1. How many parking tickets were issued to the vehicle that infringed parking regulations in the borough on the most occasions? 97
2. What was the penalty value of these tickets? £9785
3. In what street or car park were the majority of them collected? Hallgate Wigan
4. How many of them have been paid? 0 paid
5. What was the make and model of the vehicle?

We are withholding this information under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This exemption applies because the information you have requested includes personal data relating to a living individual. In this case, the details of the vehicle would enable the identification of an individual, and disclosure would therefore constitute the release of their personal information. Under the UK GDPR and Data Protection Act 2018, we must ensure that personal data is processed fairly and lawfully. Disclosing information that identifies an individual, such as information linked to a specific vehicle, would be unfair and would breach the data protection principles. Section 40(2) is an absolute exemption, meaning the public interest test does not apply.
