Active Neighbourhoods are about creating safe and attractive spaces for people to move around their community. By slowing and/or stopping traffic movements the idea is that only local people are left using the streets, improving the ability for children to play without the worry of busy car dominated roads as well as allowing residents, of all abilities, to get around, for example on foot, by wheelchair, with a buggy or by bike.

- Reducing congestion/rat-running and increasing safety for all.
