Subject: Three Year Budget Forecasts – 2019/20 to 2021/22

### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 In the Autumn Term 2018, maintained schools were asked to complete a three-year budget forecast for the period 2019/20 to 2021/22 and submit this to finance. An update to the 2019/20 position has been received through the school's annual budgets submitted this term.
- 1.2 At the last meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> May 2019, Forum members requested information on the outcome of the three-year budget exercise and the deficits forecast by schools.

### 2. 2019/20 Position

- 2.1 Maintained schools submit a budget to the Local Authority on an annual basis. The 2019/20 budgets submitted to date identify that three primary and nursery schools are forecasting deficits in the current financial year. One of our special school's may also have a deficit, however, final budget figures have not yet been received and work is ongoing with this school. No secondary schools are forecasting a deficit in 2019/20.
- 2.2 Therefore, currently **3%** of our maintained schools are forecasting a deficit this year. The total value of these deficits is **£173,690** and these range from £17,642 to £99,917.
- 2.3 The Local Authority is working closely with these schools to help identify efficiencies and to provide oversight of the financial position as the year progresses.

## 3. 2020/21 and 2021/22 Position

- 3.1 During the Autumn Term 2018, all maintained schools were asked to complete and submit a longer-term projection in the form of a three-year budget using the best available information at that time.
- 3.2 Returns have been received from 96 of our 100 maintained schools, and from the longer-term projections submitted it was found that **71%** of schools are forecasting a deficit in 2020/21 and **85%** in 2021/22.
- 3.3 The tables below summarise the deficits forecast in the submitted three-year budgets in 2020/21 and 2021/22. It should be noted that due the time elapsed since the three-year submissions this position is likely to now have changed and based on the 19/20 annual budgets we believe that the position is now more positive than the figures reported below. The information has been split by sector:

- 3.3 Those schools who are not currently anticipating a deficit by year 3 (2021/22) are still forecasting 'in-year' deficits and it is only as a result of the balances previously accumulated that they are able to balance their budgets over this period.
- 3.4 The Local Authority will again be asking schools to complete and submit three year budget plans in the Autumn Term 2019 covering the period 2020/21 to 2022/23 and an update will be presented to Forum following this exercise.

# 4. Academy three-year budgets

- 4.1 At the last forum meeting, it was noted that Academies would be asked to share their three-year budgets for order to provide the full picture of the financial pressures being faced by Wigan schools.
- 4.2 A request for this information has been made to each Academy Headteacher and to date we have received the requested information from 6 academies out of 28.
- 4.3 None of the academies that have supplied the requested information are forecasting a deficit in 2019/20 or 2020/21. However, 33% of these schools are forecasting deficits in 2021/22 and this information is summarised in the table below, split by sector.

4.4 Similar to maintained schools, all academies who have provided a response are forecasting 'in year' deficits by 2021/22 and it is only as a result of their accumulated reserves that they are able to balance their budgets.
