

# High Hedges complaint form

## Places Directorate, Planning and Transport

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Use this form to submit a complaint to the council about a high hedge, under Part 8 of the Anti-social Behaviour Act 2003. It should be completed by the person making the complaint or their representative.

Before completing this form, please read the guidance notes sent with it and the leaflet High hedges: Complaining to the council. Please use BLOCK CAPITALS and black ink.

You must pay a fee when you send in this form. The fee is currently £500. But if the person paying the fee is currently claiming benefit the fee will be £100. We will need a copy of one of the following documents before we can accept an application with a fee of £100:

- a copy of your latest council tax bill showing the benefit received; or
- a Housing Benefit notification letter from the Director of Finance at Wigan Council. These are sent to all customers in April. You can request another copy by either:
  - telephoning: 01942 828644 (Finance Department); or
  - visiting the Council Tax Office on Moore Street East, Whelley, Wigan; or
- a recent copy of your bank statement showing an entry for Housing Benefit; or
- a remittance slip which comes with a cheque for housing benefit and shows the period of the benefit.

The council will rely on the information you provide so please make sure it is clear and accurate.
