

I am writing to politely request details of you Councils Section 106 spending.

Specifically, please could you provide the following details for each of the last 5 years:

1. The total amount of unspent S106 funding

We currently have £18,701,485 in unspent funding with all funding allocated to named schemes through the covenants contained with the deeds.

- 2. The number of transport schemes funded by S106 in each financial year and the name of the corresponding schemes.
- 3. The amount of S106 funding allocated to specific transport schemes during each financial year.

4. Deadline for expenditure of S106 funds

5. The amount of funds returned to developers due to expiry or inaction

- 6. The amount of unspent funding at the end of each financial year which had been allocated to a transport scheme.
- 7. The amount of S106 funding allocated specifically to sustainable transport [mobility solutions] schemes in each financial year and the name of the corresponding schemes.
- 8. The amount of S106 funding upsent specifically allocated to sustainable transport schemes [mobility solutions] in each financial year.

This information can be found in the Councils Infrastructure Funding Statements (IFS) attached.

Please see the attached spreadsheet column A which shows the spend deadline for all unspent funds currently held by Wigan Borough Council.

Wigan Council has not returned any S106 contributions to developers as a result of expiry or inaction.

# Wigan Council Annual Infrastructure Funding Statement

For Section 106

Reporting Period: From 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2020





## Introduction

This document is Wigan Council's first Infrastructure Funding Statement. It provides information about financial contributions that the Council has secured from developers through "Section 106 Obligations". These are legal arrangements between the Council and developers, through which the developer will fund new or improved infrastructure to address the impact of development on an area.

Publishing an Infrastructure Funding Statement on or before 31st December each year, is a legal requirement for the Council in line with regulations that came into force in 2019. The regulations, whose full title is *The Community Infrastructure Levy (Amendment) (England) (No. 2) Regulations 2019,* give details of the information that the Statement has to contain. The rest of this document sets out each of these pieces of information, labelled a) to i), followed by a short explanation.

# Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A Schedule 2 Section 3

a) The total amount of money to be provided under any planning obligations which were entered during the reported year is £1,992,590.10. This figure does not consider indexation (inflation/deflation) that may be applied when the money becomes due.

This item details the value of developer contributions that were entered into in new Section 106 Obligations signed during the period covered by the Statement. The documents were signed immediately before planning permission was granted for the developments in question. Contributions do not normally become payable until development begins on the ground, which can often be some time after planning permission is granted, so the Council has not yet received most of these sums.

b) The total amount of money received from planning obligations during the reported year was £3,338,903.82.

This is the amount of contributions that were received during the year covered by the Statement. Most of these will relate to planning permissions granted in previous years, where development has begun on the ground.

c) The total amount of money received prior to the reported year that has not been allocated is £4,338,661.17.

This item describes the value of contributions that the Council is holding, for which decisions have not yet been made as to what they will be spent on.

The Council operates dedicated Infrastructure Levies in Standish and in Golborne / Lowton, where significant levels of new housebuilding are taking place. Under these Levies, developers contribute a fixed amount per new house, into an overall fund that will then be used to deliver a wide range of infrastructure improvements. The Council will be consulting with local communities in these areas about its proposals and priorities for the use of these

funds in early 2021. Of the figure of £4.338m referenced above, £3.386m is held in these Levy funds.

**d)** During the reported year the following non-monetary contributions have been agreed under planning obligations:

i) The total number of affordable housing units to be provided is 122.

This means that a total of 122 new affordable houses were provided on development sites as part of new developments. A breakdown of these is shown in iii) below.

ii) No new school accommodation has been constructed directly as part of new development.

New housing development is often required to contribute to the provision of additional school places to accommodate increased demand from new residents. This is sometimes provided directly on the development site in the form of a new school built by the developer. Alternatively the developer can be asked to provide a financial contribution to the Council, which is then used to expand accommodation at existing school sites. In the year covered by the report, all the contributions secured towards education provision were in the form of financial contributions. Details of the projects delivered to expand existing schools are shown in h) below.

e) The total amount of money from planning obligations allocated towards infrastructure during the reported year was £870,684.17. Of this amount £671,226.67 was not spent during the reported year.

This item describes the value of contributions for which the Council made decisions as to what they would be spent on, during the year covered by the report. Once a decision has been made, further work has to take place to design a scheme in detail, procure a contractor to deliver it, so it is frequently the case that money is not spent in the same year as the decision is made.

A breakdown of the unspent element (£671,226.67) is given in g) below.

f) The total amount of money from planning obligations spent during the reported year was £1,198,302.99. None of this amount was spent by a third party on behalf of Wigan Council.

This item gives details of the total amount of Section 106 funding that the Council has spent during the year covered by the report. A full breakdown of this amount is given in item h) below. In some cases the Council can pass Section 106 funding to another organisation, to spend on its behalf on an agreed project. No funding was spent in this way during the year covered by the report, but in 2018 the Council used contributions from the Golborne and Lowton Infrastructure Levy to fund a scheme of improvements at Lowton St. Mary's Church Hall, which were commissioned and delivered by a community group.

**g)** The following items have had money allocated towards them during the reported year with unspent allocations:

ii) No planning obligation money was spent on repaying money borrowed.

Councils have the ability to borrow money in order to deliver infrastructure and enable new development, with the borrowing subsequently being repaid through Section 106 contributions provided by the development as it comes forward. This item confirms that the Council has not adopted this approach during the year covered by the report.

iii) No planning obligation money was spent in respect of administration of planning obligations and monitoring in relation to the delivery of planning obligations during the reported year.

The Regulations allow Councils to use a portion (normally up to 5%) of Section 106 contributions to cover their costs in monitoring and administering the funds. The Council may decide to do this in future but did not use any Section 106 funding for this purpose in the year covered by the report.

i) The total amount of money retained at the end of the reported year is £10,334,572.90. Of this amount retained an amount of £0.00 has been retained for long term maintenance.

This item details the total amount of Section 106 funding, including the Infrastructure Levies, that the Council was holding on 31st March 2020.

Sums paid for maintenance are accounted for in the year received, and are treated in line with the obligations entered into in each Section 106 document.

Publishing an Infrastructure Funding Statement on or before 31st December each year, is a legal requirement for the Council in line with regulations that came into force in 2019. The regulations, whose full title is The Community Infrastructure Levy (Amendment) (England) (No. 2) Regulations 2019, give details of the information that the Statement has to contain. The rest of this document sets out each of these pieces of information, labelled a) to i), followed by a short explanation

# Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A Schedule 2 Section 3

a) The total amount of money to be provided under any planning obligations which were entered during the reported year is £3,419,982.00. This figure does not consider indexation (inflation/deflation) that may be applied when the money becomes due.

This item details the value of developer contributions that were entered into in new Section 106 Agreements signed during the period covered by the Statement. The agreements were signed at the same time as planning permission was granted for the developments in question. Contributions do not normally become payable until development begins on the ground, which can often be some time after planning permission is granted, so the Council has not yet received most of these sums.

b) The total amount of money received from planning obligations during the reported year was £6,563,856.88.

This is the amount of contributions that were received during the year covered by the Statement. Most of these will relate to planning permissions granted in previous years, where development has begun on the ground. Significant contributions received during this period were:

£709,803.92 Mosley Common Road Junction works

£1.602m Affordable Housing, Golborne

£50,000.00 New play equipment Repton Avenue, Ince and William Foster Playing Fields

c) The total amount of money received prior to the reported year that has not been allocated is £5,427,210.88.

This item describes the value of contributions that the Council is holding, for which decisions have not yet been made as to what they will be spent on.

The Council operates dedicated Infrastructure Levies in Standish and in Golborne / Lowton, where significant levels of new housebuilding are taking place. Under these Levies, developers contribute a fixed amount per new house, into an overall fund that will then be used to deliver a wide range of infrastructure improvements. The Council undertook a public consultation in early 2021 regarding its proposals and priorities for the use of these funds. Of the figure of £5.427m referenced above, £4.247m is held in these Levy funds.

- d) During the reported year the following non-monetary contributions have been agreed under planning obligations:
- i) The total number of affordable housing units to be provided is 109

This means that a total of 109 new affordable houses were provided on development sites as part of new developments. A breakdown of these is shown in iii) below.

ii) No new school accommodation has been constructed directly as part of new development.

New housing development is often required to contribute to the provision of additional school places to accommodate increased demand from new residents. This is sometimes provided directly on the development site in the form of a new school builtby the developer. Alternatively, the developer can be asked to provide a financial contribution to the Council, which is then used to expand accommodation at existing school sites. In the year covered by the report, all the contributions secured towards education provision were in the form of financial contributions. Details of the projects delivered to expand existing schools are shown in h) below.

# Annual Infrastructure Funding Statement for Section 106 Agreements

### Introduction

This document is Wigan Council's third Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS or the 'Statement'). It provides information about financial contributions that the Council has secured from developers through "Section 106 agreements". These are legal agreements between the Council and developers, through which the developer will fund new or improved infrastructure to address the impact of development on an area.

Publishing an IFS each year is a legal requirement for the Council in line with regulations that came into force in 2019. The regulations, whose full title is *'The Community Infrastructure Levy (Amendment) (England) (No. 2) Regulations 2019'*, give details of the information that the Statement must contain. The rest of this document sets out each of these pieces of information, labelled a) to i), followed by a short explanation.

# Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A, Schedule 2, Section 3.

a) The total amount of money to be provided under any planning obligations which were entered during the reported year is £744,734.73. This figure does not consider indexation (inflation/deflation) that may be applied when the money becomes due.

This item details the value of developer contributions that were entered into in new Section 106 Agreements signed during the period covered by this Statement. The agreements were signed at the same time as planning permission was granted for the developments in question. In general circumstances, contributions do not normally become payable until development begins on the ground, which can often be some time after planning permission is granted, so the Council has not yet received most of these sums.

b) The total amount of money received from planning obligations during the reported year was £5,575,656.99.

This amount referenced above relates to the contributions that were received during the year covered by the Statement. Most of these will relate to planning permissions granted in previous years, and in the majority of cases where development has begun on the ground.

c) The total amount of money received prior to the reported year that has not been allocated is £6,996,349.93

This item describes the value of contributions that the Council was holding at 31 March 2022, that had been received prior to March 2021, for which decisions have not yet been made as to what they will be spent on.

The Council operates dedicated Infrastructure Levies in Standish and in Golborne / Lowton, where significant levels of new housebuilding are taking place. Under these Levies, developers contribute a fixed amount per new house, into an overall fund that will then be used to deliver a wide range of infrastructure improvements.

Since March 2022 the Council has made decisions as to the spending of a significant proportion of the levy funding – this will be reported on in detail in the next IFS.

- d) During the reported year the following non-monetary contributions have been agreed under planning obligations
  - i) The total number of affordable housing units to be provided is 29.

This means that a total of 29 new affordable houses are to be provided on development sites as part of new developments. A breakdown of these is shown in iii) below.

ii) No new school accommodation has been constructed directly as part of new development.

New housing development is often required to contribute to the provision of additional school places to accommodate increased demand from new residents. This is sometimes provided directly on the development site in the form of a new school built by the developer. Alternatively, the developer can be asked to provide a financial contribution to the Council, which is then used to expand accommodation at existing school sites. In the year covered by this Statement, all the contributions secured towards education provision were in the form of financial contributions. Details of the projects delivered to expand existing school sites are shown in h) below.

e) The total amount of money from planning obligations allocated towards infrastructure during the reported year was £10,433,519.60. Of this amount £26,367,197.63 was not spent during the reported year.

This item describes the value of contributions for which the Council made decisions as to what they would be spent on, during the year covered by the report. Once a decision has been made, further work must take place to design a scheme in detail, procure a contractor to deliver it, so it is frequently the case that money is not spent in the same year as the decision is made.

The Council operates dedicated Infrastructure Levies in Standish and in Golborne / Lowton, where significant levels of new housebuilding are taking place. Under these Levies, developers contribute a fixed amount per new house, into an overall fund that will then be used to deliver a wide range of infrastructure improvements.

A report to the Council's Cabinet in February 2022 secured approval for a mechanism for taking decisions on which these projects would be funded through the Levies. The report firstly outlined the issues that would be considered, including strategic fit and deliverability, as well as feedback from the public consultation. The report also established a split within the overall funding pot in each of the Levy areas, with 20% of the fund in each area being made available for "Small Scale Infrastructure" projects including community schemes, open

spaces, and upgrades to walking and cycling routes; the other 80% of the pot to be used for "Large Scale Infrastructure" schemes, primarily highways improvements.

A further report taken to the Council's Cabinet in July 2022 set out a programme of schemes to be funded through the "Large Scale Infrastructure" pot in each of the Levy areas. The schemes identified accounted for the majority, though not all, of the 80% available for both areas. This programme of schemes was considered by the Council's internal governance processes and was endorsed by the Strategic Management Team on the 31 May 2022.

The maximum "Large Scale Infrastructure" pot that will be available in Standish, when all contributing developments have been built out is £2,306,500 (80% of the total to spend figure of £2,883,125). The projects identified have a combined value of £1,536,974 (May 2022 estimates). The maximum "Large Scale Infrastructure" pot that will be available in Golborne / Lowton, when all contributing developments have been built out is £5,799,633 (80% of the total to spend figure of £7,249,542). The projects identified have a combined value of £5,075,768 (May 2022 estimates).

The above allocation of monies was endorsed and approved by the Council's Cabinet at this July meeting. It was also endorsed and approved that the remaining levy balances in both areas are retained for the time being as contingency to mitigate potential risks in relation to cost inflation. Consideration is to be given at a future point as to what any unspent portion of the "Large Scale Infrastructure" pots can be used for, as well as elements of the "Small Scale Infrastructure" pots which are to be retained.

Significant other projects within this element include -

- Purchase and repair Scheme across Golborne and Lowton, Mosley Common
- New build direct delivery programme Tyldesley and Astley.
- Improvements to play and public open space provisions at Pennington Flash
- Highways improvement works on the A580.

A breakdown of the unspent element (£6,367,197.63) is given in paragraph g) of this document.

ii) No planning obligation money was spent on repaying money borrowed.

Councils have the ability to borrow money in order to deliver infrastructure and enable new development, with the borrowing subsequently being repaid through Section 106 contributions provided by the development as it comes forward. This item confirms that the Council has not adopted this approach during the year covered by the report.

iii) No planning obligation money was spent on administration of planning obligations and monitoring in relation to the delivery of planning obligations during the reported year.

The Regulations allow Councils to use a portion (normally up to 5%) of Section 106 contributions to cover their costs in monitoring and administering the funds. The Council may decide to do this in future but did not use any Section 106 funding for this purpose in the year covered by the report.

i) The total amount of money retained at the end of the reported year is £20,553,573.29. Of this amount retained an amount of £0.00 has been retained for long term maintenance.

# **Annual Infrastructure Funding Statement for Section 106**

Reporting Period: From 01 April 2023 to 31 March 2024

#### Introduction

This document is Wigan Council's fourth Infrastructure Funding Statement. It provides information about financial contributions that the Council has secured from developers through "Section 106 agreements". These are legal agreements between the Council and developers, through which the developer will fund new or improved infrastructure to address the impact of development on an area.

Publishing an Infrastructure Funding Statement each year, is a legal requirement for the Council in line with regulations that came into force in 2019. The regulations, whose full title is 'The Community Infrastructure Levy (Amendment) (England) (No. 2) Regulations 2019', give details of the information that the Statement must contain. The rest of this document sets out each of these pieces of information, labelled a) to i), followed by a short explanation

#### **Section 106 Matters**

## Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A Schedule 2 Section 3

a) The total amount of money to be provided under any planning obligations which were entered during the reported year is £1,361,327.02. This figure does not consider indexation (inflation/deflation) that may be applied when the money becomes due.

This item details the value of developer contributions that were entered into in new Section 106 Agreements signed during the period covered by this Statement. The agreements were signed at the same time as planning permission was granted for the developments in question. In general circumstances, contributions do not normally become payable until development begins on the ground, which can often be some time after planning permission is granted, so the Council has not yet received most of these sums.

b) The total amount of money received from planning obligations during the reported year was £2,201,020.71

This amount referenced above relates to the contributions that were received during the year covered by the Statement. Most of these will relate to planning permissions granted in previous years, and in the majority of cases where development has begun on the ground.

c) The total amount of money received prior to the reported year that has not been allocated is £4,013,124.12

This item describes the value of contributions that the Council was holding at 31 March 2024, that had been received prior to 1 April 2023, for which decisions have not yet been made as to what they will be spent on.

The Council operates dedicated Infrastructure Levies in Standish and in Golborne / Lowton, where significant levels of new housebuilding are taking place. Under these Levies, developers contribute a fixed amount per new house, into an overall fund that will then be used to deliver a wide range of infrastructure improvements.

- d) During the reported year the following non-monetary contributions have been agreed under planning obligations:
  - i) The total number of affordable housing units to be provided is 52

This means that a total of 52 new affordable houses are to be provided on development sites as part of new developments. A breakdown of these is shown in iii) below.

In addition to the affordable housing units secured through Section 106 agreements, some affordable housing delivery is also achieved via planning conditions attached to planning permissions. These contributions, while forming an important part of the overall affordable housing provision in the borough, are not captured within this Infrastructure Funding Statement as they fall outside the scope of Section 106 monitoring.

Information on such planning permissions, including those with affordable housing conditions, is publicly accessible through the Council's planning records. These can be viewed by searching our planning applications database at the following address:

While this Statement focuses specifically on affordable housing secured through Section 106 agreements, it should be noted that additional affordable housing provision is also delivered through other funding streams and the Council's own direct delivery programme.

ii) No new school accommodation has been constructed directly as part of new development.

New housing development is often required to contribute to the provision of additional **stro**places to accommodate increased demand from new residents. This is sometimes provided directly on the development site in the form of a new school built by the developer. Alternatively, the developer can be asked to provide a financial contribution to the Council, which is then used to expand accommodation at existing school sites. In the year covered by this Statement, all the contributions secured towards education provision were in the form of financial contributions. Details of the projects delivered to expand existing school sites are shown in h) below.

e) The total amount of money from planning obligations allocated towards infrastructure during the reported year was £1,464,420.82. Of this amount £926,861.51 was not spent during the reported year.

This item describes the value of contributions for which the Council made decisions as to what they would be spent on, during the year covered by the report. Once a decision has been made, further work has to take place to design a scheme in detail, procure a contractor to deliver it, so it is frequently the case that money is not spent in the same year as the decision is made.

The Council operates dedicated Infrastructure Levies in Standish and in Golborne / Lowton, where significant levels of new housebuilding are taking place. Under these Levies, developers contribute a fixed amount per new house, into an overall fund that will then be used to deliver a wide range of infrastructure improvements.

A report to the Council's Cabinet in February 2022 secured approval for a mechanism for taking decisions on which these projects would be funded through the Levies. The report firstly outlined the issues that would be considered, including strategic fit and deliverability, as well as feedback from the public consultation. The report also established a split within the overall funding pot in each of the Levy areas, with 20% of the fund in each area being made available for "Small Scale Infrastructure" projects including community schemes, open spaces, and upgrades to walking and cycling routes; the other 80% of the pot to be used for "Large Scale Infrastructure" schemes, primarily highways improvements.

A further report taken to the Council's Cabinet in July 2022 set out a programme of schemes to be funded through the "Large Scale Infrastructure" pot in each of the Levy areas. The schemes identified accounted for the majority, though not all, of the 80% available for both areas. This programme of schemes was considered by the Council's internal governance processes and was endorsed by the Strategic Management Team on the 31 May 2022.

The maximum "Large Scale Infrastructure" pot that will be available in Standish, when all contributing developments have been built out is £2,306,500 (80% of the total to spend figure of £2,883,125). The projects identified have a combined value of £1,536,974 (May 2022 estimates). The maximum "Large Scale Infrastructure" pot that will be available in Golborne / Lowton, when all contributing developments have been built out is £5,799,633 (80% of the total to spend figure of £7,249,542). The projects identified have a combined value of £5,075,768 (May 2022 estimates).

The above allocation of monies was endorsed and approved by the Council's Cabinet at this July meeting. It was also endorsed and approved that the remaining levy balances in both areas are retained for the time being as contingency to mitigate potential risks in relation to cost inflation. Consideration is to be given at a future point as to what any unspent portion of the "Large Scale Infrastructure" pots can be used for, as well as elements of the "Small Scale Infrastructure" pots which are to be retained.

Significant other projects within this element include –

- Purchase and repair Scheme across Golborne and Lowton, Mosley Common
- New build direct delivery programme Tyldesley and Astley.
- Improvements to play and public open space provisions at Lilford Park
- Highways improvement works on the A580.

f) The total amount of money from planning obligations spent during the reported year was £2,714,009.11

This item gives details of the total amount of Section 106 funding that the Council has spent during the year covered by the report. A full breakdown of this amount is given in item h) below. In some cases, the Council can pass Section 106 funding to another organisation, to spend on its behalf on an agreed project.
