1. Where will you install the chess table? Why here?

The chess table and seating will be installed in Jubilee Park, Wigan Road, Wigan WN4 9BH. Eagles.skip.spine

Jubilee Park currently holds Green Flag accreditation and is a fantastic example of a local, community focused green space. The park is split into two sections by Wigan Road, one half of the park is devoted to sport and play – play area, skate park, tennis, football pitch etc. The second half can be considered the 'formal' element of the park, with extensive formal flower beds, ornamental trees, free community library etc. It is in this section of the park where we will install the chess table.

The chosen location is a beautiful space with fantastic horticultural displays which draw in many visitors, the addition of a chess table will enhance and complement the activities which currently take place in this area.

The park is located on a busy road with excellent public transport links enabling frequent visits to the park, and within close proximity to the park is R L Hughes Primary school, the location of the school results in many of the primary school pupils visiting the park on their way home from school, evenings and weekends. The presence and visibility of a chess table will expose the pupils to chess and will increase participation.

2. Could you install another chess table in your area? If so, where and why here?

We could install another table at Bryn Gates Community Garden. This location recently received the £85,000 LUPF and as this garden is maturing it is evident that additional and different attractions are needed to sustain the existing, significant increase in visitors.

The current attractions are currently play and sport alongside community food growing areas. It would be wonderful to install an attraction that reaches a new and different audience, especially an attraction that is not age or physical ability defined and is attractive across all generations. The location of the community garden is Bryn Gates Community Garden, Hall Street, Bamfurlong

A chess club has recently formed at Ashton Library. The library is located 0.2 miles from Jubilee Park. We will establish links with the chess club to cross promote the chess table to their members. We will encourage and support the chess club to hold events, competitions within the park, these will be promoted across the Council's different social media feeds (Libraries, Parks, Deal for Communities, Local ClIrs etc) The park has recently received new signage, the availability of the chess table, competitions etc will be promoted through the signage. The park also has an active friends group, which we will ask to support this fantastic initiative. Lastly, we will use the free Little Library in the park to store chess board and pieces for visitors to use.
