Standish Cycling and Walking Network, Phase 2, Wigan walking and cycling scheme

The School Lane to Gidlow Lane Bridleway is already a popular place to walk, wheel and cycle – but could be even better.

From School Lane, past the playing field, along Barley Brook, and past Gidlow Cemetery, the path is difficult to access. Often the route is too muddy to use, or inaccessible with vegetation blocking the route and uneven surfacing.

This scheme proposes to upgrade the route, including:

- Approximately 2.6 kilometre (just over a mile and a half) of high-quality surface
- Accessible points of entry, and better connections to local communities
- Vegetation clearance, to clear the route of trees and foliage
- Use of woodland management to make great habitats for local species

This scheme will make it easier for everybody to make the most of the borough's outdoor spaces; preserve our rich industrial heritage; and provide an off-road route to get between Standish and Wigan. Wigan Council are keen to work closely with residents, businesses, and disability groups to ensure accessibility is maintained where possible.

This route complements the recently constructed and upgraded Standish Mineral Line and crossing upgrades around Gidlow Lane and Mesnes Park.
