For Pupils

The sessions below are aimed at pupils, and can be tailored to match your school's requirements. Timings as indicated.

Diversity Assembly (20-30 minutes)

This raises awareness of the diversity of languages spoken in our schools, and the problems encountered by EAL pupils who are new to English. Can be tailored to Primary or Secondary schools.

Diversity Assembly—Gypsy Traveller Theme (20—30 minutes)

This deals with the reality of life as a Gypsy or Traveller child in school today, and can be tailored to KS1, KS2 or Secondary.

Persona Dolls (20-30 minutes)

Using dolls representing Traveller children, these sessions introduce KS1 children to cultural issues from within the Traveller Community.

Rights, Responsibilities and Choice (Half Day)

This is aimed at the post - SATS Y6 class, looking at the diversity within their own group, and the effects of prejudice on our community.

Where we live (1 Hour)

Aimed at Y6 / 7, this session looks at the judgements we make about people based on their homes and neighbourhoods.

Introduction to the Holocaust (1 Hour)

A lesson aimed at Y9, introducing the Holocaust and associated themes. It can be delivered as a stand-alone lesson or be incorporated into your history or R.E. scheme.

We will happily create any session about diversity issues to meet the needs of your pupils.
