



Request

I request disclosure of the complete planning file relating to the development known as Atherleigh Park Mental Health Hospital. Situated on Atherleigh Way, Leigh. WN7 1YN. This hospital was constructed by 5 Boroughs Partnership NHS Foundation Trust and opened in 2017.

For the avoidance of doubt, the term “planning file” includes but is not limited to

- The original planning application and application reference number;
- The decision notice
- All conditions attached to the permission
- Any section 106 agreements under s106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, unilateral undertakings, or related obligations
- The transport assessment and any associated parking or traffic impact documents
- All correspondence, internal or external, held by the local planning authority, parking charges, or representations made by local residents.
- Any documents regarding assurances or commitments regarding staff or visitor parking made during the consultation or determination process.
