

Analysis of the responses of f40 LAs regarding transfers from the Schools' Block to the High Needs Block

- 1. There are 41 authorities in f40 membership.
- 2. This analysis refers to a survey of LAs undertaken in November/December 2018 [referred to as November in all further statements and tables] and again in January 2019 following the announcement by the Secretary of State in late December of additional High Needs funding.
- 3. The Secretary of State announced an additional £250m over two years (£125m each year). f40 LAs were allocated £45.1m in 2019-20.
- 4. In November, 10 of the 41 did not intend to transfer any funds to the HNB and unsurprisingly did not alter that decision in January.
- 5. In November, 24 of the remaining 32 requested between 0.1% and 0.5% and a further seven requested between 1% and 2%

- 6. The table above shows what subsequently happened to the 31 requests to move funds.
- 7. Where the Schools' Forum agreed a move in November (16 LAs), one withdrew the request after receipt of the additional funding and one reduced it (0.5% to 0.3%), the remainder left the decision as it was, many citing that whilst the funding was welcome, it would not solve the problem.
- 8. Where the Schools' Forum disagreed in November (9 LAs), three reduced the request, one withdrew it and three said that they would not change the request. In 3 cases the outcome was not known (yet).
