## **RESPONSE**

On 16.12.2025 for Ofsted registered children's homes only:

1. There are 59 Ofsted registered children's homes in Wigan including those registered by the LA.
2. There are currently 44 children placed in Ofsted registered children's homes.
3. 20 planning applications were granted in the past 3 years and 5 were refused.
