The Start Well Centre will work with parents to shape the offer of support for parents i.e. peer support groups building on the strengths of the parents and families in the community to help others.

The Start Well Centre will work with parents to shape the offer of support for parents, including the delivery of activities around healthy eating, feeding support and dads groups.

We will ensure that families are not negatively impacted due to the fact they live on the borders of the borough, and that they can access the offer of universal services in their community.

Work with local community based support groups and providers to look at the offer of support and activities during school holidays for the whole family.

# **Opportunities**

Develop links with schools/community regarding holiday provision for older children and after school services.

Develop new opportunities for Breastfeeding support groups and networks, linking this to peer support and opportunities for parents to help other parents in the area. Identify training opportunities to provide parents with the right skills who want to help their peers. Also explore options for sessions for parents that use alternative feeding methods.

Counselling services for mothers with post natal depression, parent trained in delivering this session would like to offer as part of new delivery model.

Work with the Bedford Higher Folds Community Centre to explore how it could be used as a community hub to deliver services for children, young people and families in the community.
