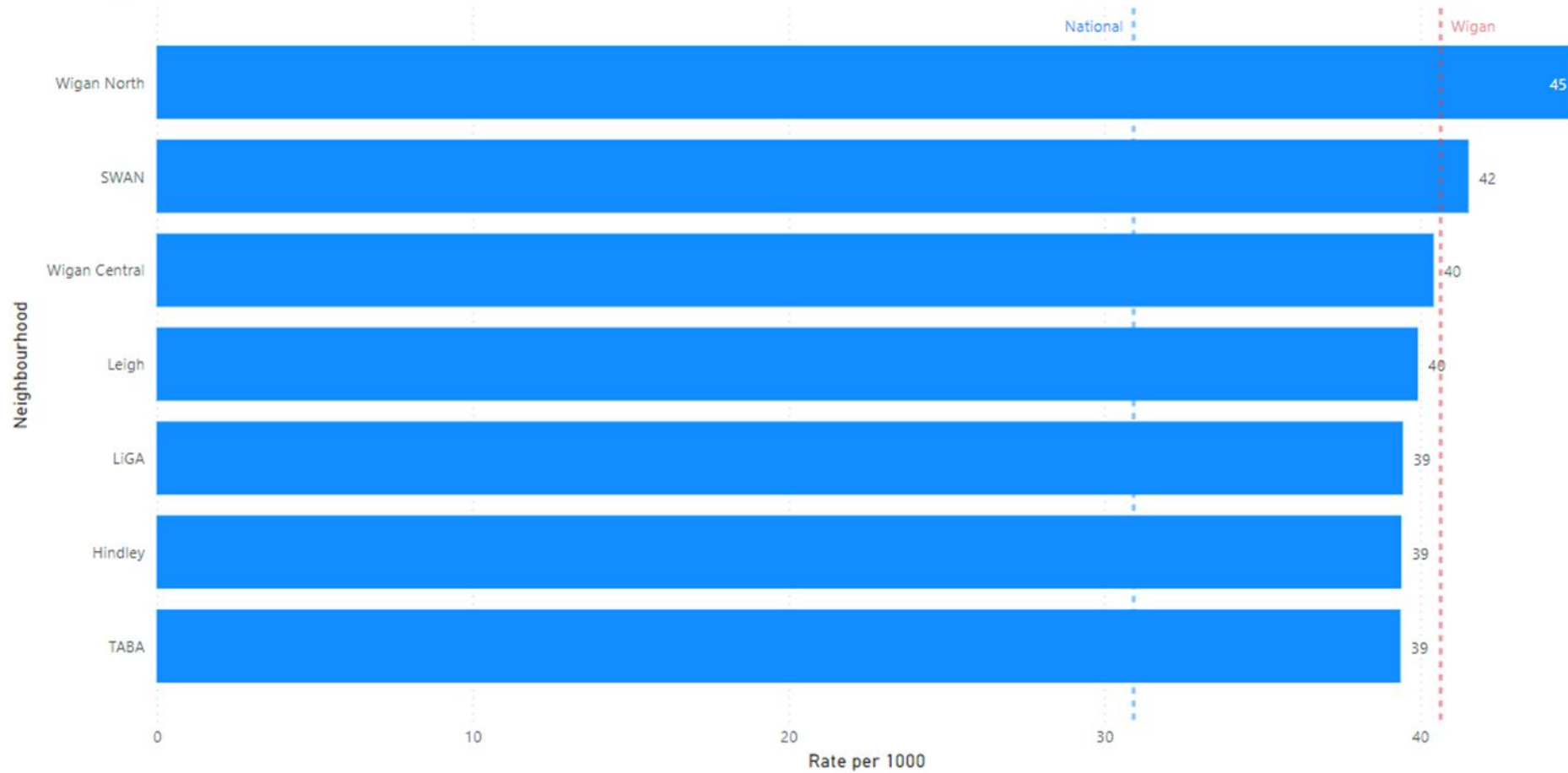

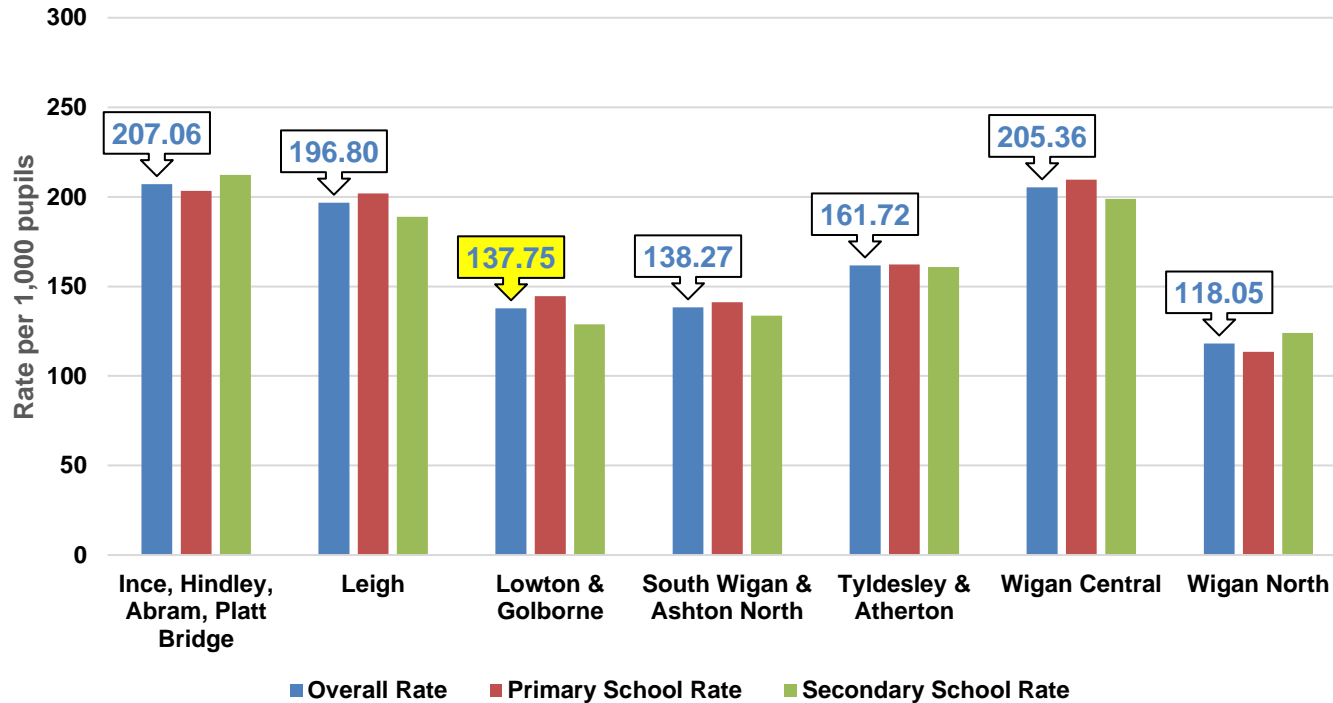

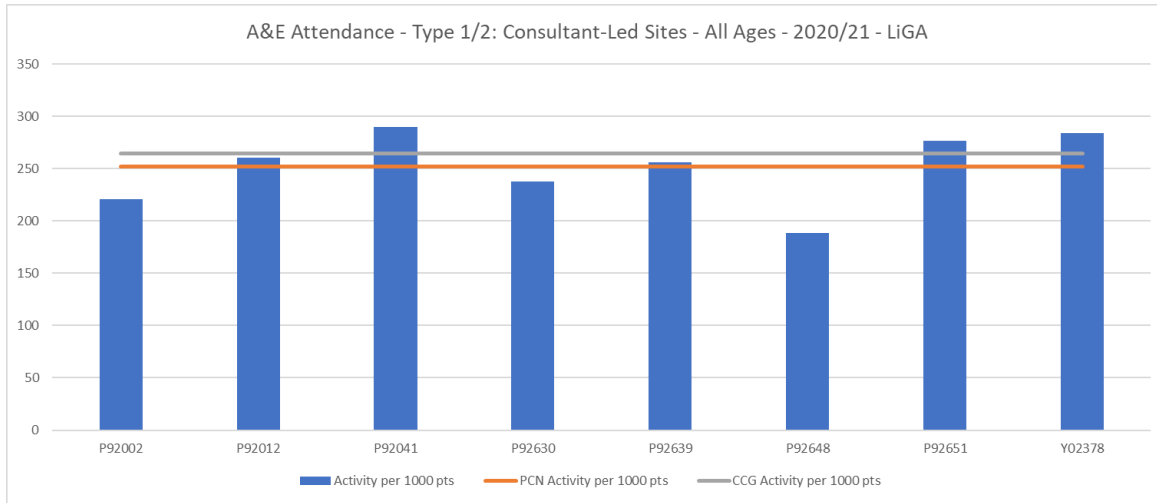

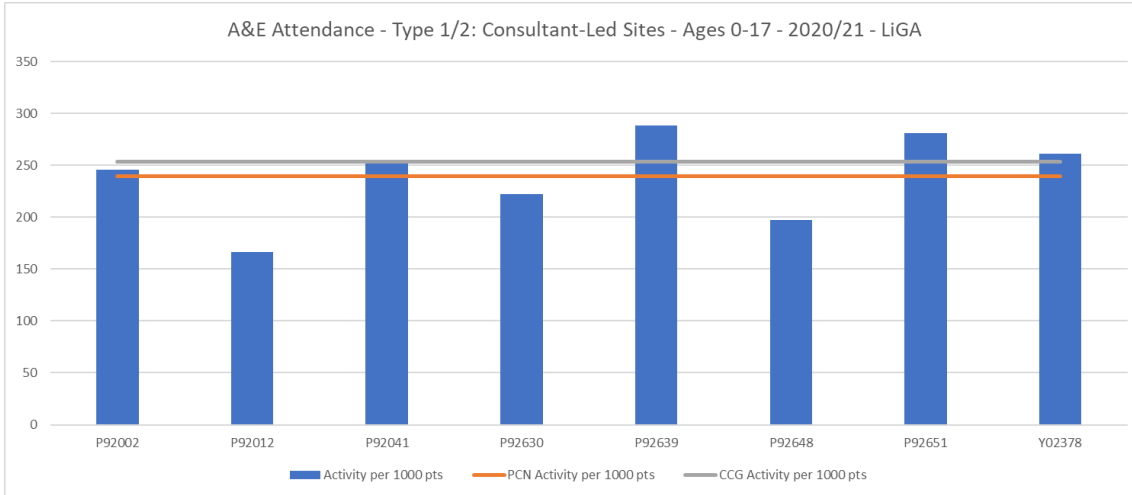

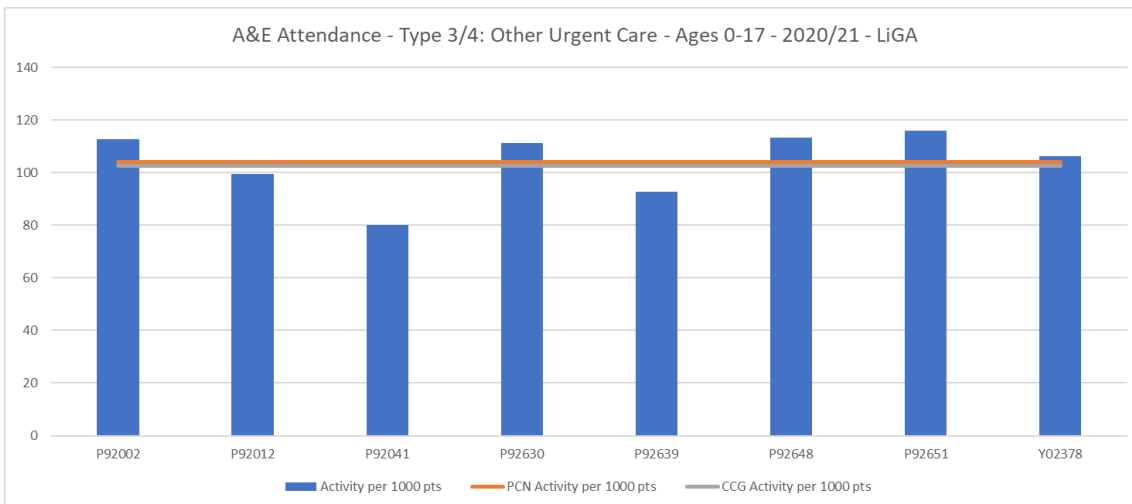

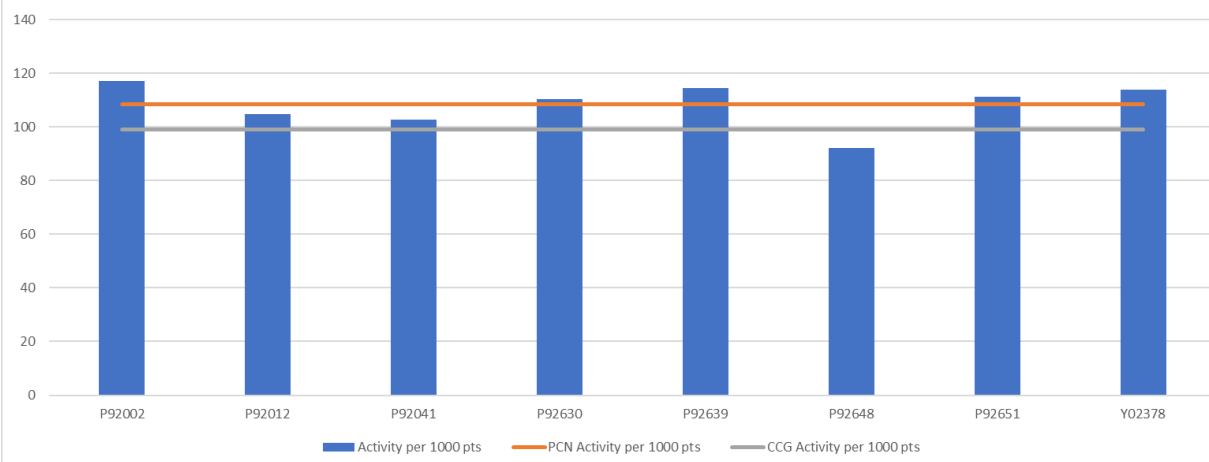

A&E Attendance - Type 1/2: Consultant-Led Sites - Ages 18-64 - 2020/21 - LiGA



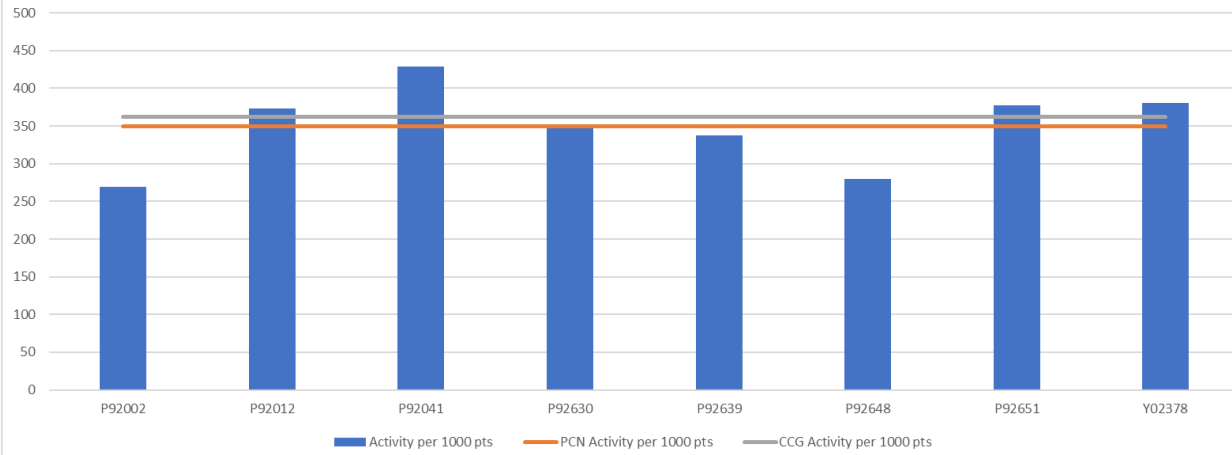

A&E Attendance - Type 3/4: Other Urgent Care - Ages 18-64 - 2020/21 - LiGA



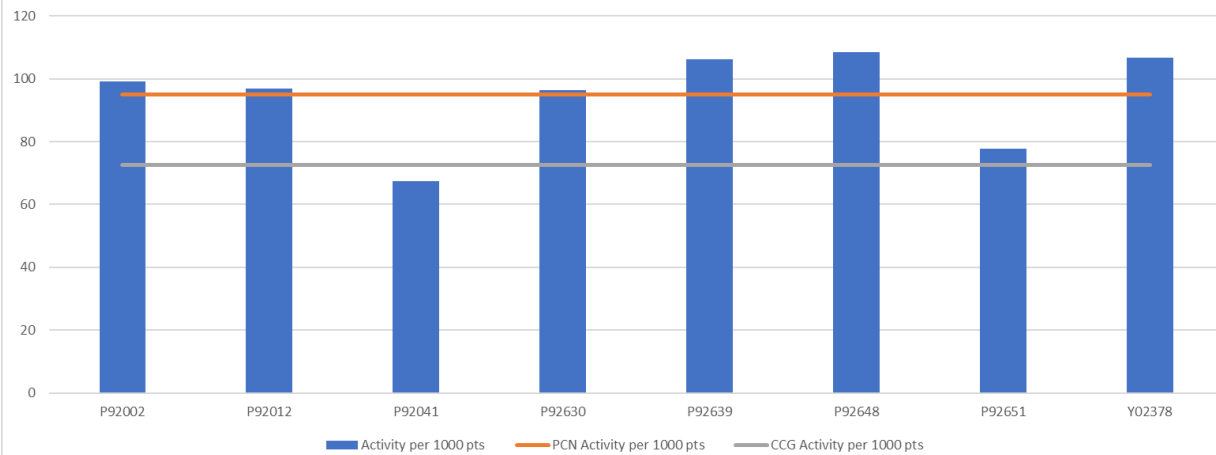

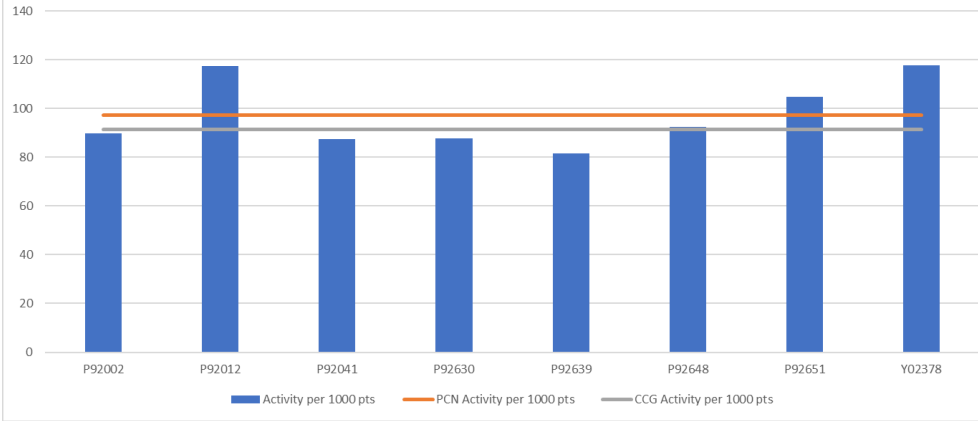
A&E Attendance - Type 3/4: Other Urgent Care - Ages 65+ - 2020/21 - LiGA



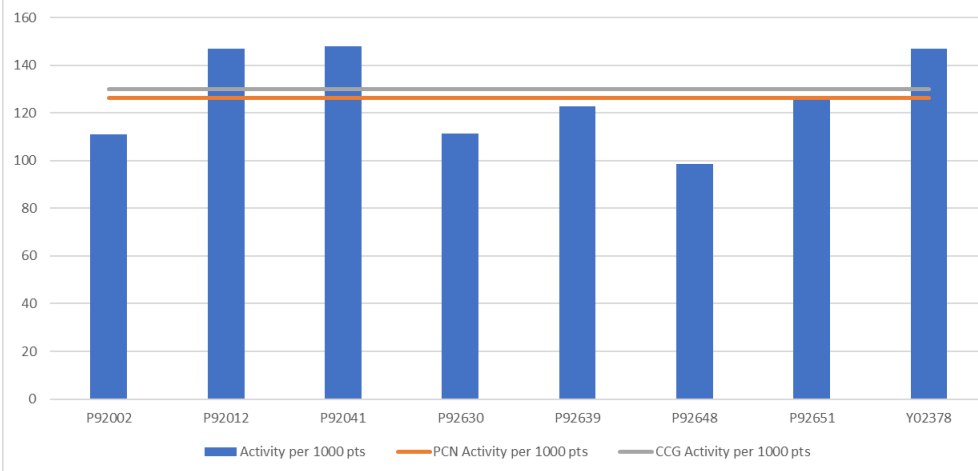

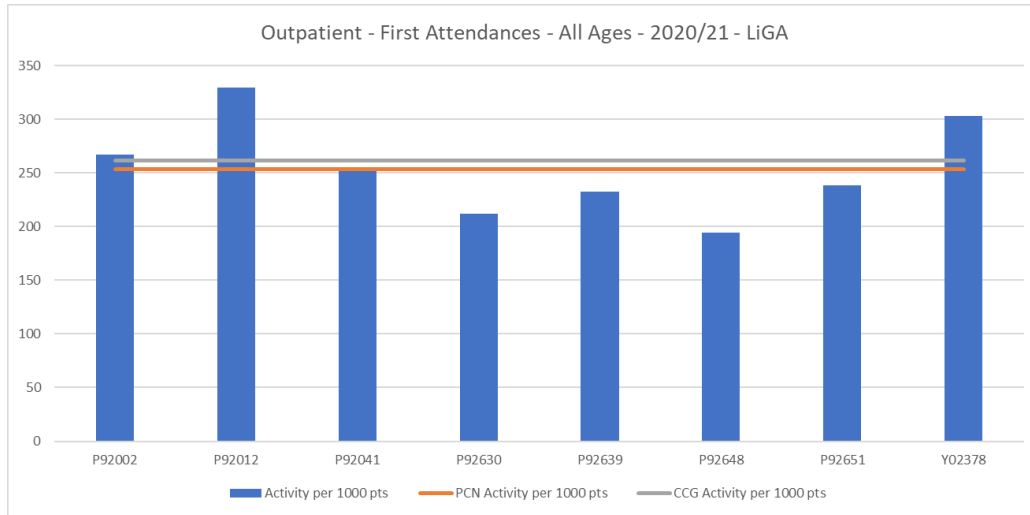
Inpatient - Elective Spells - All Ages - 2020/21 - LiGA



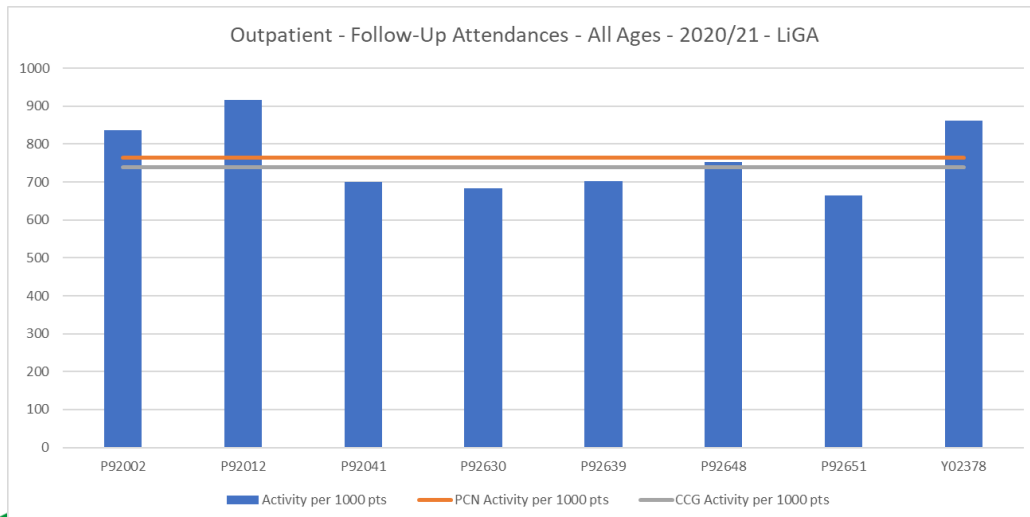
Inpatient - Non-Elective Spells - All Ages - 2020/21 - LiGA

# Place and Community Safety

- The Neighbourhood generally has lower levels of anti-social behaviour
- Rowdy / Inconsiderate Behaviour constituted the most significant proportion of anti-social behaviour incidents in the Neighbourhood, followed by Neighbour Nuisance.
- Amongst the hotspot areas were Church Street / The Poplars (n12 – mixture of malicious / nuisance communications, hoax calls, neighbour nuisance, vehicle nuisance, rowdy / inconsiderate behaviour), the retail and social amenities on Gerard Street (n15 – rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour), the greenspace at Jubilee Park (n9 – rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour), the long residential stretch of Wigan Road (n21 – mainly rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour but also including neighbour and vehicle nuisance, firearms and abandoned vehicle).
- Ashton, Lowton Golborne (LiGA) saw an anomalous trend in Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue incidents with an increase in 2019/20 followed by a decrease in 2020/21 – albeit still above the level of 2018/19 to stand at a rate of 1.77 per 1,000 population. The main incidents were general Deliberate Fires and Deliberate Fires (Loose Refuse).

# Housing

- The Golborne and Lowton sub-area has the second-highest proportion of households in affordable housing need in the Borough
- Based on current demographic profiling and need, there is a shortfall in a range of property types across the Lowton and Golborne sub-area
- The Golborne and Lowton sub-area records above-average levels of dissatisfaction with 'the home as a place to live'

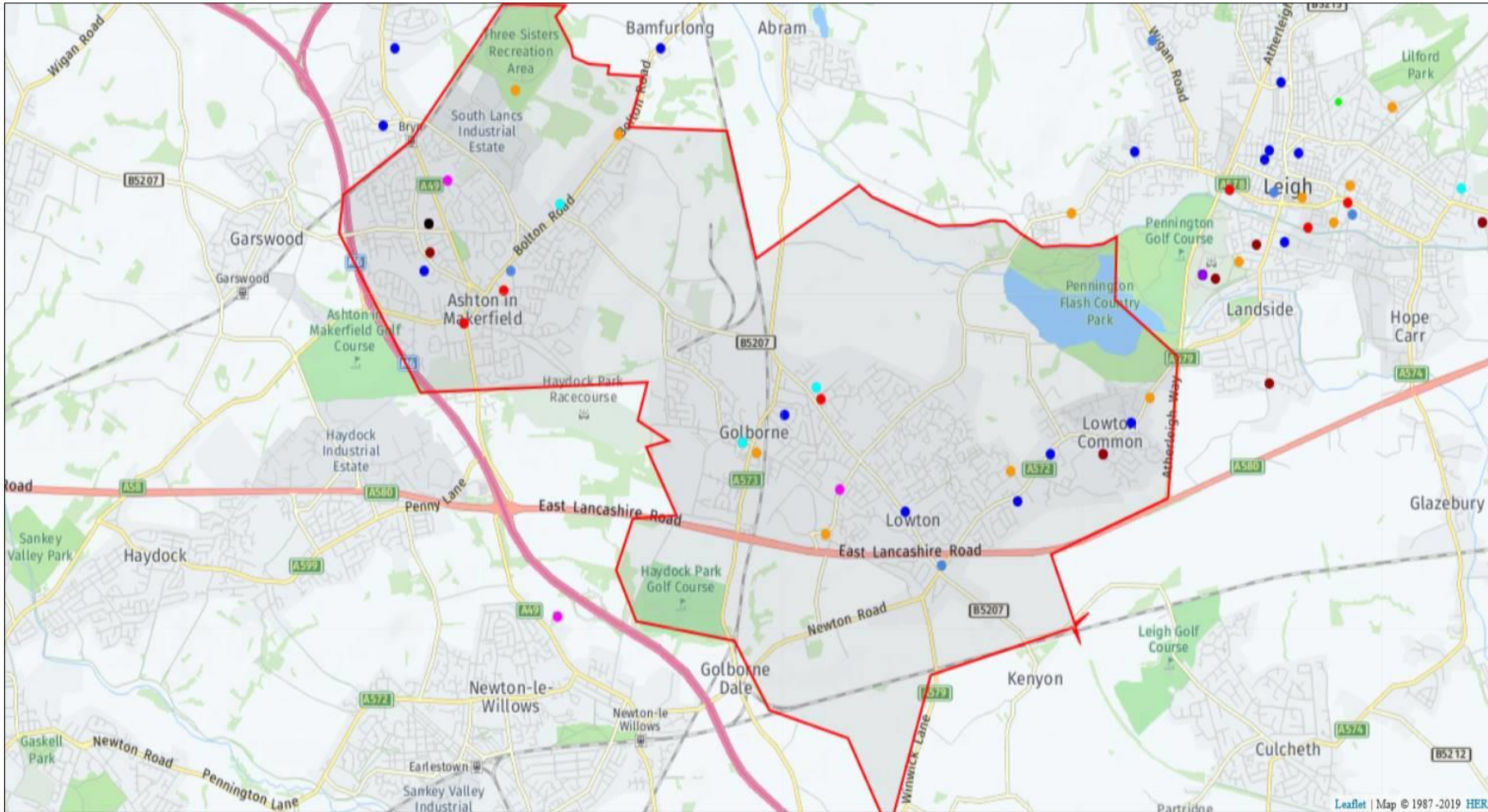

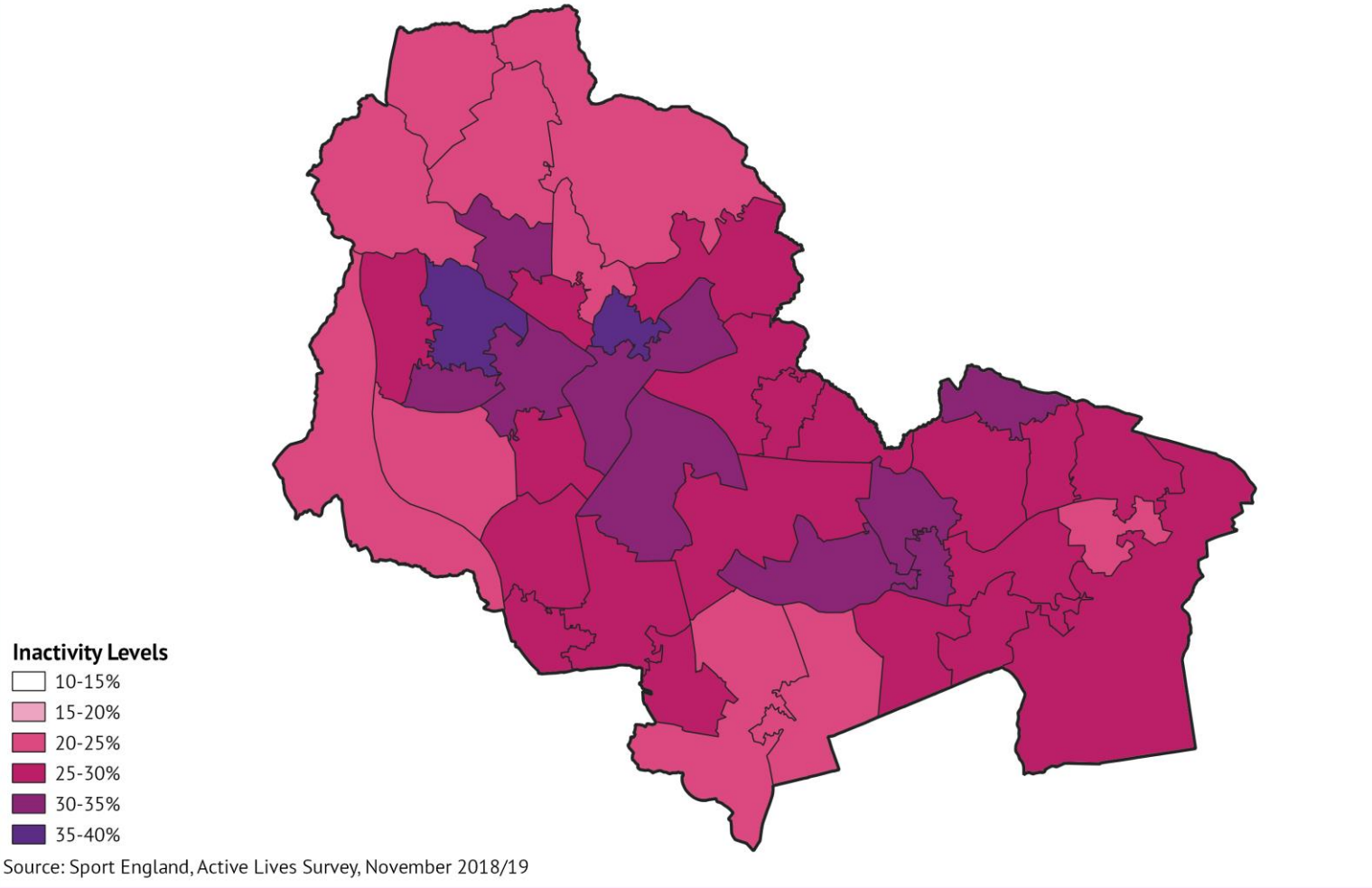
