



Community Link Workers

- Address non-clinical demands on primary, community and acute health care services.
- 'health coaching' and community knowledge to connect people to sources of support within their community.
- Make effective use of voluntary and community sector assets
- Connect people to community based activities.
- Support transformational changes to the way we deliver health and social care.

Community Link Workers

- Funding to develop pilot obtained through Better Care Fund (2016)
- Currently 16 WTE CLWs (15 primary care, 1 based in acute)- funding within Primary care budget
- Over 3,100 individuals supported in 2017-18 (referrals from GP growing by 33% each year)
- Evaluation completed by the Innovation Unit
- Shortlisted 'Innovators of the Year' National GP Practice Awards 2016
- CBA illustrates social return on investment of £10.40 for every £1 invested and fiscal return of £3.55
- Core part of place based working and 'Huddles' (connecting GP and other health providers to wider support)
- Current business case to extend the service to expand the service further with a focus on employment & health, pain management, low level mental health issues and family support
